Main Features (a)

The total number of people counted in the external Territories of Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands on census night, 6 August 1991, was 1,922. This figure represents a 22% decrease in the census count of these areas since the 1986 Census.

Christmas Island...

- 1,275 people were enumerated on Christmas Island, a
 decrease of 514 people, or 28.7%, since the 1986 Census.
 The majority of the decrease occurred in the 15-34 age group,
 with the number of people aged 15-24 falling from 309 to 83.
- The sex ratio of the Christmas Island population in 1991 was 120.97 males to 100 females, compared with 129.65 males to 100 females in 1986.
- In 1986, the largest age group for males was 30-34 years (154). In 1991 the largest age group for males was 0-4 years (103).
- In 1986, the largest age group for females was 0-4 years (134). The largest age group for females in 1991 was 5-9 years (96).
- The total number of occupied private dwellings counted on Christmas Island decreased by 33.3% since the 1986 Census, from 604 to 403 in 1991.

Cocos (Keeling) Islands...

- 647 people were enumerated on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, a decrease of 29 people, or 4.3%, since the 1986 Census.
 The number of people aged under 40 decreased by 110 or 21.2%, and for 60 years and over increased by 37 or 88.1%.
- The sex ratio of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands population in 1991 was 97.3 males to 100 females, compared with 92.1 males to 100 females in 1986.
- In 1986, the largest age group for males was 35-39 years (48). The largest age group for males in 1991 was 25-29 years (34).
- In 1986, the largest age group for females was 0-4 years (49).
 The largest age groups for females in 1991 were 0-4 and 5-9 years, both with 35.
- The total number of dwellings counted by the census on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands has increased by 6.9% since the 1986 Census, from 160 to 171 in 1991.

About this publication...

This publication contains **preliminary** data, the first counts from the 1991 Census of Population and Housing. Final data will be available from the September quarter 1992.

The publication contains preliminary counts for Australia's external Territories of Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands. The counts are on a place of enumeration basis, which provides a count of people where they were located on census night, 6 August 1991, which may not be where they usually live.

For each State, the Northern Territory, and the Australian Capital Territory, the preliminary publication *First Counts for Statistical Local Areas* (2701.1-8) will be produced. These publications contain preliminary counts of people and dwellings for statistical local areas (SLAs) and statistical divisions (SDs) in each State/Territory.

Scope and coverage...

The 1991 Census of Population and Housing was held on 6 August 1991. The purpose of the census was to count every person who spent census night in Australia. This included people in private dwellings, occupied non-private dwellings, camping out, on vessels in or between Australian ports and on board overnight transport.

People were counted where they were located on census night, which may not have been where they usually live.

Visitors to Australia were counted regardless of how long ago they arrived, or how long they planned to stay. Australian residents out of the country on census night were excluded.

All private dwellings were counted, whether occupied or unoccupied. Occupied non-private dwellings, such as hospitals, gaols, etc. were also counted.

Diplomatic personnel and their families were excluded from the census, as were diplomatic residences.

The external Territories of Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands were within the scope of the 1991 Census. The 1986 Census was the first census to include them. Previously, separate censuses of the islands were conducted by the federal department(s) responsible for administration of the external Territories.

Preliminary data limitations...

Statistical collections such as the census are subject to a number of sources of error. The effect of such errors on overall census results is generally insignificant. However, preliminary data are subject to number of additional errors which may effect the quality of the data. The counts presented in this publication have been captured using Optical Mark Recognition (OMR). With OMR, a mark is placed in a pre-defined box on the census form and read by machine.

This process may result in a number of errors. For example, marks may not be recognised by the OMR machines, or more than one mark may have been made in response to a single question.

Errors such as these are corrected for final data and therefore preliminary data may differ from final data. Any differences are expected to be small.

1986 Census data...

Preliminary counts were not available from the 1986 Census.

Final 1986 Census data have been provided in this publication. This 1986 data was originally published in Census 86 - Summary Characteristics of Persons and Dwellings, Cocos (Keeling) Islands (2488.0) and Census 86 - Summary Characteristics of Persons and Dwellings, Christmas Island (2489.0).

Introduced random adjustments...

Adjustments are randomly made to table cells to protect the confidentiality of information about individuals. As a result, component cells may not add to their totals. These differences are statistically insignificant and do not impair the usefulness of the tables.

Census variables in this publication...

Age

Age has been collected in all Australian censuses. For the 1991 Census age was self-coded, that is, age was recorded by each person marking the appropriate box.

Sex

Question 3 on the census forms asks the sex of each person.

Dwellings

The census collector recorded each dwelling as either private or non-private. Private dwellings are either occupied or unoccupied, and are further defined by structure (for example, separate house, townhouse, flat or apartment, caravan etc in caravan park). Only occupied non-private dwellings were included in the census. Non-private dwellings include motels, gaols, welfare institutions, hospitals, retirement villages, boarding schools etc.

Maps...

Census collection district (CD) maps can be obtained for the external Territories of Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

Other 1991 Census products and services...

Final data for the external Territories of Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands will be available through the Census Consultancy Service.

Final data for Australia will be published in a range of publications including *Census Counts for Small Areas* (2730.1-8), *Census Characteristics for (State/Australia)* (2710.0-8), thematic reports and social atlases. Products will also be available on floppy disk, microfiche, and CD-ROM.

A number of 1991 Census products are already available from the ABS. They include the 1991 Census Dictionary (2901.0) and 1991 Census Directory of Classifications (2904.0). For detailed explanations of data, census concepts, terminology, variables and classifications, refer to these publications. Collection District Maps (2920.0) in hardcopy and on microfiche, and the Collection District Comparability List (2919.0) are also available.
