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What is the 1991 Directory of Census Classifications?

People provide a wide range of responses to questions on the census form. To reduce these responses to a manageable level for output purposes, they are grouped into a number of categories or classes. For each topic, a list of classes is created which group related or similar responses. This list of classes is called a classification. This Directory contains a listing of the classifications used in the 1991 Census of Population and Housing; and therefore describes all the data available from the 1991 Census.

What information do I need to know about the Census to use this Directory?

For the 1991 Census there are 111 classifications. To help you, and us, identify them easily, each classification is labelled with a four character **mnemonic**. These mnemonics are a convenient shorthand method of describing census variables. So rather than saying. 'Number of residents in household aged 65 years and over', simply say... 'CE1D'!

As you browse through the classifications you will notice that the last character of the mnemonics is always a **D**, an **F**, or a **P**. This is because census information is collected and disseminated on a range of characteristics relating to **D**wellings, Families and **P**ersons. In some cases there are two or three variables with the same first three characters. For example, FINF is the family's income, whereas FINP is the income of an individual's family.

You will notice that variables which count something commence with a C.

WARNING FOR 1986 CENSUS USERS: Be careful when you use the mnemonics associated with males, females, mothers and fathers. Because of the newly derived family variables, we have used the letter \underline{M} to represent <u>male of a couple, male parent</u> and <u>father</u> (ie all of these are <u>male</u>), and \underline{F} to represent <u>female of a couple, female parent</u> and <u>mother</u> (ie all of these are <u>female</u>). The mnemonics BPMP and BPFP have therefore swapped meaning from the 1986 Census.

Please remember that the variables in this Directory are only attributes of dwellings, families and persons. Geographic variables formed by the aggregation of Collection Districts (CDs), such as Statistical Local Areas (SLA), Legal Local Government Areas (Legal LGAs) and Electoral Divisions are described in the publication 1991 Census Geographic Areas (2905.0).

How do I use the Directory?

If you turn to page 1 of this Directory, you will find a **Topic Index** in alphabetical order. Simply turn to the subject you are interested in, for example...

Marital status

and you will find a list of all the classifications relating to that topic...

... take a note of the mnemonic; MDCF,...

... turn to the **Classifications** listing on page 11, which are listed in alphabetical order of mnemonics.

In some of the classifications you may find some abbreviations you may not be familar with;

NEC - Not elsewhere classified NEI - Not elsewhere included NFD - Not further defined NA - Not applicable NS - Not stated

What can I do if the classification I am interested in is too detailed?

You may find that you do not need all of the detail provided in a classification. We have regrouped some original classifications to the most commonly requested variations. We call these regroupings **standard recodes**.

These standard recodes are identified by two numeric characters following the mnemonic. For example, AGEP classifies age in single years. AGEP02 regroups this classification to age in five year groups.

Every classification has a standard recode called '01'. '01' recodes contain the same classificatory detail as the original classifications, with the addition of totals (and in some cases subtotals), and some labels may have also been rearranged for clarity. All standard recodes available, with the exception of the '01' recodes, are listed after each classification. The number of categories in a recode is listed in brackets after the description of the recode.

Clients who are specifying customised matrixes may design recodes to suit their individual needs, based on the original classifications.

What census tables are already available?

The information you are looking for may already be available in one of our standard products. Detailed census information is contained in matrixes. For your information, a listing of the 1991 Census National Standard Matrixes (ie detailed cross tabulations) can be found at Appendix A. For information on 1991 Census State Standard Matrixes, contact the Information Services area in your State. Contact numbers are listed at Appendix B.

In addition, details of customised matrixes which have been produced for other clients will be published in our quarterly newsletter: Census Update (2902.0). Census Update will also keep you in touch with First Counts, Community Profiles, Standard Matrixes, Maps, Social Atlases, data quality, recent and forthcoming releases, user seminars and much more. If you wish to subscibe to Census Update, ring the Information Services area in your State.

What can I do if these tables do not suit my needs?

You may want to design your own matrixes. For this purpose we have a Census Consultancy Service. You will need this Directory if you are designing your own matrixes.

Is there any other reference material available which can help me?

The Dictionary contains definitions of terms and concepts used in census field collection, input processing and output of census data. It also provides some more information about the classifications in this Directory.

The 1991 Census Geographic Areas (2905.0)

This publication has been specifically tailored for use with 1991 Census data. Only Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) geographic areas for which census data are available are included. It is an essential reference document when establishing the hiearchical relationship of the area of interest to ASGC units (for example, whether a given Legal Local Government Area (Legal LGA) consists of more than one Statistical Local Area (SLA)).
