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AUSTRACIA NADEMOGRAPHIC STATISTICS DECEMBER QUARTER 1986, MARCH AND JUNE QUARTERS 1987

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MAIN FEATURES

The preliminary estimated population of Australia at 30 June 1987 is 16,248,800, an increase of 57,500 since 31 March 1987 and 230,500 since 30 June 1986. Of the growth during the last twelve months, 55 per cent was achieved through natural increase (126,800) with overseas migration (103,700) contributing the remaining 45 per cent. The annual growth rate for the year 1986-87 of 1.4 per cent was fractionally lower than the 1.5 per cent for the previous year.

The Northern Territory and Western Australia had the highest population growth rates for the year 1986-87, 2.6 per cent and 2.5 per cent respectively, followed by Queensland (1.9 per cent) and the Australian Capital Territory (1.6 per cent). States whose growth rates were below the national average were New South Wales (1.3 per cent), Victoria (1.1 per cent), South Australia (0.8 per cent) and Tasmania (0.6 per cent).

Australia's population continues to become older; the proportion of population 65 years of age and over at 30 June 1987 was 10.7 per cent compared with 10.5 per cent a year ago.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This quarterly publication contains estimated resident populations for Australia and the States and Territories. It also provides the latest available statistics of births, deaths (including infant deaths), marriages, divorces and overseas as well as interstate migration. In addition, the publication includes age estimates of the resident population for 1976, 1981, 1986 and 1987.

Notes and definitions

2. These are provided at the head of each section of tables.

Revision of population estimates

3. This issue contains revised quarterly population estimates for the States, Territories and Australia from September 1981 to June 1986 made in the light of results of the 1986 Census. These estimates are now final. For further details see the notes at the head of the population section.

Related publications

4. Detailed annual demographic statistics appeared for many years in the annual publication *Demography* which ceased after the issue for 1971. Since then, annual statistics have been contained in the publications listed below.

Population Estimates, Australia, (3219.0). This publication is issued ahead of Australian Demographic Statistics (3101.0) when prior release of population data is desirable. It is not issued every quarter. The last issue was published on 5 May 1987.

Births, Australia (3301.0). The 1986 issue was released on 31 July 1987.

Deaths, Australia (3302.0). The 1986 issue was published on 12 October 1987.

Marriages, Australia (3306.0). The 1986 issue was published on 15 July 1987.

Divorces, Australia (3307.0). The 1986 issue was released on 3 June 1987.

Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia (3404.0). The 1986 issue was published on 21 September 1987.

Estimated Resident Population by Sex and Age: States and Territories of Australia (3201.0). The 1986 issue containing final estimates for 1985 and preliminary estimates for 1986, was issued on 28 November 1986. (Note that the estimates in this issue and issues back to 1982 are now subject to revision in the light of 1986 Census results.).

Estimated Resident Population, Australia, States and Territories (3217.0). The 1986 issue was released on 1 October 1987. It contained final 1986 Census-based estimates by age and sex at 30 June 1986.

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ESTIMATED RESIDENT POPULATION AND COMPONENTS OF POPULATION CHANGE

Notes and definitions

Australia's population estimates for the period since 1971 are compiled according to the place of usual residence of the population. An explanation of the 'place of usual residence' conceptual basis for population estimates is given in the ABS technical paper, Methods and Procedures in the Compilation of Estimated Resident Population 1981 and in the Construction of the 1971-81 Time Series (3103.0) issued on 11 March 1983.

2. Method of estimation. The estimates of the population of Australia and the States and Territories at the date of the Census are the adjusted (for under-enumeration) Census Counts, Place of Usual Residence, to which are added the number of Australian residents estimated to have been temporarily overseas at the time of the census.

Quarterly estimates of the Australian population are obtained by adding to the population at the beginning of each period components of natural increase (on a usual residence basis) and net overseas migration gain. For the States and Territories, account is also taken of estimated interstate movements involving a change of usual residence. After each census final estimates for the preceding intercensal period are provided by incorporating an additional quarterly adjustment (intercensal discrepancy) to ensure that the total intercensal increase agrees with the difference between the estimated resident populations at the two respective census dates. The population estimates for periods after 30 June 1981 published in this issue of Australian Demographic Statistics include (for the first time) adjustments in accordance with results of the Census at 30 June 1986. Estimates up to 30 June 1986 are therefore final.

- 3. Natural increase. Excess of births over deaths by State of usual residence.
- Net estimated overseas migration. Figures are based on net permanent and long-term overseas movements (see notes and definitions, Overseas Migration section) with State or Territory 'not stated' allocated pro rata. Short-term movements are excluded. The estimates from July 1976 onwards include an adjustment for the net effect of 'category jumping'. (For more details on the calculation of category jumping see the Appendix at the back of this publication). This adjustment is necessary because net permanent and long-term migration figures can be affected by changes in travel intentions, as when an Australian resident departing for a short-term visit overseas (stating that he/she intends to stay abroad for less than 12 months) in fact stays more than 12 months, thereby changing his/her travel category from short-term to longterm. An ABS technical paper, Estimates of Residents Temporarily Overseas, Visitors in Australia and Category Jumping (3104.0), was published on 10 March 1983.
- 5. Net estimated interstate migration. Information about internal migration is available from population censuses and from a sample survey of internal movements which has been conducted at more or less annual intervals since 1970. These sources, however, do not provide the up-to-date quarterly estimates of interstate migration required for regular population estimates. The only suitable sources for this purpose are administrative records:
 - (1) prior to June 1986, quarterly estimates were derived from records of interstate changes of

addresses advised to the Department of Social Security in connection with family allowance payments. Family allowance transfer data related to children only, and interstate migration for all ages was based on the expansion of these family allowance data using ratios of adult to child populations. These ratios, calculated for each interstate flow, were based on results from the latest available census. Data from the Internal Migration Survey were used to constrain the total interstate moves to those revealed by the Survey. Data derived from the ratio expansion method were subject to revision in the light of the more accurate census data. For more information on estimates of interstate migration prior to June 1986 see the ABS occasional paper, Postcensal Interstate Migration Estimates, 1966-1981 which was published in April 1984.

(2) Because of difficulties in obtaining adequate coverage of all movements from family allowance transfers, estimates of interstate migration after June 1986 are being derived from unidentified information on interstate changes of addresses advised to the Health Insurance Commission in the process of administering Medicare.

In this publication, estimates for the 1981-86 intercensal period have been revised using data on interstate migration from the 1986 Census.

- 6. Rates of population growth. These express a change during a period as a proportion (per cent) of the population at the beginning of the period. These rates should be distinguished from crude rates (of births, deaths, marriages and divorces) which are expressed per 1,000 of mean population.
- 7. Mean populations. These are calculated for financial and calendar years to the formula:

mean population =
$$\frac{a + 4b + 2c + 4d + e}{12}$$

where 'a' is the population at the end of the quarter immediately preceding the twelve month period, and 'b', 'c', 'd' and 'e' are the populations at the end of each of the four succeeding quarters. Mean populations are used in the calculation of crude rates. The weights used in the formulation of the mean annual populations have been derived using a mathematical technique which involves the fitting of two quadratic polynomial functions to a series of points. Further explanation of this procedure is available to interested users on request to the ABS.

8. Population by age/sex. The age/sex data for the 1976 1981 and 1986 census dates are based on the Census Counts, Place of Usual Residence which subsequently were adjusted for under-enumeration and to which were added estimated numbers of Australian residents temporarily overseas on census night. The 1987 age distribution published in this bulletin was obtained by advancing the estimated resident population for 30 June 1986 by adding components of natural increase (usual residence basis) and net estimated interstate and overseas migration.

BIRTHS, DEATHS, MARRIAGES AND DIVORCES

Notes and definitions

Occurrence and registration. Births and deaths are registered in the State or Territory of occurrence which is not necessarily the State or Territory of usual or last residence of the mother or the deceased. Births and deaths are shown in the quarter or year of registration.

- 2. Live births. A live birth refers to a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of the pregnancy, which, after expulsion or extraction from its mother, breathes or shows any other evidence of life such as heart-beat.
- 3. Crude birth and death rates. The number of live births or deaths per 1,000 mean estimated resident population.
- 4. Infant death rate. The number of deaths under one year registered per 1,000 live births registered in the same year.
- 5. Marriages. Under the Australian Marriage Act 1961, marriages may be celebrated by a minister of religion registered as an authorised celebrant, by a district registrar or by other persons authorised by the Attorney-General. Notice of the intended marriage must be given to the celebrant at least one calendar month but within 3 calendar months before the marriage. A celebrant must transmit an official certificate of the marriage for registration to a district registrar in the State in which the marriage took place.
- 6. Divorces. The term divorce, as used in this publication, refers to decrees of dissolution of marriage.
- 7. Crude marriage and divorce rate. This is the number of marriages or divorces per 1,000 of the mean estimated resident population. (The usefulness of this rate is limited because a large and varying proportion of the population used in the denominator is below the minimum age of marriage or is unmarried. Age-specific marriage and

divorce rates can be found in the more detailed marriage and divorce publications listed under 'Related publications' at the beginning of this publication).

- 8. Total fertility rate. The sum of age-specific fertility rates (live births at each age of mother per 1,000 female population of that age). It represents the number of children a woman would bear during her lifetime if she experienced the rates of the period shown.
- 9. Female gross reproduction rate. The sum of female age-specific fertility rates. It represents the average number of daughters born to women all of whom survive to the end of the reproductive period and bear daughters at each age in accordance with the rates prevailing in a year.
- 10. Female net reproduction rate. This allows for mortality during the child-bearing period. It represents the average number of daughters born to women who are subject to the fertility rates of a year and the mortality as determined from a life table.
- 11. Nuptial births. Live births are identified as nuptial where the father registered was married to the mother at the time of the birth or where the husband died during the pregnancy.
- 12. Life expectancy refers to the average number of additional years a person of a given age and sex might expect to live if the age-specific death rates of the given period continued throughout his/her lifetime.
- 13. The median age is the age which divides the total numbers in a population into two equal halves.
- 14. The median duration of marriage is the duration (in years) which divides the number of marriages dissolved into two halves, one half of these marriages having lasted shorter, the other half longer than the duration shown.

OVERSEAS ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Source of the statistics

Persons arriving in or departing from Australia are required to complete prescribed questionnaires in the form of Incoming and Outgoing Passenger cards. These cards provide information to the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs for administrative purposes and serve as the source of statistics of overseas arrivals and departures. In accordance with the Census and Statistics Act 1905, information relating to individuals, individual flights or ships and individual carriers which is contained in these cards or other documents is treated as confidential by the ABS.

Scope

2. The statistics in this publication relate to the number of movements of travellers rather than the number of travellers (i.e. the multiple movements of individual persons during a given reference period are each counted separately). However, the statistics exclude the movements of operational air crew and ships' crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not then engaged on regular voyages.

Definitions

Category of movement

3. Category of movement is primarily determined by the passenger's selection of his or her own category on the passenger card. This selection is accepted provided it is consistent with other information on the card.

Permanent movement

4. Permanent movement comprises arrivals of settlers (i.e. persons who hold migrant visas, regardless of stated intended period of stay), New Zealand citizens who indicate an intention to settle and those who are otherwise eligible to settle (e.g. overseas born children of Australian citizens), and permanent departures of Australian residents, including former residents (i.e. those who on departure state they do not intend to return to Australia).

Long-term movement

5. Long-term movement is defined as the arrivals of visitors (except those who hold migrant visas—see paragraph 4 above) and the temporary departures by Australian residents with the intention to stay, in Australia or abroad respectively, for twelve months or more, together with the departure of visitors and the return of Australian residents who had stayed, in Australia or abroad, for twelve months or more (see also paragraph 7 below).

Short-term movement

- 6. Movements of travellers whose intended or actual period of stay is less than twelve months are classified as short-term except those who on arrival hold migrant visas (see also paragraph 7 below).
- 7. A significant number of travellers (i.e. visitors to Australia on arrival and Australian residents going abroad) state exactly 12 months or one year as their intended period of stay. Many of them stay for less than that period and on their departure from, or return to,

Australia are therefore classified as short-term. Accordingly, in an attempt to maintain consistency between arrivals and departures, movements of travellers who report their actual or intended period of stay as being one year exactly are randomly allocated to long-term or short-term, in proportion to the number of movements of travellers who report their actual length of stay as up to one month more, or one month less, than one year.

State of residence

8. State of residence refers to the State in which the traveller regards himself as living or as last having lived. State of intended residence is derived from the intended address given by settlers and Australian residents returning after a journey abroad. Particularly in the case of the former, this information does not necessarily relate to the State in which a traveller will eventually establish a permanent residence.

Country of birth

9. Statistics by country of birth have certain limitations. For instance, it is not possible to make a distinction between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland, (for the tables in this publication 'Ireland' refers to 'The Republic of Ireland' plus 'Ireland, undefined'. Previously, these tables showed the U.K. and Ireland combined) nor to separately identify England, Scotland and Wales. Similarly 'Germany' could refer to the Federal Republic or to the Democratic Republic.

Estimation method

10. Overseas arrival and departure statistics are derived from a combination of full enumeration and sampling. Fully enumerated strata cover all movements by sea regardless of duration of stay, all permanent movements and all movements with a duration of stay of one year or more than one year. All movements by air with a duration of stay of less than one year are sampled and statistics relating to these movements are therefore estimates which may differ from statistics which would have been obtained if details of all these movements had been processed.

Corrections and imputations

- 11. The imprecision due to sampling errors should not be confused with errors arising from imperfections in reporting, which may occur in any data collection whether sampled or not. Every effort is made to minimise such errors, both through careful design of the passenger cards and through checks on the information once it is received. During the edit process some items are corrected where they conflict with other known information. Missing replies to certain items such as age and country of birth are also imputed by reference to other related items.
- 12. Errors of this kind differ from discrepancies arising from the fact that certain information reflects the passengers' intentions at the time the cards were completed. These intentions are of course subject to change. The items particularly affected by such discrepancies are the distinction between permanent and temporary movement and in the latter case, length of intended stay, country of intended stay, State of intended address and reason for journey.
