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### INTERIM PROJECTIONS OF THE POPULATION OF AUSTRALIA (1968 TO 2001)

A new series of projections of the population of Australia has been calculated for general publication, and supersedes projections issued by this Bureau in February 1965.

- 2. These new projections are based on a preliminary estimate of the age distribution of the population of Australia at 30 June 1968, and on assumptions as to the future which, as explained below, will be revised in later issues in the light of investigations being made into current trends. They are published as interim projections to meet the need for up-to-date projections of the Australian population. It is recognised that an integrated set of population projections for the States, Territories and Australia as a whole is also needed. The problems involved in making such integrated projections are being examined.
- Justines and their various assumptions and limitations. It is to be stressed that the projections are not to be quoted or taken in any way as official estimates or forecasts. Trends in natural increase and migration are influenced by many factors, such as economic conditions, Government policy, occurrence or fear of war and the personal reactions of individuals, both in Australia and overseas, to changing circumstances. The forecasting of population movements is thus highly speculative and has not been attempted in these projections, which represent purely hypothetical populations based on certain assumptions as to future fertility, mortality and overseas migration.
- In the previous projections, published in 1965, three alternative assumptions as to future fertility were included but in these interim projections only one fertility assumption has been adopted, which is that the 1967 age-specific fertility rates for females will remain unchanged throughout the period covered by the projections. These rates result in a gross reproduction rate of 1,39 (female children per woman) and an average age of mother (for all children born) of 27.26 years. Adopting these rates represents merely a convenient long-term application of the latest available experience and does not imply any prediction that the 1967 rates will not change. This single assumption about fertility has been adopted pending the completion of investigations currently being made into fertility trends. These investigations, which will take time to complete, are on a detailed basis, extending to annual and generation rates, marriage fertility and various characteristics such as age and previous issue of mother and duration of marriage.
- The projected mortality experience has been based on an investigation into long-term trends in the mortality of the Australian population, which was made by the Commonwealth Actuary for the purpose of the previous projections, when age-specific mortality rates were determined for five-yearly periods to 30 June 1986. These projected rates have been used for the present series, and have been extended to the year 2001 by assuming that the 1981-86 rates continue unchanged. This procedure has been adopted only as an interim measure until a further review of mortality trends can be made.
- As previously, net overseas migration (excess of total arrivals over total departures) has been projected on the basis of 100,000 persons per annum. It has also been assumed that the age-sex distribution of net migration remains the same as for the ten years ended 30 June 1968. This round figure of 100,000 persons per annum has been used only as a convenient unit to facilitate pro-rata calculations for any other unit. Thus, projections of migration at 90,000 per annum throughout Ref. No. 4.13

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may be derived by multiplying the net migration component by 0.9 (representing the ratio of 90,000 to 100,000). Use of the level of 100,000 per annum in these projections is not meant to imply any view as to the absorptive capacity of the economy nor the probable rate of future migration.

- 7. The calculations have been made in two separate parts:
  - (i) Projections of the estimated population at 30 June 1968, exclusive of subsequent migration; and
  - (ii) Projections of population resulting from net overseas migration subsequent to 30 June 1968.
- 8. It has not been practicable as yet to determine appropriate fertility and mortality experiences for these components separately. Therefore the fertility and mortality assumptions described above, which are based on the experience of the Australian population as a whole, have been applied to both parts of the calculations (i) and (ii) at the appropriate ages.
- 9. The table below is a summary of the results at selected intervals from 1969 to 2001.

- (a) The assumed level of 100,000 has been used only as a convenient round figure to facilitate pro-rata calculations for other levels.
- 10. Users who wish to obtain projections of the total population on the assumptions made can do so by adding the projections of base population shown in (i) to projections of the net migration component calculated by applying a simple pro-rata factor to the figures shown in (ii). For example, illustrative totals for the year 2001, inclusive of net overseas migration at the levels of 90,000, 100,000 and 150,000 persons per annum, would be 22,233,800, 22,709,900 and 25,090,600 respectively.
- 11. The projections for the years shown above, together with the estimated population at 30 June 1968, on which they are based, are summarised by sex and five-yearly age groups in the attached tables. The projections have, however, been computed by single years of age and for each individual financial year. Detailed results from these calculations, not available from the attached tables, may be obtained on application to the Bureau.
- 12. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in tables are due to rounding.
- 13. The projections throughout include Aborigines.
