



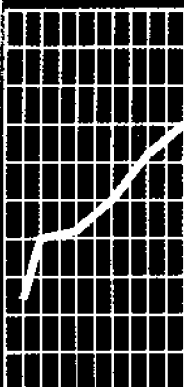

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## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

### TOTAL POPULATION

The estimated resident population of Tasmania as at 30 June 1996 was 474,443, an increase of 7,641 since June 1991. The growth rate for 1995-96 was 0.18%, compared with an average growth rate of 0.33% for the 1991-96 period.

Population growth varied considerably between subdivisions for the 1991-96 period with four increasing and four decreasing. In order, by total population, those to increase were Greater Hobart (4,979 or 2.6%), Greater Launceston (2,695 or 2.8%), Southern (1,453 or 4.4%) and North Eastern (346 or 2.5%). Those to decrease were Burnie-Devonport (141 or 0.2%), North Western Rural (304 or 1.2%), Central North (74 or 0.4%) and Lyell (1,313 or 17.1%).

### MEDIAN AGE

The median age of the estimated resident population of Tasmania as at 30 June 1996 was 34.6, an increase of 2.1 years since June 1991. This was 0.6 years higher than the Australian median age of 34.0 years. The median age for Tasmanian males increased from 31.8 at 30 June 1991 to 33.8 at 30 June 1996. The equivalent figures for Tasmanian females were 33.1 in 1991 and 35.3 in 1996.

The highest median age among the subdivisions was in North Eastern (37.2 years), followed by Southern (35.6 years) and Central North (35.3 years). The lowest median age was recorded by Lyell (30.4 years) followed by North Western Rural (32.8 years).

The local government areas with the highest median ages were Glamorgan/Spring Bay (40.2 years), Break O'Day (39.1 years), Flinders (38.5 years) and Tasman (38.4 years). Local government areas with the lowest median ages included Brighton (26.7 years), West Coast (30.4 years) and Circular Head (32.0 years).

### AGE STRUCTURE

#### Population Aged 0-14 Years

The population aged 0-14 years was estimated to be 105,914 persons, or 22.3% of the population of Tasmania at 30 June 1996, compared with 107,485 persons (24.1%) in 1986.

Greater Launceston subdivision was the only area to have more children aged 0-14 years in 1996 than in 1991.

The subdivision with the highest proportion of its population in the 0-14 age group was Lyell (26.1%), followed by North Western Rural (26.0%) and Southern (24.2%). Greater Launceston (21.5%) and Greater Hobart (21.6%) had the lowest proportions.

The local government areas with the highest proportion of children aged 0-14 years were Brighton (31.9%), West Coast (26.1%), Sorell (26.0%) and Huon Valley (25.7%). The local government areas of Hobart (16.4%) and Glamorgan/Spring Bay (19.8%) were estimated to have the lowest proportions of children aged 0-14 years.

## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS *continued*

### Population Aged 15-64 Years

The population aged 15-64 years was estimated to be 308,103 persons, or 64.9% of the population of Tasmania at 30 June 1996, compared with 290,456 persons (65.1%) in 1986.

The subdivision of Lyell had the highest proportion of its population in the 15-64 age group (67.7%), while North Eastern had the lowest (62.1%).

The local government areas with the highest proportion aged 15-64 years were Hobart (69.1%), West Coast (67.7%) and Central Highlands (66.1%). The local government areas of Dorset (61.2%), Break O'Day (62.7%) and Waratah/Wynyard (63.1%) were estimated to have the lowest proportions of their populations aged 15-64 years.

### Population Aged 65 Years and Over

The 65 years and over age group was estimated to be 60,426 persons, or 12.7% of the population of Tasmania at 30 June 1996, compared with 48,532 persons (10.9%) in 1986.

Between 1991 and 1996, the number of persons aged 65 and over grew in all subdivisions except for Central North.

The subdivision with the highest proportion of its population in the 65 and over age group was North Eastern (14.5%), followed by Burnie-Devonport (13.9%) and Greater Launceston (13.6%). Lyell had the lowest proportion (6.2%).

Glamorgan/Spring Bay had the highest proportion of its population aged 65 years and over (15.7%) followed by Glenorchy (15.4%) and Break O'Day (15.2%). Lowest proportions were recorded by Brighton (4.7%), West Coast (6.2%) and Kentish (9.5%).

### Population Aged 85 Years and Over

The population aged 85 years and over in Tasmania was estimated to be 5,408 persons, or 1.1% of the population at 30 June 1996, compared with 3,595 persons (0.8%) in 1986.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

### METHODOLOGY

1 Australia's population statistics (since 1971) have been compiled according to the place of usual residence of the population. An explanation of the conceptual basis is given in the ABS Information Paper *Population Estimates: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (3228.0) issued on 23 June 1995.

2 The estimated resident population of any area at a Census date is derived by adjusting the Census Count Place of Enumeration data to exclude visitors who normally reside outside the area, to include residents who were temporarily absent in other areas or overseas, and to apply a factor for census under-enumeration.

3 Due to the 1996 Census being held on 6 August, further adjustments have been made for births, deaths and net migration for the period 30 June to 6 August 1996 to arrive at an estimated resident population at 30 June 1996.

4 Post-censal estimates at the National and State and Territory levels are made quarterly and are obtained by adding components of natural increase (on a usual residence basis) and net migration gain to the population at the beginning of each period.

5 At the National level, estimates of overseas migration are based on net permanent and long-term overseas movements as recorded on passenger cards completed by incoming and outgoing travellers for the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs.

6 At the State and Territory level, information about internal migration is available from population censuses and from a sample survey of internal movements (conducted at more or less annual intervals to 1987 and resumed in 1991). These sources, however, do not provide the up-to-date quarterly estimates of interstate migration required for regular population estimates. The only suitable sources for this purpose are administrative records. Since June 1986, quarterly estimates of internal migration have been derived from changes of addresses advised to the Health Insurance Commission in the process of administering Medicare.

7 Post-censal Statistical Local Area (SLA) estimates are made annually and are produced with the assistance of local government authorities and other bodies who provide information on significant local factors which may have caused population changes in the relevant period.

8 Estimates for Tasmania and component areas, based on 1996 Census results, were published in *Regional Population Growth, Australia, 1996 Census Edition, 1991-96* (Catalogue No. 3218.0). This publication was released on 15 July 1997.

### DATA QUALITY

9 The quality of estimates in this publication depends on the quality of population census results (including under-enumeration adjustments) and on the various components and indicators of population change.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

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### STATISTICAL GEOGRAPHY

10 The statistical geography used in this publication is based on *1996 Statistical Geography Volume 1, Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC)* (Catalogue No. 1216.0).

11 Population estimates for statistical local areas and local government areas in this publication are based on the boundaries in existence at 30 June 1996.
