


PREFACE

This bulletin is the fifth in the annual series of Demography, South Australia and contains population and vital statistics data. It brings together different sets of demographic indicators in the one publication. These statistics are presented in a format comparable with those published by the other State Offices of the ABS.

Data are presented in seven sections. The first of these provides an overview of demographic statistics in South Australia in 1994, a summary of vital events, comparisons with other States and Territories, and a table of births and deaths in small areas.

This is followed by sections on population, births, deaths, marriages, divorces, and the indigenous population in South Australia. Each section is preceded by a summary of findings for that area of data. Explanatory Notes about these collections, and a Glossary of Terms follow the data. The Notes and Glossary are aids to the interpretation of data, and should be read in conjunction with the tables.

Vital statistics are presented on the basis of numbers registered in the recording years, with the exception of tables at the end of both the Births and Deaths Sections, where data are shown according to when the event occurred rather than when it was registered.

In relation to occurrence tables, it should be noted that they are progressively subject to revision, as earlier events are registered in later registration periods. Other tables compiled on the same basis are available upon request.

Details of divorces granted in 1994 are presented in two sections. Part A contains data compiled on the basis of the State in which divorces were granted, while Part B has been compiled on the basis of the State in which the divorced couple lived before separation.

Although this bulletin covers several areas of demographic and population statistics, it does not provide all available data. More specialised information may be found in the bulletins listed in the Explanatory Notes under 'related publications'. A full list of the data items collected in the vital statistics collections is shown in Appendix A. SECTION 1: DEMOGRAPHIC SUMMARY

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Population

In 1994, the lowest annual State population growth rates were recorded by Tasmania (0.1%), South Australia (0.3%), and Victoria (0.4%). Queensland was again the fastest growing State, with 2.5%. The growth rate for the whole of Australia was 1.3%.

Births

The crude birth rate for South Australia (13.2 per 1,000 estimated resident population) was the lowest of all States and Territories. The total fertility rate (the number of children one woman would expect to bear during her child-bearing lifetime) of 1.738 was lower than the Australian rate (1.846). The Australian Capital Territory (1.716) was the only State or Territory to record a lower rate. The median ages of South Australian parents were higher than those for Australia.

South Australia had the lowest net reproduction rate of all the States and Territories (0.833) with the Northern Territory being the only State/Territory where the population could be expected to replace itself from natural increase.

Deaths

The median age at death in South Australia for both males (74.3 years) and females (80.9) was the highest of the States and Territories, and compared with the Australian medians of 73.5 and 80.2 years respectively. The Northern Territory had the lowest median age at death for both males and females (53.9 and 64.0 respectively).

Marriages and divorces

South Australia recorded crude rates of 6.1 marriages and 2.8 divorces per 1,000 estimated resident population. The marriage rate per 1,000 was 0.1 lower than the national figure while the divorce rate was 0.1 higher.

The median age of bridegrooms in South Australia was the same as that for Australia (29.0), while the median age of brides was marginally higher than the national median (26.7 compared with 26.6).

SMALL AREA DEMOGRAPHIC SUMMARY

The Adelaide Statistical Division (ASD) recorded 70.8% of the births registered in South Australia in 1994, and 74.1% of the deaths. The total fertility rate for Adelaide (averaged over three years) was 1.636 and the death rate, standardised for age, was 6.6.

Within the ASD, Elizabeth (2.354) had the highest fertility rate (averaged over three years). It was followed by Munno Para (2.172), Enfield Part B (2.036) and Willunga (1.967).

The Statistical Local Areas (SIAs) within the ASD with the highest standardised death rates were St Peters (9.5 per 1,000 persons), Kensington and Norwood (8.7), Unley (8.4) and Adelaide (8.3).

The Upper South East had the highest total fertility rate (averaged over three years) of all Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs) in South Australia at 2.455. Within that area, the SLA of Tatiara recorded the highest rate at 2.699. The SSD with the lowest rate was Eastern. Adelaide, where 2,281 births resulted in a fertility rate of 1.336.

The areas with the lowest standardised death rates in the ASD were Happy Valley (4.0) and East Torrens (5.1).

SECTION 2: POPULATION

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS


Overview

South Australia's estimated resident population at 31 December 1994 was 1,471,251 persons, comprising 730,341 males and 740,910 females.

Growth in 1994

South Australia experienced a positive, but slowing, population growth in 1994. Natural increase accounted for 7,707 persons and net overseas migration 1,934 persons. However, this was offset by a net interstate migration loss of 4,741 persons.


POPULATION GROWTH RATE, SOUTH AUSTRALIA 1891 TO 1994





Age structure of the South Australian population In 1994 the child-dependency ratio (the number of children aged 0-14 years per 100 population aged 15-64) was 31.0, while the aged dependency ratio (the number of persons aged 65 and over per 100 population aged 15-64 years) was 20.6.



Population projections

The South Australian population is expected to grow to between 1.62 and 1.74 million by the year 2041, entering a period of stable or even declining population towards the middle of the next century. The projections shown in the graph below are based on various assumptions made about future rates of the components of population change - births, deaths and migration. 
SECTION 4: BIRTHS

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Overview

In 1994 there were 19,409 births registered to mothers usually resident in South Australia, a decrease of 669 (3.3%) from the previous year, and 643 (3.2%) fewer than the number of births in 1984. There were 19,134 confinements, and the crude birth rate was 13.2 births per 1,000 resident population, the lowest in Australia.

CRUDE BIRTH RATES 1954 TO 1994




Child bearing patterns

The total fertility rate (expressed as the number of children one woman would expect to bear during her child-bearing lifetime) declined by nearly one-third between 1971 and 1983 to 1.812. However, from 1983, the decline has been much more gradual, falling to 1.738 in 1994.

Net reproduction rate

The female net reproduction rate has been below the replacement level of unity since 1974, and fell slightly from 0.862 in 1993 to 0.833 in 1994.


NET REPRODUCTION RATE



Nuptial births

In 1994, there were 14,261 nuptial live births registered from 14,041 confinements. Of these, 5,925 (42.2%) produced the first child of the marriage and only 897 (6.4%) produced a fourth or subsequent child. These proportions were similar to those in 1993.


NUMBER OF BIRTHS BY NUPTIALITY



Ages of mothers

Over the period 1984 to 1994, age-specific birth rates for mothers aged less than 30 years have declined markedly, while those for mothers aged 30 to 44 years have risen.


AGE-SPECIFIC BIRTH RATES SOUTH AUSTRALIA, 1984 AND 1994



Age at confinement

The overall median age of mother at confinement was 29.2 years in 1994. The median age for nuptial confinements was 30.1 years, while for ex-nuptial confinements it was 25.6. From the graph below, it can be seen that the median age of mothers has increased noticeably over the last 20 years.

Age of father

The median age of father also has risen over this 20 year period, and in 1994 was 32.4 years for nuptial confinements, and 31.7 for all confinements where age of father was known.

Duration of marriage


The trend towards a longer period between marriage and the first confinement has been apparent for almost 30 years. In particular, there has been a decrease in the percentage of nuptial first confinements of women who have been married for less than two years, from 68.4% in 1964 to 37.1% in 1994.

However, the median duration of marriage for nuptial first confinements, which had increased by 0.7 years to 2.6 years between 1973 and 1983, has remained relatively steady since then (2.8 in 1994).

Ex-nuptiality

Since 1960 there has been a marked increase in the proportion of ex-nuptial births. For the previous forty years, the rate had remained relatively steady at about 3 per 100 live births, but in recent years it has increased sharply, with the proportion of ex-nuptial births rising from 14.5% of all live births in 1984 to 26.5% in 1994.

The proportion of ex-nuptial births for which fathers acknowledged paternity increased from 70.3% in 1984 to 84.1% in 1994.

Country of birth of parents

In 34.1% of nuptial confinements in 1994, at least one parent was born overseas. Over one-fifth (22.0%) of mothers and nearly one-quarter (23.4%) of fathers were born overseas. In 1984 the proportion was even higher, with 28.4% of all fathers and 25.0% of all mothers being overseas born.

SECTION 4: DEATHS

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Numbers


There were 11,710 deaths (6,241 males and 5,469 females) of South Australian residents registered in 1994. This was an increase of 182 (1.6%) over the 1993 total and the highest on record.

The sex ratio (ratio of male to female deaths) was 114.1, slightly higher than the Australian ratio of 113.9.

Rates

The crude death rate in 1994 was 8.0 per 1,000 mid-year resident population. This was 0.9 above the Australian rate (7.1), and was the second highest of the States and Territories, being almost twice as high as the rates in the ACT (4.1) and the Northern Territory (4.5). It was the highest South Australian rate since 1989.

CRUDE DEATH RATES, SOUTH AUSTRALIA




The South Australian death rate, after standardisation for age, was similar to the national standardised rate of 6.7 per 1,000 resident population.


Age at death


The median age at death for both males and females has been moving upward over the past 20 years. In 1994 the median ages, 74.3 and 80.9 years respectively, were the highest ever recorded and were well above the medians (68.5 and 76.9) recorded in 1974.

Age-specific death rates for males were higher than female rates for most age groups. This was especially the case in the very young (under 1) and the older age groups (over 70).






Over the past 50 years, age-specific death rates have declined in all age groups. Consequently life expectancy at all ages has risen during this period.

Life expectancy

Based on the mortality conditions prevailing in South Australia in 1994, life expectancy at birth was 75.1 years for males and 81.3 years for females.


EXPECTATION OF LIFE AT SELECTED AGES



Causes of death

In 1994, 3,086 deaths registered in South Australia (26.4% of the total) were attributable to malignant neoplasm (cancer). Other main causes of death were ischaemic heart disease (2,975 deaths, 25.4% of the total); cerebrovascular disease (1,212, 10.4%), and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (571, 4.9%). Overall, diseases of the circulatory system accounted for 5,270 deaths (45.0%), and diseases of the respiratory system for 888 deaths (7.6%). There were 593 deaths attributable to accidents, poisonings and violence, which included 162 deaths from motor vehicle traffic accidents.





Cause specific rates

The standardised death rates per 100,000 persons for the leading causes were close to the Australian rates. For further information about leading causes of death readers should refer to *Causes of Death Australia*, 1994 (3303.0).

Changes in ten years

Between 1984 and 1994, there was a 16.0% increase in the number of deaths. The main movements which have occurred over the decade are described below:

- 57.5% increase in deaths from infectious and parasitic diseases (to 74);
- 18.5% decrease in female deaths from cancer of the stomach (to 44);
- 48.4% increase in male deaths from cancer of the rectum and anus (to 92):
- 60.6% increase in female deaths from cancer of the trachea, bronchus and lung (to 167);
- 66.5% increase in male deaths from cancer of the genito-urinary organs (to 343);
- 118.2% increase in male deaths from diabetes (to 144);
- 3.1% decrease in male deaths from ischaemic heart disease (to 1,618) including 19.0% decrease in deaths caused by myocardial infarction (to 1,046);
- 38.6% decrease in deaths attributable to atherosclerosis (to 86);
- 27.1% increase in female deaths attributable to respiratory diseases (to 352);
- 28.0% decrease caused by motor vehicle traffic accidents (to 162).

Youth deaths

There were 139 deaths of persons aged between 15 and 24 years of whom only 37 were females. Over three-quarters (75.5%) of male youth deaths were attributable to accidents, poisonings and violence, including 36.3% from motor vehicle traffic accidents and 24.5% from suicide.

Deaths of persons aged 25-44

There were 328 male and 159 female deaths of persons aged between 25 and 44 years. Over one-third (34.0%) of the female deaths were attributable to cancer, and more than one-quarter were caused by accidents, poisonings and violence. In contrast, nearly one-half of the male deaths (49.4%) in this age group were attributable to accidents, poisonings and violence, including 19.2% from suicide.

Deaths of persons aged 45-64

There were 1,011 male and 548 female deaths in this age group. Over one-half of the women (52.0%) died from cancer, while the main causes for men were cancer (39.1%) and ischaemic heart disease (25.2%).


Deaths of persons aged 65 years and over

Of the 9,370 deaths in this age group (4,710 males and 4,660 females), more than one-half (50.6%), were accounted for by diseases of the circulatory system, and nearly one-quarter (24.1%) were attributable to cancer. A higher proportion of males (28.0%) than females (20.2%) died from cancer, but a higher proportion of females (53.7%) than males (47.6%) died from diseases of the circulatory system. The proportions of males and females dying from ischaemic heart disease were similar at 28.6% for males and 27.7% for females.

Infant deaths

There were 92 infant deaths, 55 males and 37 females, registered in South Australia in 1994. More than one-half of these (54.3%) occurred in the first week of life. The infant mortality rate of 4.7 deaths per 1,000 births was the lowest ever recorded. The decline in infant mortality rates over the last 30 years is illustrated in the following graph.

Perinatal deaths

In 1994, there were 137 perinatal deaths registered, a fall of 11.0% from the previous year. There were five fewer fetal deaths (91 compared to 96) and 12 fewer neonatal deaths (58 to 46). The perinatal death rate fell from 7.6 to 7.1 (see glossary of terms for definitions).

Fetal deaths

A feature of the 1994 data was that there were more female than male fetal deaths, with a ratio of 86 males for every 100 females. The neonatal sex ratio was 170 male deaths for every 100 female deaths.

Year of occurrence

The preceding commentary relates to deaths data based on year of registration which appear in Tables 4.1 to 4.10. Tables 4.11 to 4.14 in this section show numbers and rates for deaths which occurred in 1994 and earlier years, and had been registered by the end of June 1995. Rates for year of occurrence are similar to those for year of registration data.


SECTION 5: MARRIAGES

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Overview

In 1994 there were 8,909 marriages registered in South Australia, 205 fewer than in 1993.

MARRIAGE RATES, SOUTH AUSTRALIA 1894 - 1994




The crude marriage rate was 6.1 per 1,000 population, the lowest rate since 1931, when it had fallen to a record low of 5.3.

Age at marriage

Age-specific rates for first marriages indicate that there is an increasing proportion of the population who choose not to marry. Of those who do marry there seems to be a tendency to marry later in life. Rates for persons under 30 years of age have declined significantly since 1971, while the rates for older age groups have fallen only slightly.

The median age at marriage has increased steadily for both men and women over the last twenty years. In 1994 the overall median age was 29.0 years for bridegrooms and 26.7 years for brides. For first marriages the median ages were 27.0 and 24.9 years respectively.

MEDIAN AGES AT FIRST MARRIAGE, 1968 - 1994




The proportion of brides and bridegrooms under 25 years of age has decreased markedly over the last ten years. In 1994, 22.6% of bridegrooms and 38.6% of brides were under 25, compared with 39.8% and 57.4% respectively in 1984.

The number of brides aged 30 years and over has grown more than three-fold over the last twenty years. In 1974 this group comprised only 15.6% of all females marrying; however, by 1984 the proportion had risen to 23.0%, and in 1994 it was 33.7%.

Some of this increase can be attributed to the increased number of divorced women remarrying, but females who are marrying for the first time now form a larger proportion of those aged 30 years and over. Since 1974 this proportion has risen from 22.3% to 35.2%.


BRIDES AND BRIDEGROOMS BY AGE GROUP, 1984 AND 1994



Marriage rites

In 1994 marriages performed by civil celebrants accounted for 42.8% of all marriages. More than three-quarters of these civil ceremonies were performed by civil celebrants other than official registrars.

Although the majority of marriages are religious ceremonies, the following graph indicates that the proportion of civil marriage ceremonies has been rising over the last 20 years.




Remarriages

In 1994, 34.9% of marriages involved at least one party who had been married before. Third and subsequent marriages for bridegrooms accounted for 14.8% of remarriages. The corresponding figure for brides was 15.1%.

More than one-third (35.5%) of bridegrooms and 29.4% of brides married less than two years after the termination of their previous marriages.

Children

In 1994, 37.5% of men and 38.7% of women who remarried had dependent children aged under 16 years. Of those with children 49.1% of bridegrooms and 48.5% of brides only had one child.

Country of birth

In 66.7% of marriages, both partners were Australian born. In 9.2% of marriages, both partners were born overseas. Over the last ten years, there has been a growing proportion of marriages where both partners were born in Australia (up from 61.5% in 1984).

A total of 2,013 bridegrooms (22.6%) and 1,781 brides (20.0%) were born overseas. Slightly less than one-half of these (988 bridegrooms and 864 brides) were from the United Kingdom, while other birthplaces of significance were New Zealand (114 bridegrooms and 99 brides); Vietnam (106 and 105); Germany (70 and 74); Italy (76 and 34), and the Philippines (13 and 63).



SECTION 6: DIVORCES

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Overview


Following the introduction of the Family Law Act in 1976 the number of divorces granted in South Australia increased from 1,812 in 1975 to 6,142 in 1976. Since 1977 the number of divorces granted in South Australia has fluctuated between 3,700 and 4,600.



In 1994 there were 4,192 divorces granted in South Australia. This represented a 3.2% increase over 1993. The crude divorce rate was 2.9 per 1,000 population.


Ages of persons being divorced

As can be seen from the following graph, median ages at the time of divorce and at the time of marriage for persons granted divorces have been rising steadily for several years. Of those who divorced in 1994, 50.1% of husbands and 67.9% of wives were under 25 years of age at the time of marriage. This compares with 63.3% and 79.3% respectively in 1984.



The age-specific divorce rates indicate that in 1994 males were most likely to divorce between the ages of 40 and 44, while for females the highest rate occurred in the 30 to 34 age group.


AGE-SPECIFIC DIVORCE RATES



Duration of marriage

Over the last decade there has been an increase in the proportion of divorces from long-term marriages. In 1994, 36.5% of divorces involved marriages of 15 years or more duration, compared with 32.8% in 1984. Divorces where the duration of marriage was less than 5 years fell from 20.2% in 1984 to 17.2% in 1994.


DURATION OF MARRIAGE

Children

The number of divorces involving dependent children in South Australia has declined in recent years, comprising 47.5% of all divorces in 1994. However, the average issue per dissolved marriage has remained at 1.9 children for some time.

Country of birth

Of the divorces granted in South Australia in 1994, 44.1% involved at least one party who was born overseas. Just over one-half (51.0%) of overseas born wives and 47.7% of overseas born husbands were born in the United Kingdom.

SECTION 7: THE ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER POPULATION

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Introduction

This section includes information on births and deaths in the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population usually resident in South Australia. While there is some independent evidence that indicates some degree of misreporting (particularly for deaths) the level of this misreporting is not considered to be significant. Care needs to be taken when interpreting year-to-year movements due to relatively small numbers and varying data quality. No data on the indigenous population are available for marriages and divorces.

The population (Table 7.9) used in the calculation of rates is an experimental estimate, based on projections from the 1991 Census results. Because of the experimental nature of this estimate, rates (especially the more detailed age-specific rates) should be considered only as approximate.

Identification

Indigenous births are recorded when the person registering the birth identifies at least one of the parents as being of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin.

If a deceased person is reported on either the death information form or the cause of death certificate as being of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin, the death is recorded as the death of an indigenous person.

It is possible that some indigenous persons whose usual residence was in South Australia, but whose birth or death was registered in another State, may not have been identified as being of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin.

Births

The number of indigenous births registered to mothers usually resident in South Australia rose 2.3% from 519 in 1993 to 531 in 1994. Since 1990 the number of indigenous births has fallen by 9.7% from 588, while total South Australian births have risen by 2.3% over the same period. Births to indigenous mothers declined 16.9% from 498 in 1990 to 414 in 1994.


Fertility rate

In 1994 the total fertility rate (the number of children one woman would expect to bear during her child-bearing lifetime) for the indigenous population was 2.440 compared with 1.738 for the total South Australian population. Five years ago, the difference was greater, with the total fertility rate for the indigenous population being 3.049, and the rate for the total population 1.750.

Median age of parents

The median age of parents of indigenous infants has risen slightly since 1990. The median age for mothers rose from 23.6 to 24.2 years in 1994, while the median age of fathers (for confinements where paternity was acknowledged) rose from 26.6 to 27.4 years over the same period. The median age of indigenous mothers rose from 23.3 to 23.8 years.

PERCENTAGE OF BIRTHS BY AGE GROUP OF MOTHER SOUTH AUSTRALIA, 1994




Deaths

There were 123 deaths of indigenous persons usually resident in South Australia in 1994. Of these, 69 were male and 54 were female. This represents a sex ratio of 127.8 male deaths for every 100 female deaths.

Median age at death

The median age at death for indigenous males was 51.5 years, while the median age for females was 49.8. These ages are significantly lower than the overall State medians of 74.3 and 80.9 respectively. Because of the difficulty in getting accurate data on age at death, and the small number of observations, these figures fluctuate from year to year. The following chart illustrates these fluctuations.

Infant deaths

There were 4 indigenous infant deaths recorded in 1994, representing an infant mortality rate of 7.5 (deaths per 1,000 live births). This rate is lower than that of previous years, but still compares unfavourably with the overall South Australian rate of 4.7.


Cause of death

The leading causes of death for the indigenous population in 1994 were diseases of the circulatory system, and accidents, poisonings and violence which accounted for 22.0% and 17.9% respectively of all indigenous deaths.

Standardisation

A measure of indigenous mortality can be obtained by the indirect standardisation of death rates, *i.e.* by applying the age-specific cause of death rates for the total State population to the age distribution of the indigenous population, and then calculating the number of indigenous deaths by cause that would be expected if indigenous persons were subject to the same mortality conditions as the total population. These expected numbers may be compared with the actual number of occurrences. The following graph illustrates these observed and expected occurrences for a number of causes.

The 1994 ratio of observed to expected deaths from all causes was similar for both males and females, at 2.8 and 2.9 respectively, and exemplified the much higher age-specific death rates experienced by the indigenous population when compared with the total South Australian population. The ratio for diseases of the circulatory system which accounted for more than 20% of indigenous deaths indicates that indigenous persons were 2.6 times more likely to die from this cause than were the rest of the population. Other ratios of interest were diabetes mellitus where the number of observed deaths was 14.3 times the expected for males and 7.5 times for females, and accidents, poisonings and violence where the respective ratios were 3.3 and 5.8.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains Births, Deaths, Marriages and Divorces data, and also includes some cause of death and population data. For details of other published information relating to demography, readers should refer to the section on Related Publications in these Notes. A Glossary of Terms follows the Explanatory Notes.

POPULATION

- 2 This Section provides estimates of the resident population, and population projections, with information on overseas arrivals and departures and net interstate migration.
- 3 Estimates of the South Australian population are made to varying degrees of detail throughout the year and this publication includes the most up-to-date estimates available for each particular table.
- 4 The figures for natural increase in Tables 1.1 and 2.1 are those used in the preliminary estimation of the population at 31 December 1994 and have been rounded to the nearest thousand.

POPULATION PROJECTIONS

- 5 Population projections are published twice in each intercensal period. The latest projections are based on the results on the 1991 Census of Population and Housing, and relate to the period from 1993 to 2041.
- The population projections are not intended as predictions or forecasts, but as illustrations of that growth and change in the population which would occur if certain specified assumptions about future demographic trends were realised. While the selection of the assumptions is based on analysis of past demographic needs, both in Australia and overseas, and an assessment of their likely future movement, there is no certainty that any of the assumptions will be realised.
- Four alternative projections have been provided in recognition of the uncertainty of future movements in demographic trends, and to give users a range of options. Further details are shown in the publication *Projections* of the Population of Australia, States and Territories, 1993 to 2041 (3222.0).

MIGRATION

- Data on overseas arrivals and departures relate to the number of movements of travellers rather than to the number of travellers. However, the statistics exclude the movements of operational air and ship crews, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not engaged on regular voyages. Estimates of transit sea passengers are no longer available.
- 9 Data on interstate migration have been derived from aggregated statistical information on interstate changes of addresses advised to the Health Insurance Commission in the process of administering Medicare. Further details are available in *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0).

BIRTHS

- 10 Births statistics are presented on the basis of the State or Territory of usual residence of the mother, regardless of where in Australia the birth occurred or was registered.
- 11 Births to mothers usually resident in Australia which took place overseas are excluded. Births to mothers usually resident overseas which occurred in Australia are included in the State or Territory where the birth occurred.

12 Except for Tables 3.7 through to 3.9, the statistics in this section refer to live births registered during the calendar year shown. Tables 3.7 to 3.9 refer to births occurring in the years shown, and the data are drawn from registrations completed up to 30 June 1995. There is usually an interval between the occurrence and registration of a birth, and, as a result of delay in registration, some births occurring in one year are not registered until the following year, or even later. However, more than 99% of births are registered by 30 June of the following year.

DEATHS

- 13 In this publication death statistics are presented on the basis of the State or Territory of usual residence of the deceased, regardless of where in Australia the death occurred and was registered.
- 14 Except for Tables 4.11 to 4.14 inclusive, the death statistics in this section refer to deaths registered during the year shown. Tables 4.11 to 4.14 refer to deaths occurring in the years shown, with data drawn from registrations up to 30 June 1995. There is usually an interval between the occurrence and registration of a death, but most deaths are registered within 6 months of occurrence.
- 15 The birth statistics used to calculate the fetal and neonatal death rates in Tables 4.9 and 7.5 have been adjusted (in accordance with the WHO definition of perinatal death) to exclude cases where the birthweight was known to be less than 500 grams.
- 16 The statistics in this section refer to marriages registered by the South Australian Registrar during the years shown. There is usually an interval of at least some days between the celebration and the registration of a marriage. As a result of the delay in registration, some marriages celebrated in one year are not registered until the following year.
- 17 Under the Australian Marriage Act 1961, marriages may be celebrated by a minister of religion registered as an authorised celebrant; by a district registrar, or by other persons authorised by the Attorney-General. Notice of the intended marriage must be given to the celebrant at least one calendar month, but within 6 calendar months, before the marriage.
- 18 From 20 June 1973, the minimum age at which a person may marry without parental consent was reduced from 21 to 18 years. Further amendment to the Marriage Act in 1991 designated the minimum age at which persons are legally free to marry to be 18 years. Persons between the ages of 16 and 18 years may marry with a parent's or guardian's consent and an order from a judge or magistrate. Any two persons under the age of 18 years may not marry each other.
- 19 The State of registration in Tables 6.1 to 6.6 is based on the location of the Family Court where the divorce was granted and registered. The number of divorces shown for South Australia is dependent on the number of cases heard by the Family Court in South Australia. The State of usual residence in Tables 1.1 and 6.7 is the State or Territory of usual residence at time of separation.
- 20 Under the Family Law Act 1975, the only ground on which a divorce may be granted is that of irretrievable breakdown of the marriage. This ground is established by the husband and wife having lived apart for 12 months or more, with no reasonable likelihood of reconciliation. Application for nullity of marriage under Family Law legislation must be on the ground that there was a failure to meet a legal requirement, such as that neither party be already lawfully married to another person.

MARRIAGES

DIVORCES

- Successful applicants for a divorce are initially granted a decree nisi. This becomes absolute after one month, unless it is rescinded or appealed against, or the Court is not satisfied that proper arrangements have been made for the welfare of any children involved.
- The statistics shown in this publication are compiled by the Australian Bureau of Statistics from Statistical Reports completed by the Family Court in respect of each application which resulted in the granting of a decree absolute. These reports are forwarded to the ABS on finalisation of proceedings.
- In the interpretation of data, it is important to bear in mind that the availability of judges and complexity of the cases brought before them can affect the number of decrees granted or made absolute in any one year. A rise in numbers may reflect only the clearing of a backlog of cases from an earlier period.

THE ABORIGINAL AND TORRES IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Tables in this section refer to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait STRAIT ISLANDER POPULATION Islander population usually resident in South Australia.

GEOGRAPHIC BOUNDARIES

- The geographic boundaries for statistical local areas (SLAs) are 25 defined in the Australian Standard Geographical Classification, Edition 5 (1216.0). In South Australia they equate directly with local government areas, except for Enfield, which is split into two statistical local areas.
- The boundaries of statistical local areas used in determining the population are those in existence at 30 June 1994. The boundaries used for Births and Deaths statistics are the SIA boundaries at 1 July 1994.
- The country of birth tables use the Australian Standard Classification of Countries for Social Statistics (ASCCSS) which was developed for Australian users. In this classification, neighbouring countries are grouped into progressively broader geographic areas on the basis of social, cultural, political and economic similarities. The base units of ASCCSS are broadly compatible with those of the United Nations birthplace classification. ASCCSS has been applied to Demographic statistics since January 1990.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Age-specific birth rate

The number of live births registered during the calendar year, according to age of mother, per 1,000 of the estimated mid-year female resident population. For the purpose of calculating these rates, births to mothers under 15 are included in the 15–19 year age group, and births to mothers aged 50 and over are included in the 45–49 year age group. Pro rata adjustment is made in respect of births for which age of mother is not given.

Age-specific death rate

The number of deaths at a specified age per 1,000 of the estimated mid-year resident population of that age. The *infant mortality rate* is used for the age-specific rate for children under 1 year of age. Pro rata adjustment is made in respect of deaths for which age of the deceased is not given.

Age-specific divorce rate

The number of divorced parties by age multiplied by 1,000, and divided by the estimated mid-year population in specific age groups. Males under 18 and females under 16 are excluded from the population.

Two different populations are used in the calculation of age-specific divorce rates.

- Per 1,000 population at 30 June. This relates the number of divorces, by age at decree made absolute, to the estimated mid-year resident population in specific age groups. Males under 18 and females under 16 are excluded from the population.
- Per 1,000 married population at 30 June. This relates the number of divorces, by age at decree made absolute, to the married population in specific age groups. Those classified as permanently separated are included in the married population. Males and females under 15 are excluded from the population. These rates for South Australia are calculated on the population census count, as the estimated resident population by marital status by age and sex is calculated only for Australia.

Pro rata adjustment is made in respect of divorces for which the ages of the divorcing parties are not given.

Age-specific marriage rate

Two different populations are used in the calculation of age-specific marriage rates.

- Per 1,000 population at 30 June. This relates the number of marriages, by age at marriage, to the estimated mid-year resident population in specific age groups. Males and females under 15 are excluded from the population.
- Per 1,000 not currently married population at 30 June. This relates the number of marriages, by age at marriage, to the not currently married population in specific age groups. Males and females under 15 are excluded from the population. These rates for South Australia are calculated on the population census count, as the estimated resident population by marital status by age and sex is calculated only for Australia.

Birth

The term *birth* relates to a live birth, i.e., the delivery, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, of a child who, after being born, breathes or shows any other evidence of life such as a heartbeat. A multiple birth is a confinement which results in two or more births, at least one of which is liveborn.

Children

In divorce data, the term *children* refers to unmarried children of the marriage who were aged under 18 years at the time of application for divorce. Under the *Family Law Act 1975*, these may include (in certain cases) adopted and ex-nuptial children and children from a former marriage. Children who are married or aged 18 years or more are not subject to custody and guardianship orders and are excluded.

In marriages data, the term *children* refers to persons under 16 years of age born from previous marriages. The term *children* should not be confused with the term *previous issue* used in births data (see below).

Confinement

A pregnancy which results in at least one live birth.

Crude birth rate

The number of live births registered during the calendar year per 1,000 of the estimated mid-year resident population. For years before 1994, the *crude birth rate* is based on the mean estimated resident population for the calendar year.

Crude death rate

The number of deaths registered during the calendar year per 1,000 of the estimated mid-year resident population. For years before 1994, the *crude death rate* is based on the mean estimated resident population for the calendar year.

Crude divorce rate

The number of decrees absolute granted per 1,000 of the estimated mid-year resident population. For years before 1994, the *crude divorce rate* is based on the mean estimated resident population for the calendar year. (In the interpretation of this rate, it must be kept in mind that a large and varying proportion of the population used in the denominator is unmarried or below the minimum age of marriage.)

Crude marriage rate

The number of marriages registered per 1,000 estimated mid-year resident population. For years before 1994, the *crude marriage rate* is based on the mean estimated resident population for the calendar year.

Date of final separation

The date, given on the application for divorce, from which the period of living apart is calculated for the purpose of establishing the grounds for divorce. In determining the date of final separation, a single period of resumed cohabitation of less than 3 months may be ignored, provided the periods of living apart before and after resumed cohabitation amount to a total of 12 months or more.

Divorce

Decree absolute of dissolution of marriage.

Duration of marriage

The interval measured in completed years between the date of marriage and the date the marriage ended.

Estimated resident population (ERP)

The official ABS estimate of the Australian population. The ERP is based on results of the latest population census, and updated for subsequent births, deaths and migration.

Rates shown in this publication for the years since 1974 are calculated using estimates of resident population. A description of the conceptual basis of the estimated resident population is contained in *Population Estimates: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (3228.0) published 23 June 1995. Revised population estimates are shown in the quarterly publication, *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0).

Female gross reproduction rate The sum of the female age-specific fertility rates (i.e., the number of female live births according to age of mother per 1,000 females of that age) multiplied by 5 and divided by 1,000. It represents the average number of daughters each woman could expect to bear if she were subject to the fertility rates prevailing in that year throughout her child -bearing lifetime.

Female net reproduction rate

This rate makes allowance for women who do not survive until the end of the reproductive period. The rate is obtained by multiplying the female age-specific birth rates by the proportion of survivors at corresponding ages in a life table, adding the products, and dividing by 1,000. The female net reproduction rate represents the average number of daughters born to a group of women who are subjected to the fertility rates of that year and to the mortality rates of the life table.

Fetal death

This term relates to the delivery of an infant, weighing at least 500 grams at delivery (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least 22 weeks gestation) who did not, at any time after delivery, breathe or show any other evidence of life such as heartbeat.

Fetal death rate

The number of fetal deaths per 1,000 live births of babies who weighed at least 500 grams at birth (or, when birthweight was unavailable, were of at least 22 weeks gestation) plus fetal deaths.

First marriage rate

The number of males and females of a certain age, marrying for the first time per 1,000 population of never married males and females of the same age. These rates for South Australia are calculated on the population census count, as the estimated resident population by marital status by age and sex is calculated only for Australia.

Indigenous persons

Persons who identify as being of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin. Indigenous births are those where at least one parent was identified as being of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin.

Infant death

The death of a liveborn child less than one year old.

Infant mortality rate

The number of deaths of children under 1 year of age per 1,000 live births.

Life expectancy

The average number of additional years a person of a given age and sex might expect to live if the age-specific death rates of the given period were to continue throughout his or her lifetime.

Live birth

The delivery of a child, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, who, after being born, breathes or shows any other evidence of life, such as heartbeat.

Marital status

Two separated concepts are measured by the ABS. These are registered marital status and social marital status. They are different personal characteristics and are independent variables with separate classifications. *Marital status* used in this publication refers to formally registered marriages for which the partners hold a marriage certificate.

The category of *never married* refers to those persons who have never been in a registered marriage.

Median value

The median value (age, duration or interval) is that value which divides the relevant population into two equal parts, half falling below this value, and half exceeding it. Where the value for a particular record has not been stated, that record is excluded from the calculation.

Multiple birth

A confinement which results in two or more issue, at least one of which is liveborn.

Natural increase

The excess of births over deaths registered in the recording year.

Neonatal deaths

Deaths of babies who weighed at least 500 grams at birth (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least 22 weeks gestation) and who died within 28 days of birth.

Neonatal death rate

The number of neonatal deaths per 1,000 live births of babies who weighed at least 500 grams at birth, (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least 22 weeks gestation).

Net estimated interstate

migration

The balance of movements to and from a State of persons travelling within Australia. The data are derived from unidentified information on interstate changes of address advised to the Health Insurance Commission.

Nuptial first confinement

The first confinement of the current marriage but not necessarily the mother's first ever confinement resulting in a live birth.

Nuptiality

Confinements and births are identified as being nuptial where the father registered was married to the mother at the time of the birth or where the husband died during the pregnancy. Other confinements, and the children resulting from them, are classified as ex-nuptial whether or not the parents were living together at the time of the birth, and whether or not the child is subsequently legitimised or adopted.

Paternity-acknowledged births

Ex-nuptial births where paternity was acknowledged by the father.

Permanent movement

Arrivals of settlers, and permanent departures of Australian residents, (i.e., those who, on departure, state that they do not intend to return to Australia).

Previous issue

Previous liveborn issue of a mother to the current marriage only, excluding foster, step or adopted children.

Rate of population growth

Expresses population change over a period as a proportion (%) of the population at the beginning of that period. In this bulletin population growth rate is measured over the twelve months to 31 December of the recording year.

Remarriage rate

The number of remarrying males and females, of a certain age, per 1,000 (mid-year) population of widowed or divorced males and females of the same age. These rates for South Australia are calculated on the population census count, as the estimated resident population by marital status by age and sex is calculated only for Australia.

Sex ratio

The number of males per 100 females.

Standardised death rate

The state of the s

Two different methods are used in the calculation of standardised death rates.

- Direct method expressed per 1,000 persons in general deaths statistics, and per 100,000 persons in causes of death. It is the overall death rate that would have prevailed in a standard population if it had experienced at each age the death rates of the population being studied. The standard population used in these calculations is all persons in the 1991 Australian population. The direct method is used for State/Territory and Australia rates.
- Indirect method expressed per 1,000 persons in general deaths statistics, and per 100,000 persons in causes of death. It is calculated by initially applying a standard set of age-specific rates (those for persons in the 1991 Australian population) to the population under study, and comparing the actual number of deaths with the number expected, assuming that these standard death rates applied. The standardised death rate for the population under study is then calculated by multiplying the crude death rate of the standard population by the ratio of actual deaths to expected deaths. The indirect method is used in the calculation of standardised death rates for data at statistical local area level.

State/Territory of registration

The State/Territory in which an event (birth, death or marriage) was registered, or the State/Territory in which the divorce was granted.

State/Territory of usual residence

The State/Territory of usual residence of the population (in the estimation of the resident population), the mother (in the births collection), the deceased (in the deaths collection), or the parties at separation (in the divorces collection).

Usual residence data are not available for the marriage collection.

Total fertility rate

The sum of the age-specific birth rates multiplied by five and divided by 1,000. It represents the number of children one woman would expect to bear if the age-specific rates of the year shown continued during her child-bearing lifetime.


