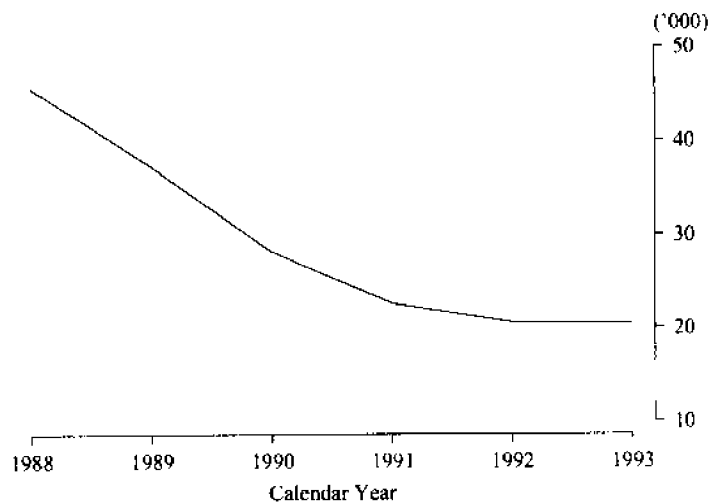

SECTION 2: POPULATION

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Population growth

The estimated resident population of Western Australia at 30 June 1993 was 1,677,616 persons, an increase of 20,535 persons (1.2 per cent) from the 30 June 1992 total of 1,657,081 persons.

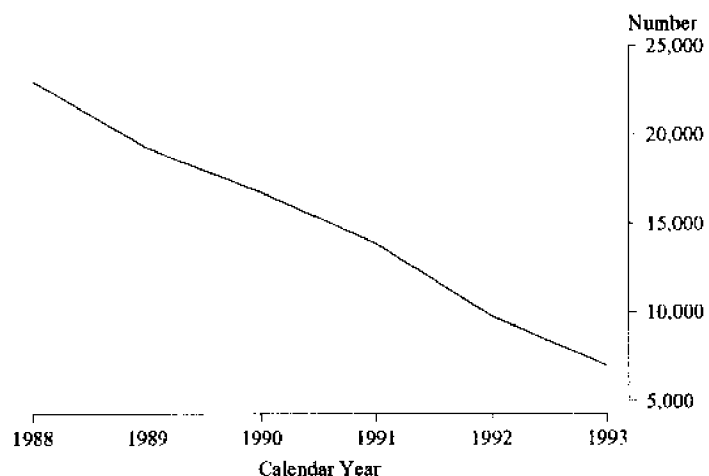
The estimated resident population of Western Australia at 30 December 1993 was 1,687,300 persons, comprising 847,600 males (50.2 per cent) and 839,600 females (49.8 per cent). On a calendar year basis Western Australia's population increased by 20,500 in 1993. This was mainly due to a natural increase of 14,800 excess births over deaths and a gain of 5,400 persons from net overseas migration.

Western Australia's growth rate of 1.2 per cent was well below the 3 per cent growth of 1988 and has been falling in each year since that time. Western Australia's rate of population growth was third overall of all the states and territories following Queensland (2.7 per cent) and the Australian Capital Territory (1.5 per cent).

Permanent settler arrivals

There were 7,030 permanent settler arrivals in Western Australia during 1993, a fall of 2,790 (28 per cent) from the 9,820 recorded in 1992. Since 1988, when settler arrivals were 23,050, numbers have been falling steadily. For the first time, arrivals of Australian residents (8,750) returning after long term absences (12 months or more) outnumbered arrivals of permanent settlers. Unpublished data shows of those settler arrivals with occupations (3,090) the largest group were professionals (840) made up predominantly of business professionals (200), teachers (180) and building professionals (160).

Long term movement

Long term arrivals during 1993 fell 940 to 22,550, a fall of 4 per cent. Total permanent and long term departures during the same period also fell, by 800 (5 per cent) to 14,280.

SECTION 3: BIRTHS AND CONFINEMENTS

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Number of births	In 1993 there were 25,081 births recorded to mothers usually resident in Western Australia, an increase of just 8 births on 1992. There has been little change in the number of births in Western Australia in recent years with numbers ranging from a low of 25,051 in 1989 to 25,417 in 1991.
Crude birth rate	In 1993 the crude birth rate was 15.0 births per 1,000 of the mean estimated resident population. This figure continues a gradual decrease in the crude birth rate from 16.4 in 1988.
Childbirth postponed	Age specific birth rates continue to show increasing numbers of women postponing childbirth or not having children. Rates fell for the 15-19, 20-24 and 25-29 year old age groups and rose for both the 30-34 and 35-39 year old age groups.
Median age of mother	The median age of mother for all 1993 confinements was 28.7 years, an increase of 0.2 years over 1992 and an increase of 0.9 years over 1988. The median age for nuptial first confinements was 28.3 years while for ex-nuptial first confinements it was 24.3 years. The median age of father for nuptial confinements was 32.0 years, up 0.3 years on 1992 and up 1.0 year on 1988.
Ex-nuptial births	Ex-nuptial births continued to increase and in 1993 there were 6,991 such births representing 27.9 per cent of all live births. This is a continuation of the trend of falling nuptial births and rising ex-nuptial births while the total number of births remains relatively static. For mothers under 20 years of age 91.1 per cent of confinements were ex-nuptial.
Home births	Of the 25,081 births to Western Australian mothers in 1993 24,747 (98.7 per cent) occurred in a hospital and 128 (0.5 per cent) occurred at home. The remaining 150 births occurred at another private residence, en route to hospital, outside any private residence, in an interstate hospital or where the address was unknown.

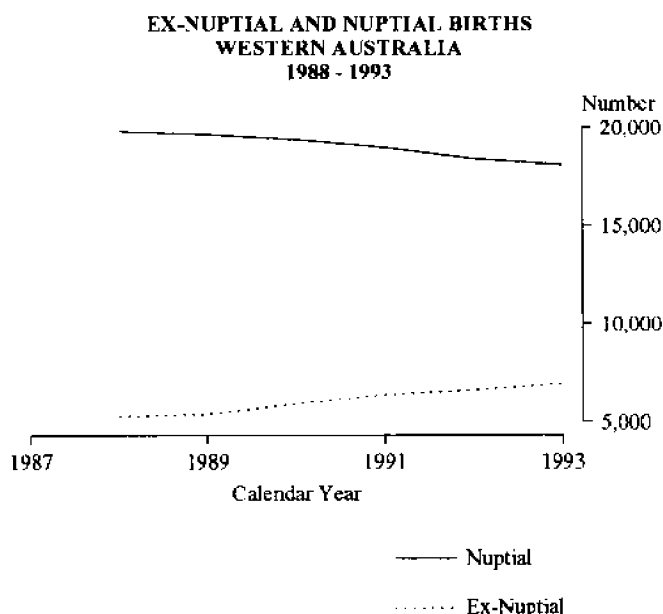

SECTION 4: DEATHS

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

General

In 1993 there were 10,316 deaths where the State of usual residence was Western Australia, an increase of 4.2 per cent on 1992. The standardised death rate in 1993 of 6.6 deaths per 100,000 of population was the highest since 1989 when it was also 6.6 and was up from a rate of 6.1 in 1992. The standardised death rate for Australia was also 6.6.

Age at death

Median age at death continued to increase for both males and females. For males it increased from 72.5 years in 1992 to 72.6 years in 1993 and for females it increased from 79.0 years to 79.8 years.

There were more male than female deaths in the age groups 0 to 4 through to 75 to 79, with the exception of the 5 to 9 age group. Some 62.7 per cent of all deaths of persons under the age of 80 were of males and for persons aged 10 to 29 males accounted for 77.8 per cent of deaths. In the age groups 80 to 84 and older there were more female than male deaths.

Expectation of life

From 1981 to 1991 expectation of life of males increased from 72.07 years to 75.07 years, and for females it increased from 79.26 to 80.98. In 1993 in Western Australia expectation of life for males was 75.05 years and for females it was 81.15 years compared with Australian figures of 74.99 years for males and 80.86 years for females.

Infant deaths

In 1993 there were 147 infant deaths, 93 of which were of male infants and 54 were of female infants. Age at death of 34.0 per cent of infants was under 1 day, a further 21.1 per cent were 1 day old but less than 4 weeks old and 44.9 per cent were between four weeks old and under 12 months. The infant mortality rate was 5.9 deaths per 1,000 live births, with the rate for males being 7.2 and the rate for females being 4.4.

Cause of death

The two major causes of death in Western Australia in 1993 were malignant neoplasms (cancer) (2,803 deaths) which accounted for 27.2 per cent of deaths and ischaemic heart disease (2,494 deaths) which accounted for 24.2 per cent of deaths. A further 9.4 per cent of deaths were due to cerebrovascular disease (973 deaths) and 7.8 per cent were due to diseases of the respiratory system (801 deaths). Accidents, poisonings and violence were the cause of 722 deaths or 7.0 per cent.

MAJOR CAUSES OF DEATH BY SEX, WESTERN AUSTRALIA 1993

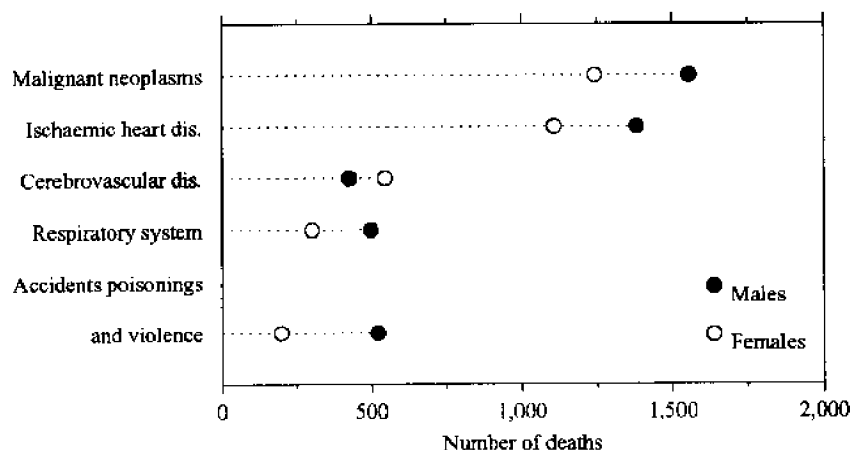

SECTION 5: MARRIAGES

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Number of marriages	In 1993 there were 10,382 marriages of Western Australian residents, an increase of 264 marriages (2.6 per cent) from 1992. Of all the marriages registered 6,677 (64.3 per cent) couples were married for the first time, 2,023 (19.5 per cent) marriages occurred in which one party had been married before and 1,682 (16.2 per cent) marriages were registered in which both parties had previously been married.
Marrying later in Life	The trend of both sexes marrying later continued in 1993 with the median age of bridegrooms at 29.3 years and brides 26.5 years. This compares to 28.2 years and 25.6 years respectively in 1988. For people marrying for the first time the median age of bridegrooms was 27.1 years and for brides 24.8 years.
Crude marriage rate	The crude marriage rate rose slightly in 1993 to 6.2 per 1,000 of the mean estimated resident population from 6.1 per cent in 1992.
Marital status	Of the 10,382 marriages performed in 1993 in Western Australia 6,677 or 64.3 per cent were between previously unmarried persons while 1,351 or 13.0 percent of marriages involved partners who were both previously divorced.
Marriage rites	During 1993 in Western Australia 4,959 or 47.8 per cent of all marriages were performed by ministers of religion and 5,423 or 52.2 per cent were performed by civil celebrants. This ratio between the two types of marriage has remained relatively steady for the past six years.
Registry offices	The table below provides the location of the Registry Office where marriages were registered in 1993. It does not necessarily mean that a marriage was conducted in that precise location, so care should be exercised when examining the distribution of marriage ceremonies throughout Western Australia.

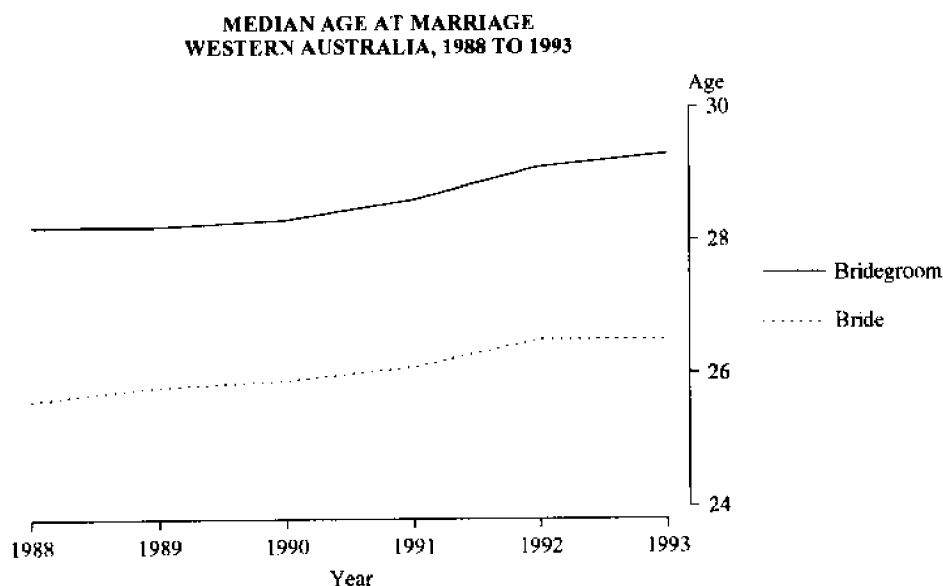

SECTION 6: DIVORCES

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Divorces granted	There were 4,654 divorces granted in Western Australia in 1993 an increase of 2.5 per cent compared with 1992. For the same period the crude divorce rate increased from 2.7 to 2.8 divorces per 1,000 of population. In 27 per cent of divorces the husband was the applicant, in 40 per cent the wife was the applicant and in 33 per cent of divorces there were joint applications.
Age specific divorce rate	<p>For husbands the highest divorce rate of 13.1 divorces per 1,000 of population was in the age group 35 to 39 and the lowest rate of 0.6 per 1,000 of population was in the 24 and under age group. For wives the highest rate of 14.4 was in the 30 to 34 age group and the lowest rate of 1.7 was in the 55 and over age group.</p> <p>For persons under the age of 40, the rate of divorce per 1,000 of population was higher for wives and for persons aged 40 or over the rate was higher for husbands.</p> <p>The age group where the rates differed most was the 25 to 29 age group where husbands had a rate of 7.5 and wives had a rate of 11.6 divorces per 1,000 of population.</p>
Median age	The median age at decree made absolute is younger for wives than for husbands and continues to increase marginally for both husbands and wives. In 1988 the median age for husbands was 38.1 and it has increased each year since to be 40.0 in 1993. Similarly for wives the median age has increased from 35.1 in 1988 to 36.9 in 1993.
Children	In 1993 compared with 1992 there were 83 fewer divorces involving children, a drop of 3 per cent. Between 1988 and 1993 the proportion of divorces involving children has declined from 59 per cent to 53 per cent.
Occupation at separation	<p>Unpublished data is available on occupation at time of separation for both wives and husbands. Larger occupation groups can generally be expected to record a larger number of divorces. For husbands the most common occupation reported was unemployed, with 380 or 8 per cent of separated husbands included in that category in 1993. For wives the most often reported occupation (1,759 or 38 per cent) was that of home duties.</p> <p>The number of divorces for other occupations for husbands were road and rail drivers 246, building tradesmen 216, labourers 183, administrators 171 and sales managers 171. For wives the most often reported occupations were clerks 372, unemployed 178, school teachers 146, nurses 133 and sales assistants 133.</p>
Joint address at separation	<p>Unpublished data based on postcode shows that at the time of separation the joint address of 93 per cent of applicants was in Western Australia with a further 5 per cent interstate and 2 per cent overseas.</p> <p>A breakdown of postcode data for Western Australia shows that postcode 6062 (Dianella, Embleton, Malaga, Morley and Noranda) had 139 divorces, 6163 (Bibra Lake, Coolbellup, Hamilton Hill, Hilton, Kardinya, North Lake, O'Connor, Samson and Spearwood) had 131 divorces, 6025 (Beldon, Craigie, Hillarys, Kallaroo, Mullaloo and Padbury) had 124 divorces, and 6155 (Canning Vale and Willetton) had 119 divorces. Care should be taken when using postcode data as populations for postcode areas will vary in their number of people and in the composition of their population. SECTION 7: TOURISM, OVERSEAS ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Short term visitor arrivals In 1993 there were 263,620 short term visitor arrivals to Western Australia, of whom 262,120 or 99 per cent arrived by air. This is the largest number of short term arrivals to visit Western Australia and is up 24 per cent on 1992 and 217 per cent on 1984.

The 5 major source countries, which accounted for 65 per cent of overseas visitor arrivals by air, were the United Kingdom and Ireland (21 per cent), Singapore (17 per cent), Japan (10 per cent), Malaysia (9 per cent) and New Zealand (8 per cent).

Short term resident departures The number of Western Australians departing on short term overseas journeys decreased slightly from 268,170 in 1992 to 267,130 in 1993. The most popular destination was Indonesia, chosen by 24 per cent of departing residents, followed by the United Kingdom and Ireland (13 per cent), Singapore (10 per cent), Malaysia (9 per cent) and New Zealand (8 per cent).

Purpose of journey The majority of short term overseas visitors to Western Australia by air (59 per cent) gave their reason for journey as holiday and a further 25 per cent came to visit relatives. The leading source countries for visitors on holiday were Singapore 22 per cent, Japan 15 per cent and the United Kingdom and Ireland 14 per cent of holiday visitors. For short term arrivals visiting relatives the leading source countries were the United Kingdom and Ireland with 43 per cent, New Zealand 16 per cent and Singapore 7 per cent.

The majority of short term departures of Western Australian residents by air (56 per cent) gave their reason for journey as holiday, and a further 21 per cent left to visit relatives. The leading destinations for Western Australian residents on holiday were Indonesia 36 per cent, Singapore 10 per cent and the United Kingdom and Ireland 10 per cent. For short term departures to visit relatives the leading destinations were the United Kingdom and Ireland with 29 per cent, New Zealand 18 per cent and Malaysia 7 per cent.

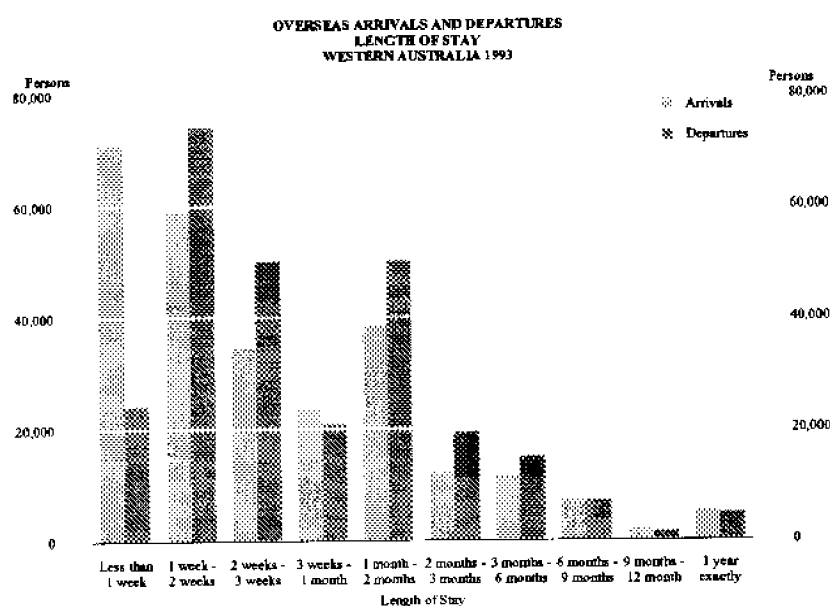

OVERSEAS ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES SHORT TERM MOVEMENT

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Short term visitor arrivals

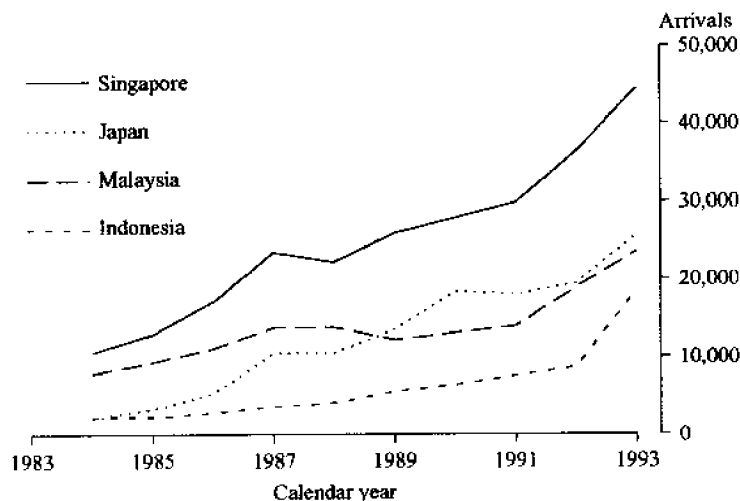
Between 1984 and 1993 the source countries to show the largest increases in visitor arrivals by air in percentage terms were Thailand up 2,110 per cent to 8,840 visitor arrivals, Taiwan up 2,080 per cent to 2,180, Japan up 1,120 per cent to 25,620 and Indonesia up 705 per cent to 18,520. For the same period the number of visitor arrivals from India decreased 36 per cent to 900 visitors.

Between 1992 and 1993 the source countries to show the largest percentage increases in visitor arrivals by air were Indonesia (113 per cent), South Africa (95 per cent) and Taiwan (74 per cent). The countries to show largest increases in numbers were Indonesia up 9,810, Singapore up 8,250 and Japan up 6,150 visitor arrivals.

Short term resident departures

Between 1992 and 1993 resident departures to Indonesia increased by 6,850 or 12 per cent; departures to Thailand were up 2,970 or 27 per cent; departures to South Africa were up 1,380 or 121 per cent and departures to India were up 1,000 or 59 per cent. Countries to record significant decreases as destinations for Western Australian residents were Singapore down 5,050 or 16 per cent, Hong Kong down 3,580 or 24 per cent, the United Kingdom and Ireland down 2,820 or 7 per cent and the United States of America down 1,800 or 10 per cent.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication brings together a number of closely related series of statistics on demography, births, deaths, marriages and divorces.

2. A Glossary of Terms follows the Explanatory Notes and more detailed definitions are to be found in specialised publications.

Demographic Summary and Population

3. This Section provides estimates of the resident population with information on overseas arrivals and departures and net interstate migration. Numbers of births and deaths counted in statistical local areas in Western Australia as at 31 December 1993 are shown in Table 1.2.

4. Estimates of the Western Australian population are made to varying degrees of detail throughout the year, and this publication has used the most up to date estimates available for each particular table.

5. The figures for natural increase in Tables 1.1 and 2.1 are those used in the preliminary estimate of the population as at 31 December 1993.

6. Population projections are based on estimates of the levels of births, deaths, overseas and interstate migration for the projected period. Each series assumes a standard level of mortality but different levels of fertility and migration. For series A to D these are as follows:

Series A - Fertility (medium) Overseas migration (low)
Interstate migration (high)

Series B - Fertility (medium) Overseas migration (low)
Interstate migration (low)

Series C - Fertility (high) Overseas migration (low)
Interstate migration (high)

Series D - Fertility (medium) Overseas migration (high)
Interstate migration (high)

Further detail is available in *Projections of the Populations of Australia, States and Territories* (3222.0).

Overseas Arrivals and Departures

7. Data on overseas arrivals and departures relate to the number of movements of travellers rather than to the number of travellers. The statistics exclude the movements of operational air crew and ship's crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not engaged on regular voyages. Estimates of transit sea passengers are no longer available.

8. Details of long term and permanent arrivals and departures are shown in 'Section 2: Population'. Details of short term overseas arrivals and departures are shown in 'Section 7: Tourism, Overseas Arrivals and Departures'.

Interstate Migration

9. Estimates of interstate migration have been derived from aggregated statistical information on interstate changes of address advised to the Health Insurance Commission in the process of administering Medicare. The ABS adjusts the Health Insurance Commission data to make allowance for persons who do

not inform the Commission of their change of address. Further details are shown in the Explanatory Notes to *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0).

Births

10. Birth statistics are presented on the basis of the State or Territory of usual residence of the mother, regardless of where in Australia the birth occurred or was registered.

11. Births to mothers usually resident in Australia which took place overseas are excluded. Births to mothers usually resident overseas which occurred in Australia are included in the State or Territory where the birth occurred.

12. Except for Tables 3.7 to 3.10, the statistics in this publication refer to births registered during the calendar year shown. Tables 3.7 to 3.10 refer to births which occurred in the years shown, the data being drawn from registrations up to 30 June. There is usually an interval between the occurrence and registration of a birth, and some births occurring in one year are not registered until the following year, or even later. However most births are registered shortly after they occur and more than 99 per cent of births occurring in one year are registered by 30 June of the following year.

13. Data on stillbirths (fetal deaths) are available in *Deaths, Western Australia, 1993* (3312.5).

14. The live birth statistics used to calculate the fetal and neonatal death rates have been adjusted (in accordance with the World Health Organisation definition of perinatal death) to exclude cases where the birth weight was known to be less than 500 grams. However, infant death rates are calculated using all live births registered because figures are not available for infants who weigh less than 500 grams at birth, and who live for 28 days, but die before they are one year old.

Deaths

15. In this publication death statistics are presented on the basis of the State or Territory of usual residence of the deceased, regardless of where in Australia the death occurred and was registered.

16. Except for Tables 4.8 and 4.9, the death statistics in this publication refer to deaths registered during the year shown. Tables 4.8 and 4.9 refer to deaths occurring in the years shown, with data drawn from registrations up to 30 June 1993. There is usually an interval between the occurrence and registration of a death and some deaths occurring in one year are not registered until the following year or even later. However, most deaths are registered shortly after they occur and more than 99 per cent of deaths occurring in one year are registered by 30 June of the following year.

17. The deaths and perinatal deaths collections are published in more detail in *Deaths, Western Australia, 1993* (3312.5).

Marriages

18. The statistics in this publication refer to marriages registered by the Western Australian Registrar-General during the years shown. There is usually an interval of at least some days between the celebration and the registration of a marriage. As a result of the delay in registration, some marriages celebrated in one year are not registered until the following year. Under the *Australian Marriage Act 1961*, marriages may be

celebrated by a minister of religion registered as an authorised celebrant, by a district registrar or by other persons authorised by the Attorney General. Notice of the intended marriage must be given to the celebrant at least one calendar month, and within six calendar months, before the marriage. A celebrant must transmit an official certificate of the marriage for registration to a District Registrar in the State in which the marriage took place.

19. From 20 June 1973, the minimum age at which a person may marry without the written consent of each person whose consent is required under the Act has been 18 years. A male aged between 16 and 18 years may marry with such consent, combined with a judicial order, but the marriage of a female within the same age range requires the consent of her parents or guardians only. A judge or magistrate may, in exceptional circumstances make an order authorising a male who has attained 16 years of age, or a female who has attained 14 years, to marry a person of marriageable age.

20. Figures for years from 1966 include registered marriages identified as those of full-blood Aboriginals. Tribal marriages are excluded from the statistics.

Divorces

21. Under the *Family Law Act 1975*, the only ground on which a divorce may be granted is that of irretrievable breakdown of the marriage. This ground is established by the husband and wife having lived apart for 12 months or more, with there being no reasonable likelihood of reconciliation. Application for nullity of marriage under Family Law legislation must be on the ground that there was a failure to meet a legal requirement, such as that neither party be already lawfully married to another person. There is no provision for judicial separation under Family Law legislation.

22. Successful applicants for a divorce are initially granted a *decree nisi*. This becomes absolute after one month, unless it is rescinded or appealed against, or the Court is not satisfied that proper arrangements have been made for the welfare of any children involved.

23. The statistics in this publication are compiled by the ABS from statistical reports completed by the Family Court in respect of each application which resulted in the granting of a *decree absolute*. These reports are forwarded to the ABS on finalisation of proceedings.

24. In the interpretation of data, it is important to bear in mind that the availability of judges and complexity of cases brought before them can affect the number of decrees granted or made absolute in any one year. A rise in numbers may reflect only the clearing of a backlog of cases from an earlier period.

25. The number of divorces shown for Western Australia is dependent on the number of cases heard by the Family Court in Western Australia. As there is no residential requirement under Family Law, applicants may be resident anywhere in Australia. Caution should therefore be exercised in interpreting the rates shown in this bulletin.

26. Details of divorces granted in 1993 are for the first time presented on both a State or Territory of usual residence at separation basis and a State or Territory of registration basis. For divorces based on usual residence

the postcode of the joint address of the separating couple is used.

Geographic Boundaries

27. The geographic boundaries for local government area data are defined in the *Australian Geographical Classification, Edition 8 (1216.0)*. The cities of Perth, Fremantle and Stirling are further comprised of a number of Statistical Local Areas (SLAs).

28. The boundaries of SLAs used in determining the population are those in existence at 30 June 1991. The boundaries used for births and deaths statistics are the SLA boundaries at January 1991.

29. The country of birth tables use the *Australian Standard Classification of Countries for Social Statistics (1269.0)* (ASCCSS) which was developed for Australian users. In this classification, neighbouring countries are grouped into progressively broader geographic areas on the basis of social, cultural, political and economic similarities. The base units of ASCSS are broadly compatible with those of the United Nations birthplace classification. ASCSS has been applied to demographic statistics since January 1990.

30. Occupation data is based on the *Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (1222.0 and 1223.0)*.

Related Publications

31. The format of this publication of demographic statistics is repeated, with minor amendments, across all States and Territories. Each State Demography bulletin has a catalogue number of 3311 and a suffixed number appropriate to the State of publication.

Additional statistics and services available

33. In most cases, the ABS can also make available information which is not published. This information may be made available in one or more of the following forms: microfiche, photocopy, data tape, floppy disk, computer printout, or clerically extracted tabulation.

34. Current publications produced by the ABS are listed in the *Catalogue of Publications and Products, Australia* (1101.0). The ABS also issues, on Tuesdays and Fridays, a *Publications Advice* (1105.0) which lists publications to be released in the next few days. These publications are available from any ABS office.

35. Information from Life Tables prepared by the Australian Bureau of Statistics as contained in Table

4.4, Expectation of life, relate to the number of deaths registered at five yearly intervals 1971 to 1991 and 1993. These tables are not constructed according to strict actuarial principles. Readers wishing to use life tables for actuarial purposes are advised to refer to the Official Australian Life Tables prepared by the Australian Government Actuary. Copies are available from the Commonwealth Government Bookshop in each State capital city.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

1. *Aboriginal* persons, for the purposes of the tables in this publication, are those identified as being Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.
2. *Age-specific birth rates* are the live births registered during the calendar year, according to age of mother, per 1,000 of the estimated mid-year female resident population of the same age. For the purposes of calculating these rates, births to mothers under 15 are included in the 15-19 year age group, and births to mothers aged 50 and over are included in the 45-49 year age group.
3. *Age and marital status specific rates* distinguish first marriages and remarriages, and use as the denominator the appropriate population estimates by age marital states. Thus, *first marriage rates* are the numbers of males and females of a certain age marrying for the first time per 1,000 (mid-year) population of never married males and females of the same age. *Remarriage rates* are based on the number of remarrying males and females per 1,000 widowed or divorced males and females respectively of the same age. These rates for Western Australia are calculated from the 1991 population census count, as the estimated resident population by marital status by age and sex is calculated only for Australia.
4. The *age-specific death rate* is the number of deaths at a specific age per 1,000 of the population of that age.
5. The *age-specific divorce rate* (per 1,000 population) relates the number of divorced parties by age to the estimated mid-year resident population in specific age groups. Males under 18 and females under 16 are excluded from the population.
6. A *birth*, unless otherwise stated, is a live birth, i.e. the delivery irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, of a child who, after being born, breathes or shows any other evidence of life such as a heartbeat. A multiple birth is a confinement (see below), which results in two or more births, at least one of which is live born.
7. *Category of movement* in overseas arrivals and departures is primarily determined by the traveller's own selection of his or her category on the passenger card. This selection is accepted if it is consistent with other information on the card.
8. The definition of *children* in the Divorces collection encompasses unmarried children who are under the age of 18 years at the time of application for divorce, as defined by the *Family Law Act 1975*. These may include (in certain cases) adopted, ex-nuptial, foster or step-children. Children who are married or aged 18 years or more are not subject to custody and guardianship orders, and are therefore excluded. *Children* in the Marriages collection are children (whether now living and under the age of 16, or deceased), who were born alive to previous marriages. The term *children* must not be confused with *previous issue*, used in the Births collection (see paragraph 37).
9. A *confinement* is a pregnancy which results in at least one live birth. *Nuptial first confinements* are the first confinements in the current marriage and do not necessarily represent the woman's first ever confinement resulting in a live birth.
10. The *crude birth rate* is the number of registered live births per 1,000 of the mean estimated resident population, except for Table 2 in which the crude birth rate is measured as the number of registered live births per 1,000 of the mid year estimated resident population for each Statistical Local Area.
11. The *crude death rate* is the number of registered deaths per 1,000 of the mean estimated resident population, except for Table 2 in which it is measured as the number of registered deaths per 1,000 of the mid-year estimated resident population for each Statistical Local Area.
12. The *crude divorce rate* is the number of decrees absolute granted per 1,000 of the mean estimated resident population. (In the interpretation of this rate, it must be kept in mind that a large and varying proportion of the population used in the denominator is unmarried or below the minimum age of marriage.)
13. The *crude marriage rate* is the number of marriages per 1,000 mean estimated resident population
14. *Date of final separation* is the date, given on the application for divorce, from which the period of living apart is calculated for the purpose of establishing the grounds for divorce. In determining the date of final separation, a single period of resumed cohabitation of less than 3 months may be ignored, provided the periods of living apart before and after resumed cohabitation amount to a total of 12 months or more.
15. The term *divorce*, as used in this publication, refers to decrees absolute of dissolution of marriage.
16. Duration of marriage is the interval measured in completed years between the date of marriage and:
 - (a) In the Births collection, the date of the current birth.
 - (b) In the Marriages and Divorces collections, the date a marriage ended by decree made absolute.
17. The *estimated resident population* (ERP) is the official ABS estimate of the Australian population. The Estimated Resident Population of Western Australia is based on the final results of the 1991 population census, and is updated for subsequent births, deaths, and overseas and interstate migration.
18. The *female net reproduction rate* represents the number of daughters a woman would bear if she were subject to the female age-specific fertility and mortality rates of the year shown. It is obtained by multiplying the female age-specific birth rates by the proportion of survivors at corresponding ages in a life table, adding the products and dividing by 1,000.
19. Under Western Australian legislation, *Fetal and Neonatal* deaths relate to the delivery of a child weighing at least 400 grams (Australia 500 grams) at delivery or 20 weeks duration of gestation (Australia 22 weeks). These deaths can still be registered if the birthweight is under 400 grams provided the duration of gestation is 20 weeks or more, or if the duration of gestation is under 20 weeks provided the birthweight is 400 grams or more. This definition is used in Table 4.5.
20. *Fetal deaths* in Western Australia relate to the delivery of a child, weighing at least 400 grams at delivery (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least 20 weeks gestation), who did not any time after delivery, breathe or show any other evidence of life such as a heartbeat.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

21. The fetal death rate in Western Australia is the number of fetal deaths per 1,000 live births of babies who weighed at least 400 grams at birth (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least 20 weeks duration), plus fetal deaths.
22. - The *growth rate* expresses population change over a period as a proportion (percentage) of the population at the beginning of that period. In this bulletin, population growth rate is measured over the twelve months to 31 December of the recording year.
23. An *infant death* is the death of a live-born child who died when less than one year old.
24. The *infant mortality rate* is the number of deaths of children under one year of age per 1,000 live births.
25. Net estimated *interstate migration* is derived from aggregated statistical information on interstate changes of address advised to the Health Insurance Commission.
26. *Life expectancy* refers to the average number of additional years a person of a given age and sex might expect to live if the age-specific death rates of the given year continued throughout his or her lifetime.
27. *Long-term movements* relate to movements of travellers (other than those who, on arrival, hold migrant visas) whose intended or actual length of stay is 12 months or more.
28. The *median value* (age, duration or interval) is that value which divides the relevant population into two equal parts, half falling below this value, and half exceeding it. Where the value for a particular record has not been stated, that record is excluded from the calculation.
29. Natural increase is the excess of births over deaths registered in the recording year.
30. *Neonatal deaths* in Western Australia are deaths of live born babies who weighed at least 400 grams at birth (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least 20 weeks gestation), and who died within 28 days of birth.
31. The *neonatal death rate* in Western Australia is the number of neonatal deaths per 1,000 live births of babies who weighed at least 400 grams at birth (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least 20 weeks gestation).
32. *Never married* refers to those persons who have never been validly married.
33. *Nuptiality* relates to the relative marital status of parents in the Births collection. Confinements and births are identified as being nuptial where the father registered was married to the mother at the time of the birth, or where the husband died during the pregnancy. Other confinements, and the children resulting from them, are classified as ex-nuptial whether or not the parents were living together at the time of the birth, and whether or not the child may subsequently have been legitimised or adopted.
34. A *perinatal death* is either a fetal or a neonatal death, as elsewhere defined.
35. The perinatal death rate is the number of perinatal deaths per 1,000 live births and fetal deaths combined. (See paragraph 13 of the Explanatory Notes).
36. *Permanent movement* is comprised of arrivals of settlers, and permanent departures of Australian residents (*i.e. those who, on departure, state that they do not intend to return to Australia*).
37. *Previous issue* in the Births collection refers to previous live-born issue of a mother to the current marriage only, and excludes foster, step, or adopted children.
38. The *sex ratio* is the number of males per 100 females.
39. *Short-term movements* relate to movements of travellers (other than those who, on arrival, hold migrant visas), whose intended or actual length of stay is up to 12 months.
40. The *standardised death rate* is the overall death rate that would have prevailed in a standard population if it had experienced at each age the death rates of the population being studied. The standard population used in these calculations is all persons in the 1991 population.
41. The total fertility rate is obtained by summing the five year age-specific birth rates and multiplying by five. It represents the number of children 1,000 women would bear during their lifetimes if they experienced the rates of the year shown.

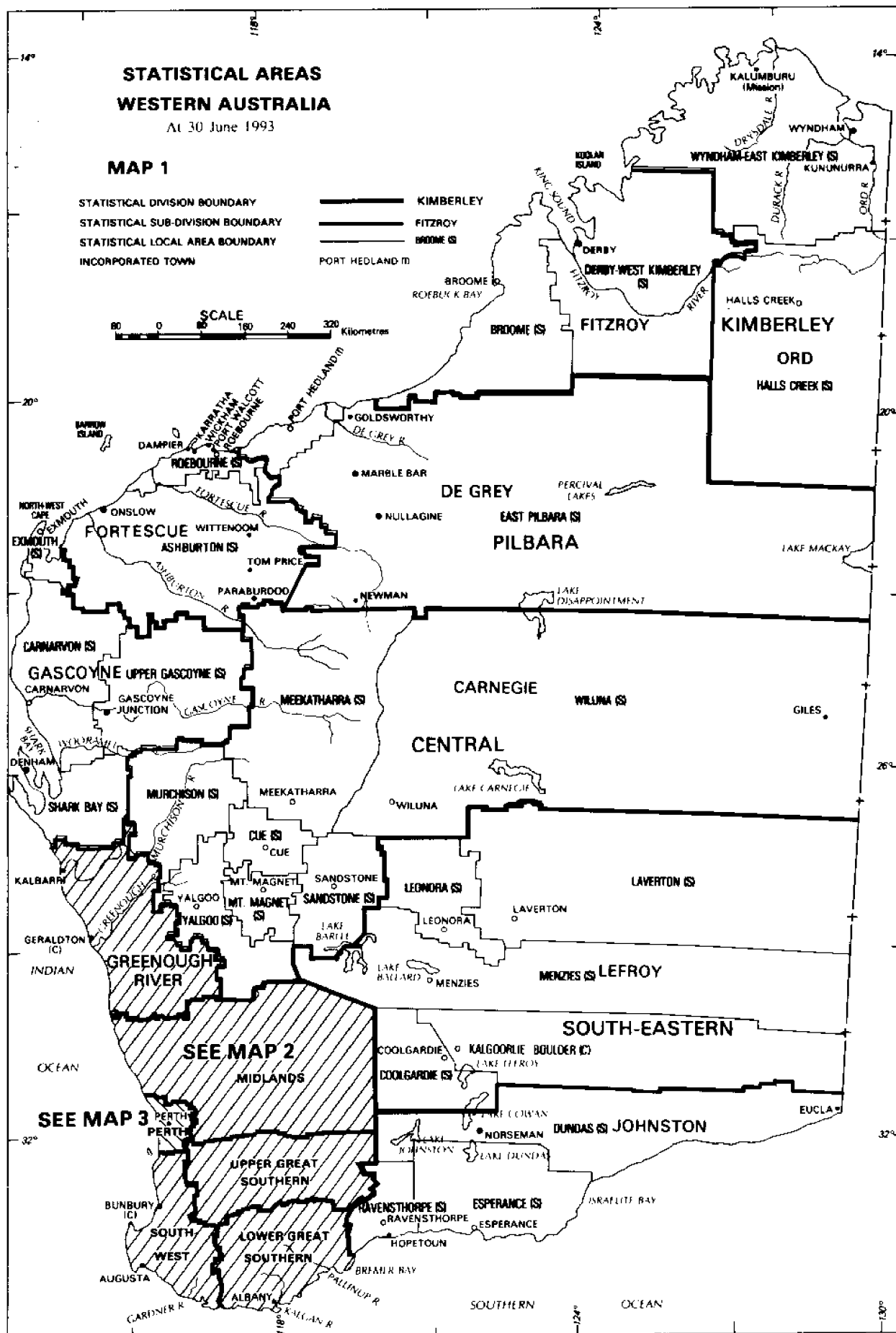

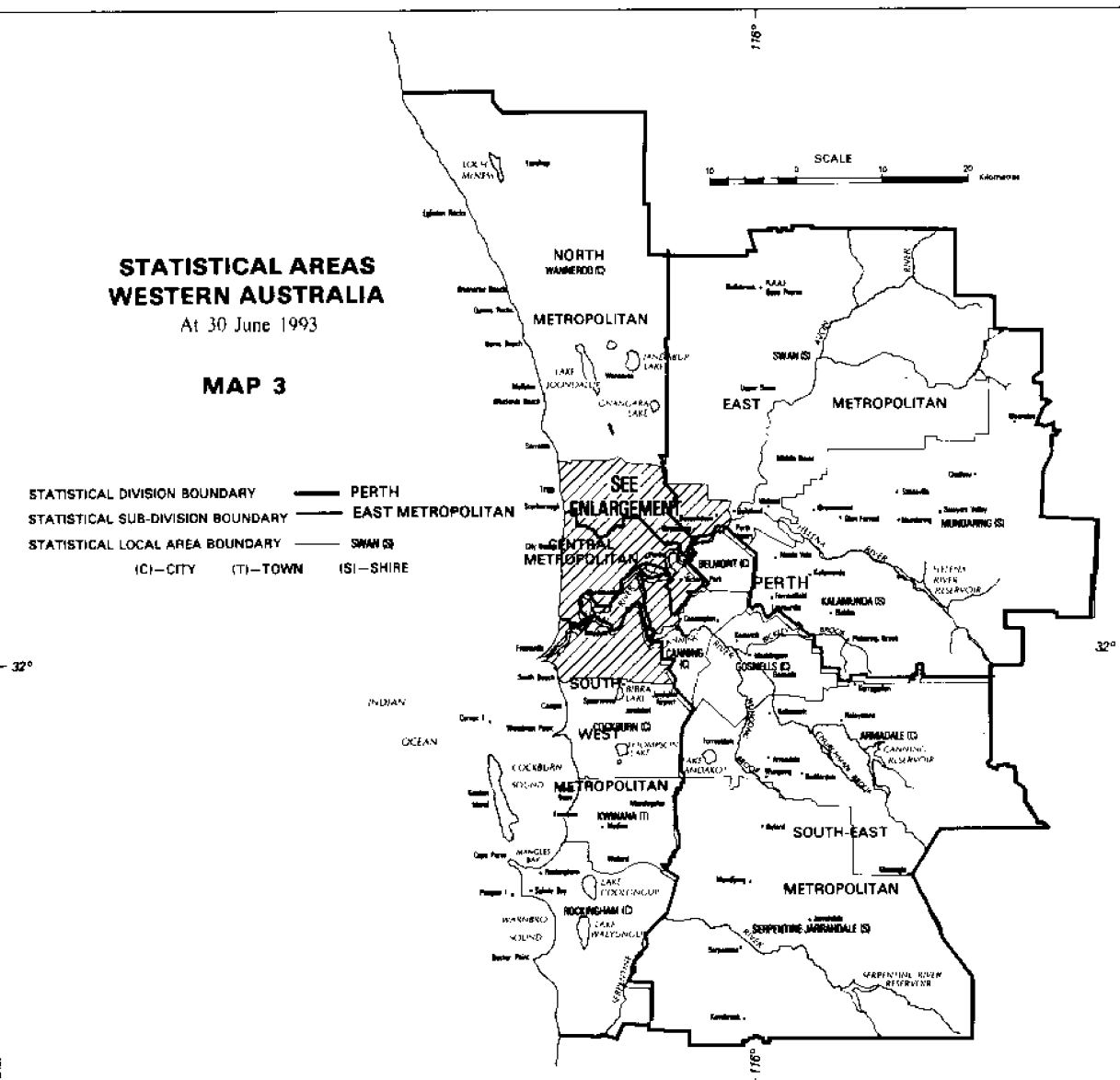


STATISTICAL AREAS WESTERN AUSTRALIA

At 30 June 1993

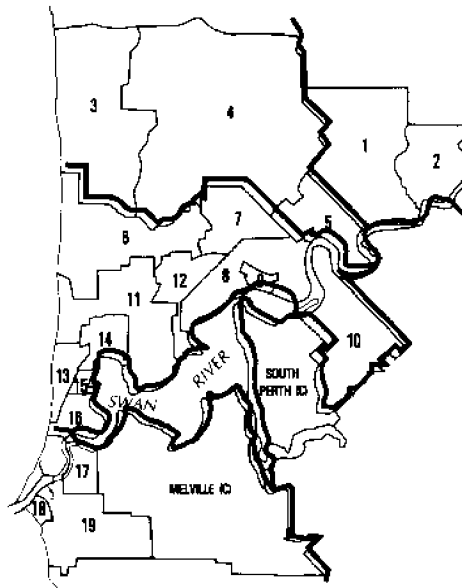
MAP 3
