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

#### **Population**

The estimated resident population of the Northern Territory at the 31st of December, 1993, was 170 549 persons.

The population of the Northern Territory had increased by twenty-two percent between December, 1983 (139 500 persons) and December, 1993. This compared with an increase of forty percent between 1973 and 1983.

#### **Population Growth**


Throughout the latter two quarters of 1991, and up to the final quarter of 1993, a series of upwards adjustments totalling 1 045 persons was made to Northern Territory estimated resident population. These adjustments resulted from evidence of undercounting of the Northern Territory's population at the 1991 Census (see Explanatory Notes). Assessments of post-1991 demographic data must therefore be made in light of the impact of these upward adjustments.

With the inclusion of the upward adjustments between September quarter 1991 and December quarter 1993, the Northern Territory's annual growth rates for 1992 (1.3%) and 1993 (1.1%) were slightly higher than those for Australia as a whole (1.1% and 1.0% respectively). Without the contribution of the adjustments, the Northern Territory growth rate remained slightly below that of Australia for 1992 (1.0% unadjusted) and 1993 (0.9% unadjusted).

The annual rate of population growth (excluding upward adjustments) for the Northern Territory in 1993 was exceeded only by Queensland (2.7%), the Australian Capital Territory (1.4%), and Western Australia (1.2%).

There has been a slowing down in annual population growth rates in the Northern Territory from rates of 4.2 percent and 4.9 percent in 1984 and 1985 to the 1993 rate of 1.1 percent.

GRAPH 2: POPULATION GROWTH NORTHERN TERRITORY AND AUSTRALIA 1984 TO 1993(a)



#### **Population Change**


The major contributor to population change in the Northern Territory in 1993 was natural increase. Natural increase contributed 2 838 persons, comprising 3 603 registered live births and 765 deaths.


GRAPH 3: COMPONENTS OF POPULATION CHANGE NORTHERN TERRITORY 1988 TO 1993



The pattern of population change observed in 1993 appeared consistent with patterns observed in the previous five years, with a large positive contribution from natural increase and a smaller contribution from net overseas migration. The 1 045 persons involved in the upward adjustments since 1991 were coded as overseas inward migration, which would account for much of the net overseas migration contribution in 1992 and 1993. As in previous years, there was a negative contribution to the Northern Territory population from net interstate migration (1 461 persons) in 1993.

The Darwin statistical subdivision experienced a slight decrease in resident population from 68 094 persons in June 1992 to 67 699 persons in June 1993. This represented a decrease of 0.6 percent. Tennant Creek statistical local area experienced a decrease in resident population of 2.3 percent between June 1992 (3 215 persons) and June 1993 (3 140 persons).

In contrast, the Palmerston-East Arm statistical subdivision experienced an increase in resident population of 9.9 percent from 9 272 persons in June 1992 to 10 186 persons in June 1993. The Darwin Rural Areas statistical subdivision experienced an increase of 6.4 percent from 11 753 persons in June 1992 to 12 504 persons in June 1993.


Katherine statistical local area experienced a 2.4 percent resident population increase, and Alice Springs statistical local area increased in resident population by 1.8 percent between June 1992 and June 1993.

#### Age Structure

The median age of the Northern Territory population was 27.5 years in 1993. This compared to a median age of 33.0 years for the Australian population.


The Northern Territory population can be distinguished from the total Australian population by its young age structure. While forty-five percent of the Northern Territory population was aged less than twenty-five years in June 1993, only around thirty-seven percent of the total Australian population was in this age group. Conversely, twelve percent of the Australian population was aged sixty-five years or older, compared with just three percent of the Northern Territory population.






Births and Fertility

There were 3 603 live births registered to mothers usually resident in the Northern Territory in 1993. This represented a decrease of 3.7 percent from the 3 742 births registered in 1992.





The total fertility rate (the number of children women could be expected to bear during their lifetimes) in the Northern Territory was 2.3 in 1993. This was higher than the rate of 1.9 for Australia. The total fertility rate in the Northern Territory has remained higher than that of Australia since at least 1988.

The high fertility rate in 1993 was accompanied by a relatively high net reproduction rate of 1.1 for the Northern Territory. While the Northern Territory was above the replacement level of 1.0, Australia was below the replacement level (0.9).

The sex ratio at birth in the Northern Territory in 1993 was 110 males for every 100 females.


There were 765 deaths of persons usually resident in the Northern Territory in 1993. The standardised death rate was 10.0 per 1 000 standard population (see Glossary of Terms). This rate was well above the Australian rate of 6.6.

In 1993, the median age at death in the Northern Territory was 53.7 years for males and 56.8 years for females. These estimates were well below the corresponding national means of 72.9 years and 79.5 years for males and females respectively.

The Northern Territory had the lowest expectation of life at birth in Australia of 69.2 years for males and 73.8 years for females. The corresponding national expectations were 75.0 years for males and 80.9 years for females.

There were fifty-five infant deaths recorded in the Northern Territory in 1993. The infant mortality rate for the Northern Territory was 15.3 per 1 000 live births. The Australian rate was 6.1.

Deaths

The three major causes of death in the Northern Territory in 1993 were: cancer (159 deaths or 20.8% of all deaths); heart disease (139 deaths or 18.2% of all deaths); and respiratory disease (ninety-three deaths or 12.2% of all deaths). These were the most common cause of death for both males and females:

**Marriages** 

There were 806 registered marriages in the Northern Territory in 1993. The number of marriages continued to decline from a peak of 890 in 1991. The crude marriage rate (number of marriages per 1 000 estimated resident population) was 4.8 per 1 000 estimated resident population, compared with a national crude marriage rate of 6.4 per 1 000 estimated resident population.

In 1993, the median age at marriage was 30,7 years for males and 27.7 years for females.


**Divorces** 

There were 343 divorces granted by the Northern Territory Family Court in 1993. This compared with 345 divorces in 1992 and 397 divorces in 1991.

As well as information about divorces granted by the Northern Territory Family Court, data was available for the first time in 1993 about the number of divorces granted throughout Australia to usual residents of the Northern Territory. There were 390 divorces granted to usual residents of the Northern Territory by Family Courts throughout Australia.

The Northern Territory had the lowest crude divorce rate (number of divorces per 1 000 estimated resident population) for usual residents of any State or Territory with 2.3 divorces per 1 000 estimated resident population. The Australian rate was 2.7.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

#### Introduction

This publication brings together a number of closely related series of statistics on demography including Births, Deaths, Marriages and Divorces. It also includes some information on numbers of persons counted at the 1991 Census, estimated resident population and migration. For details of publication of other data related to demography, readers should refer to the section on Related Publications, at the end of these notes.

A Glossary of Terms follows the Explanatory Notes. More detailed definitions are given in more specialised publications, a list of which is given in the section on Related Publications.

#### Population

- 3 This section provides estimates of the resident population, with information on overseas arrivals and departures and net interstate migration.
- 4 Estimates of the Northern Territory population are made to varying degrees of detail thoughout the year, and this publication has used the most up to date estimates available for each particular table.
- A recent review of Northern Territory estimated resident population identified an estimated undercount in the 1991 Census of 1 045 persons. This was over and above the undercount for which adjustments to ERP had already been made. As a result, an additional series of adjustments have been made to ERP for the ten quarters up to and including the December quarter, 1993. The result of these adjustments is a slight overestimation of population increase for those quarters.

#### Migration

- Data on overseas arrivals and departures relate to the number of movements of travellers rather than to the number of travellers. However, the statistics exclude the movements of operational air crew and ships' crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not engaged on regular voyages. Estimates of transit sea passengers are no longer available.
- 7 Data on interstate migration have been derived from aggregated statistical information on interstate changes of addresses advised to the Health Insurance Commission in the process of administering Medicare. The ABS adjusts the Health Insurance Commission data to make allowance for the persons who do not inform the Commission of their change of residence. Further details are shown in the Explanatory Notes to Australian Demographics Statistics (3101.0).

#### Births

8 Birth statistics are presented on the basis of the State or Territory of usual residence of the mother, regardless of where in Australia the birth occurred or was registered.

- 9 Births to mothers usually resident in Australia which took place overseas are excluded. Births to mothers usually resident overseas which occurred in Australia are included in the State or Territory where the birth occurred.
- 10 Except for Tables 11 to 14, the statistics in this publication refer to births registered during the calendar year shown. There is usually an interval between the occurrence and registration of a birth, and some births occurring in one year are not registered until the following year, or even later. However, most births are registered shortly after they occur, and almost all births occurring in one year are registered by 30 June of the following year. Tables 11 to 14 refer to births which occurred in the years shown.
- 11 Data on stillbirths (fetal deaths) may be found in summary form in Table 21 of the publication.
- 12 The live birth statistics used to calculate the fetal and neonatal death rates have been adjusted (in accordance with the WHO definition of perinatal death) to exclude cases where the birthweight was known to be less than 500 grams.

### Deaths

- 13 In this publication death statistics are presented on the basis of the State or Territory of usual residence of the deceased, regardless of where in Australia the death occurred and was registered.
- 14 Except for Tables 23 and 24, the death statistics in this publication refer to deaths registered during the year shown. There is usually a time lapse between the occurrence and registration of death, and some deaths occurring in one year are not registered until the following year, or even later.
- 15 In 1988, revisions were made to Northern Territory legislation to enable the registration of a death prior to the certification of cause. As a result, deaths registered in the Northern Territory during 1988 included a number of deaths which would not necessarily have been registered under the former legislation. This should be borne in mind in interpreting statistics for 1988 and comparing them with earlier years

### **Marriages**

16 Marriage statistics in this publication refer to marriages registered by the Northern Territory Registrar during the years shown. There is usually an interval between the celebration and the registration of a marriage. As a result of the delay in registration, some marriages celebrated in one year are not registered until the following year. Under the Australian Marriage Act 1961, marriages may be celebrated by a minister of religion registered as an authorised celebrant, by a district registrar or by other persons authorised by the Attorney-General. Notice of the intended marriage must be given to the celebrant at least one calander month, and within six calendar months before the marriage. A celebrant must transmit an official cerificate of the marriage for registration to a District Registrar in the State or Territory in which the marriage took place.

17 From 20 June 1973, the minimum age at which a person may marry without parental consent, as required under the Act has been eighteen years. Persons between the ages of sixteen and eighteen years may marry with parental or guardian consent and an order from a judge or magistrate. Any two persons under the age of eighteen years may not marry each other.

### Divorces

- 18 The State/Territory classification used in Tables 1, and 33 to 37 of this publication, relates to State or Territory of usual residence at time of seperation. This takes account of some Family Courts having responsibility for hearing divorce cases relating to other States and Territories.
- 19 The State/Territory classification used in Table 38 of this publication, relates to State/Territory of registration which is based on the location of the Family Court where the divorce is granted or registered.
- 20 Under the Family Law Act 1975, the only ground on which a divorce may be granted is that of irretrievable breakdown of the marriage. This ground is established by the husband and wife having lived apart for 12 months or more, with there being no reasonable likelihood of reconciliation. Application for nullity of marriage under Family Law legislation must be on the ground that there was a failure to meet a legal requirement, such as that neither party be already lawfully married to another person. There is no provision for judicial separation under Family Law legislation.
- 21 Successful applicants for a divorce are initially granted a decree *nisi*. This becomes absolute after one month, unless it is rescinded or appealed against, or the Court is not satisfied that proper arrangements have been made for the welfare of any children involved.
- 22 The statistics shown in this publication are compiled by the ABS from Statistical Reports completed by the Family Court in respect of each application which resulted in the granting of a decree absolute.
- 23 In the interpretation of data, it is important to bear in mind that the availability of judges, and complexity of the cases brought before them can affect the number of decrees granted or made absolute in any one year. A rise in numbers may reflect only the clearing of a backlog of cases from an earlier period.
- 24 The number of divorces shown for Northern Territory is dependent on the number of cases heard by Family Law Courts in the Northern Territory. As there is no residential requirement under Family Law, applicants may be resident anywhere in Australia. Caution should therefore be exercised in interpreting the rates shown in this bulletin.

# **Geographic Boundaries**

- 25 The geographic boundaries for small area data are defined in the Australian Standard Geographical Classification, Edition 2.2 (1216.0).
- **26** The boundaries used for Births and Deaths statistics are the SLA boundaries as at 1 January 1993.
- 27 The classification of countries in this publication is based on the Australian Standard Classification of Countries for Social Statistics (ASCCSS). For more detailed information refer to the ABS publication Australian Standard Classification of Countries for Social Statistics (1269.0)
- 28 Recent political developments in Europe and the former USSR have resulted in a number of changes to the ASCCSS. These changes have affected some of the categories in this publication and are detailed in Revision 1.02 of the ASCCSS.

# Additional statistics and services available

- 30 In most cases, the ABS can also make available information which is not published. This information may be made available in one or more of the following forms: microfiche, photocopy, data tape, floppy disk, computer printout, or clerically extracted tabulation.
- 31 Current publications produced by the ABS are listed in the Catalague of Publications and Products, Australia (1101.0). The ABS also issues, on Tuesdays and Fridays, a Publications Advice (1105.0) which lists publications to be released in the next few days. These publications are available from any ABS office.
- 32 Estimates of expectation of life prepared by the Australian Burcau of Statistics are included in Table 18. This table provides a time series of overall life expectancy based on the mortality experience of each reference year. The table is not constructed according to strict actuarial principles. Readers wishing to use life tables for actuarial purposes are advised to refer to the Official Australian Life Tables 1985-87, prepared by the Australian Government Actuary. These were released in 1991, and copies are available from the AGPS Bookshop in each State capital city.

Age specific births rates are the live births registered during the calendar year, according to age of mother, per 1,000 of the estimated mid-year female resident population of the same age as estimated for 30 June. For the purposes of calculating these rates, births to mothers aged less than fifteen years are included in the 15-19 year age group, and births to mothers aged fifty years and over are included in the 45-49 year age group.

- Age and marital status specific marriage rates distinguish first marriages and remarriages, and use as the denominator the appropriate population estimates by age and marital status. Thus, first marriage rates are the numbers of males and females of certain age marrying for the first time per 1,000 (mid-year) population of never married males and females of the same age. Remarriage rates are based on the number of remarrying males and females per 1,000 widowed or divorced males and females respectively of the same age. These rates for Northern Territory are calculated on the population census count, as the estimated resident population by marital status by age and sex is calculated only for Australia and not for each separate State and Territory.
- 3 The age-specific death rate is the number of deaths at a specified age per 1,000 of the population at that age.
- 4 The age-specific divorce rate (per 1,000 population) relates the number of divorced parties by age to the estimated mid-year resident population in specific age groups. Males under eighteen and females under sixteen are excluded from the population.
- A birth, unless otherwise stated, is a live birth, i.e. the delivery, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, of a child who, after being born, breaths or shows any other evidence of life such as a heartbeat. A multiple birth is a confinement (see below) which results in two or more births, at least one of which is liveborn.
- 6 Category of movement in overseas arrivals and departures is primarily determined by the traveller's own selection of his or her category on the passenger card. This selection is accepted, provided it is consistent with other information on the card.
- The definition of *children* in the Divorce collection encompasses unmarried children who are under the age of eighteen years at the time of application for divorce, as defined by the *Family Law Act 1975*. These may include (in certain cases) adopted, ex-nuptial, foster- or step-children. *Children* who are married or aged eighteen years or more are not subject to custody and guardianship orders, and are therefore excluded. Children in the Marriages collection are children (whether now living and under the age of sixteen, or deceased) who were born alive to previous marriages. The term *children* must not be confused with *previous issue* used in the Births collection (see paragraph 38).

- 8 Child dependancy ratio is the number of children aged zero to fourteen years per 1 000 population aged fifteen to sixty-four years.
- 9 A confinement is a pregnancy which results in at least one live birth. Nuptial first confinements are the first confinements in the current marriage, and do not necessarily represent the woman's first ever confinement resulting in a live birth.
- 10 The *crude birth rate* is the number of registered live births per 1 000 of the estimated mean resident population.
- 11 The *crude death rate* is the number of registered deaths per 1 000 of the estimated mean resident population.
- 12 The crude divorce rate is the number of decrees absolute granted per 1 000 of the estimated mean resident population. (In the interpretation of this rate, it must be kept in mind that a large and varying proportion of the population used in the denominator is unmarried or below the minimum age of marriage).
- 13 The *crude marriage rate* is the number of marriages per 1 000 estimated mean resident population.
- 14 Date of final separation is the date, given on the application for divorce, from which the period of living apart is calculated for the purpose of establishing grounds for divorce. In determining the date of final separation, a single period of resumed cohabitation of less than 3 months may be ignored, provided the periods of living apart before and after resumed cohabitation amount to a total of 12 months or more.
- 15 The term *divorce*, as used in this publication, refers to decrees of dissolution of marriage made absolute.
- 16 Duration of marriage of a divorce is the interval measured in completed years between the date of marriage and the date the marriage ended by decree made absolute or death of the spouse.
- 17 The estimated resident population (ERP) is the official ABS estimate of the Australian population. The ERP for the whole of Northern Territory is based on the preliminary results of the 1991 population census. ERP is concerned only with resident population, and excludes other populations such as tourists and non-resident service populations.

- 18 The female net reproduction rate represents the number of daughters a woman would bear if she were subject to the female age-specific fertility and mortality rates of the year shown. It is obtained by multiplying the female age-specific birth rates by the proportion of survivors at corresponding ages in a life table, adding the products and dividing by 1 000.
- 19 Fetal deaths relate to the delivery of a child, weighing at least 500 grams at delivery (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least twenty-two weeks gestation) who did not, at any time after delivery breathe or show any other evidence of life such as a heartbeat.
- 20 The fetal death rate is the number of fetal deaths per 1 000 live births of babies who weighed at least 500 grams at birth (or, when birthweight is unavailable, of at least twenty-two weeks gestation) plus foctal deaths.
- 21 An *infant death* is the death of a live-born child who died when less than one year old.
- 22 The *infant mortality rate* is the number of deaths of children under one year of age per 1 000 live births.
- 23 Life expectancy refers to the average number of additional years a person of a given age and sex might expect to live if the age-specific death rates of the given year continued throughout his or her lifetime.
- 24 Long term arrivals comprise overseas visitors (except those who hold migrant visas) who intend to stay in Australia for twelve months or more, and Australian residents returning after an absence of twelve months or more overseas.
- 25 Long-term departures comprise Australian residents who intend to stay abroad for twelve months or more, and overseas visitors departing who stayed twelve months or more in Australia.
- 26 The median value (age, duration or interval) is that value which divides the relevant population into two equal parts, half falling below this value, and half above it. Where the value for a particular record has not been stated, that record is excluded from the calculation.
- 27 Natural increase is the excess of births over deaths registered in the recording year.
- 28 Neonatal deaths are deaths of babies who weighed at least 500 grams at birth (or, when birthwieght is unavailable, were of at least twenty-two weeks gestation) and who died within twenty-eight days of birth.

- 29 The *neonatal death rate* is the number of neonatal deaths per 1 000 live births of babies who weighed at least 500 grams at birth, (or, when birthweight is unavailable, were of at least twenty-two weeks gestation). See also paragraph 12 in the Explanatory Notes.
- 30 Net estimated interstate migration is derived from aggregated statistical information on interstate changes of address advised to the Health Insurance Commission.
- 31 Net overseas migration is derived by subtracting the number of long term departures from the number of long term arrivals
- **32** Never married refers to those persons who have never been validly married.
- 33 Nuptiality relates to the relative marital status of parents in the Births collection. Confinements and births are identified as being nuptial where the registered father was married to the mother at the time of the birth, or where the husband died during the pregnancy. Confinements and children of Aboriginal mothers considered to be tribally married are classified as nuptial. Other confinements, and the children resulting from them, are classified as ex-nuptial whether or not the parents were living together at the time of the birth, and whether or not the child may subsequently have been legitimised or adopted.
- 34 A perinatal death is either a foctal or a neonatal death, as elsewhere defined
- 35 The *perinatal death rate* is the number of perinatal deaths per 1 000 live births and foctal deaths combined.
- **36** Permanent movement is comprised of arrivals of settlers, and permanent departures of Australian residents. (i.e., those who, on departure, state that they do not intend to return to Australia).
- 37 The rate of population growth expresses population change over a period as a proportion (per cent) of the population at the beginning of that period. In this bulletin, population growth rate is measured over the twelve months to 31 December of the recording year.
- **38** Previous issue in the Births collection refers to previous live-born issue of a mother to the current marriage only, and excludes foster, step, or adopted children.
- 39 The sex ratio is the number of males per one hundred females.
- 40 Movements of travellers whose intended or actual length of stay is less than twelve months are classified as *short-term*, except those who on arrival hold migrant visas.

- 41 The standardised death rate is the overall death rate that would have prevailed in a standard population if it had experienced at each age the death rates of the population being studied. The standard population used in these calculations is the 1991 population.
- 42 The total fertility rate is obtained by summing the five year age-specific birth rates and multiplying by five. It represents the number of children women would bear during their lifetimes if they experienced the rates of the year shown.


