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MAIN FEATURES

In July 1986 there were 10,085 schools operating in Australia. Of these, 7,589 (75.3 per cent) were government schools operated by the State Directors-General of Education (or equivalent) and 2,496 (24.7 per cent) were non-government schools.

The number of full-time students attending these schools in July 1986 totalled 3,001,389 comprising 2,207,801 (73.6 per cent) in government schools and 793,588 (26.4 per cent) in non-government schools. In 1985 non-government comprised 25.8 per cent of full-time students.

The number of full-time students attending government schools in July 1986 decreased by 1.0 per cent (23,032) from the 2,230,833 attending in 1985, whilst the number of full-time students attending non-government schools increased by 2.4 per cent (18,252) from the 775,336 attending in 1985.

The apparent retention rate of secondary school students to Year 12 rose from 46.4 per cent in 1985 to 48.7 per cent in 1986. As in previous years, the retention rate for female students (52.1 per cent) was higher than the corresponding figure for males (45.6 per cent). The rate varied between States and Territories, ranging from 30.3 per cent in Tasmania to 77.7 per cent in the Australian Capital Territory.

The number of teaching staff at government and nongovernment schools in July 1986 comprised 183,731 fulltime teachers and 25,395 part-time teachers who contributed 12,991 full-time equivalent (FTE) units of effort, giving a total FTE teaching staff of 196,721.

There was the equivalent of 148,334 full-time teaching staff in government schools in July 1986, a decrease of 0.3 per cent (428) since 1985, whilst teaching staff in non-government schools totalled 48,388 full-time equivalent units, an increase of 3.5 per cent (1,641). The non-government sector comprised 24.6 per cent of teaching staff (FTE) in 1986 and 23.9 per cent in 1985.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains statistics of government and non-government schools, students and staff, as at July 1986. Extra tables with revised school staff data for Victoria and total Australia for 1985 have also been included.

2. The National Schools Statistics Collection (NSSC) series was established through the work of the Australian Education Council School Statistics Committee (AECSSC), of which the ABS is a member. The AECSSC was established in 1979 by the Australian Education Council to improve the quality of education statistics relating to government and non-government primary and secondary education and has developed a set of concepts, definitions and classifications for use in the National Schools Statistics Collection.

3. The statistics are compiled from collections conducted, in co-operation with the AECSSC, by the State/Territory Departments of Education (government series) and the Commonwealth Department of Education (non-government series).

4. With the implementation of the NSSC concepts, definitions, classifications and coverage were revised. The new government series was implemented in 1981 and the non-government in 1984. Therefore, care should be exercised when comparing data in this publication with that prior to 1981 and 1984 for the government and non-government series respectively, and between the two series from 1981 to 1983.

Scope and coverage

5. The statistics in this publication relate to establishments which have as their major activity the administration and/or provision of full-time day primary, secondary or special education, or primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence. Major activity is based on the activity of students or, where this is not appropriate, on the activity of staff in full-time equivalent units (FTE). See paragraph 26 for details of the calculations of FTE. Those establishments at which some other activity is major are excluded, therefore the statistics presented do not include establishments, students or staff engaged in such activities as the Tertiary Orientation Programs conducted by Technical and Further Education Institutions in Victoria.

6. Statistics for the government series relate to all establishments administered by the Department of Education under the Director-General of Education (or equivalent) in each State/Territory, students attending those establishments and all staff engaged in the administration/provision of government school education at those establishments. Statistics for the non-government series relate to all establishments not administered by the Departments of Education and include special schools administered by Government authorities other than the State/Territory Departments of Education.

Census date

7. The census date for the collection was 1 July 1986 (or as near as possible to that date).

Definitions

8. A non-special school must satisfy the following criteria:

- (a) Its major activity is:
 - (i) the provision of full-time day primary or secondary education or,
 - (ii) the provision of primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence;

- (b) It is headed by a principal (or equivalent) responsible for its internal operation; and
- (c) It is possible for students to enrol for a minimum of four continuous weeks, excluding breaks for school vacations.

9. A special school is one which provides special instruction for physically and/or mentally handicapped students, or those with social problems. Students must exhibit one or more of the following characteristics before enrolment is allowed:

- (i) mental or physical handicap, slow learning ability;
- (ii) social or emotional problems;
- (iii) in custody, on remand, in hospital.

10. The term 'school' in this publication includes schools in institutions and hospitals, mission schools and similar establishments. The term excludes pre-schools, kindergarten centres, pre-primary schools or classes in or attached to non-special schools, senior technical and agricultural colleges, evening schools, continuation classes, and institutions such as business or coaching colleges.

11. An Ancillary Education Establishment (AEE) is an establishment where the major activity is the provision of aspects of primary, secondary or special education to students supplementary to that provided by schools. AEEs include those education establishments in institutions and hospitals where students cannot enrol for a period exceeding four continuous weeks, certain holiday excursion centres, etc.

Note: In this publication AEE data include students and staff only.

12. Other education establishments within the scope of these statistics, but not defined as schools or Ancillary Education Establishments, include:

- (a) Administrative offices which have as their major activity the administration of primary, secondary or special education; and
- (b) Teacher resource centres operated by a State Director-General of Education.

13. Category of school refers to the classification of schools/AEEs to the government or non-government sector for the purposes of this collection.

14. Affiliation of non-government schools is classified to three groups; Anglican, Catholic and Other. Included in the 'Other' category are schools with specific religious affiliations (other than Anglican and Catholic) and schools that are inter-denominational, non-denominational or which have no religious affiliation.

- 15. Level/Year of education is defined as follows:
 - (a) Primary education is that full-time education which typically commences at around age 5 and lasts for seven to eight years. It does not include sessional education such as pre-school education. In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, primary education may extend from Pre-Year 1 to Year 6 (or equivalent). In South Australia and Northern Territory it may extend from Pre-Year 1 to Year 7 (or equivalent). In Queensland and Western Australia it may extend from Year 1 to Year 7 (or equivalent).
 - (b) Secondary education is that education which typically commences at around age 12 after completion of primary education and lasts for five or six years. In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, secondary education may extend from Year 7 to Year 12 (or equivalent). In Queensland, Western Australia, South Australia and Northern Territory it may extend from Year 8 to Year 12 (or equivalent).
 - (c) Special education in this collection refers only to that education provided at special schools. There is no lower or upper age limit for students in special schools.

Note: Prior to the 1985 NSSC collection, some full-time students attending special classes at non-special schools were classified to the 'special education' category. Data from 1985 onwards in this publication reflect the current definition.

16. There is no Australia-wide standard method of allocating students and classes to a certain year of education (grade). A number of schools (other than special schools) do not maintain a formal grade structure. Students at these schools have been allocated to equivalent grades where possible but otherwise appear against the category *ungraded* in either the primary or secondary levels of education.

17. A student is a person who is enrolled in a school and active in a course of study other than pre-school or Technical and Further Education (TAFE) courses. Persons absent at the reference date are included if they were expected to be absent for less than four continuous weeks (excluding schools vacations) and are excluded if they had left the school or had been absent without explanation for four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) prior to the reference week.

18. A *full-time student* is one who undertakes a workload specified as full-time in the government or non-government sector.

Note: This publication details full-time students only.

19. The apparent retention rate is the percentage of students of a given cohort group who continued to a particular year/level of education. In this publication, *apparent retention rates* are calculated for students who continued to Years 10, 11 and 12 of secondary schooling. Care should be exercised in the interpretation of apparent retention rates since a range of factors affecting calculation have not been taken into account. At the Australia level these include students repeating a year of education, migration/immigration and other net changes to the school population. At lower levels of disaggregation, additional factors of inter-sector transfer and interstate movements of students which would also influence the data have not been taken into account.

Note: Part-time students are excluded from apparent retention rates; the effect of this exclusion varies between States.

20. One example of the calculation of *apparent retention rates* is as follows:

— to calculate the apparent retention rate, at the Australia level, of the student cohort group who are currently (1986) in Year 10 from their commencement in secondary schooling (as shown in Tables 12 and 13 and Diagram 7), the total number of students in Year 10 in 1986 is divided by the sum of students in Year 7 in New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory in 1983 and those students in Year 8 in Queensland, Western Australia, South Australia and the Northern Territory in 1984 (since those Years represent the commencement of the secondary school system in the respective States) and convert the resultant figure to a percentage.

21. Staff are persons who are involved in the administration or provision of primary, secondary or special education. Staff are categorised as school staff or as nonschool staff. They are placed in the former category if they usually spend more than half of their time actively engaged in duties at one or more schools or Ancillary Education Establishments. School staff include all teaching staff and those non-teaching staff who spend more than half their time actively engaged in duties in schools/AEEs.

Note: This publication contains details of non-school staff for the government series only, since equivalent data are not available for the non-government series.

22. Teaching staff are staff who spend the majority of their time in contact with students and have teaching duties, ie., are engaged to impart the school curriculum or are engaged in the provision of services for the direct benefit of students. Teaching staff are usually employed under a teacher's award or equivalent. Also included for the purposes of this collection are principals, deputy principals and senior teachers mainly involved in administrative duties. 23. Non-teaching staff are staff who provide support services and who do not spend the majority of their time in contact with students. Included in this category are those engaged as teacher aides, library assistants, clerks, typists, maintenance workers etc.

24. Executive staff are non-teaching staff generally undertaking functions of a senior administrative type of a nature broader than that of a principal and whose salary generally exceeds that of a principal. They are non-school staff and include Directors-General of Education, directors and their deputies and inspectors/superintendents.

25. Type of Employment identifies staff as either fulltime or part-time.

- (a) Full-time staff are those who perform the full allocation of duties specified as full-time in the relevant award, contract or administrative arrangement. However, persons who are employed full-time but part of whose duties are out-of-scope of the collection (e.g. pre-school, TAFE, etc.) have been regarded as part-time.
- (b) Part-time staff are staff who are not employed full-time, or who are employed full-time but part of whose duties are out-of-scope of this collection (e.g. pre-school, TAFE, etc.).

Note: Emergency and casual relief teaching staff employed on a casual basis are not included in this collection as they replace permanent teaching staff absent for short periods of time. These permanent teaching staff are already counted in this collection.

26. The *full-time equivalent (FTE)* of a full-time staff member (i.e. employed full-time and engaged solely on in-scope activities) is equal to 1.0. The calculation of FTE for part-time staff is as follows:

- (a) The full-time equivalent of part-time staff performing some out-of-scope activities is calculated on the basis of the proportion of time spent on in-scope activities compared with that spent by a full-time staff member solely occupied by inscope activities.
- (b) The full-time equivalent of part-time staff performing solely in-scope activities is calculated on the basis of time worked compared with that worked by full-time staff performing similar duties.

Note: Some States are not able to calculate full-time equivalent on a time spent basis for all staff functions but use wages paid as a fraction of full-time rate, or a resource allocation based formula. Some also use a pro-rata formula based on student or teacher numbers to estimate aggregate FTE for some categories of staff. 27. The *area of activity* of staff is considered to be primary education, secondary education or education conducted in special schools. As a rule, the FTE of staff are apportioned across areas of activity on the basis of time spent in the various areas of activity.

Methodology

28. These statistics are compiled from collections conducted in co-operation with the AECSSC by the State/ Territory Departments of Education (government series) and the Commonwealth Department of Education (nongovernment series).

Note:

- (a) The methodologies employed by State Departments of Education in the government sector in compiling the State aggregates on which the statistics in this publication are based vary from State to State. They range from manipulation of central administrative records to direct collection of data from establishments.
- (b) The Commonwealth Department of Education collects data directly from establishments in the non-government sector for all States and Territories. The statistics in this publication are a summary of that collection.

Interpretation of results

29. In interpreting the figures in this publication, users should be aware that, because of the diversity of the Australian education system and its administration, the statistics reported in this publication are not entirely comparable. Comparability between States and between government and non-government schools in any one State is affected by differences in the organisation of grades, policy on student advancement, flows from secondary to vocational education and the recruitment and employment of teachers.

30. The S.A. Education Department have advised that the apparent increase in the number of students in Reception Year since 1985 is the result of the implementation of the 'First Years of School Policy' which commenced at the beginning of 1985 requiring all students to spend 7 to 10 terms under the 3-term year (or 10 to 13 terms under the 4-term year) prior to entry to Year 3. Previously students could move from Reception to Year 1 in the same year or from a full Reception year to Year 2 in the following year. The new policy has resulted in additional students being retained in the lower Year levels. In particular, prior to 1985, in order to retain a cohort group of Year 1 (for statistical purposes), any Reception students expected to be in Year 2 in the following year were designated as Year 1 students. 31. The Victorian Ministry of Education have advised that the school staff data reported for 1985 contained errors. This publication contains revised school staff figures for 1985 for Victoria and total Australia. Users requiring further information should contact the Victorian Ministry of Education.

STRUCTURE OF PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLING

The structure of primary and secondary schooling in Australia varies between the different States and Territories. There are three basic patterns evident, as illustrated below.

In South Australia and Northern Territory the primary system comprises a Reception or Transition grade followed by Years 1 to 7. The secondary system comprises Years 8 to 12.

In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory the primary system comprises a Kindergarten or Preparatory grade followed by Years 1 to 6. The secondary system comprises Years 7 to 12.

In Queensland and Western Australia the primary system comprises Years 1 to 7 and the secondary system Years 8 to 12.

Each State and Territory also has a pre-school sector which is separate from primary and secondary schooling. Data on pre-school education within schools have been excluded from primary enrolments in this publication.






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


(a) Excluding students in special schools.







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









