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
MAIN FEATURES

In July 1988 there were 10,054 schools operating in Australia. Of these, 7,535 (74.9 per cent) were government schools operated by the State Directors-General of Education (or equivalent) and 2,519 (25.1 per cent) were non-government schools. The number of government schools in Australia has fallen by 40 since July 1987, while the number of non-government schools has increased by 15.

The number of full-time students attending these schools in July 1988 totalled 3,022,329 comprising 2,197,703 (72.7 per cent) in government schools and 824,626 (27.3 per cent) in non-government schools. In 1987 non-government comprised 26.9 per cent of full-time students.

The number of full-time students attending government schools in 1988 increased marginally (961) from the 2,196,742 attending in 1987, while the number of full-time students attending non-government schools increased by 2.0 per cent (16,485) from the 808,141 attending in 1987.

The apparent retention rate of secondary school students to year 12 rose from 53.1 per cent in 1987 to 57.6 per cent in 1988. As in previous years, the retention rate for female students (61.8 per cent) was higher than the corresponding rate for males (53.4). The rate varied between States and Territories, ranging from 37.6 per cent in Tasmania to 81.4 per cent in the Australian Capital Territory.

The number of teaching staff at government and non-government schools in July 1988 comprised 186,188 full-time staff, and 26,011 part-time staff who contributed 13,572 full-time equivalent (FTE) staff units giving a total FTE teaching staff of 199,760.


There was the equivalent of 148,905 full-time teaching staff in government schools in July 1988, a marginal decrease of 67 since 1987, while teaching staff in non-government schools totalled 50,855 full-time equivalent units, an increase of 2.6 per cent (1,312). The non-government sector comprised 25.5 per cent of teaching staff (FTE) in 1988 and 25.0 per cent in 1987.

NOTE

The statistics in this publication relate to government and non-government schools, staff, and full-time students, and were collected through the National Schools Statistics Collection which was established through the work of the Australian Education Council School Statistics Committee of which the ABS is a member.





















APPARENT RETENTION RATES

The following three tables relate to apparent retention rates. Care should be exercised in the interpretation of these tables, since a range of factors affecting their calculation have not been taken into account. At the Australia level these include students repeating a year of education, migration and other net changes to the school population.

In Table 12, at the State level additional factors affecting the data, such as enrolment policies (which contribute to different age/grade structures between states), inter sector transfer and interstate movements of students have not been taken into account. It is also important to note that enrolment patterns in schools/TAFEs vary between States, with differing effects on school retention rates.

The apparent retention rates in the following Table 13 show the percentage of students who continued to Years 10, 11 or 12 in 1988 from their respective cohort groups at the commencement of their secondary schooling. For example, Year 10 in 1988 retained 96.2 per cent of students who commenced Year 7 in NSW, Vic, Tas. and ACT in 1985 and Year 8 in Qld, WA, SA and NT in 1986, representing the first year of their secondary schooling.


In Table 14, comparision between government and non-government school retention rates should be made with caution due to the effect that student transfer from government to non-government schools has on the apparent retention rate figures. For example, the Anglican figures in 1988 show an apparent retention rate in excess of one hundred per cent. This has been caused by transfer from other schools into the cohort group after the base year, thus inflating the real situation.



EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains statistics of government and non-government schools, staff and full-time students, as at July 1988.

2. The National Schools Statistics Collection (NSSC) series was established through the work of the Australian Education Council School Statistics Committee (AECSSC), of which the ABS is a member. The AECSSC was established in 1979 by the Australian Education Council to improve the quality of education statistics relating to government and non-government primary and secondary education. It has developed a set of concepts, definitions and classifications for use in the National Schools Statistics Collection.

Scope and coverage

- 3. The statistics in this publication relate to establishments which have as their major activity the administration and/or provision of full-time day primary, secondary or special education, or primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence. Major activity is based on the activity of students or, where this is not appropriate, on the activity of staff in full-time equivalent units (FTE -see paragraph 23 for details of the calculations). Those establishments at which some other activity is major are excluded; therefore the statistics presented do not include establishments, students or staff engaged in such activities as the Tertiary Orientation Programs conducted by Technical and Further Education Institutions in Victoria.
- 4. Statistics for the *government* series relate to all establishments administered by the Department of Education under the Director-General of Education (or equivalent) in each State/Territory, students attending those establishments and all staff engaged in the administration/provision of government school education at those establishments. Statistics for the *non-government* series relate to all establishments not administered by the Departments of Education and include special schools administered by Government authorities other than the State/Territory Departments of Education.

Census date

5. The census date for the collection was 1 July 1988 (or as near as possible to that date).

Definitions

- 6. A non-special school must satisfy the following criteria:
 - (a) Its major activity is:
 - (i) the provision of full-time day primary or secondary education or,
 - (ii) the provision of primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence;
 - (b) It is headed by a principal (or equivalent) respon-

sible for its internal operation; and

- (c) It is possible for students to enrol for a minimum of four continuous weeks, excluding breaks for school vacations.
- 7. A special school is one which provides special instruction for physically and/or mentally handicapped students, or those with social problems. Students must exhibit one or more of the following characteristics before enrolment is allowed:
 - (i) mental or physical handicap, slow learning ability;
 - (ii) social or emotional problems;
 - (iii) in custody, on remand, in hospital.
- 8. The term 'school' in this publication includes schools in institutions and hospitals, mission schools and similar establishments. The term excludes pre-schools, kindergarten centres, pre-primary schools or pre-primary classes in or attached to non-special schools, senior technical and agricultural colleges, evening schools, continuation classes, and institutions such as business or coaching colleges.
- 9. An Ancillary Education Establishment (AEE) is an establishment where the major activity is the provision of aspects of primary, secondary or special education to students supplementary to that provided by schools. AEEs include those education establishments in institutions and hospitals which do not have officially recognised student enrolments.

Note: In this publication AEE data include students and staff only.

- 10. Other education establishments within the scope of these statistics, but not defined as schools or Ancillary Education Establishments, include:
 - (a) Administrative offices which have as their major activity the administration of primary, secondary or special education; and
 - (b) Teacher resource centres operated by a State Director-General of Education.
- 11. Category of school refers to the classification of schools/AEEs to the government or non-government sector for the purposes of this collection.
- 12. Affiliation of non-government schools is classified to three groups: Anglican, Catholic and Other. Included in the 'Other' category are schools with specific religious affiliations (other than Anglican and Catholic) and schools that are inter-denominational, non-denominational or which have no religious affiliation.

- 13. A student is a person who is enrolled in a school and active in a course of study other than pre-school or Technical and Further Education (TAFE) courses. Persons absent at the census date are included if they were expected to be absent for less than four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) and are excluded if they had left the school or had been absent without explanation for four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) prior to the census date.
 - (a) A full-time student is one who undertakes a workload specified as full-time in the government or non-government sector.
 - (b) A part-time student is one who undertakes a workload less than that specified as full-time in either sector.

The method used to determine student workload varies between States.

Note: This publication details full-time students only, with the exception of Table 3, which includes the full-time equivalent (FTE) of part-time students, calculated on the basis of the workload of a full-time student.

- 14. Level/Year of education is defined as follows:
 - (a) Primary education is that full-time education which typically commences at around age 5 and lasts for seven to eight years. It does not include sessional education such as pre-school education. In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, primary education may extend from Pre-Year 1 to Year 6 (or equivalent). In South Australia and Northern Territory it may extend from Pre-Year 1 to Year 7 (or equivalent). In Queensland and Western Australia it may extend from Year 1 to Year 7 (or equivalent).
 - (b) Secondary education is that education which typically commences at around age 12 after completion of primary education and lasts for five or six years. In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, secondary education may extend from Year 7 to Year 12 (or equivalent). In Queensland, Western Australia, South Australia and Northern Territory it may extend from Year 8 to Year 12 (or equivalent).
 - (c) Special education in this collection refers only to that education provided at special schools. There is no lower or upper age limit for students in special schools.

Note: Prior to the 1985 NSSC collection, some full-time students attending special classes at non-special schools were classified to the 'special education' category. Special education data from 1985 onwards in this publication refer only to special schools.

15. There is no Australia-wide standard method of allocating students and classes to a certain year of education (grade). A number of schools (other than special schools)

do not maintain a formal grade structure. Students at these schools have been allocated to equivalent grades where possible but otherwise appear against the category ungraded in either the primary or secondary levels of education.

16. The apparent retention rate is the percentage of students of a given cohort group who continued to a particular Level/Year of education. In this publication, apparent retention rates are calculated for students who continued to Years 10, 11 and 12 of secondary schooling. Care should be exercised in the interpretation of apparent retention rates since a range of factors affecting calculation have not been taken into account. At the Australia level these include students repeating a year of education, migration and other net changes to the school population. At lower levels of disaggregation, additional factors affecting the data, such as enrolment policies (which contribute to different age/grade structures between States), inter-sector transfer and interstate movements of students have not been taken into account. International comparisons are another area where structural differences. must be taken into account.

Note: Part-time students are excluded from apparent retention rates; the effect of this exclusion varies between States.

17. One example of the calculation of apparent retention rates is as follows:

To calculate the apparent retention rate, at the Australia level, of the student cohort group who are currently (1988) in Year 10 from their commencement in secondary schooling (as shown in Tables 13 and 14), the total number of students in Year 10 in 1988 is divided by the sum of students in Year 7 in New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory in 1985 and students in Year 8 in Queensland, Western Australia, South Australia and the Northern Territory in 1986 (since those Years represent the commencement of the secondary school system in the respective States). The resultant figure is converted to a percentage.

18. Staff are persons who are involved in the administration or provision of primary, secondary or special education. Staff are categorised as school staff or as non-school staff. School staff include all teaching staff and those non-teaching staff who spend more than half their time actively engaged in duties in one or more schools/AEEs.

Note: This publication contains details of non-school staff for the government series only, since equivalent data are not available for the non-government series.

19. Teaching staff are staff who spend the majority of their time in contact with students and have teaching duties, i.e. are engaged to impart the school curriculum or are engaged in the provision of services for the direct benefit of students. Teaching staff are usually employed under a teacher's award or equivalent. Also included for the purposes of this collection are principals, deputy prin-

cipals and senior teachers mainly involved in administrative duties.

- 20. Non-teaching staff are staff who provide support services and who do not spend the majority of their time in contact with students. Included in this category are those engaged as teacher aides, library assistants, clerks, typists, maintenance workers, etc.
- 21. Executive staff are non-teaching, non-school staff generally undertaking functions of a senior administrative type, of a nature broader than that of a principal, and whose salary generally exceeds that of a principal. They include Directors-General of Education, directors and their deputies and inspectors/superintendents.
- 22. Type of Employment identifies staff as either full-time or part-time.
 - (a) Full-time staff are those who perform the full allocation of duties specified as full-time in the relevant award, contract or administrative arrangement. However, persons who are employed full-time but part of whose duties are out-of-scope of the collection (e.g. pre-school, TAFE, etc.) have been regarded as part-time.
 - (b) Part-time staff are staff who are not employed full-time, or who are employed full-time but part of whose duties are out-of-scope of this collection (e.g. pre-school, TAFE, etc.).

Note: Emergency and casual relief teaching staff employed on a casual basis are not included in this collection as they replace permanent teaching staff absent for short periods of time. These permanent teaching staff are already counted in this collection.

- 23. The full-time equivalent (FTE) of a full-time staff member (i.e. employed full-time and engaged solely on in-scope activities) is equal to 1.0. The calculation of FTE for part-time staff is as follows:
 - (a) The full-time equivalent of part-time staff performing some out-of-scope activities is calculated on the basis of the proportion of time spent on inscope activities compared with that spent by a full-time staff member solely occupied by in-scope activities.
 - (b) The full-time equivalent of part-time staff performing solely in-scope activities is calculated on the basis of time worked compared with that worked by full-time staff performing similar duties.

Note: Some States are not able to calculate full-time equivalent on a time spent basis for all staff functions but use wages paid as a fraction of full-time rate, or a resource allocation based formula. Some also use a pro rata formula based on student or teacher numbers to estimate aggregate FTE for some categories of staff.

24. The area of activity of staff is considered to be primary education, secondary education or education

conducted in special schools. As a rule, the FTE of staff is apportioned across areas of activity on the basis of time spent in the various areas of activity.

Methodology

25. These statistics are compiled from collections conducted in co-operation with the AECSSC by the State/Territory Departments of Education (government series) and the Commonwealth Department of Employment, Education and Training (non-government series).

Note:

- (a) The methodologies employed by State Departments of Education in the government sector in compiling the State aggregates on which the statistics in this publication are based vary from State to State. They range from manipulation of central administrative records to direct collection of data from establishments.
- (b) The Commonwealth Department of Employment, Education and Training collects data directly from establishments in the non-government sector for all States and Territories. The statistics in this publication are a summary of that collection.

Interpretation of results

26. The ABS has published education statistics for many years. However prior to the implementation of the NSSC, the data were not necessarily comparable between States. With the implementation of the NSSC concepts, the definitions, classifications and coverage were revised. The new government series was implemented in 1981 and the non-government series in 1984. Therefore, care should be exercised when comparing data in this publication with that prior to 1981 and 1984 for the government and nongovernment series respectively, and between the two series from 1981 to 1983. In interpreting the figures in this publication, users should be aware that, because of the diversity of the Australian education system and its administration, the statistics reported in this publication are not entirely comparable. Comparability of statistics between States and between government and non-government schools in any one State is affected by differences in the organisation of grades, policy on student intake and advancement, flows from secondary to vocational education and the recruitment and employment of teachers.

27. The Education Department of South Australia has advised that the apparent increase in the number of students in Reception Year since 1985 is the result of the implementation of the 'First Years of School Policy' which commenced at the beginning of 1985 requiring all students to spend 7 to 10 terms under the 3-term year (or 10 to 13 terms under the 4-term year) prior to entry to Year 3. Previously students could move from Reception to Year 1 in the same year or from a full Reception year to Year 2 in the following year. The new policy has resulted in additional students being retained in the lower Year levels. In particular, prior to 1985, in order to retain a cohort group of Year 1 (for statistical purposes), any Reception students expected to be in Year 2 in the following year were designated as Year 1 students.

- 28. The Education Department of Tasmania has advised that changes in enumeration methods introduced in 1987 have resulted in an apparent decrease of 253 FTE in teaching staff and an apparent increase of 287 FTE in non-teaching staff since 1986. Although total staff data is unaffected, care should be taken when comparing this and future years' data with data prior to 1987.
- 29. The Education Department of the Northern Territory has advised that the increase in teaching staff for 1987 was due mainly to the inclusion of assistant teachers for Aboriginal Homeland Centres. There were 189 such persons with an FTE of 165.9.
- 30. In previous years Table 19, Executive staff, consisted of two groups:
 - (a) Senior executive officers, and
 - (b) Inspectors/ superintendents.

For 1988, this table is published at the Total level only. The main reason for this change is that the Victorian Ministry of Education advised that due to a restructuring of the Schools Division, the functions of Inspectors/superintendents no longer exist. Staff previously included in this group are now included either in this table or in other tables according to their new functions.

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STRUCTURE OF PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLING

The structure of primary and secondary schooling in Australia varies between the different States and Territories. There are three basic patterns evident, as illustrated below.

In South Australia and Northern Territory the primary system comprises a Reception or Transition grade followed by Years 1 to 7. The secondary system comprises Years 8 to 12.

In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory the primary system comprises a Kindgergarten or Preparatory grade followed by Years 1 to 6. The secondary system comprises Years 7 to 12.

In Queensland and Western Australia the primary system comprises Years 1 to 7 and the secondary system Years 8 to 12.

Each State and Territory also has a pre-school sector which is separate from primary and secondary schooling. Data on pre-school education within schools have been excluded from primary enrolments in this publication.
