


DEC QTR 1995 KEY POINTS

TREND ESTIMATES

- GDP(A) increased 0.8% in December quarter to a level 3.3% higher than in December quarter 1994.
- GDP(E) and GDP(P) both recorded growth rates of 0.9%, while GDP(I) grew at a somewhat lower rate of 0.6%.
- The terms of trade increased 0.5% in the December quarter. This resulted in an increase of 0.8% in real gross domestic income, in comparison with the 0.6% growth in GDP(I).
- Gross farm product increased 5.0% in December quarter, while gross non-farm product increased 0.7%.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- GDP(A) increased 0.5% in December quarter and is now 3.1% higher than in December quarter 1994.
- All measures of GDP recorded lower growth rates in December quarter than in September quarter 1995.
- Gross fixed capital expenditure fell by 2.0% in December quarter, the largest fall since June quarter 1991, due to falls of 1.2% and 4.8% in the private and public sectors, respectively.
- The implicit price deflator for GDP rose by 0.3% in December quarter to a level 2.9% higher than in December quarter 1994.

DETAILED INTERNATIONAL TRADE DATA

The March quarter 1996 issue of *Balance of Payments, Australia* (5302.0) is expected to be released on 31 May 1996, two days after the March quarter national accounts (5206.0). However, copies of tables which show the details of exports and imports of goods and services underlying the data published in 5206.0, and which are included in 5302.0, will be available on request from Mr Michael Morgan (telephone (06) 252 6716) after the release of the March quarter 1996 national accounts publication.

REVISIONS IN THIS ISSUE

Quarterly estimates for all aggregates have been revised in accordance with revised annual benchmark estimates which will be published in *Australian National Accounts: National Income, Expenditure and Product 1994-95* (5204.0), scheduled for release in May 1996. In addition, seasonally adjusted estimates have been revised following the annual reanalysis of seasonally adjusted series (see the notes on page 11 for a description of changes to the method used to derive seasonally adjusted GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and the incorporation of a "seasonal break" correction from December quarter 1993 for wages, salaries and supplements).

Estimates for the household saving ratio have been reduced over the last three years following the incorporation of benchmark information from income tax statistics for 1993-94, and the 1993-94 Household Expenditure Survey. As a consequence, estimates of unincorporated income have been reduced and those for private final consumption expenditure on services have been increased. Both of these series of revisions have contributed to lower estimates for household saving.

Estimates of GDP(P) have been revised for all years as a result of revised base year (1989-90) gross product estimates for most industries. In addition, estimates for recent quarters have been revised due to the availability of more complete survey data. In particular, the seasonally adjusted growth for June quarter 1995 has been revised down from 1.4% to 0.8% as a result of a large negative revision to the manufacturing growth for that quarter (from 1.5% to -1.3%). These revisions are based on the revised manufacturers' sales data for June quarter 1995 recently released in the December quarter 1995 issue of *Stocks, Selected Industry Sales and Expected Sales, Australia* (5629.0).

DECEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure grew by 1.0% (1.2% seasonally adjusted). The only categories to show declines were cigarettes and tobacco, furniture and floorcoverings, and purchases of motor vehicles. Government consumption rose 0.3%.

PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- Dwelling construction fell 4.6% (-5.8% seasonally adjusted) in December quarter, the fifth consecutive quarterly decline. Investment in equipment fell by 1.1% following a fall of 0.7% in September quarter (-1.2% in December quarter and -3.1% in September quarter, seasonally adjusted). By contrast there was a strong growth of 7.3% (3.7% seasonally adjusted) in non-dwelling construction in December quarter. Overall, private GFCE fell 0.5% compared with an increase of 1.2% in seasonally adjusted terms.

INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- The strong build-up in private non-farm stocks over recent quarters continued, but at a slightly slower rate, with an increase of \$706 million in December quarter following an increase of \$746 million in September quarter. The seasonally adjusted increases were \$1,215 million in September quarter and \$423 million in December quarter which resulted in a negative contribution to growth of -0.7 percentage points from this source in December quarter. Private non-farm stocks have built up for the last twelve quarters.

Comments are based on trend constant price estimates, unless otherwise stated.

DECEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHING

- Increased 4.6% (1.2% in seasonally adjusted terms), reflecting much higher crop production in 1995-96.

MANUFACTURING

- Both the trend and seasonally adjusted estimates rose 0.4%. In seasonally adjusted terms, sales showed a healthy increase but this was largely offset by a much weaker change in stocks of finished goods and work-in-progress than occurred in the September quarter.

CONSTRUCTION

- An increase of 0.8% follows a period of low growth over the previous four quarters. In seasonally adjusted terms, the 0.2% increase reflects strong growth in engineering construction and a fall in building activity.

WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

- In trend terms wholesale and retail trade continued to show steady growth with both rising 0.8%. The seasonally adjusted movements were 2.3% and 0.6%, respectively.

COMMUNICATION

- A 3.7% increase in the trend estimate contributed to a rise of 16.1% since the December quarter 1994.


WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

- Rose 1.9% (2.0% in seasonally adjusted terms).
- The rise reflects an increase of 0.5% in the number of wage and salary earners and 1.4% in the underlying average earnings. The corresponding changes in seasonally adjusted terms were a rise of 0.3% in the number of wage and salary earners and an increase of 1.7% in underlying average earnings.


GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS

- GOS of private corporate trading enterprises increased 0.7% in December quarter but declined 1.2% in seasonally adjusted terms.
- Quarterly growth rates in GOS have slowed markedly over the last six quarters.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. This means that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring Trends; An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in March quarter 1996.

Seasonally adjusted growth of 1.0% is required in March quarter 1996 to maintain the trend growth, in March quarter, of 0.8% currently estimated for December quarter 1995.

TREND ESTIMATE — PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN GDP(A)



The graph below provides a comparison of the quarterly growth rates (percentage changes) in constant price GDP(A) in both seasonally adjusted and trend terms in recent years.


Percentage changes



HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the December quarter was 98.5%. The balance, household saving, was 1.5% (see note on revisions on page 2). Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can cause changes in the apparent direction of the trend. The following graph presents the household saving ratio derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).



PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In trend current price terms, the book value of private non-farm stocks increased by \$1,059 million (1.6%), while sales increased by \$741 million (1.0%). Consequently the stocks to sales ratio increased from 0.892 to 0.898. The following graph presents the ratio of private non-farm stocks to sales over the last fourteen years (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).


Trend at Current Prices



IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended and at current prices, fell to 0.251 in December quarter 1995, from 0.257 in September quarter. The following graph presents the ratio of imports to sales over the last fourteen years (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 25).

Trend at Current Prices



TERMS OF TRADE

In December quarter 1995 the terms of trade index derived from trend estimates (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) rose 0.5%. A decrease of 0.4% in the implicit price deflator (IPD) for exports was more than offset by a decrease of 0.9% in the IPD for imports.


Trend (1989-90 = 100)



REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the Technical Note included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below provides a comparison of trend GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and real gross domestic income. Trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of real gross domestic income are shown in Tables 68 and 69 respectively.

PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE— NON-DWELLING CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT

Movements in private gross fixed capital expenditure can often be affected by large second-hand transactions and large one-off purchases. Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors, expenditure on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction are provided in the table below.

GROSS FARM PRODUCT (continued) (A more detailed description of the seasonal adjustment of gross farm product is provided in Appendix 1 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).)

FARM TREND ESTIMATES

In order to minimise revisions to the trend estimates for gross farm product for the last three quarters the usual procedures have been modified to take account of the higher level of farm production expected throughout 1995-96. The modification this quarter involves extending the seasonally adjusted gross farm product series for the last two quarters of 1995-96 using forecasts and calculating the trend estimates using the extended series. This method of calculating the trend estimates for farm product at current and constant prices resulted in minor differences to June and September quarters 1995 and decreases of \$87 million and \$40 million, respectively, to the current and constant price estimates for December quarter 1995.

These differences have been used to adjust the "normal" trend estimates of gross operating surplus of unincorporated enterprises on the income side of the domestic production account and public marketing authority stocks on the expenditure side. The adjustments to trend estimates of gross farm product at average 1989-90 prices have thus been incorporated in the constant price trend estimates of GDP(I), GDP(E), and GDP(P).

WAGES SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

Quarterly movements in wages, salaries and supplements can at times be significantly affected by changes in the level of severance, termination and redundancy payments or in the level of supplements to wages and salaries (ie employers' contributions to superannuation and workers' compensation claims). Employers' contributions to superannuation were increased in September quarter 1995 as a consequence of the one percentage point increase in the minimum employer contribution required from 1 July 1995, under the Superannuation Guarantee Levy legislation. Severance, termination and redundancy payments for recent quarters are shown below (although an estimate for December quarter 1995 is not yet available) together with estimates for supplements for the last nine quarters. (The estimates can be shown only in original terms because wages, salaries and supplements are seasonally adjusted in total.)

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS (continued)

- SEASONAL REANALYSIS — GDP(I) AT AVERAGE 1989-90 PRICES** The methods used to seasonally adjust the constant price estimates of GDP(I) and GNFP(I) for the latest base year period have been changed. Previously, the constant price estimates of gross non-farm product derived using the income approach (GNFP(I)) were seasonally adjusted directly. The resulting estimates were added to the seasonally adjusted constant price estimates of gross farm product (GFP) to obtain the seasonally adjusted constant price estimates of GDP(I). The new method uses the implicit price deflators derived from the seasonally adjusted current and constant price estimates of GDP(E) to deflate the seasonally adjusted current price estimates of GDP(I) to obtain the seasonally adjusted constant price estimates of GDP(I). The seasonally adjusted constant price estimates of GFP are subtracted from the resulting estimates to obtain the seasonally adjusted constant price estimates of GNFP(I). As a result of these changes, the implicit price deflators derived from the seasonally adjusted estimates of GDP(I) and GDP(E) are the same (except for the occasional rounding difference) and those derived from the seasonally adjusted estimates of GNFP(I) and GNFP(E) are very similar.
- SEASONAL REANALYSIS — WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS** For a number of years the seasonal pattern of wages, salaries and supplements has been changing. In the past, the figures displayed a very strong seasonal pattern, with December quarter "seasonally high" and March quarter "seasonally low" due to such factors as the prepayment of holiday pay, leave loadings and Christmas bonuses. Over time, the seasonal pattern has become less pronounced, with December quarter becoming less seasonally high and March quarter becoming less seasonally low. For the most part, the change has been quite gradual, but for the December quarter 1993 and the March quarter 1994 the change in the seasonal pattern appears to have been much greater than either before or since. While the method used to seasonally adjust the series can adapt to gradual changes in seasonal pattern reasonably well, it is unable to adapt quickly to major abrupt changes. For this reason, and as explained in previous issues of this publication, special adjustments were made to the original estimates to remove the abrupt change. This was a temporary solution until such time had elapsed that it was possible to make a reasonable estimate of the magnitude of the abrupt change in seasonal pattern. Such an estimate has now been made and incorporated in the seasonal adjustment process by incorporating a "seasonal break" correction between the September and December quarters 1993. As a result, revisions to both the original and seasonally adjusted estimates have ensued.
- GROSS FARM PRODUCT** Gross farm product rose 17.6% in seasonally adjusted constant price terms in the September quarter 1995. On a seasonally adjusted basis, production of wheat, other grain crops and other crops increased significantly.
- It should be noted that the convention used to seasonally adjust wheat, sugar cane, other grain crops and other crops has particular implications for the interpretation of quarter to quarter changes in seasonally adjusted gross farm product. The method used is to divide the annual production of these crops by four and allocate this amount to each of the four quarters in a financial year. Although this avoids problems that would be associated with the application of standard methods of seasonal adjustment to the production of crops, it introduces a step in the seasonally adjusted estimates between June and September quarters because it concentrates the whole of the annual change for these crops into the September quarter, followed by zero growth in December, March and June quarters.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains estimates of the components of gross domestic product and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, pages 13–14, show the full range of data provided.

CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

2 These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). In association with the introduction of constant price estimates at average 1989–90 prices, some of the methods used to derive constant price estimates were changed. The major changes are described in Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989–90 Prices* (5243.0).

ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

3 Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

REVISIONS

4 Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Major revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

TREND ESTIMATES

5 Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

6 A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters has changed.

7 If a series has a high 'irregular' component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

TREND ESTIMATES (continued)

8 For more information about ABS procedures for deriving trend estimates and an analysis of the advantages of using them over alternative techniques for monitoring trends, see *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring 'Trends': an Overview* (1348.0) or contact the Assistant Director, Time Series Analysis on (06) 252 6345.

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFULATOR (IPD)

9 The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates. Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT:

GENERAL METHOD

10 Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here:

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(I)

INCOME APPROACH

11 GDP(I) is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of GDP(E).

GDP(E)

EXPENDITURE APPROACH

12 GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E) are the sum of all these components at average 1989–90 prices.

GDP(P)

PRODUCTION APPROACH

13 GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989–90 prices) for each industry.

MEASURES OF GDP (continued)

GDP(A) **14** While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS
TO GROWTH

15 Tables 6 and 7 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100$$

where

$A(t)$ = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration

$A(t-1)$ = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter

$GDP(t-1)$ = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

TERMS OF TRADE

16 There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used:

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 11, 12, 18, 19, 68 and 69.

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

17 GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Technical Note* included in the September 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 68 and 69.

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT
OF LABOUR INPUT

18 Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economies of scale, etc.).

19 When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer-term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

20 A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market* sectors are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM
MARKET SECTORS

21 The estimates of gross product at constant prices for six industries: Finance and insurance; Property and business services; Government administration and defence; Education; Health and community services; and Personal and other services are derived either wholly or primarily by using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purpose of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be $\text{GDP}(P)$ less the above six industries, less Ownership of dwellings (for which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), plus the imputed bank service charge related to the 'non-market' industries.

22 A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector less Agriculture, forestry and fishing. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of agricultural production due to changing seasonal conditions.

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND
HOURS WORKED

23 The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed, refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS
SALES RATIO

24 The ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69. The denominator of this ratio, in current price terms, is defined as :

- private final consumption expenditure on goods
- plus private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings, non-dwelling construction and equipment
- plus public gross fixed capital expenditure
- plus exports of non-rural goods.

IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

25 The ratio is merchandise imports (ie total imports of goods) to sales (as defined in paragraph 24 above). This ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69.

HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

26 This is the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is a memorandum item in Tables 27 and 28 and is also shown in Table 67.

GDP(A) PER CAPITA

27 This is the ratio of GDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.

DATA ON FLOPPY DISK

28 All quarterly series in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk, *Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk* (5228.0). These data generally run from September quarter 1959. An important exception is GDP(P) and its components which run from September quarter 1974.
