

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

March quarter 1996 compared with December quarter 1995—

Excess of merchandise exports or imports

In the March quarter 1996 merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by \$187 million. The decrease of \$599 million in the deficit on merchandise trade occurred mainly as a result of a decrease in imports which was partly offset by a smaller decrease in exports.


Australia's trade with its major trading partners produced deficits with:

- USA, up \$325 million (10%) to \$3,517 million;
- UK, down \$180 million (31%) to \$402 million.

Surpluses were recorded with:

- Japan, down \$96 million (7%) to \$1,378 million;
- Republic of Korea, up \$40 million (4%) to \$1,066 million;
- New Zealand, down S128 million (23%) to S417 million;
- Taiwan, up \$164 million (126%) to \$294 million.
- Singapore, up \$123 million (76%) to \$284 million;
- China, a turnaround of S128 million from a deficit of \$96 million to a surplus of \$32 million.


GRAPH I: AUSTRALIA'S QUARTERLY TRADE WITH MAJOR COUNTRIES Excess of exports(+) or imports(-)



Merchandise exports

Merchandise exports for March quarter 1996 were \$18,832 million, down \$224 million or 1 per cent on the previous quarter.

GRAPH 2: MERCHANDISE EXPORTS



The export commodity groups recording significant decreases on the previous quarter were:

- machinery and transport equipment, down \$252 million (10%) to \$2,294 million (due mainly to decreased exports of electrical machinery; office machines and computers; and machinery specialised for particular industries);
- crude materials, inedible, except fuels, down \$186 million (5%) to \$3,435 million (due mainly to decreased exports of textile fibres and their wastes);
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, down \$154 million (6%) to \$2,304 million (due mainly to decreased exports of non-ferrous metals; manufactures of metal nes; and iron and steel).

Increases were recorded for food and live animals, up \$158 million (4%) to \$4,081 million (due mainly to significantly increased exports of cereals which were partly offset by decreases in sugar and meat); and commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere in the SITC, up \$283 million (16%) to \$2,043 million (due mainly to increased exports of gold).


Australia's major export destinations were:

- Japan, down \$319 million (8%) to \$3,877 million;
- Republic of Korea, down S51 million (3%) to \$1,577 million;
- New Zealand, down \$181 million (12%) to \$1,285 million;
- USA, down \$101 million (9%) to \$1,087 million;
- China, up S81 million (8%) to \$1,063 million;
- Taiwan, up \$106 million (13%) to \$911 million;
- Singapore, down S68 million (7%) to \$853 million; and
- United Kingdom, up \$82 million (12%) to \$771 million.

Merchandise imports

Merchandise imports for March quarter 1996 were \$19,020 million, down \$822 million or 4 per cent on the previous quarter.

The import commodity groups recording significant decreases on the previous quarter were:

- machinery and transport equipment, down \$702 million (7%) to \$8,708 million (due mainly to decreased imports of road vehicles; transport equipment; and telecommunications and sound recording and reproducing apparatus); and
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, down \$223 million (8%) to \$2,637 million (due mainly to decreased imports of paper and paperboard; manufactures of metals, nes; and iron and steel).

Increases were recorded for mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, up \$215 million (22%) to \$1,176 million (due to increased imports of petroleum, petroleum products and related materials); and chemical and related products nes, up \$170 million (8%) to \$2,312 million (due to increased imports of fertilisers, and organic and inorganic chemicals).

Australia's major import sources were:

- USA, up \$225 million (5%) to \$4,604 million;
- Japan, down \$223 million (8%) to \$2,498 million;
- UK, down \$98 million (8%) to \$1,173 million;
- Germany, down \$38 million (3%) to \$1,166 million:
- China, down \$48 million (4%) to \$1,030 million;
- New Zealand, down \$54 million (6%) to \$867 million:
- Taiwan, down \$58 million (9%) to \$617 million;
- Singapore, down \$191 million (25%) to \$569 million.

Year ended March 1996 compared with year ended March 1995 —

Excess of merchandise exports or imports


For the year ended March 1996 merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by \$3,917 million, a decrease of \$1,665 million on the deficit recorded for the previous year.

Australia's trade with its major trading partners produced deficits with:

- USA, up \$2,300 million (22%) to \$12,866 million;
- UK, up \$125 million (6%) to \$2,056 million; and
- China, down \$54 million (9%) to \$539 million.

Surpluses were recorded with Japan, up \$1,822 million (52%) to \$5,329 million; Republic of Korea, up \$1,068 million (36%) to \$4,043 million; New Zealand, up \$718 million (65%) to \$1,826 million; Singapore, down \$274 million (20%) to \$1,369 million; and Taiwan, up \$470 million (119%) to \$865 million.

Merchandise exports


Merchandise exports for the year ended March 1996 were \$74,151 million, up \$8,325 million or 13 per cent on the previous year.

The exports commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous year were:

- machinery and transport equipment, up \$1,511 million (19%) to \$9,499 million (due to increased exports in most categories with the largest being in transport equipment; computers; electrical machinery; and machinery specialised for particular industries);
- food and live animals, up \$1,456 million (11%) to \$14,322 million (due mainly to increased exports of cereals and live animals);
- mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, up \$1,359 million (12%) to \$12,275 million (with all categories contributing to the increase, coal being the most significant); and

 manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, up \$1,104 million (13%) to \$9,821 million (due mainly to increased exports of non-ferrous metals; and iron and steel).


GRAPH 5. COMMODITY COMPOSITION (SITC SECTION) OF EXPORTS



Australia's major export destinations were:

- Japan, up \$467 million (3%) to \$16,600 million;
- Republic of Korea, up \$1,405 million (29%) to \$6,293 million;
- New Zealand, up \$851 million (18%) to \$5,446 million;
- USA, down \$101 million (2%) to \$4,586 million;
- Singapore, up \$36 million (1%) to \$3,622 million;
- Taiwan, up \$543 million (19%) to \$3,470 million;
- China, up \$482 million (16%) to \$3,434 million;
- Hong Kong, up S442 million (17%) to \$3,040 million.

Merchandise imports


Merchandise imports for the year ended March 1996 were \$78,068 million, up \$6,660 million or 9 per cent on the previous year.

The imports commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous year were:

- machinery and transport equipment, up \$3,317 million (10%) to \$36,574 million (due to increased imports in most categories, with the largest being in electrical machinery; computers; telecommunications equipment; and general industrial machinery and equipment);
- chemical and related products nes, up \$1,205 million (16%) to \$8,856 million (with all categories contributing to the increase); and
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, up \$821 million (8%) to \$11,289 million (due mainly to increased imports of paper, paperboard, and articles of paper pulp; iron and steel; and manufactures of metals).

Decreases were recorded for crude materials, inedible, except fuels, down \$53 million (3%) to \$1,685 million (due mainly to decreased imports of cork and wood); and commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere, down \$44 million (5%) to \$801 million (due to decreased imports of gold).


GRAPH 7: COMMODITY COMPOSITION (SITC SECTION) OF IMPORTS



Australia's major import sources were:

- USA, up \$2,198 million (14%) to \$17,451 million;
- Japan, down \$1,356 million (11%) to \$11,270 million;
- Germany, up \$661 million (15%) to \$5,081 million;
- UK, up \$573 million (14%) to \$4,790 million;
- China, up \$427 million (12%) to \$3,972 million;
- New Zealand, up \$133 million (4%) to \$3,620 million;
- Taiwan, up \$73 million (3%) to \$2,605 million; and
- Singapore, up \$309 million (14%) to \$2,527 million

REVISIONS

Revisions since the last issue of this publication have:

- increased total exports for the December quarter 1995 by \$48 million, and increased total exports for the year ended December 1995 by \$59 million;
- reduced total imports for the December quarter 1995 by \$16 million, and decreased total imports for the twelve months ended December 1995 by \$19 million; and

 decreased the merchandise trade deficit for the December quarter 1995 by \$64 million; and for the year ended December 1995 by \$77 million.

These revisions resulted from generally small changes to a large number of commodities and countries, with no significant contributor,

In addition, some revisions have been made to Exports by Industry of Origin presented in Table 9. Exports and imports statistics classified by Industry of Origin are compiled by allocating commodity items of the Australian Harmonized Export Commodity Classification and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to industry classes in the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification based on the main economic activities with which the commodities are primarily associated. A full review of these linkages is currently being undertaken and some changes have been made based on preliminary results. The only significant change at the level of detail presented in this publication is the transfer of exports of alumina (valued at \$2,442 million in the year ended December 1995) from the petroleum, coal, chemical and associated products industry to the metal products industry.

The review of linkages will be completed, and any necessary revisions processed, before the next issue of this publication. However, it is not expected that these revisions will be significant.

CHANGES TO THE CLASSIFICATION OF MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS FROM 1 JULY 1996

Overview

On 1 July 1996, a number of changes will be made to detailed commodity codes used in the clearance of goods into and out of Australia. These changes were foreshadowed in the June quarter 1995 issue of this publication and were described in greater detail in an Information Paper, International Merchandise Trade Statistics: 1996 Revision of Commodity Classifications (Cat. No. 5488.0), published by the ABS on 15 August 1995.

- 2. The changes are the result of amendments made to the Harmonized System (HS) by the World Customs Organisation (WCO). The HS is used internationally to record goods shipped between countries, and the changes are being made to ensure that the classification remains dynamic. Roughly 8% of existing 6-digit HS codes will be affected by
 - clarifications;
 - new codes for areas in which trade is becoming more significant;
 - new codes for areas in which interest is growing (cg waste materials); and
 - amalgamation of existing codes for areas in which trade is becoming less significant.
- 3. The Australian Harmonized Export Commodity Classification (AHECC) and Customs Tariff (CT), which are used to record Australia's exports and imports respectively, are detailed extensions to the HS classification. These classifications have been revised to accommodate the WCO changes. During the course of this revision, the ABS consulted widely with importers, exporters and users of statistics to ensure that wherever practicable, the impact of changes was minimised.

User Consultation

- 4. The ABS received more than 1,000 enquiries concerning the revisions and distributed about 700 copies of the Information Paper. Over 100 clients sought copies of 'inventories', ie analyses of changes as they affected detailed codes.
- 5. A number of submissions were received concerning possible loss of statistical detail. The areas identified in submissions included fibreglass; steel wire; fibreboard; semiconductor devices; magnetic media (recorded and unrecorded); paper; television sets; rubber belting; and some primary produce. Less specific issues such as appropriateness of units of quantity used for codes changing with the review, and inclusion of 'parts' in with 'wholes', were also raised.

6. Submissions have been evaluated and, in most cases, accommodated in the revisions. A small minority of investigations returned negative findings due to low levels of trade for the goods in question, inability to identify specific goods, or poor survey response in feasibility studies.

Statistical Impact

- 7. Users of detailed statistics on international merchandise trade based on the HS classification will be most affected by the changes. However, the consultation process outlined above enabled interested users to ensure that continuity was maximised in their particular areas of interest.
- 8. Users of international merchandise trade statistics classified according to less detailed classifications (such as the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev 3), Broad Economic Categories (BEC) and the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (AN-ZSIC)) should not be significantly affected by the WCO changes. Data based on these classifications are compiled by using linkages (concordances) with the AHECC and CT codes at the detailed level. In cases where the AHECC or CT code is to change, the existing concordances have been maintained where possible. However, in a minority of cases, new concordances have had to be calculated. This need has arisen in instances where existing AHECC or CT codes with conflicting concordances have been merged by the WCO changes. To deal with this, ABS has created 13 'dummy' 5-digit SITC codes. These 'dummy' codes will group accurately at broader levels of the classification. At the level of aggregation presented in this publication, the effect of the changes should be negligible.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains quarterly statistics of Australia's merchandise trade with its major trading partners and selected country groups.

2. The merchandise export and import statistics in this publication are compiled in broad agreement with the United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of international trade statistics. The sections below briefly describe the concepts and methods used in their compilation.

Source of data

3. These statistics are compiled by the Australian Bureau of Statistics from information submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Australian Customs Service (ACS).

Scope

4. Merchandise trade covers all movable goods which add to (imports) or subtract from (exports) Australia's stock of material resources.

Excluded are:

- (a) direct transit trade, i.e. goods being trans-shipped or moved through Australia for purposes of transport only;
- (b) ships and aircraft moving through Australia while engaged in the transport of passengers or goods between Australia and other countries; and
- (c) non-merchandise goods, consisting primarily of goods moving on a temporary basis (eg mobile equipment; goods under repair; goods for exhibition; and passengers' effects).

Coverage

- 5. The United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of merchandise trade statistics recognise that the basic source used by most compiling countries the customs record will not be able to capture certain transactions. In Australia the following types of goods which fall within the scope of merchandise trade, are excluded because customs entries are not required:
- (a) certain materials under inter-governmental agreements for defence and similar projects;
- (b) migrants and passengers' effects exported or imported and parcel post exports and imports of small value, for which Customs entries are not required;
- (c) the sale or delivery of certain ships intended for use on overseas routes; and

For exports only:

(d) sales of aircraft (and parts or components) which were imported into Australia prior to 1 July 1987 for use on overseas routes; sales of aircraft (and parts or components) which were imported into Australia on or after 1 July 1987 for use on over-

- seas routes are included in recorded export statisties:
- (e) fish and other sea products landed abroad directly from the high seas by Australian ships; and
- (f) from 1 July 1986 individual transaction lines (within an export consignment) where the value of the goods is less than \$500. Prior to that date, the value level was \$250.

For imports only:

- (g) bunkers, aviation fuel and stores supplied abroad to Australian ships and aircraft;
- (h) prior to 1 July 1987 the delivery of certain aircraft (and parts and components) intended for use on overseas routes; and
- (i) cntries lodged on informal clearance documents (ICDs) for values not exceeding \$250. From 21 October 1985 onwards, ICDs for postal articles valued between \$250 and \$1000 are excluded.

In addition, although merchandise trade statistics should include illegal transactions, such as smuggled goods, these transactions are omitted as there is no practical way to collect this information.

Basis of compilation

- 6. The merchandise trade statistics in this publication are recorded on a general trade basis, i.e. exports include both Australian produce and re-exports, and imports comprise goods entered directly for home consumption together with goods imported into bonded warehouses.
- 7. Australian produce is defined as goods, materials or articles which have been produced or manufactured in Australia. Processing and assembly operations that leave imported components and products essentially unchanged are not considered as production or manufacture.
- 8. Re-exports are defined as goods, materials or articles originally imported into Australia which are exported in the same condition or after undergoing minor operations (e.g. blending, packaging, bottling, cleaning, husking and shelling) which leave them essentially unchanged. Information on re-exports is shown in Table 13.

Statistical Period

- 9. From January 1988, exports are recorded in the calendar month in which the goods departed from Australia. Prior to January 1988, exports are recorded in the month in which the entries were processed by the ACS. For further details on the impact of the changed compilation basis on the merchandise export series refer to the article 'Changed timing basis for compilation of merchandise exports statistics' in the June 1992 issue of this publication.
- 10. Imports are generally recorded statistically in the calendar month in which the import entries are finalised by the ACS. Import entries may be lodged early and finalised prior to arrival, or their finalisation may be delayed because of the various validation checks carried out by ACS. Currently, approximately 85 per cent of total im-

port trade by value shown for a particular month reflects shipments which arrived in that month, while approximately 10 per cent reflects shipments which arrived during the previous month with the remaining 5 per cent by value arriving in earlier or later months. For individual commodities these percentages may vary considerably.

11. Occasionally significant delays occur in the lodgement, rather than processing, of import entries. When the affected entries are for significant values, they are recorded statistically in the month that they should have been lodged and finalised.

Valuation

- 12. The value of exports is the free on board (f.o.b.) transactions value of the goods expressed in Australian dollars. Goods shipped on consignment are initially valued at the f.o.b. Australian port of shipment equivalent of the current price offering for similar goods of Australian origin in the principal markets of the country to which the goods are despatched for sale. Exporters who do not know the value of the goods at shipment and enter an approximate value must subsequently submit an entry either confirming or revising the estimated return.
- 13. The value of imports is the Australian Customs value. Goods are valued at the point of containerisation (in most cases) or the port of shipment, or at the customs frontier of the exporting country, whichever comes first.
- 14. Changes in Customs valuation introduced from 1 July 1989 with the Customs and Excise Legislation Amendment Act 1989 are likely to have marginally raised Customs valuations. Data for periods from 1 July 1989 are therefore not fully comparable with data for previous periods. However, investigations of imports valuations, for years before and after the change have shown no measurable effect on the valuation of imports that can be attributed to the change in legislation. For details of the changes in legislation see the note 'Change in the Valuation of Imports' at the beginning of the Explanatory Notes of the 1989-90 issue of Foreign Trade, Australia: Comparative and Summary Tables (5410.0).

Country

- 15. For the purposes of international merchandise trade statistics, a country is defined as a geographical entity which trades, or has the potential to trade, with Australia in accordance with ACS provisions. External territories under Australian administration are treated as separate countries while self-governing territories and dependent territories under the administration of other countries may be treated as individual countries in Australian international merchandise trade statistics.
- 16. For exports, country refers to the country to which the goods were consigned at the time of export. Where the country of consignment is not known at the time of export, and where it is impossible to determine the destination, goods are recorded as 'Destination Unknown'. Tables which show exports by country also include the item "Ships' stores". "Ships' stores" comprise fuel, food and other goods loaded onto foreign owned vessels and aircraft to be consumed during international journeys.
- 17. For imports, country refers to the country of origin of the goods, which is defined as the country of production for Customs purposes. Where the country of origin is not known at the time of imports and where it is im-

possible to determine the origin, goods are recorded as 'Origin Unknown'. Goods reported with country of origin 'Australia' (i.e. goods of Australian origin exported and subsequently re-imported) are shown as country 'Australia (Re-imports)' and are included in the Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation country group.

- 18. Wherever possible, statistics for countries and country groups for all time periods included in this publication reflect the composition of those countries and country groups on the last day of the reference period of this publication. Thus, after the German Democratic Republic and the German Federal Republic were reunited, statistics for all periods both before and after re-unification refer to the combined entity (called Germany in country classified statistics).
- 19. However, in the case of a country that breaks into a number of component entities, it is not possible to provide data for earlier periods for the new entities. For example, from October 1991, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania are each separately identified in the statistics, but for earlier periods trade data for these three republics are included indistinguishably in data for the USSR.
- 20. The country groups shown in this publication are selected economic groups with which Australia trades, namely:
 - Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation (APEC);
 - Association of South-East Asian Nations (ASEAN);
 - Developing Countries (DCs);
 - European Union (EU);
 - Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC).
- 21. A list of the countries included in each of the above groups is shown in the Appendix. Country groups may not be mutually exclusive e.g. Indonesia is included in APEC, OPEC, ASEAN and as a Developing Country. The countries that belong to more than one group are identified with a footnote in the Appendix.
- 22. More details on the composition of countries identified in these statistics are available from the *Classification Manager* on Canberra (06) 252 5409.

Commodity classification

- 23. Commodity export and import statistics in Tables 3, 4, 6, 7 and 8 of this publication are presented according to the codes and descriptions of the third revision of the United Nations' Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev3) with the addition of dummy codes to take account of Australia's treatment of gold coin, whether or not legal tender, and other legal tender coin and confidential items.
- 24. Tables 15 and 16 of this publication are presented according to the second revision of SITC for 1982-83 to December 1987 and according to SITC Rev3 from January 1988. See Appendix B of the 1988-89 issue of Foreign Trade Australia: Comparative and Summary Ta-

bles (5410.0) for details of Divisions significantly affected by this change.

Broad Economic Categories

25. Merchandise trade in Tables 11 and 12 arc classified according to the categories of the United Nations' classification, Broad Economic Categories (BEC). The BEC classifies international merchandise trade statistics for the purposes of general economic analysis according to the main end use of the commodities traded. The statistics are compiled by allocating the statistical items of the Australian Harmonized Export Commodity Classification (AHECC) and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the appropriate BEC.

Industry of origin

26. Exports and imports statistics classified by subdivisions of the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC) are shown in Tables 9 and 10. The statistics are compiled by allocating statistical items of the AHECC and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the ANZSIC industry of origin based upon the main economic activities of those industries with which the commodities are primarily associated. A full description of ANZSIC classes is contained in the publication Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification, 1993 Edition (1292.0).

State

- 27. State information for exports presented in Table 13 refers to the State in which the final stage of production or manufacture occurs.
- 28. State information for imports presented in Table 14 refers to the State where imported goods were released from Customs control, also called the State of final destination. The State of final destination is not necessarily the State in which the port of discharge of the goods is located. Goods can be forwarded interstate after discharge either under ACS control or not, but are recorded as being imported into the State where they are released by the ACS.

Confidentiality

29. Restrictions are placed on the release of statistics for certain commodities for reasons of confidentiality. These restrictions do not affect total export and import figures, but they can affect statistics at all levels in country and commodity tables. More details on the confidentiality process can be obtained from the *Confidentiality Manager* on Canberra (06) 252 5409.

Reliability

30. Statistics in this publication for recent periods should be considered preliminary. Revisions to previously published data frequently occur due to continuing data quality checks.

Relationship to balance of payments statistics

31. The basic source of balance of payments data on merchandise exports and imports is 'international mer-

chandise trade statistics'. However, because of conceptual differences, various coverage, timing and (imports only) valuation adjustments are necessary before foreign trade statistics can be put on a balance of payments basis.
