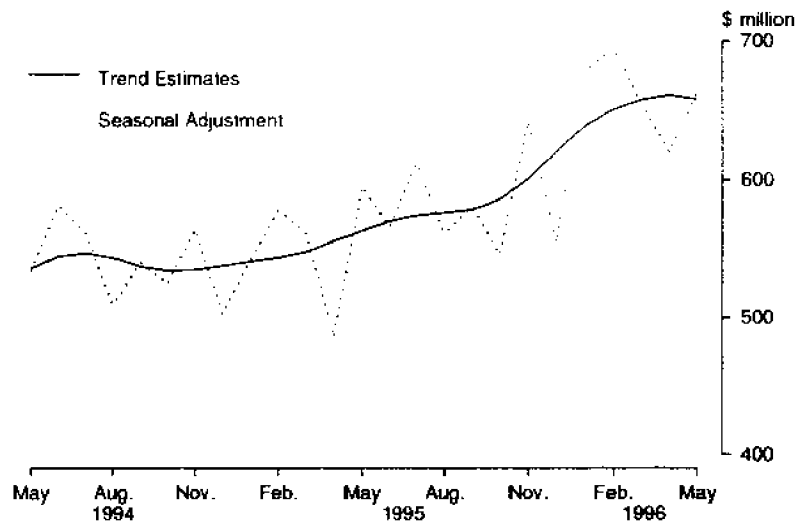

MAIN FEATURES

LEASE FINANCE, AUSTRALIA, MAY 1994 – MAY 1996



- 1** The provisional trend estimate for lease finance commitments made by significant lenders in May 1996 was \$658.4 million, a decrease of \$2.6 million (0.4%) on April 1996 but an increase of \$95.5 million (17.0%) on May 1995.
- 2** Seasonally adjusted, lease finance commitments were \$664.0 million in May 1996, an increase of \$44.0 million (7.1%) on April 1996 and an increase of \$69.1 million (11.6%) on May 1995.
- 3** In original terms lease finance commitments in May 1996 were \$734.5 million, an increase of \$157.3 million (27.3%) on April 1996 and an increase of \$85.3 million (13.1%) on May 1995.
