

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### THE LABOUR FORCE, 1973 AND 1974

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#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

#### Introduction

This bulletin contains estimates of the civilian labour force for 1973 and 1974 (apart from Table 1 which contains figures for 1964 to 1974) derived from the results of the population survey, which is carried out on a sample basis throughout Australia in February, May, August and November each year. It is issued as a supplement to the quarterly bulletin The Labour Force (Reference No. 6.20) which contains current estimates for the main series. Corresponding estimates from 1964 have been issued in a series of bulletins entitled The Labour Force (Reference No. 6.22) covering the period 1964 to 1968 and single years thereafter. The estimates in this bulletin are based on population benchmarks derived from the 1971 census, whereas those in earlier issues were based on benchmarks derived from the 1966 census. (See paragraphs 14 and 15 below.)

2. Although emphasis in the survey is placed on the regular collection, each quarter, of data on the demographic and labour force characteristics of the population, supplementary surveys of particular aspects of the labour force or of other subjects are carried out from time to time. Statistics from supplementary surveys are published in separate bulletins which are available free on request. (See page 94 for a list of titles.)

#### The population survey

3. The survey is based on a multi-stage area sample of private dwellings (about 30,000 houses, flats, etc.) and non-private dwellings (botels, motels, etc.), and covers about two-thirds of one per cent of the population of Australia. The information is obtained each quarter from the occupants of selected dwellings by carefully chosen and specially trained interviewers. The interviews are carried out during a period of four weeks, so that there are four survey weeks in each of the months to which the survey relates. These four survey weeks are chosen so as to fall within the limits of the calendar month or with minimum encroachment into the adjacent months.

#### Scope

4. The estimates relate to all persons aged fifteen years and over except members of the permanent armed forces and certain diplomatic personnel customarily excluded from census and estimated populations.

#### Classification of the labour force

5. The labour force classification used in the survey conforms closely to that recommended by the Eighth International Conference of Labour Statisticians,

- 1954. The labour force category to which a person is assigned depends on his actual activity (i.e. whether working, looking for work, etc.) during a specified week, known as survey week, which is the week immediately preceding that in which the interview takes place. The principal categories of the labour force appearing in the tables in this bulletin are defined in the following paragraphs.
- 6. The labour force comprises all persons who, during the survey week, were employed or unemployed as defined in paragraphs 7 and 8.
- 7. **Employed persons** comprise all those who, during the survey week,
  - (a) did any work for pay, profit, commission or payment in kind, in a job or business, or on a farm (including employees, employers and self-employed persons), or
  - (b) worked fifteen hours or more without pay in a family business (or farm), or
  - (c) had a job, business or farm, but were not at work because of illness, accident, leave, holiday, production hold-up due to bad weather, plant breakdown, etc., or because they were on strike.

A person who had a job but was temporarily laid off by his employer for the whole week without pay is excluded, and is classified in the tables as unemployed. A person who did some work during the week, however, before he either lost his job or was laid off, is classified as employed. A person who held more than one job is counted only once, in the job at which he worked most hours during the survey week.

- 8. **Unemployed persons** comprise all those who, during the survey week, did no work at all, and who either:
  - (a) did not have a job or business and were actively looking for full-time or part-time work (including those who stated that they would have looked for work if they had not been temporarily ill or believed no work was available, or had not already made definite arrangements to start work in a new job after the survey week), or
  - (b) were laid off from their jobs without pay for the whole week.

A person who either lost his job or was laid off during the survey week, but did some work at his job during the survey week, is classified as employed.

- 9. Full-time workers are those who usually work 35 hours a week or more and others who, although usually part-time workers, worked 35 hours or more during the survey week. Part-time workers are those who usually work less than 35 hours a week and who did so during the survey week. When recording hours of work fractions of an hour are disregarded.
- 10. Persons not in the labour force are those who, during the survey week, were not in the categories 'employed' or 'unemployed' as defined. This category therefore includes persons without a job, business or farm who were not actively looking for work, and who, during the survey week, were either keeping house (unpaid), attending an educational institution (e.g. school or university), retired or voluntarily idle, permanently unable to work or inmates of institutions. A person who worked less than fifteen hours without pay in a family business during the survey week is also classified as not in the labour force.

#### Industry classification

- 11. In quarterly and annual Labour Force bulletins prior to November 1972 the industry estimates were based on the Classification of Industries used at the 1961 and 1966 population censuses. As from November 1972 industry has been classified according to the Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC). Estimates for particular industries for November 1972 and later periods are not, therefore, directly comparable with those for August 1972 and earlier periods.
- 12. During the changeover to the use of ASIC, industry was classified according to both ASIC and the 1966 Population Census Classification for five consecutive surveys (August 1971 to August 1972). An indication of the relationship between the two classifications was given by Tables 9 and 10 of the 1972 issue of this bulletin and by Tables 8 and 9 in the combined November 1972 and February 1973 issue of the quarterly bulletin *The Labour Force* (Reference No. 6.20).

#### Revision of estimates

- 13. The survey estimates are calculated in such a way as to conform to the independently estimated distribution of the population by age and sex. As a consequence, when the population estimates are revised it becomes necessary to revise the labour force estimates also.
- 14. Estimates for the period from August 1966 have been revised by using population estimates based on the results of the 1971 population census. Estimates published in previous issues of this bulletin were based on population estimates derived from 1966 census results. Estimates of the population 15 years of age and

over, shown in Table 1 of those bulletins have been reduced by about 40,000 persons for the period May 1971 to November 1972 with successively smaller revisions back to August 1966. As a result the estimates of the labour force have also been reduced. Revised estimates of the population classified by employment status are shown in Table 1 which for convenience of reference also includes estimates back to February 1964, the date of the first Australia-wide labour force survey.

15. All labour force estimates in this bulletin have been calculated on the revised basis. However, for the period August 1966 to November 1972 only the principal labour force categories have been revised and are shown in Table 1. Revisions to rates (e.g. labour force participation rates, unemployment rates), percentage distributions (e.g. by industry) and averages (e.g. duration of unemployment, average hours worked) have been negligible.

## Differences between population census and population survey estimates

- 16. The results of the 1971 population census, which have been published in a series of bulletins entitled *Summary of Population* (Reference No. 2.83), show that the census labour force estimates differ substantially from the corresponding estimates derived from the population surveys of May and August 1971.
- 17. The definition of the labour force used in the population census is similar to that used in the survey (see paragraphs 6 to 10). However, evidence from census post-enumeration surveys indicates that the personal interview approach, as used in the quarterly survey, tends to identify a larger number of persons as being in the labour force than does the filling in of the questions on the census schedule by the householder, and that this tendency increased between the 1966 and 1971 censuses.
- 18. These considerations should be borne in mind if comparisons of the total labour force or of labour force participation rates are made between the 1971 census and the 1971 labour force survey estimates.

#### Discontinuity of series

19. The survey periods for February in the years 1971, 1972 and 1974 were later than in other years, and as a consequence the estimates of the proportion of the population 15 years and over who "went to school" are correspondingly higher. No exact estimates of this effect are available; however, it may be conjectured that had these survey periods been one week earlier approximately 20,000 fewer persons would have been classified in the "went to school" category. In addition, in February 1974 the survey period in Queensland was delayed by a further week in order to avoid as far as

possible the effects of the flood in the south-east area of the State.

20. At the 1971 population census, trainee teachers (enrolled at government teachers colleges and in some cases enrolled at other institutions) were for the first time classified as *not in the labour force*, and since then they have also been excluded from labour force estimates derived from the population survey. Exclusion of these students constitutes a break in the series between May and August 1971, the numbers of males and females excluded from the labour force in August 1971 being approximately 7,000 and 17,000 respectively.

#### Seasonally adjusted series

21. Seasonally adjusted estimates for selected labour force characteristics are shown in Table 1. The methods used in seasonally adjusting these series are explained in Seasonally Adjusted Indicators, 1975

(Reference No. 1.10). The series shown by Seasonally Adjusted Indicators, 1975 are, however, based on the results of the 1966 population census. (See paragraph 14 above.)





#### TECHNICAL NOTE

## The sample design

The sample used for the labour force survey is based on the population survey master sample, which is designed to permit the selection of samples for any purpose for which a sample of dwellings or persons is appropriate. The design of the sample was investigated and a more efficient sampling plan was introduced during 1972. Before the redesign, a one per cent sample of households throughout Australia was used. About 40,000 private dwellings (houses, flats, etc.) as well as a sample of other dwellings (hotels, hospitals, etc.) were included. Data obtained in the 1971 Census of Population and Housing were used to reselect the sample in accordance with the improved design. In the new sample the proportion of the population included varies from State to State but, in aggregate, about two thirds of one per cent of the population of Australia is included. The new sample consists of about 30,000 private dwellings as well as a sample of other dwellings. The new sample was phased in over three surveys, May to November 1972. The February 1972 estimates are based entirely on the old sample and the November 1972 estimates are based entirely on the new sample.

Because of the difficulty of obtaining and keeping up to date a complete list of dwellings from which to select a sample, the population survey master sample is for the most part a sample of areas, the exception being the sample of "special dwellings" (certain types of non-private dwellings for which lists can be maintained and which have different characteristics in respect of size and geographical location). Since dwellings can readily be associated with the areas in which they are located, the area sample is equivalent to a sample of dwellings. To obtain a sample of persons, rules are adopted which associate each person with one and only one dwelling, either private or non-private. Briefly, these rules are designed so that a person is included at his usual place of residence if it is occupied by one or more of its usual residents at any time during the week in which the survey is conducted and, at the time of the survey, the person is not absent from it for a continuous period of more than four weeks. Where a person is not included at his usual place of residence, he is included at the dwelling at which he spends most of the survey week. Modifications to these rules are necessary for dwellings such as hotels and hospitals, which contain a high proportion of transient residents; nevertheless, the rules ensure that each person is given his correct chance of inclusion in the sample.

- 3. All dwellings in Australia are allocated to a number of mutually exclusive groups called strata, each of which is sampled separately. Private dwellings are separated from special dwellings and are divided between metropolitan areas and urban and rural non-metropolitan areas, dwellings within each of these divisions being grouped into strata according to location and socio-economic considerations. Special dwellings are also divided between metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas, strata within these divisions being formed according to type of special dwelling (e.g. gaols, hospitals, etc.).
- 4. The sample from the private dwelling strata in metropolitan and other densely populated areas is a self-weighting three-stage area sample, the areas and finally the dwellings with which they are associated being selected in three stages. The first stage is the selection of Census Collectors' Districts (CDs), a CD being the area covered by one population census collector; the second, the selection of blocks (areas which can be physically defined by streets or other recognisable features) from within selected CDs; and the third the selection of dwellings from within selected blocks. Although the CDs and blocks have different probabilities of inclusion (probabilities in fact approximately proportional to the number of dwellings they contain), the sample is self-weighting because in each State each of the dwellings (and persons) selected has the same probability of inclusion and thus may be given the same weight in forming the sample estimates for the State. In South Australia, for example, the probability of including any dwelling (or person) is one in a hundred, but this does not imply that exactly one-hundredth of all dwellings or persons are included. The number of dwellings or persons actually included may, by chance, be somewhat more or less than one-hundredth of the total number; certain steps taken to limit the size of this difference and to allow for its possible effect on survey estimates are described below. Outside the densely populated areas, a self-weighting four-stage area sample is generally used, with areas such as towns or rural local government areas being the primary sample units at the first stage of selection and CDs, blocks and dwellings being the units at the subsequent stages. In some small towns the first stage of selection is omitted, the town itself being treated as though it were a single CD. Other modifications to the selection procedure are also made for certain other types of areas, but these affect only a small proportion of sample dwellings.

- 5. The sample of special dwellings in metropolitan and other densely populated areas is a self-weighting two-stage cluster sample, the sample units at each stage being special dwellings and either persons or accommodation units (e.g. rooms of hotels) according to the type of dwelling. Outside the densely populated areas, a self-weighting three-stage cluster sample is used, sample units being local government areas or towns of the private dwelling sample, dwellings and either persons or accommodation units according to the type of dwelling. Where accommodation units are selected, rules are adopted to ensure that each person associated with the dwelling is associated with one accommodation unit.
- The effect of new dwellings, conversions, demolitions, etc. is taken into account in the sample selection procedure. For the private dwelling sample a check is made during each survey on all dwellings within each selected block. New dwellings detected are given the same chance of selection as other dwellings in the same block, so that, taking the sample as a whole, new dwellings also have the correct chance of being selected. Similar procedures exist for buildings converted for use as dwellings. Dwellings demolished or converted to non-dwelling use are removed from the sample. In areas where there has been an unusually rapid rate of growth of private dwellings since the sample was first selected, either very many or very few of the new dwellings will be in sample blocks or in sample CDs. Even though there will be no general tendency for the sample to include too many or too few new dwellings, the effect in particular areas, of chance departures from a sample of exactly the correct distribution will be that a disproportionately high or low number of new dwellings will be included, and as a consequence characteristics associated with new dwellings will be over-estimated or under-estimated accordingly. To limit such effects, special procedures are adopted to ensure that the sample remains representative, a reselection of CDs being made from the appropriate stratum, if necessary. The lists of special dwellings used in the selection of the special dwelling sample are brought up to date before each survey by using all information available from sources external to the sample. The combined effect of these measures is that during any survey the sample of dwellings represents dwellings currently in existence in Australia.
- 7. Enumeration at sample dwellings included in the population survey is carried out during a four-week period in metropolitan areas and a two-week period in non-metropolitan areas. Thus, data are obtained each quarter from four interpenetrating samples in metropolitan areas and two interpenetrating samples in non-metropolitan areas.

8. A selected dwelling generally remains in the sample for no more than two years. In order to minimise respondent fatigue and to maintain continuity within the sample, one eighth of the private dwellings in the sample are replaced after each survey. Adoption of this "rotation" procedure, whereby seven-eighths of the sample remains unchanged from one quarter to the next, enables more reliable measurements of changes in the population and labour force characteristics to be made than would be possible if a new sample were introduced each quarter. Selected non-private dwellings (except the large ones) are retained in the sample for no longer than one year, one quarter of those selected being replaced after each survey.

# **Estimation procedure**

- 9. Labour force and other estimates derived from population survey data are obtained by using a complex ratio estimation procedure, in the application of which the following components are used:
  - (i) population estimates ("benchmarks") classified by State, area, age and sex;
  - (ii) the number of persons with the characteristics being measured in the sample in each "cell" formed by the benchmarks; and
  - (iii) the total number of persons in the sample in each cell.

The latter two components are expressed as a ratio, which is multiplied by the population benchmark for the appropriate cell to give an estimate of the total number of persons with the given characteristics in that population cell. This procedure ensures that survey estimates conform to the known distribution of the population by age and sex, even though (as can be expected in a sample) the sample itself may not exactly represent that distribution, and at the same time it automatically compensates for any inherent under-enumeration or over-enumeration in the sample.

10. It will be appreciated that the theoretical soundness of the sample design could be greatly affected in practice by any substantial degree of failure to obtain information in respect of all persons selected, whether from failure on the part of the interviewer to make contact or from lack of co-operation by respondents. For this reason, a high level of response is sought and, in fact, achieved.

### Reliability of the estimates

11. Since the estimates in this bulletin are based on

a sample, they may differ from the figures that would have been obtained from a complete census using the same questionnaires and procedures. One measure of the likely difference is given by the *standard error*, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample, and not the whole population, was enumerated. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained from a comparable complete enumeration, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors.

12. Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this bulletin. A table of standard errors for general application is given below (Table A). These figures will not give a precise measure of standard error of a particular estimate since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of past surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics. However, they will provide an indication of the magnitude of the standard error of any particular estimate for any particular survey. An example of the use of Table A is as follows: if the estimate obtained from the sample is 100,000 and the standard error is 3 per cent of the estimate, i.e. 3,000, there are about two chances in three that the true figure is within the range 97,000 to 103,000 and about nineteen chances in twenty that this figure is between 94,000 and 106,000.

The quarter-to-quarter change (Table B) in the level of an estimate is also subject to sampling variability. The standard error of the change depends on the standard error of the level of the estimate, rather than on the change itself. Final estimates of the standard errors of movement have not yet been calculated, but an indication of the magnitude of standard errors of quarter-to-quarter change is given in Table B below. The estimates of standard error of quarter-to-quarter change apply only to estimates of change between two consecutive quarters. Changes between corresponding quarters of consecutive years, or between two other non-consecutive quarters, will generally be subject to somewhat greater sampling variability than is indicated in Table B. Furthermore, changes during the period February to November 1972 will have greater standard errors than indicated in Table B, because of the introduction of the new sample. An example of the use of Table B is as follows: if the estimates for two successive quarters were 500,000 and 520,000, then from Table A it can be seen that the standard errors of these two estimates would be of the order of 6,000, and from Table B that the standard error of the quarter-to-quarter change would be 5,000. That is, there are about two chances in three that the quarter-to-quarter change lies between 15,000 and 25,000 and about nineteen chances in twenty that it lies between 10,000 and 30,000.

- 14. The standard errors of estimates relating to agricultural employment are generally somewhat higher than the standard errors of other estimates of the same magnitude. Estimates for females also tend to have higher standard errors than the estimates of equivalent size for males in similar employment categories.
- 15. The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed by using sample data for both numerator and denominator, depends upon both the size of the numerator and the size of the denominator. However, the per cent standard error of the estimated percentage will generally be lower than the per cent standard error of the estimate of the numerator. The per cent standard errors of the numerators can be obtained from Table A.
- 16. As the standard errors in Table A show, the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high

- standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In the tables in this bulletin, estimates less than 4,000 have not been shown. Although figures for these small components can in some cases be derived by subtraction, they should not be regarded as reliable.
- 17. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the *non-sampling error*, and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or only a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a mimimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.

### POPULATION SURVEY REPORTS

Although emphasis in the population survey is placed on the regular collection, each quarter, of data on demographic and labour force characteristics, supplementary surveys of particular aspects of the labour force or of other subjects are carried out from time to time. The results of these surveys are published separately. Copies of the following publications are available free on request.
