Main price changes between June quarter 1982 and September quarter 1982 were as follows:

Food

Prices of fresh fruit and vegetables increased in all cities except Darwin.

Prices of meals out and take-away food increased in all cities.

Prices of soft drinks, ice cream and confectionery increased in all cities.

Milk prices increased in all cities except Melbourne. Bread prices increased in Melbourne, Adelaide, Perth and Hobart.

Lamb prices fell in all cities except Hobart.

Clothing

Footwear prices increased in all cities.

Housing

Private dwelling rents increased in all cities.

House prices increased in all cities.

Government dwelling rents increased in Sydney, Adelaide, Perth and Darwin.

Local government rates and charges increased in Brisbane.

Household equipment and operation

Electricity charges increased in all cities except Hobart. Furniture prices increased in all cities. Telephone charges increased in all cities. Prices of household supplies and services increased in all cities except Brisbane.

Transportation

Petrol prices increased significantly in all cities.

Motor vehicle prices increased in all cities.

Urban transport fares increased in Sydney, Brisbane, Perth and Hobart.

Vehicle service and repair costs increased in all cities

except Hobart.

Tobacco and alcohol

Beer, wine and spirits prices increased in all cities. Cigarette prices increased in all cities.

Health and personal care

Health insurance charges increased in all cities except Brisbane.

Hospital charges increased in all cities except Brisbane.

Recreation and education

Domestic air fares increased for all cities.

Prices for books, newspapers and magazines increased in all cities.

EXPLANATORY NOTES ...

Brief description of the CPI

- 1. The CPI measures quarterly changes in the price of a 'basket' of goods and services which account for a high proportion of expenditures by metropolitan wage and salary earner households. This 'basket' covers a wide range of goods and services, arranged in the following eight groups: food; clothing; housing; household equipment and operation; transportation; tobacco and alcohol; health and personal care; and recreation and education. Each group is in turn divided into sub-groups. Index numbers at the group and All Groups levels are published for each State capital city, Canberra, Darwin, and for the weighted average of eight capital cities. Index numbers for All Groups are also published for the weighted average of six State capital cities. Subgroup index numbers are published for the weighted average of eight capital cities.
- 2. It is important to note that the capital city indexes measure price movements over time in each city individually. They do not measure differences in retail price levels between cities.
- 3. A major review of the CPI was recently completed and its results incorporated in the tenth CPI series introduced in the June quarter 1982 issue of this publication. Details of the review are contained in ABS Information Paper: Review of the Consumer Price Index (6450.0).
- 4. Further information about the CPI is contained in a booklet entitled A Guide to the Consumer Price Index (6440.0) which is available from the ABS on request.

Prices

- 5. Prices of goods and services included in the CPI are generally collected quarterly. However, some important items are priced monthly or more frequently (e.g. bread, fresh meat and fish, fresh fruit and vegetables, petrol, alcohol and tobacco) and a small number annually (e.g. seasonal clothing, local government rates and charges).
- 6. The bulk of items for which prices are collected quarterly are priced at the middle of the mid-month of the quarter (i.e. in August, November, February and May), but, to facilitate a more even spread of the field collection workload, some goods and services are priced in the first and third months of each quarter. Items priced in the third month are generally those subject to price changes at discrete points of time (e.g. electricity and postal charges, milk); in these cases information is obtained of any changes in price during the quarter so that a weighted average price for the whole quarter can be calculated.
- 7. As a result of the recent review of the CPI it was decided to discontinue the collection of most food prices monthly, as a consequence, the monthly food group index numbers are no longer compiled.

Weighting pattern

- 8. There are 105 expenditure classes (that is, groupings of like items) in the tenth series CPI and each expenditure class has its own weight, or measure of relative importance. In calculating the index, price changes for the various expenditure classes are combined using these weights.
- 9. Changes in the weighting pattern have been made at approximately five-yearly intervals to take account of changes in household spending patterns. The CPI now comprises ten series of price indexes which have been linked to form a continuous series. The tenth series (that is, the current series), which was introduced in the June quarter 1982, has a weighting pattern based, in general, on estimated household expenditure in 1979-80.

Index points and percentage changes

10. Movements in indexes from one period to another can be expressed either as percentage changes, or as changes in 'index points'. The difference between these two methods of describing movements in indexes is shown by the following example:

All Groups CPI: Weighted average of eight capital cities

Index numbers:

September quarter 1982: 118.5 Less: June quarter 1982: 114.5 Change in index points: +4.0

Percentage change = $\frac{+4.0}{114.5}$ x 100 = +3.5%

The index number of 118.5 for September quarter 1982 indicates an increase of 18.5% since the reference base year (1980-81).

11. Most of the tables in this publication show index numbers or percentage changes calculated from index numbers. However, Table 3 shows the main changes between June quarter 1982 and September quarter 1982, in terms of All Groups index points, for each capital city.

Special tables

- 12. Table 7 provides a detailed analysis, for the weighted average of eight capital cities, of movements in the CPI since the previous quarter, including information on movements for subgroups and for some special series. It also shows the contribution which each group and subgroup makes to the total CPI. For instance, the dairy produce subgroup contributed 2.40 index points to the total All Groups index number of 118.5 for September quarter 1982. The final column shows contributions to the change in All Groups index points by each group and subgroup.
- 13. The All Groups index includes the effects of changes in prices for hospital and medical services. To facilitate analysis of trends in retail prices without the effects of these changes, Table 5 shows percentage changes for a special series All Groups excluding hospital and medical services, and compares these with changes in the All Groups index.

Revisions

14. A number of June quarter 1982 figures are revised in this issue, most notably the All Groups and Household equipment and operation group index numbers for Sydney. These revisions have been made necessary by the deferment, after publication of the CPI for June quarter 1982, until 1 October 1982 of an increase in the price of electricity in Sydney. This increase had been announced previously as effective from 2 August 1982 and would have been applicable to a proportion of electricity consumed in the June quarter 1982.
