INTRODUCTION

This publication contains price indexes relating to materials used in the mining of coal in Australia. Separate indexes show movements in prices of materials used in open cut and underground coal mining operations.

INDEX NUMBERS

Index numbers for financial years are simple averages of the quarterly index numbers. In cases where more complete information is obtained after index numbers for a period have been published, or it is discovered that incorrect prices have been used in compiling the indexes, revisions to index numbers may occur in subsquent issues of this publication. Each index is presented on a reference base of 1987–88=100.0.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

ITEMS AND WEIGHTS

1 These indexes are fixed weights indexes. The items included in the indexes were selected on the basis of the estimated average values of materials used in the operation of open cut and underground coal mines in Australia during the three years ended June 1987.

PRICES

- **2** The point of pricing is delivered on mine site or to the primary storage area for a group of mines. Prices are obtained from representative suppliers of the materials used in coal mining.
- **3** As far as possible, actual transactions prices are used—that is, the prices actually paid by coal mines to suppliers for materials delivered on mine sites. The actual price paid for anything can, of course, be described in various ways. Instead of being described as a single price (as usually happens in retail shops), a price for a mining material may be described in terms of the components that make up the price—for instance, 'list price plus sales tax', 'supplier's price plus freight', 'basic price less (particular types of) discount', and so on. It is these net prices that buyers pay to sellers in exchange for materials that the ABS aims to use in compiling these indexes.

ANALYSIS OF INDEX CHANGES

- **4** Care should be exercised when interpreting quarter to quarter movements in the indexes as short-term movements do not necessarily indicate changes in trend.
- **5** Movements in indexes from one period to another can be expressed either as changes in 'index points' or as percentage changes. The following example illustrates the method of calculating index points changes and percentage changes between any two periods:

Open cut mining index numbers -

September Qtr 1997 120.3 (see Table 1)

less September Qtr 1996 119.8 (see Table 1)

Change in index points 0.5

Percentage change $0.5 \times 100 = 0.4$ 119.8
