Australian agriculture contributes over 3% annually to Australia's Gross Domestic Product. The diverse activities of the agriculture sector utilise approximately 60% of Australia's land mass and provide employment for nearly 400,000 people. These activities range from cut-flower growing to pig farming and are conducted on approximately 150,000 farms across Australia.

While small producers still dominate major industries such as beef cattle farming, sheep farming and grape growing, farms are getting bigger as farmers buy more land or consolidate with adjoining holdings to maintain incomes in the face of falling real prices. To monitor such developments along with regular production levels, value of production, financial statistics and livestock slaughterings, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) conducts a range of agricultural collections for use by governments, primary producers, industry associations and researchers.

Many other groups such as product corporations, industry councils and research institutions are also building databases which could be of great benefit to people interested in agriculture. To present the most complete picture possible, the ABS, in keeping with its mission 'to assist and encourage informed decision-making, research and discussion', has drawn together a number of references to data relating to the field of agriculture.

This directory provides a description of the collection and the data content. The Indexes provide quick reference guides by data source and subject.

For more detailed information about the publications and collections listed, readers should refer to the contact specified in each entry. The ABS is not responsible for the accuracy of the information provided by non-ABS organisations and inclusion in this directory should not be taken as an endorsement by the ABS.

Description	
	The Agricultural Census/Agricultural Commodity Survey (ACS) is the basic
	source of Australian agricultural commodity statistics and is conducted at
	the end of March each year. It collects data from units that have agricultural production in the form of crops, fruit, vegetables or livestock.
	For some commodities not harvested by 31 March such as apples and
	pears, hops, and potatoes, production data are collected by means of a
	specific supplementary questionnaire at a later, more relevant time. Every
	fifth year, the data are collected by mail questionnaire from a census of
	approximately 150,000 establishments, the next one scheduled for
	2001-02. In the intervening years, a survey of up to 60,000 establishments
	will provide estimates of production and area.

	A wide range of items are collected. Broadly, these items include:

#### Geographic coverage

Data from agricultural census years (up to and including 1996–97) are available down to Statistical Local Area (SLA) level. This generally equates to the shire level. From the 1997–98 ACS, data are available at the State and Agro-Ecological Region.

Statistical Division and SLA data will not generally be available in survey years due to the smaller sample takes in these regions. However, some of the major commodities may yield reasonable estimates (due to their number) but this will only be able to be determined on a special consultancy basis.

Purpose	
	The prime purpose of the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) Business Register is to provide a comprehensive source of business names and addresses from which businesses can be selected for inclusion in ABS economic censuses and surveys.
	Besides business names and addresses, data recorded on the Register for each business include items such as main economic activity, geographic location and employment size. These data items are aggregated and made available to ABS clients. However, business name and address information is for ABS use only, and is not available to clients.
Description	
·	The ABS Business Register includes those businesses that employ wage
	and salary earners, including businesses that temporarily have no employees, and businesses with no employment, but which are linked by common ownership or control to another business that does. Non-employing farm businesses are included on the Business Register. Other non-employing businesses are not included on the Business Register.
	The term 'business' is taken to mean a legal entity such as a registered company, partnership, trust, sole proprietor, religious organisation, government department, or any other legally recognised organisation which provides goods and services.
Data detail	
	The business units about which statistical output is available from the ABS Business Register are the management unit and the establishment.
	The management unit is the largest unit within a business for which detailed accounts are kept on at least a quarterly basis. For most businesses, particularly the smaller ones, it will equate with the legal entity owning the business (i.e. the sole proprietor, partnership, incorporated company, etc.). For larger businesses, there may be a management unit for each 'line of business' or 'division' that the business operates.
	Structurally, management units consist of one or more establishments, so their industry code will reflect the predominant activity of their establishments, and their employment will be the sum of the employment of their establishments.

Data detail continued	
	The establishment is the physical site from which a business engages in productive activity on a relatively permanent basis (e.g. a shop, a factory, or a suite of offices in a multi-occupancy building). For an agricultural unit, the establishment is usually the property, even though this may consist of a number of separate holdings. The establishment is the lower-level business unit recorded on the Register.

Whether a small business owner, a marketing manager in a large corporation, a policy maker, a student, or whatever your interest, the ABS provides a range of information services designed to deliver statistical information to you. These include:

- information consultancy service;
- subscriptions to publications, products;
- ABS bookshops;
- electronic products and services;
- ABS statistics on the Internet;
- library access to ABS information; and
- statistical consultancy service.

## INFORMATION CONSULTANCY SERVICE

To satisfy your information needs, the ABS provides an information consultancy service on a fee-for-service basis, ranging from simple information inquiry to specialised in-depth data investigations. Information is provided in the format of your choice, for example, a hard copy report (which can be mailed to you), or a file on computer diskette or compact disk (or a file which can be emailed to you).

ABS publications only contain a fraction of the available data.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

If you want access to ABS publications on a regular basis, the ABS subscription service is the solution. With a subscription, you receive your choice of publications directly through the mail.

To subscribe to ABS publications, you order in advance on an annual basis. You can amend your subscription at any time and include new products as they become available. You may also subscribe to on-line services or a range of special non-publication data services.
