## CORRIGENDUM

This corrigendum is issued to replace Table 11.4, Table 13.1 and Table 13.3 of the publication. In Table 11.4, an error has been detected which resulted in incorrect figures for green pea production during 1995.

In Table 13.1, Cargo (revenue) was incorrectly described as 'dollars' rather than as 'tonnes'. An explanatory footnote has been added.

In Table 13.3, one category relating to manufacturing required a more detailed description.

Commentary relating to these tables that appears on pages 77 and 91 of the publication has been modified to reflect these corrections.

No other data in the tables or commentary content were affected.

#### Vegetables

From 1995 to 1997 the total production of selected vegetables increased from 470,471.6 tonnes to 515,160.0 tonnes, an increase of 9.5%. The Mersey–Lyell Region accounted for 64.9% of the total production of selected vegetables in Tasmania in 1997. The Northern Region accounted for 31.1% of production, while the Greater Hobart–Southern Region accounted for 4.0% of the production of selected vegetables in the State.

Tasmania's production of vegetable crops is dominated by beans, carrots, green peas, onions (white and brown) and potatoes. These crops accounted for 94.3% of the State's output of the vegetables listed. From 1995 to 1997 the production of beans in Tasmania increased by 67.3%, from 8,461.9 tonnes to 14,154.0 tonnes. Potato production increased by 24.1%, from 255,737.8 tonnes to 317,448.3 tonnes. Onion production declined by 18.9%, from 73,536.9 tonnes to 59,677.3 tonnes as did green peas by 14.1%, from 83,479.6 tonnes to 71,736.9 tonnes.

Livestock

Cattle, sheep, lambs, pigs and chickens for egg production are some of the livestock produced in Tasmania. In 1997, Tasmania produced 725,200 head of cattle, a 4.7% increase on 1995 figures. Of these, 71.0% of production was for meat. Sheep and lamb production also increased between 1995 and 1997, by 3.2%, as did chickens for egg production, by 17.3%. Pig production, however, fell from 38,113,000 head in 1995 to 23,852,000 head in 1997, a decline of 37.4%.

A large proportion of the production of cattle for meat and milk for 1997 was centred in the Northern Region (40.1%) and the Mersey–Lyell Region (46.7%). In 1997, the Northern Region accounted for 72.6% of the State's pig production and 50.7% of the State's sheep and lamb production.

## CHAPTER 13

TRADE .....

#### PORT CORPORATIONS

Between 1995–96 and 1997–98, mass cargo handled by Tasmanian port corporations increased by 9.2%, from 10,832,518 tonnes to 11,827,950 tonnes. The Port of Launceston handled 33.5% of the State's cargo during 1997–98 (3,967,785 tonnes), compared to 33.1% in 1995–96 and 31.6% in 1996–97.

State-wide, container traffic reached 264,598 twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) in 1997–98, a 7.9% increase on traffic in 1995–96. Whilst the Burnie Port Corporation handled 43.8% of the State's container traffic in 1997–98 (115,809 TEUs), the Port of Devonport Corporation handled 101,181 TEUs that year, an increase of 85.8% on 1995–96 container traffic at that port.

The total number of ships to visit Tasmanian ports decreased by 4.4%, from 1,910 in 1995–96 to 1,826 in 1997–98. During 1997–98, the Port of Devonport Corporation and Burnie Port Corporation reported 58.9% of the State's ship docking.

The Hobart Ports Corporation and the Port of Devonport Corporation were the only Tasmanian port corporations to receive visits from cruise ships between 1995–96 and 1997–98. The Hobart Ports Corporation received the majority of visits, with 18 cruise ships visiting during 1997–98. This was twice the number of 1995–96 cruise ship visits.

#### **EXPORTS**

#### Commodity exports

Total Tasmanian exports by commodity increased by 25.9% from \$1,685m in 1996 to \$2,121m in 1998. Metal product manufacturing accounted for 30.7% of all commodities exported in 1998, a 22.1% increase on 1996 figures. Other commodities to have major increases in their export value between 1996 and 1998 included Manufacturing (187.7%); Textile, clothing, footwear and leather manufacturing (82.2%); and Metal ore mining (44.8%).

#### Tasmanian exports by country

Between 1996 and 1998, the majority of Tasmania's exports were to Japan, United States of America, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Malaysia. In 1998, exports to these countries totalled \$1,153m, an increase of 24.8% on 1996 export figures.

Exports to Canada, China and Germany rose substantially from 1996 to 1998. Exports to Denmark recorded the largest increase over this time, from \$350,300 in 1996 to \$136m in 1998. Exports to New Zealand, Thailand and the United Kingdom declined between 1996 and 1998. The largest decline occurred in exports to the United Kingdom, a decline of 88.1% from \$211m in 1996 to \$25m in 1998.

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
