# NOTES

## SCOPE

The statistics in this publication relate to government and non-government schools, students and schools staff, and were collected through the National Schools Statistics Collection, which was established through the work of the Ministerial Council on Education, Employment, Training and Youth Affairs Taskforce on School Statistics.

This publication includes details of full-time students only, except table 3, which includes the full-time equivalent (FTE) of part-time students, and tables 48 and 49 which show the number and FTE of part-time secondary students.

## MAIN FEATURES

### SCHOOLS

In August 2000, there were 9,595 schools in Australia. Of these, 6,961 (73%) were government schools and 2,634 (27%) were non-government schools.

Due to amalgamations and school closures, the number of government schools has fallen by 9 since 1999. The number of non-government schools has increased by 14, compared with an increase of 31 in 1999.

### STUDENTS

The number of full-time students attending schools in 2000 was 3,247,425. Of these, 2,248,287 (69%) attended government schools and 999,138 (31%) attended non-government schools.

The number of full-time students attending government schools in 2000 increased by 613 (0.02%) from 1999, while the number of full-time students attending non-government schools increased by 20,162 (2.1%).

### APPARENT RETENTION RATES

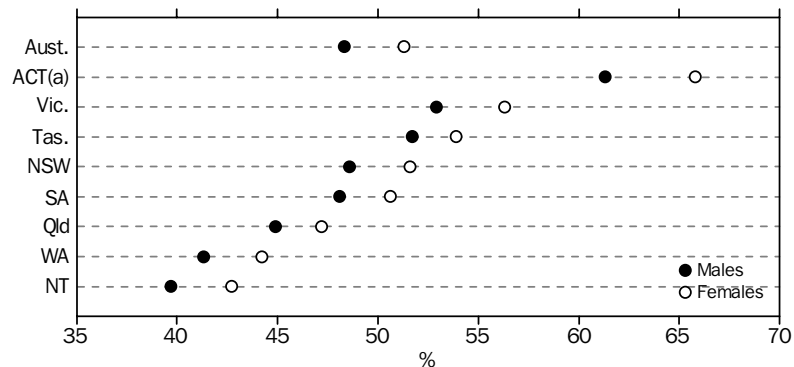
The apparent retention rate of full-time secondary school students from Year 7/8 to Year 12 for 2000 remained at 72.3%, as in 1999. As in previous years, the apparent retention rate for female students (78.7%) was higher than the rate for males (66.1%).

The apparent retention rate of secondary school students from Year 10 to Year 12 for 2000 remained at 74.4%, as in 1999. The apparent retention rate for female students (80.0%) was higher than the rate for males (69.0%).

### AGE PARTICIPATION RATES

The age participation rates for full-time students, at the Australia level, were 93.6% for 15-year-olds, 80.8% for 16-year-olds and 61.6% for 17-year-olds.

### STAFF

There were 243,997 full-time and part-time teaching staff at government and non-government schools in 2000. This represented 218,050 full-time equivalent (FTE) units.

Government schools had the equivalent of 150,610 full-time teaching staff in 2000, an increase of 128 (0.1%) from 1999, while non-government schools had the equivalent of 67,440 full-time teaching staff, an increase of 2,198 (3%).

Just over three-quarters of teaching staff (78%) in primary schools were female, compared with 54% in secondary schools.

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### STAFF *continued*

The average number of students per teaching staff member (FTE) was 14.9 for government schools and 14.8 for non-government schools. The average number of students per teaching staff member (FTE) for all primary schools was 17.3 and for all secondary schools was 12.4.

## PART-TIME SECONDARY STUDENTS

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### PART-TIME SECONDARY STUDENTS

Tables 48 and 49 show the number and FTE of part-time secondary students by year of education by category of school by State and Territory. The FTE of part-time students has been calculated by dividing the student's workload by what is considered to be a full workload by that State or Territory, as the method used to determine student workload varies between States and Territories.

Part-time figures vary considerably between States and Territories, as each education authority has different policy and organisational arrangements. The number of part-time courses available also varies considerably between States and Territories.

Age level data are not published as not all States and Territories collect the age of part-time students.

Secondary education commences at Year 7 in New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, and at Year 8 in Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and the Northern Territory.

## APPARENT RETENTION RATES

### APPARENT RETENTION RATES

Tables 50, 51 and 52 relate to apparent retention rates for full-time students, expressed as a percentage. Care should be exercised in the interpretation of these tables, since a range of factors affect the calculation of apparent retention rates. At the Australia level, these include students repeating a year of education, migration, and other net changes to the school population such as full-fee paying overseas students. No adjustments have been made for these effects.

In tables 50 and 51, at the State and Territory level, additional factors affect the data. These include enrolment policies (which contribute to different age/grade structures between States and Territories), inter-sector transfer and interstate movements of students. It is also important to note that enrolment patterns in schools/TAFEs vary between States and Territories, with differing effects on apparent retention rates. For example, in the Australian Capital Territory, the rate for government schools exceeds 100%. One of the reasons for this is that a number of non-government schools finish at Year 10 and students need to change schools to continue to Years 11 and 12. This has the effect of reducing the non-government rate and increasing the government rate. For these reasons, apparent retention rates are more useful as an indicator of changes over time within States and Territories, rather than for comparison between States and Territories.

The apparent retention rates in table 50 show the percentage of students who continued to Year 12 in 2000 from their respective cohort groups at the commencement of their secondary schooling. For example, at the Australia level, Year 12 in 2000 retained 72.3% of students who commenced Year 7 (NSW, Vic., Tas. and the ACT) in 1995, and Year 8 (Qld, SA, WA and the NT) in 1996. In table 51, the apparent retention rates show the percentage of students who continued to Year 12 in 2000 from their respective cohort group in Year 10. For example, at the Australia level, Year 12 in 2000 retained 74.4% of students who commenced Year 10 in 1998.

In table 52, comparisons between government and non-government apparent retention rates should be made with caution, due to the effect that student transfer between government and non-government schools has on the apparent retention rate figures. For example, some figures in 2000 for Anglican and Other schools show an apparent retention rate in excess of 100%. This has been caused by transfer from other categories of schools into the cohort group after the base year, thus inflating the real situation.

## AGE PARTICIPATION RATES

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### AGE PARTICIPATION RATES

Age participation rates shown in table 53 measure the number of full-time students of a particular age and sex, expressed as a proportion of the estimated resident population of the same age and sex. Whereas apparent retention rates rely on students having to progress year by year through the system, participation rates relate to the population as a whole.

Participation rates vary considerably between States and Territories, partly reflecting the different enrolment patterns and structures of the education systems.

In table 53 some participation rates in the Australian Capital Territory exceed 100%. This is mainly due to enrolment in Australian Capital Territory secondary schools of students who are not residents of the Australian Capital Territory, but live in surrounding New South Wales.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

### INTRODUCTION

**1** This publication contains statistics of government and non-government schools, students and staff as at August 2000.

**2** The National Schools Statistics Collection (NSSC) is a collaborative arrangement between State, Territory and Commonwealth education authorities. A schools statistics committee, of which the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) is a member, was established in 1979 to improve the quality of education statistics relating to government and non-government primary and secondary education. It has developed a set of concepts, definitions and classifications for use in the NSSC.

### SCOPE AND COVERAGE

**3** The statistics in this publication relate to establishments which have, as their major activity, the administration and/or provision of full-time day primary, secondary or special education, or primary or secondary distance education. Major activity is based on the activity of students or, where this is not appropriate, e.g. in administrative offices, on the activity of staff. Therefore, the statistics presented do not include establishments, students or staff engaged in such activities as courses conducted by the Technical and Further Education (TAFE) institutions.

**4** Statistics for the government series relate to all establishments administered by the Department of Education under the Director-General of Education (or equivalent) in each State and Territory, students attending those establishments, and all staff engaged in the administration or provision of government school education at those establishments. Statistics for the non-government series relate to all establishments not administered by the Department of Education.

**5** In the government series, Pre-year 1 in Western Australia is called Pre-primary. In 2000, there were 20,008 students attending Pre-primary on a four-day-per-week basis, supported by 1,779.5 FTE school staff and 76.1 FTE non-school staff. The Education Department of Western Australia has advised that Pre-primary students will be attending five days per week from 2002, at which stage the students and staff will be included within the scope of the NSSC.

**6** This publication contains details of non-school staff for the government series only, since equivalent data are not available for the non-government series.

**7** Emergency and casual relief teaching staff employed on a casual basis are not included in this collection, as they replace permanent teaching staff absent for short periods of time. These permanent teaching staff are already counted in this collection.

**8** Education services in Jervis Bay Territory are provided by the Australian Capital Territory Department of Education and Community Services, through Commonwealth Government funding. For the purposes of the NSSC, figures for Jervis Bay Territory are included in statistics for the Australian Capital Territory. As at August 2000, there was one government primary school in Jervis Bay Territory with 84 students, 7.0 FTE teaching staff and 2.9 FTE non-teaching staff.

**9** Tables 48 and 49 shows part-time secondary students by number and FTE by year of education by category of school. Information on age of part-time students is not published as some States and Territories do not collect this data.

### CENSUS DATE

**10** The census date for the collection is the first Friday in August each year. For 2000 this was 4 August, except for the Northern Territory which, for administrative reasons, held its census on 18 August. The age reference date was 1 July for all States and Territories.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

### METHODOLOGY

**11** The statistics were compiled from collections conducted in cooperation with the Ministerial Council on Education, Employment, Training and Youth Affairs Task Force on School Statistics, by the State and Territory Departments of Education (government series), and the Commonwealth Department of Education, Training and Youth Affairs (non-government series).

**12** The methodologies employed in compiling the government sector aggregates on which the statistics in this publication are based, vary between the different State and Territory Departments of Education. They range from manipulation of central administrative records to direct collection of data from establishments.

**13** The Commonwealth Department of Education, Training and Youth Affairs collects data directly from establishments in the non-government sector for all States and Territories. The statistics in this publication are a summary of results from that collection.

### INTERPRETATION OF RESULTS

**14** The ABS has published education statistics for many years. However, prior to the implementation of the NSSC, the data were not necessarily comparable between States and Territories. With the implementation of the NSSC concepts, the definitions, classifications and coverage were revised. The new government series was implemented in 1981 and the non-government series in 1984. Therefore, particular care should be exercised when comparing data in this publication with that prior to 1981 and 1984 for the government and non-government series respectively, and between the two series from 1981 to 1983. In interpreting the figures in this publication, users should be aware that comparability of statistics between States and Territories and between government and non-government schools in any one State or Territory is affected by differences in the organisation of grades, policy on student intake and advancement, flows from secondary to vocational education and the recruitment and employment of teachers.

**15** There is no Australia-wide standard method of allocating students and classes to a certain year of education (grade). A number of schools (other than special schools) do not maintain a formal grade structure. Students at these schools have been allocated to equivalent grades where possible, but otherwise appear against the category ungraded in either the primary or secondary levels of education.

**16** To calculate the apparent retention rate at the Australia level, of the full-time student cohort group who are currently (2000) in Year 12, from their commencement in secondary schooling (as shown in table 50), the total number of full-time students in Year 12 in 2000 is divided by the sum of the full-time students in Year 7 in New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory in 1995 and the full-time students in Year 8 in Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and the Northern Territory in 1996 (since those years represent the commencement of the secondary school system in the respective State and Territory). The resultant figure is converted to a percentage.

### STUDENT/TEACHING STAFF RATIOS

**17** Student/teaching staff ratios are calculated by dividing the number of full-time students by the FTE of teaching staff. Please note that student/teaching staff ratios should not be used as a measure of class size.

### DISCONTINUITIES IN THE SERIES

**18** Commencing with the 1989 collection, staff have been categorised according to their major function. This means that some staff who were previously included in teaching staff are now included in specialist support. Users

are advised to be aware of this when comparing teaching staff figures published prior to 1989.

**19** Commencing with the 1989 collection, executive staff have been included in non-school staff.

**20** As from 1990, students attending special schools have not been identified separately, and have been allocated to either primary or secondary level of education. From 1990, staff in special schools have also not been identified separately, and have been allocated to either primary or secondary area of activity.

**21** The Tasmanian Department of Education has advised that a change in the Early Childhood Admission Policy, commencing in 1993, has resulted in a change in the enrolment pattern of students in Preparatory and Year 1. Commencing with the 1989 collection, executive staff have been included in non-school staff.

**22** The Department of Education of the Northern Territory has advised that, commencing in 1995, students identified as secondary-aged in remote Aboriginal schools have been reclassified to the ungraded secondary category, as these students cannot be readily classified into the normal urban secondary grade structure. The removal of these students from the calculation of apparent retention rates is partially responsible for the apparent increase in these rates from 1997 (for the Year 10 to Year 12 rate), and from 1999 (for the Year 8 to Year 12 rate).

**23** As a result of changed reporting methodology in 1995, non-government school staff who are not based at a particular school, but who are mainly active in schools, are now included in the published figures.

**24** The Tasmanian Department of Education has advised that, commencing in 1996, the defined load of a full-time secondary student attending Years 11 and 12 has changed from 450 annual student contact hours to 600. The Department has further advised that, commencing in 1999, students previously identified as ungraded are being included in the normal school grade structure. This may affect apparent retention rates, however the impact is expected to be negligible given the small number of students involved.

### GENERAL ACKNOWLEDGMENT

**25** This publication draws extensively on information provided freely by education organisations. Their continued cooperation is very much appreciated: without it, the wide range of education statistics published by the ABS would not be available. # APPENDIX STRUCTURE OF PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLING

## STRUCTURE OF PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLING

The structure of primary and secondary schooling in Australia varies between the different States and Territories. There are three basic patterns evident, as illustrated below:

- in New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory primary education comprises a Pre-year 1 grade followed by Years 1 to 6. In New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory, Pre-year 1 is called Kindergarten, and in Victoria and Tasmania it is called Preparatory. Secondary education comprises Years 7 to 12;
- in South Australia and the Northern Territory primary education comprises a Pre-year 1 grade followed by Years 1 to 7. In South Australia, Pre-year 1 is called Reception, and in the Northern Territory it is called Transition. Secondary education comprises Years 8 to 12; and
- in Queensland and Western Australia primary education comprises Years 1 to 7 and secondary education Years 8 to 12. For details on Western Australia's government pre-primary education see paragraph 5 of the Explanatory Notes.

Each State and Territory also has a preschool sector which is separate from primary and secondary schooling. Data on preschool education within schools have been excluded from primary enrolments in this publication.

## GLOSSARY

<b>Affiliation of non-government schools</b>	Non-government schools are classified to three groups: Anglican, Catholic and Other. Included in the Other category are schools with specific religious affiliations (other than Anglican and Catholic) and schools that are interdenominational, non-denominational or which have no religious affiliation.
<b>Age participation rate</b>	The age participation rate is the number of full-time students of a particular age and sex expressed as a proportion of the preliminary estimated resident population of the same age and sex. It indicates the proportion of the population who are still at school. In the Australian Capital Territory some rates exceed 100%. This is mainly due to the enrolment of secondary school students who are not residents of the Australian Capital Territory, but live in the surrounding New South Wales area.
<b>Ancillary Education Establishment (AEE)</b>	This is an establishment where the major activity is the provision of aspects of primary, secondary or special education to students supplementary to that provided by schools. AEEs include those education establishments in institutions and hospitals which do not have officially recognised student enrolments. Only student and staff data are included for AEEs.
<b>Apparent retention rate</b>	<p>This is the percentage of students of a given cohort group who continued to a particular level/year of education. In this publication, apparent retention rates are calculated for full-time students who continued to Years 10, 11 and 12 of secondary schooling. Care should be exercised in the interpretation of apparent retention rates since a range of factors affecting calculation have not been taken into account. At the Australia level these include students repeating a year of education, migration and other net changes to the school population. At lower levels of disaggregation, additional factors affecting the data, such as enrolment policies (which contribute to different age/grade structures between States and Territories), inter-sector transfer and interstate movements of students have not been taken into account. International comparisons are another area where structural differences must be taken into account. See Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16 for an example of the calculation of apparent retention rates.</p> <p>Part-time students are excluded from apparent retention rates; the effect of this exclusion varies between States and Territories.</p>
<b>Area of activity (of staff)</b>	The area of activity of staff is considered to be primary education or secondary education. As a rule, the FTE of staff is apportioned across areas of activity on the basis of time spent in the various areas of activity.
<b>Category of school</b>	Schools/AEEs are classified to the government or non-government sector for the purposes of this collection.
<b>Full-time equivalent (FTE) units</b>	<p>This is a measure of the total level of staff resources used. The FTE of a full-time staff member (i.e. employed full-time and engaged solely on activities which fall within the scope of this collection) is equal to 1.0. The calculation of FTE for part-time staff is as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>■ the FTE of part-time staff performing some activities which fall outside the scope of this collection (e.g. preschool or TAFE) is calculated on the basis of the proportion of time spent on in-scope activities compared with that spent by a full-time staff member solely occupied by in-scope activities; and</li><li>■ the FTE of part-time staff performing activities which fall solely within the scope of this collection is calculated on the basis of time worked compared with that worked by full-time staff performing similar duties.</li></ul> <p>Some States and Territories are not able to calculate FTE on a time-spent basis for all staff functions but use wages paid as a fraction of full-time rate, or a resource allocation based formula. Some also use a pro rata formula based on student or teacher numbers to estimate aggregate FTE for some categories of staff.</p>

## GLOSSARY *continued*

<b>Indigenous student</b>	A student of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin who identifies as an Aborigine or Torres Strait Islander.
<b>Level/Year of education</b>	Level of education is split into primary and secondary. Year of education comprises Pre-year 1 through to Year 12, plus ungraded primary and ungraded secondary.
<b>Major function (of non-school staff)</b>	<p>Major function is based on duties performed. Staff who spend less than half their time in contact with students, and/or do not generally perform their duties in any school/AEE are classified as non-school staff.</p> <p>The functional categories for non-school staff are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>■ executive staff are staff generally undertaking functions of a senior administrative nature broader than that of a secondary principal and whose salary usually exceeds that of a secondary principal;</li><li>■ specialist support staff are staff who manage or are engaged in curriculum development and research activities, assisting with teaching resources, staff development, student support services and teacher support services;</li><li>■ administrative and clerical staff are staff whose main duties are of an administrative and clerical nature; and</li><li>■ building operations, general maintenance and other staff include staff involved in the maintenance of buildings, grounds etc. Also included are staff providing associated technical services and other janitorial staff.</li></ul>
<b>Major function (of school staff)</b>	<p>Major function is based on duties performed. Staff who spend more than half their time in contact with students, and/or generally perform their duties in one or more schools/AEEs are classified as school staff.</p> <p>The functional categories for school staff are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>■ teaching staff are staff who spend the majority of their time in contact with students, i.e. support students either by direct class contact or on an individual basis, and have teaching duties, that is, are engaged to impart school curriculum. For the purposes of this collection, teaching staff includes principals, deputy principals and senior teachers mainly involved in administration;</li><li>■ specialist support staff are staff who perform functions that are of special benefit to students or teaching staff in the development of the school curriculum;</li><li>■ administrative and clerical staff (including teacher aides and assistants) are staff whose main duties are generally of an administrative and clerical nature; and</li><li>■ building operations, general maintenance and other staff are staff involved in the maintenance of buildings, grounds etc. Also included are staff providing associated technical services and janitorial staff.</li></ul>
<b>Other education establishments</b>	<p>A number of other establishments within the scope of these statistics, but not defined as schools or AEEs include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>■ administrative offices which have as their major activity the administration of primary, secondary or special education; and</li><li>■ teacher resource centres operated by a State or Territory Director-General of Education (or equivalent).</li></ul>
<b>Primary education</b>	Full-time education which typically commences at around age five and lasts for seven to eight years. It does not include sessional education such as preschool education. In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, primary education may extend from Pre-year 1 to Year 6 (or equivalent). In South Australia and the Northern Territory it may extend from Pre-year 1 to Year 7 (or equivalent). In Queensland and Western Australia it may extend from Year 1 to Year 7 (or equivalent).



## GLOSSARY *continued*

- School** A school (other than a special school) must satisfy the following criteria:
- its major activity is the provision of full-time day primary or secondary education or the provision of primary or secondary distance education; and
  - it is headed by a principal (or equivalent) responsible for its internal operation; and
  - it is possible for students to enrol for a minimum of four continuous weeks, excluding breaks for school vacations.

The term 'school' in this publication includes schools in institutions and hospitals, mission schools and similar establishments. The term excludes preschools, kindergarten centres, pre-primary schools or pre-primary classes in or attached to non-special schools, senior technical and agricultural colleges, evening schools, continuation classes and institutions such as business or coaching colleges.

- Secondary education** Education which typically commences after completion of primary education, at around age 12, and lasts for five or six years. In New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory, secondary education may extend from Year 7 to Year 12 (or equivalent). In Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, and the Northern Territory it may extend from Year 8 to Year 12 (or equivalent).

- Special school** A school which provides special instruction for physically and/or mentally disabled or impaired students, or those with social problems. Students must exhibit one or more of the following characteristics before enrolment is allowed:
- mental or physical disability or impairment;
  - slow learning ability;
  - social or emotional problems; and/or
  - in custody, on remand or in hospital.

- Staff** Staff are persons who are involved in the administration or provision of primary or secondary education. Staff are categorised as school staff or non-school staff, based on the duties in which they spend the majority of their time. See also Major function (school staff) and Major function (non-school staff).

- Student** A person who is enrolled in a school and active in a course of study other than preschool or TAFE courses. Persons not present at the census date are included if they were expected to be absent for less than four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) and are excluded if they had left the school or had been absent without explanation for four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) prior to the census date.

A full-time student is one who undertakes a workload specified as full-time in the government or non-government sector.

A part-time student is one who undertakes a workload less than that specified as full-time in either sector.

In tables 3 and 49, the FTE of part-time students has been calculated by dividing the student's workload by what is considered to be a full workload by that State or Territory, as the method used to determine student workload varies between States and Territories.





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
