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ABOUT THIS PUBLICATION

This publication presents information on persons in custody and community-based corrections. The statistics are derived from information provided to the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) from administrative records held by corrective services agencies in each state and territory, and from the Federal Attorney-General's Department for details on federal prisoners. Details are provided for each state and territory on numbers and imprisonment rates by type of custody (i.e. open or secure custody or periodic detention). Information is also presented on prisoner numbers by legal status (sentenced or unsentenced) and by sentence type, for all prisoners and for Indigenous prisoners, together with the number of sentenced receptions into custody and the number of federal prisoners.

The ABS acknowledges the valuable contribution of the Board of Management, the Advisory Group of the National Corrective Services Statistics Unit and the staff of the various agencies that provide the statistics that are presented in this publication.



NUMBER OF PRISONERS


PERSONS IN PRISON CUSTODY, Average daily number per month



In the December quarter 2003, the average daily number of prisoners in Australia was 22,878, an increase of 143 (less than 1%) on the September quarter 2003. The average daily number of prisoners in Australia increased by 867 (4%) over the year from the December quarter 2002.

AVERAGE DAILY IMPRISONMENT RATE(a)




Nationally, the average daily imprisonment rate was 151 prisoners per 100,000 adult population during the December quarter 2003, an increase of 3% since the December quarter 2002. The Northern Territory had the highest imprisonment rate (521 prisoners per 100,000 adult population), followed by Western Australia (201) and Queensland (182). The Australian Capital Territory (including Australian Capital Territory prisoners held in New South Wales prisons) and Victoria had the lowest imprisonment rates (73 and 98 prisoners per 100,000 adults respectively). New South Wales recorded a 4% increase in the imprisonment rate since the December quarter 2002. Decreases in imprisonment rates were recorded in the Australian Capital Territory (including Australian Capital Territory prisoners in New South Wales prisons) and Tasmania of 11% and 3% respectively during this period.

Of the average daily number of prisoners in Australia in the December quarter 2003, 21,389 (93%) were male and 1,489 (7%) were female. Males were 15 times more likely to be in prison than females.

INDIGENOUS PRISONERS


INDIGENOUS PERSONS IMPRISONMENT RATE (a)

The national rate of imprisonment for Indigenous persons in the December quarter 2003 was 1,972 per 100,000 adult Indigenous population, an increase of 5% since the December quarter 2002 and an increase of 3% since the September quarter 2003.

The highest rate of imprisonment for Indigenous persons was recorded in Western Australia (2,960 Indigenous persons per 100,000 adult Indigenous population) followed by New South Wales (2,188). Over the past quarter South Australia, Tasmania and the Northern Territory recorded increases in the Indigenous rates of imprisonment (6%, 5% and 4% respectively).

Western Australia recorded the highest proportional increase in the Indigenous rate of imprisonment (12%) between the December quarters 2002 and 2003, followed by the Northern Territory (10%) and Victoria (10%). Over the twelve month period from the December quarter 2002, Tasmania and South Australia recorded decreases in the Indigenous rates of imprisonment of 8% and 2% respectively.

Nationally, the Indigenous rate of imprisonment was 16 times the non-Indigenous rate of imprisonment. The highest ratio of Indigenous to non-Indigenous rates of imprisonment was recorded in Western Australia where the Indigenous rate of imprisonment was 22 times the non-Indigenous rate. 
TYPE OF CUSTODY

In the December quarter 2003, the average daily number of prisoners in secure prison custody was 16,474 (72%). The remaining prisoners were held in open prison custody. Nationally, the proportion of persons held in secure and open prison custody has remained fairly stable over the past year.

In the December quarter 2003, the highest proportions of prisoners held in secure custody were recorded in Victoria (89%) and South Australia (88%). The states and territories with the lowest proportions of prisoners in secure prison custody were the Australian Capital Territory (including Australian Capital Territory prisoners held in New South Wales prisons) and New South Wales (48% and 54% respectively).

LEGAL STATUS AND SENTENCE TYPE Of the total prison population of 22,988, the average number of unsentenced prisoners on the first day of the month was 4,851 (21%) for the December quarter 2003. The Australian Capital Territory – including Australian Capital Territory prisoners held in New South Wales prisons – had the highest proportion of unsentenced prisoners (34%). The lowest proportion of unsentenced prisoners was recorded in Western Australia (15%).

Based on annual figures, the number of unsentenced prisoners has increased by 8% between 2002 and 2003. In contrast, the number of sentenced prisoners has increased by 3% between 2002 and 2003. The proportion of unsentenced prisoners has remained constant between 2002 and 2003.

SENTENCED RECEPTIONS

In the December quarter 2003, there were 5,973 sentenced receptions in Australia. The number of sentenced receptions decreased by 572 (9%) compared with the December quarter 2002. Decreases in sentenced receptions between the December quarters 2002 and 2003 were recorded by all jurisdictions except the Northern Territory which recorded an increase of 29 (12%). Between the September and December quarters 2003, the number of sentenced receptions decreased in South Australia (18%), Western Australia (8%), Tasmania(8%) and Victoria (5%). New South Wales, Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory recorded increases in sentenced receptions in this period.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS continued

PERIODIC DETENTION

Periodic detention is a form of custody only used in New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory. During the December quarter 2003 there was an average daily number of 757 persons in New South Wales and 81 persons in the Australian Capital Territory held in periodic detention. While the rate of imprisonment in periodic detention in New South Wales decreased by 16% between the December quarters 2002 and 2003 it increased by 8% in the Australian Capital Territory during the same period. As at the December quarter 2003, 9% of persons in custody in New South Wales were in periodic detention. In contrast, for the same period, 31% of Australian Capital Territory persons in custody were in period detention

FEDERAL PRISONERS

In the December quarter 2003, there were 669 federal prisoners in Australia, a decrease of 73 (10%) since the December quarter 2002. The Northern Territory and Western Australia had the largest decreases in federal prisoners (70% and 30% respectively). However, federal prisoners in Queensland increased from 77 to 89 between December quarter 2002 and 2003.

PERSONS IN

CORRECTIONS


In the December quarter 2003, there were 50,541 persons in community-based corrections in Australia, a decrease of 2,322 (4%) since the December quarter 2002. However, Victoria, Tasmania and the Northern Territory recorded increases in persons in community-based corrections between December quarter 2002 and December quarter 2003 (10%, 10% and 8%).

Rates per 100,000 adults

Nationally, the rate of persons in community-based corrections was 332 persons per 100,000 adult population for the December quarter 2003. This is a decrease of 6% on the rate of persons in community-based corrections in the December quarter 2002, and unchanged since the September quarter 2003.

In the December quarter 2003, the male rate of participation in community-based corrections was 550 per 100,000 adult male population in comparison to 117 females per 100,000 adult female population. Males were five times more likely to be in community-based corrections than females.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

- **1** This publication presents statistical series on persons held in either adult corrective services custody or who are serving community-based orders in Australia. It contains data on the number of persons by their sex, type of custody, legal status and sentence type; the number of sentenced persons received into corrective services custody each month; the number of Indigenous persons in corrective services custody by their sex, legal status and sentence type, and the number of federal prisoners.
- **2** Statistics presented in this publication are compiled in three ways:
 - Average daily prisoner population: Counts taken on each day of the month are summed and divided by the number of days in that month to determine the average daily prisoner population for that month. The average daily periodic detainee population is a count of persons on periodic detention on each day a centre is open, divided by the number of days a centre is open.
 - Sentenced prisoner reception figures: Counts are provided each month on the number of receptions where a prisoner is received as a sentenced prisoner plus the number of changes of legal status from unsentenced to sentenced.
 - First day of the month prisoner population: Counts of prisoner populations, taken on or near the first day of the month (see Explanatory Notes, paragraphs 4 and 5).
- **3** Although national standards and classifications are used in the compilation of these statistics, some discrepancies remain between the states and territories. These are due to legislative and procedural differences between jurisdictions and the way that these differences are reflected in agencies' administrative data systems. As part of its development strategy, the ABS is working with corrective services agencies to minimise the effect of these differences.

REFERENCE PERIOD/DATE

- **4** For the average daily prisoner population and the sentenced prisoner receptions counts, the reference period is the complete reference month. For all other information in the publication, the reference date is the first day of the month. However, not all states and territories report strictly according to this 'first day of the month' rule:
 - The Western Australian and Victorian prison population and Australian Capital Territory prisoners in New South Wales prisons are counted as at midnight on the last day of the month. In these cases the figures provided are taken to represent the prison population at the beginning of the following month to align with practices in other states and territories.
 - The New South Wales prison population is counted on the first Sunday of the month.
 - In January 1999 ACT Corrections commenced sending some unsentenced prisoners to New South Wales prisons. These unsentenced ACT in NSW prisoners are shown on a daily average basis in table 5.
- **5** Calculation of figures for the entire quarter and entire year varies depending on the counting unit and method of counting prisoners. These figures may be subject to rounding:
 - Average daily figures: Figures are calculated by weighting the average according to the number of days in each month or year.
 - First day of the month: Figures are simple averages. Quarterly figures for each month are added and the total is divided by three; for yearly figures, the figures for each month are added and the total divided by twelve.
 - Sentenced receptions: Figures are totals of each month.

6 The scope of the statistics in this publication includes all persons remanded or sentenced to adult custodial corrective services agencies or who are serving community-based orders in each state and territory in Australia, including Work Outreach Camps and Community Custody Centres in Queensland. corrections includes those persons with breached or suspended orders, with the exception of Tasmania.

- **7** In all states and territories except Victoria and Queensland, persons remanded or sentenced to adult custody are aged 18 years and over. Persons under 18 years are treated as juveniles in most Australian courts and are not remanded or sentenced to custody in adult prisons, other than in exceptional circumstances. However, in Victoria and Queensland, 'adult' refers to persons aged 17 years and over.
- **8** Statistics in this publication are derived from information provided to the ABS from administrative records held by corrective services agencies within each state and territory. Statistics on federal prisoners are derived from records kept by the Criminal Law Division of the Commonwealth Attorney-General's Department.
- **9** The Australian Capital Territory Corrective Services Department has advised that the numbers of Indigenous prisoners sentenced in Australian Capital Territory courts and held in New South Wales prisons had been under reported. This under reporting was resolved from April 2000. No adjustments to data prior to April 2000 were able to be made.
- **10** Tasmanian prisoner data for first day of month counts in table 5 for reference periods prior to the September quarter 2003 are under enumerated. Data are currently being investigated and may be revised.
- **11** New South Wales Community-Based Corrections data are subject to ongoing quality assurance processes undertaken in this state. Prior to the September quarter 2003, pre-sentence reports were omitted from reported bail figures. Bail figures in Table 18 relating to earlier reference periods are under enumerated.
- **12** Queensland prisoner data for the March quarter 2002 have been revised(tables 1–6, 8–12) to include all prisoners held in Community Custody Centres. Queensland sentenced receptions (table 7) for the March quarter 2002 to the June quarter 2003 have also been revised due to ongoing quality assurance processes undertaken in this state. Data prior to 2002 have not been revised and may be under enumerated.

INDIGENOUS IDENTIFICATION

- 13 In all states and territories persons are asked during entry into custody whether they identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander. It is uncommon for corrective services agencies to collect Indigenous status information from sources other than the person's own identification.
- **14** Some persons in custody are recorded as of unknown Indigenous status on corrective services agencies' information systems, but unknown Indigenous status has not been provided for this collection. Such persons are designated as non-Indigenous. It is intended that unknown Indigenous status will be collected from these systems in future.

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL
TERRITORY PRISONERS

- **15** The Australian Capital Territory has a detention centre for unsentenced prisoners and a periodic detention centre. With the exception of some sentenced fine default only prisoners, persons sentenced to full-time custody by Australian Capital Territory criminal courts are held in New South Wales prisons.
- **16** During 2000 the Australian Capital Territory commenced detaining prisoners sentenced for fine default only at their centre for unsentenced persons. To provide greater understanding of the number of prisoners attributed to the Australian Capital Territory, while presenting an accurate picture of the New South Wales prisoner population, statistics relating to Australian Capital Territory prisoners in New South Wales prisons are presented as a subset of the New South Wales figures.

RATES AND RATIOS

- 17 Imprisonment rate data for the Australian Capital Territory are now included in the publication and are calculated on the basis of the total number of ACT prisoners (i.e. ACT prisoners held in NSW prisons, and ACT prisoners held in the ACT) divided by the estimated resident ACT adult population and multiplied by 100,000. For New South Wales, the imprisonment rate is now based on the count of NSW prisoners, excluding ACT prisoners held in NSW prisons, divided by the estimated resident NSW adult population and multiplied by 100,000. Time series data have also been derived on this basis. Previously, New South Wales imprisonment rates included ACT prisoners held in NSW prisons, which had the effect of slightly overstating the NSW imprisonment rate.
- **18** Imprisonment rates enable comparison of prisoner numbers across states and territories. Prisoner rates are expressed per 100,000 adult population.
- **19** For the purpose of this publication the population figures used in the calculation of rates are for persons aged 18 years and over for all states and territories except Victoria and Queensland where the population used is persons aged 17 years and over (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 7).
- **20** Rates for the Indigenous adult population in this publication are based on revised projections for 30 June 2003 (refer Experimental Projections of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Population 30 June 1996 to 30 June 2006 (cat. no. 3231.0)). These projections are in turn based on the results of the 1996 Census of Population and Housing.
- 21 Two series of these projections have been published. The so-called 'higher series' takes into account a possible change in propensity for people to identify themselves as Indigenous since the 1996 Population Census and estimates this from the 1991–1996 intercensal period. The lower series assumes no such change has taken place since 1996. The lower of the two series was used in calculating rates for the Indigenous adult population in this publication. This is because, after discussions with representatives of corrective services agencies, it was felt that the propensity to identify as Indigenous has not increased to the same extent in the prison environment as might have occurred in the wider community.
- **22** A new set of projections of the Indigenous population, based on 2001 Census of Population and Housing, are due for release in July 2004 in the publication *Experimental Estimates and Projections of Indigenous Australians*, 1991 to 2016 (cat. no. 3238.0). Indigenous imprisonment rates will be revised using the data from these updated estimates when available.
- 23 Rates for the total adult prisoner population and persons in community–based corrections are calculated using the Estimated Resident Population (ERP) for each of the states and territories (refer *Australian Demographic Statistics* (cat. no. 3101.0)). As the population changes over time the denominator used for the calculation of rates varies, depending on the reference period. Rates are calculated using ERP for two quarters prior to their respective quarters. Thus for the December quarter 2003, ERP for the June quarter 2003 was used in the calculation of rates. This approach uses the latest ERP available at the time of publication.
- **24** The ratio of imprisonment rates of Indigenous persons to non-Indigenous persons is calculated by dividing the Indigenous imprisonment rate for each period and state or territory by the corresponding non-Indigenous imprisonment rate.
- 25 The ratio indicates the extent to which the imprisonment rates of Indigenous persons exceed the imprisonment rates of non-Indigenous persons. A ratio of 20.0 indicates that, for the given state or territory, the imprisonment rate of Indigenous persons per 100,000 adult population is 20 times that of the imprisonment rate of non-Indigenous persons.

EXPLANATORY NOTES continued

RATES AND RATIOS continued

26 In some instances Indigenous rates and ratios have not been published. Where this occurs, the cell concerned contains the symbol 'np'. This happens where, either the number of persons in custody is less than 10, or where the denominator population on which the rate is calculated is less than 5,000. This has been done because such rates and ratios vary widely from month to month with small variations in numbers of persons, and therefore may give an inaccurate reflection of the relative involvement of Indigenous persons in custody.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- **27** The Maryborough Correctional Centre, Queensland, was officially opened in April 2003. The Centre has the capacity to hold 500 prisoners.
- **28** During 2002 the following factors in Western Australia have impacted on the prisoner population: an increase in the acquittal and dismissal rates in courts; greater use by the courts of suspended imprisonment and community orders as penalties; and a decrease in the breach rate for early release orders. The impact of these factors has been proportionally greater on the number of Indigenous prisoners who tend to be convicted of offences which attract shorter sentences.
- **29** During 2003 in Western Australia there was an increase in the number of Indigenous persons sentenced to imprisonment by the courts, mostly in relation to 'Driving/Traffic', 'Against the Person' and 'Justice/Good Order' offences.
- **30** Bail figures are included for the first time in WA from the December quarter 2003. These are a result of new sentencing legislation that may also influence other community corrections data in future issues.
- **31** During the 2001–02 financial year, Tasmania recorded a large increase in the number of unsentenced prisoners. This overall increase was due to an increase in lodgments in the Supreme Court coupled with the move by police to more actively oppose bail. The variation over the period is explained primarily by the availability of judicial resources. A Supreme Court Judge was allocated to a long running trial in the March and June quarters of 2002 this represented 25% of the judicial resources allocated to crime by the court. There was also a reduction in the number of magistrates available in the Court of Petty Sessions due to a number of long running coronial inquests.
- **32** In the Northern Territory, over the 12 months to 30 June 2003, there has been an increase in the number of Indigenous persons sentenced to imprisonment for a range of assault and driving offences.

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APPENDIX INTERPRETATION OF INDIGENOUS STATISTICS

INTRODUCTION

Tables 8 to 12 in this publication provide nationally comparable statistics on imprisonment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (Indigenous) people. There are a number of issues that bear on the statistical measures of Indigenous imprisonment. This technical appendix provides advice on how these statistics should be interpreted.

NUMBERS

The first and most basic measure of Indigenous imprisonment is the *number of persons imprisoned*. Imprisoned persons are classified as Indigenous if they identify themselves as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander at the time they are received into prison custody. These statistics in *Corrective Services Australia* are derived from administrative records held by corrective services agencies in each jurisdiction. The accuracy of the Indigenous component of the statistics is dependent upon the quality of the information collected by these agencies.

PROPORTIONS

The second measure is the Indigenous *proportion of the prisoner population*. This relates the number of Indigenous persons in custody to the total number of persons in custody, and provides a basis for comparing the composition of the prison population across jurisdictions.

RATES

The third measure of Indigenous imprisonment is the *rate of imprisonment*, that is the number of Indigenous prisoners per 100,000 adults in the Indigenous population. The number of persons imprisoned in any jurisdiction is partly a function of the size of the population in that jurisdiction. All other things being equal, a jurisdiction such as the Northern Territory with a large Indigenous population will have a larger number of Indigenous prisoners than a jurisdiction such as Tasmania with a small Indigenous population. The rate of imprisonment provides a basis for comparing the relative likelihood that any Indigenous adult in a state or territory will be imprisoned.

RATIOS

The fourth measure of Indigenous imprisonment is the *ratio of Indigenous to non-Indigenous imprisonment*. Australian states and territories have widely varying rates of imprisonment. Hence, the likelihood that any Indigenous adult will be imprisoned in any jurisdiction is partly a function of the overall likelihood of imprisonment in that jurisdiction. This ratio provides a measure of how much more likely it is that an Indigenous adult in a particular jurisdiction will be imprisoned compared with his or her non-Indigenous counterparts.

GLOSSARY

Community-based corrections

This refers to the community-based management of court-ordered sanctions, post-prison administrative arrangements and fine conversions for offenders, which principally involve the provision of one or more of the following activities: supervision, programmes or community work.

Corrective services custody

Confinement in a place intended primarily for the purpose of confining prisoners, such as a prison, prison farm, Periodic Detention Centre or Community Custody Centre.

Federal sentenced prisoner

Persons charged and sentenced under a Commonwealth statute. For the purposes of this publication federal sentenced prisoners are those persons who are recognised by the Criminal Law Division of the Commonwealth Attorney-General's Department as having been charged and sentenced under a Commonwealth statute. Federal sentenced prisoners are counted by the state or territory in which they were sentenced, not necessarily where they were held in custody.

Fine default only

A sentence type indicating that, at the time, the prisoner is serving a sentence for default of a fine and nothing else.

Full-time custody

A type of custody where a prisoner is required to be held in custody on a full-time basis.

Indigenous prisoner

A prisoner who identifies as either Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.

Legal status

An offender may be either sentenced or unsentenced depending on the warrant(s) or court order(s) which provide the legal basis for the detention of the offender in custody.

Open custody

A custodial regime for managing prisoners which does not require them to be confined by a secure perimeter physical barrier, irrespective of whether a physical barrier exists.

Other sentenced

A sentence type indicating that, at the time, a person is serving a sentence other than, or in addition to, a fine default sentence.

Periodic detention

A type of custody or order where a sentenced prisoner is required to be held in custody for two consecutive days in a one-week period.

Prisoner

A person held in custody. For the purposes of this collection, prisoners are those whose confinement is the responsibility of a corrective services agency.

Reparation

Reparation refers to all offenders with a community service order or fine option that requires them to undertake unpaid work.

Restricted movement

This refers to offenders who are subject to a system of restricted movement including supervision and/or electronic monitoring.

Secure custody

A custodial regime for managing prisoners that requires them to be confined by a secure physical barrier.

Sentenced

A legal status indicating that a person has received a custodial order from a court in response to a conviction for a criminal offence.

Sentenced prisoner reception

Includes persons who enter corrective services custody from the community, having received a sentence of imprisonment as an outcome of a court proceeding. It also includes persons who are sentenced to custody while in custody on remand (i.e. change status from a remand to a sentenced prisoner). Sentenced prisoners in custody who receive a further sentence of imprisonment are not counted as sentenced receptions.

Two types of sentenced prisoner reception are distinguished:

- A *fine default only* reception is a sentenced reception where a person enters custody as a result of defaulting on the payment of a fine.
- An *other sentenced* reception is a sentenced reception (including changes of status from unsentenced to sentenced) for anything other than a fine default only reception.

Note that Victorian reception figures do not include prisoners who change status from unsentenced to sentenced in the period.

GLOSSARY continued

Supervision (compliance)

This includes community-based orders other than those categorised as restricted movement or reparation (e.g. parole, bail and sentenced probation).

Unsentenced

A legal status indicating that a person is confined to custody while awaiting the outcome of their trial. Some sentenced prisoners may also be 'remanded in custody', (i.e. are unsentenced) in relation to other offences pending a court hearing. In such cases, these prisoners are counted as sentenced.

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
