## NOTES

### ABOUT THIS PUBLICATION

This publication contains detailed information concerning the 1996–97 Input-Output Product Classification (IOPC), and product supply and exports by detailed product item for 1996–97. A separate publication *Australian National Accounts, Input-Output Tables, 1996–97* (5209.0) provides a comprehensive range of input-output flow and coefficient tables.

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### ABOUT THE CLASSIFICATION

The IOPC is an industry-of-origin product classification that has been specifically developed for the compilation and application of Australian input-output tables. The industry classification to which the 1996–97 IOPC is related is the *Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC) 1993* (1292.0).

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### CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

For reasons of data availability and significance, the number of input-output industries has been reduced from 107 to 106 by merging the industry *Financial asset investors* (7303) with the industry *Non-bank finance* (7302).

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# ABOUT THE TABLES

## INTRODUCTION

**1** This publication provides detailed information about the 1996-97 Input-Output Product Classification (IOPC), and supply and exports by product item. The information complements the broadly classified input-output flow and coefficient tables released electronically and the publication *Australian National Accounts: Input-Output Tables, 1996-97* (5209.0). That publication also contains extensive notes about Australian input-output tables and the sources and methods used for their compilation.

**2** This edition of the IOPC is consistent with the 1993 edition of the *Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification* (ANZSIC), the *Australian and New Zealand Standard Commodity Classification* (ANZSCC) and the 1996-97 *Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System* (HS) at the 6 digit level.

## DESCRIPTION OF TABLES

Table 1

**3** This table provides a list of IOPC product items and shows, for each product item and group, the value of supply in 1996-97, its source (Australian production or imports) and the value of exports. Product values shown in these tables can be related directly to tables 1, 2 and 3 of the Input-Output Tables publication. For each product group total in table 1 of this publication, entries in the column headed *total* are equal to those in the column *total supply* (T6) in table 2, *Use table - input by industry and final use category and supply by product group*, of that publication. Similarly, entries in the column headed *exports* are equal to those in the column *exports* (Q7) for each product group in table 2 of the Input-Output Tables publication.

**4** The value of Australian production for each product group is equal to the total Australian production for the corresponding product group in table 1, *Supply table - supply by product group by industry and imports*, of the Input-Output Tables publication. The value of competing imports c.i.f. for each product group is equal to *total supply* (T6) for the corresponding product group in table 3, *Imports table - supply by product group and inputs by industry and final use category*, of that publication (electronic version); it is also equal to *competing imports* (P6), shown in table 2, *Use table - input by industry and final use category and supply by product group*, of the Input-Output Tables publication. Although competing imports for each product is valued c.i.f. the aggregate imports estimates are valued f.o.b. This is because the freight and insurance provided by resident operator, which is included in the value of imports valued on a c.i.f. basis, has been netted off the freight and insurance provided by non-residents.

**5** The value of complementary imports is equal to the total for *complementary imports* in table 3, *Imports table - supply by product group and inputs by industry and final use category*, of the Input-Output Tables publication (electronic version); it is also equal to *complementary imports* (P5) shown in table 2, *Use table - input by industry and final use category and supply by product group*, of that publication. Imports treated as complementary are also listed in Appendix C of the Input-Output Tables publication.

**6** These tables provide a reconciliation between information shown in table 1 and information shown in the source data series of international merchandise trade, agriculture, forestry, fishing, hunting, mining and manufacturing.

**7** This table provides a sample page from the concordance, for the agriculture and mining (excluding services to mining) and manufacturing sectors, between each item used for data collection in 1996-97 and the IOPC item(s) to which it is classified. For the manufacturing sector the production items refer to the ANZSCC items. The concordance also links each electricity and gas item used for data collection in 1996-97 and the corresponding IOPC item. Full details of the concordance are available electronically.

**8** Most of the production that is primary to the agriculture, mining, manufacturing, electricity and gas sectors relates to specified items for which a concordance to IOPC item(s) can readily be established. In addition, some production is recorded against broadly specified items which cannot be classified directly to an IOPC item. Production for the latter items is included in the input-output tables but no source data items are included in this classification table. The broadly defined items are referred to as production item gaps with respect to the IOPC and are discussed in paragraph 30 below. A reconciliation between mining and manufacturing survey data and input-output tables is provided in table 4.

**9** These tables also provide samples of output available electronically. They provide details of the IOPC item(s) to which each import or export item in international merchandise trade statistics is classified. These items relate to the HS at the 6 digit level.

**10** In addition to international merchandise trade, international trade in services and adjustments required for balance of payments and national accounting purposes are included in input-output tables. However, no items for these additional flows are included in tables 6 and 7. These flows are referred to as international trade item gaps with respect to the IOPC and are discussed in paragraph 31 below. A reconciliation between the international trade source data series and the input-output tables is shown in table 2.

**11** This table is a further sample of output available electronically. It provides a concordance between each IOPC item and the items specified for the collection of production, merchandise imports and merchandise exports data. For each IOPC item, the table shows the code and description of the input-output industry and ANZSIC industry of origin, and the relevant source data items. In addition, where an IOPC item comprises a source data item that is split between IOPC items, percentage allocations and all relevant item codes are shown. For a more detailed explanation see paragraphs 18 to 35 below.

Appendix

**12** The Appendix provides a link between the input-output industry sectors and the corresponding sectors of the 1993 edition of the ANZSIC. The ANZSIC codes shown in the Appendix consist of the first four digits of the codes generally used to define products in the IOPC shown in tables 1 to 8. The structure of the IOPC in terms of the ANZSIC is discussed in paragraphs 18 to 21 below.

**ABOUT THE TABLES** *continued*

NATURE OF THE INPUT-OUTPUT PRODUCT CLASSIFICATION

**13** Because the input-output system describes the production and subsequent use of all goods and services, an input-output product classification needs to be defined in terms of characteristic products of industry sectors. The overall principles for the preparation of such an industry-of-origin product classification are:

- homogeneity of inputs - each product or product group should consist of items that have similar input-structures or technology of production. This principle is generally applied through the definition of each IOPC item in terms of the ANZSIC industry sector in which it is mainly produced.
- homogeneity of disposition - each product or product group, having satisfied the first criterion, should consist of items that have similar patterns of disposition or usage. This principle is applied by reference to the description of source data items and information about the transport, distribution and product taxation margins applying to particular products.

**14** At its most detailed level the IOPC comprises approximately 1,000 individual product items. For confidentiality and data availability reasons the values of some of these detailed products are aggregated in this publication.

**15** An integral part of the input-output product classification is a concordance between the items in the classification and data source items of production, imports and exports. The concordance ideally relates each data source item to a single input-output item. When it is not possible to satisfy both the one-to-one concordance and the industry-of-origin criteria simultaneously, the industry-of-origin criterion takes precedence.

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE IOPC AND THE ANZSCC

**16** In general, items in *The Australian and New Zealand Standard Commodity Classification (ANZSCC)* (1254.0) originate from one ANZSIC class and relate to one IOPC. In some cases, ANZSCC items sometimes cover products originating from more than one industry. However, the input-output product items are specified in strict industry-of-origin terms. This necessitates classifying or linking some products to more than one input-output product item. This limitation is overcome in practice by the allocation of such products using special investigations and imputations.

**17** *The Australian and New Zealand Standard Commodity Classification (ANZSCC)* (1254.0) classifies domestically produced transportable goods and links them to the HS and the ANZSIC. This classification is the basis of the production items included in the IOPC.

## ABOUT THE TABLES *continued*

### STRUCTURE OF THE IOPC

**18** The structure of the IOPC arises from its industry-of-origin basis. In an industry-of-origin classification, each product item is shown according to the industry in which it is primarily produced. Thus, the structure of the IOPC consists of industry-of-origin headings with detailed product items shown under each heading.

**19** This structure is implemented in the IOPC by the adoption of ANZSIC classes as the basis for defining IOPC items. In this scheme, for 1986-87 and earlier tables, each IOPC item was identified by a seven digit code with the first four digits generally indicating the *Australian Standard Industrial Classification* (ASIC) class to which the item is primary and the last three digits indicating the product number within an ASIC industry-of-origin category. However, from 1989-90 onwards IOPC items are identified by an eight digit code with the first four digits referring to the ANZSIC class (ASIC class for 1989-90) and the last four digits the product number. The longer product number allows greater flexibility to expand the classification. For example, the product item *bacon and ham and other dried, salted or smoked pigmeat (incl. canned)* is IOPC item 21130011. This product is primary to ANZSIC class 2113 *bacon, ham and smallgood manufacturing*. In addition, each IOPC item is related to an input-output industry group. That group classification is comprised of 106 sectors and is used for the presentation of input-output product by industry flow tables in the publication *Australian National Accounts, Input-Output Tables* (5209.0). The input-output industry classification is shown in terms of ANZSIC in the Appendix to this publication.

**20** There are, however, some instances where the IOPC industry-of-origin categories are identified with more than one ANZSIC class. Where an industry-of-origin category represents a combination of activities primary to two or more ANZSIC classes, either a four digit code not used in the ANZSIC has been adopted, or the first ANZSIC of the combined group has been adopted. In both situations, the codes of the combined ANZSIC classes are shown in brackets in the IOPC item description.

**21** IOPC item 21130011 *bacon and ham and other dried, salted or smoked pigmeat (incl. canned)*, is an example of an item which is primary to a single ANZSIC class. An example of an IOPC item which combines activities that are primary to more than one ANZSIC class is 41200010 *non-residential building construction* (4113, 42 part). This IOPC is comprised of activities primary to ANZSIC 4113 *non-residential building construction* and activities primary to ANZSIC classes within the subdivision 42 *construction trade services* that serve non-residential building construction.

COMPOSITION OF IOPC ITEMS

Splitting of international merchandise trade items

**22** All international merchandise trade items have been examined in order to establish a concordance to IOPC items. The concordances established have been based on ANZSIC and HS links between items of production, imports and exports and the description of individual import and export items. The attainment of concordances, without gaps or overlaps, between international merchandise trade items and individual IOPC items is not always practicable because some import and export items are related to production items primary to more than one IOPC item. In such circumstances the import or export item is split between relevant IOPC items and separately keyed to each item.

**23** To facilitate use of these concordances the basis of the splitting process is described below. Once an import or export item is split between IOPC items further investigation is required in order to allocate first a broad part code and then a percentage to the trade item. The part code will be one of the letters P, S or D; for each code, the following definitions and percentage allocation conventions are adopted:

- P (PART) - denotes that an import or export item relates to two or more IOPC items and that a significant proportion of its value may relate to each of the relevant IOPC items. In each case a percentage of the source data item value is assigned to each relevant IOPC item using special investigations and imputation.
- S (SURPLUS) and D (DEFICIENCY) - these part codes are applied to individual import and export items that relate to two or more IOPC items. Where an item includes parts of products which would be attributed to a different IOPC item if more narrowly defined import or export product items were available, the part of the item necessarily included is referred to as *SURPLUS*. This inclusion results in a *DEFICIENCY* in the IOPC item which ideally would include the designated part of the import or export item. Although the basic data does not allow an ideal allocation of such international trade items, the IOPC makes an arbitrary allocation of such items to the relevant IOPC items. For significant trade items a percentage allocation is made to the relevant IOPC item of both *SURPLUS* and *DEFICIENCY* components based, where practicable, on special investigations. For other trade items the full relationship of the item to the IOPC is noted by the classification but zero allocation is made to the *DEFICIENCY* component. If the *SURPLUS* component is attributed to more than one IOPC item a pro rata percentage allocation is made.

Overlapping ANZSIC classes

**24** An objective of the IOPC is that individual items be defined as being primarily produced by a single industry. However, some product items are produced by separate establishments engaged in a fundamentally different mix of activities with respect to one another. When the separate activities are individually significant, the ANZSIC defines separate industry classes to reflect the different activity mixes. The relevant classes are termed overlapping ANZSIC classes.

## ABOUT THE TABLES *continued*

### Overlapping ANZSIC classes *continued*

**25** In the IOPC, source data items primary to more than one ANZSIC class are treated as split items within the respective IOPC items. The compilation conventions adopted in the implementation of this approach are:

- for Australian production of an IOPC item primary to an overlapping ANZSIC class, the production is treated as being primary to the industry where it is primarily produced.
- for imports and exports, affected international merchandise trade items are split between the relevant IOPC items. For example, HS item 420500 *articles of leather or composition leather* is split between the IOPC items 22490044 *clothing (incl leather) and clothing accessories nec* and 22620031 *saddlery and harness, of any material; leather articles nec*.

### Redefinition of production

**26** The input-output industry classification departs in some respects from the usual application of the ANZSIC. The nature of industry estimates and the composition of IOPC items is determined not only by the categories within the classification but also by the definition of the units which are classified according to it.

**27** ANZSIC is applied to establishment units (as defined in annual ABS economic collections), each establishment being classified to an industry. This is the starting point for most of the input-output industries. However, for input-output tables it is desirable that an industry corresponds as closely as possible to the production of products primary to that industry. This applies especially where establishments classified to one industry produce significant amounts of products primary to another industry which has a quite different pattern of inputs. In such cases, where it is practicable, the secondary or subsidiary production is treated as output of the industry to which the production is primary; this is called redefinition of production.

**28** The following are the major redefinitions made. Trading activity of miners and manufacturers is redefined to wholesale or retail trade, and manufacturing activity of wholesalers, where significant, is redefined to appropriate manufacturing industries. The industries *mechanical repairs* (5401) and *other repairs* (5402) have no counterpart in ANZSIC. They are formed by redefinition of the repair activity undertaken by wholesalers and retailers. Significant cases of capital work on own account, where not primary to the industry of the establishment undertaking the activity, are redefined to construction or an appropriate manufacturing industry. The imputed component of the industry *ownership of dwelling* (7701) is specified in the 1993 ANZSIC as being part of industry *residential property operators* (ANZSIC class 7711).

**29** In addition, there are some areas of the economy, e.g., *construction* (4101, 4102) and *agriculture* (0101-0200), where the nature of available data or other considerations may preclude a strict adherence to ANZSIC industries. In such areas, the input-output industries and the component IOPC items are formed by the redefinition of products from an ANZSIC sector to the relevant input-output industry.



## ABOUT THE TABLES *continued*

### Production item gaps

**30** Some production is recorded in input-output data sources under broadly specified items which cannot be classified directly to an IOPC item or which required significant adjustment or refinement before inclusion in the input-output data base. These products have been treated as follows:

- Some have been included in IOPC items composed of specific production items of a similar nature. This treatment is particularly relevant to the manufacturing industry where production is shown against the code 499.99.XX.YY where XX.YY refers to a specific ANZSIC class. This item has been allocated to the other commodity in the ANZSIC class, but is adjusted to offset any production gaps.
- the remainder comprise separate IOPC items for which it is not practicable to record source data production items in the IOPC. This treatment is most relevant to the construction and services sectors of the IOPC for which information is drawn from a diverse range of sources. For each IOPC item in this group, a dummy production item code of 99999 is recorded against IOPC items where source data production items are identified by a description, but not a numeric code, in the source data series.

### International trade item gaps

**31** Some import and export flows are obtained from Balance of Payments and other sources in addition to International Merchandise Trade statistics. Those additional source data relate to valuation, scope, coverage and timing adjustments which are required to place International Merchandise Trade information on a Balance of Payments/Input-Output basis, and to international trade in services. The Balance of Payments and other source data items are included in the input-output tables after a process of investigation and analysis and the concordances between those items and IOPC items are not included in this publication. These Balance of Payments and other source data items represent international trade item gaps with respect to the IOPC.

### Competing and complementary imports

**32** A distinction between competing and complementary imports is made in the input-output tables. Complementary imports are defined, in principle, as those products which are not produced in Australia (e.g., natural rubber). Imports which in principle are complementary but which are identified as having a value of less than \$1 million at the import or export item level are not treated as complementary. All remaining imports are treated as competing imports.

**33** Complementary imports are shown separately in Table 1 of this publication and are identified in the IOPC by codes ending with numbers in the range 8000 to 8990. For example, the code assigned to the complementary import *natural rubber* is 01698300.

### Repairing and servicing, Other income and Changes in inventories of work-in-progress

**34** For processing reasons, the above IOPC items primary to the manufacturing industries appear against only the last ANZSIC class in each input-output industry-of-origin group. The items so appearing represent the combination of these activities for all of the ANZSIC classes within the group.

### Royalties and licence fees

**35** For processing reasons, the above IOPC item in most cases appears against only the last ANZSIC class in each input-output industry-of-origin group. The items so appearing represent the combination of these activities for all of the ANZSIC classes within the group.

**36** A new, and completely revised, issue of *Australian System of National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0) is available on the ABS website [www.abs.gov.au](http://www.abs.gov.au) (starting at the home page select: Statistics—Statistical Concepts Library—ABS concepts, sources, methods and statistical frameworks—5216.0).

The new manual gives an up-to-date and comprehensive description of the concepts, sources and methods used to compile Australia's national and State accounts, including the input-output tables, chain volume estimates, capital stock and productivity statistics.

The manual is also available in printed form.
