OVERVIEW

2012 LABOUR STATISTICS IN BRIFF Labour statistics are of interest from both economic and social perspectives. This pamphlet provides a brief overview of data available from the ABS relating to the Australian labour market.

Comparisons of data over a 20-year period are given for labour force participation, employment, unemployment, underemployment, hours worked, industrial disputes, wages and prices and job vacancies. Unless specifically stated, all estimates are original.

Also included are recent data on labour force underutilisation, earnings, education and work, people not in the labour force, methods of setting pay and an international comparison of population and unemployment rates.

AGGREGATE MONTHLY HOURS WORKED: TREND ESTIMATES








