LABOUR FORCE STATUS AND OTHER CHARACTERISTICS OF FAMILIES AUSTRALIA JULY 1983

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

In July 1983 a survey, based on the monthly population survey, was conducted throughout Australia to provide details of the labour force status of family members, their relationship to the family head and family composition.

2. Table 1 summarizes the family status of persons aged 15 years and over and details those persons included in the scope of the survey. Tables 2 to 24 show information about married-couple and other families — for example, number of dependent children present, labour force status of husband, wife or head of other family, while Tables 25 to 33 contain more detailed estimates of the family status of persons aged 15 years and over classified by age, birthplace and other variables.

The population survey

3. The population survey is based on a multi-stage area sample of private dwellings (about 33,000 houses, flats, etc.) and non-private dwellings (hotels, motels, etc.) and covers about two-thirds of one per cent of the population of Australia. The information was obtained from the occupants of selected dwellings by carefully chosen and specially trained interviewers, the interviews being conducted during the two weeks beginning on Monday 11 July 1983. The information obtained relates to the week before the interview (i.e. the survey week).

Scope

- 4. The monthly population survey included all persons aged 15 years and over except:
 - (a) members of the permanent defence forces;
 - (b) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
 - (c) overseas residents in Australia; and
 - (d) members of non-Australian defence forces (and their dependents) stationed in Australia.
- 5. Because of the coverage rules of the population survey which associate persons with particular dwellings so that each person has an equal chance of selection in the survey, persons who usually live with other members of their family, may, at the time of the survey, be enumerated as not living with all the usual members of their family. This situation is more likely for persons who are enumerated as visitors to other private dwellings or as persons staying in non-private dwellings (hotels, caravan parks, hospitals, etc.). The determination of family structure and family characteristics in such cases is most difficult. Thus for the family survey, scope was further restricted to usual residents of private dwellings and the following persons were excluded:
 - (a) all persons enumerated in non-private dwellings (including hotels, motels, hospitals and other institutions); and
 - (b) persons enumerated as visitors to (rather than usual residents of) private dwellings.

In addition, in those private dwellings where it was not possible to obtain information relating to all the usual residents, no family information was recorded. Thus persons living in families which include a member of the permanent defence forces, who is outside the scope of the population survey, are excluded from the family survey because family information could not be obtained from each usual resident. Similarly families which at the time of the survey have one or more of their members away from the usual residence, are also excluded from the family survey. Table 1 summarizes those persons for whom family information was obtained as well as those usual residents of private dwellings for whom complete family information could not be obtained, and those persons specifically excluded from the scope of the family survey. The table shows that family status was determined in this survey for 10,813,300 persons out of a total of 11,589,400 civilians aged 15 years and over — a coverage of 93.3 per cent.

Definitions

Labour force

- 7. The labour force category to which a person is assigned depends on his or her actual activity (i.e. whether working, looking for work, etc.) during the survey week. The following definitions, which conform closely to the international standard definitions specified by the International Labour Organisation (ILO), relate only to those persons within the scope of the survey.
- 8. Employed persons comprise all those aged 15 years and over who, during the survey week:
 - (a) worked for one hour or more for pay, profit, commission or payment in kind in a job or business, or on a farm (including employees, employers and self-employed persons); or
 - (b) worked for 15 hours or more without pay in a family business or on a farm (i.e. unpaid family helpers); or
 - (c) were employees who had a job but were not at work and were: on paid leave; on leave without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week; stood down without pay because of bad weather or plant breakdown at their place of employment for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week; on strike or locked out; on workers' compensation and expected to be returning to their job; or receiving wages or salary while undertaking full-time study; or
 - (d) were employers or self-employed persons who had a job, business or farm, but were not at work.
- 9. Unemployed persons are those aged 15 years and over who were not employed during the survey week, and
 - (a) had actively looked for full-time or part-time work at any time in the four weeks up to the end of the survey week and:

- (i) were available for work in the survey week, or would have been available except for temporary illness (i.e. lasting for less than four weeks to the end of the survey week); or
- (ii) were waiting to start a new job within four weeks from the end of the survey week and would have started in the survey week if the job had been available then;
- or (b) were waiting to be called back to a full-time or part-time job from which they had been stood down without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week (including the whole of the survey week) for reasons other than bad weather or plant breakdown.
- 10. The unemployment rate for any group is the number unemployed expressed as a percentage of the labour force in the same group.
- Duration of unemployment is the period from the time the person began looking for work or was laid off to the end of the survey week. Thus the survey measures current (and continuing) periods of unemployment rather than completed spells. For persons who may have begun looking for work while still employed, the duration of unemployment is defined as the period from the time the person last worked full time for two weeks or more to the end of the survey week. Periods of unemployment are recorded in complete weeks and this results in a slight understatement of duration. Average (mean) duration is the duration obtained by dividing the aggregate number of weeks a group has been unemployed by the number of persons in that group. Median duration is the duration which divides unemployed persons into two equal groups, one comprising persons whose duration of unemployment is above the median and the other, persons whose duration is below it.
- 12. The *labour force* comprises all persons who, during the survey week, were employed or unemployed, as defined in paragraphs 8 and 9.
- 13. The *labour force participation rate* for any group is the labour force expressed as a percentage of the civilian population aged 15 years and over in the same group.
- 14. Full-time workers are those who usually work 35 hours or more a week and others who, although usually part-time workers, worked 35 hours or more during the survey week. Part-time workers are those who usually work less than 35 hours a week and who did so during the survey week.
- 15. Hours of work. The figures refer to actual hours worked during the survey week, not hours paid for. They may be affected by public holidays, leave, absenteeism; temporary absence from work due to sickness, injury, accident and industrial disputes; and stoppages of work due to bad weather, plant breakdown, etc. Fractions of an hour are disregarded and this results in slightly lower figures than would be the case if actual time worked was recorded.

- 16. Persons not in the labour force are those who, during the survey week, were not in the categories 'employed' or 'unemployed', as defined in paragraphs 8 and 9.
- 17. Persons classified by labour force status are classified according to whether or not they are in the labour force. Persons in the labour force classified by employment status are classified according to whether they are employed or unemployed. Employed persons classified by status of worker are classified according to whether they are employers, self-employed persons, wage and salary earners (employees), or unpaid family helpers (who worked 15 hours or more in the survey week).
- 18. Main English-speaking countries comprise the United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, the United States of America, New Zealand and South Africa.
- 19. Other countries comprise all countries outside Australia other than the main English-speaking countries mentioned in paragraph 18.
- 20. A dwelling may contain one or more households, and separate households were considered to exist within a dwelling when:
 - (a) a group of one or more persons considered themselves to be a separate household from others in the dwelling;
 - (b) regular provision was made for groups to take meals at different times or in different rooms; or
 - (c) a dwelling contained one or more lodgers, who received accommodation, but no meals; each lodger was then considered to be a separate household.

A household may consist of any number of families and non-family members. A boarder who received both accommodation and meals was not considered to constitute a separate household.

Marital status is determined from information supplied by the respondent about the individual himself or herself and, where the person was reported as being married, about the living arrangements of persons usually resident in the household. Marital status does not therefore necessarily reflect legal status. Persons are classified as married if they are reported as being married (including de facto) and their spouse was a usual resident of the household at the time of the survey. The notmarried category includes persons who have never married, or are separated, widowed or divorced, as well as those who, although reported as being married, did not have a spouse who usually lived in the household. Persons who live in a de facto relationship but do not volunteer this information when asked whether they are married are classified as not married.

Family relationships

22. The determination of family relationships and composition is complex, involving many factors. The following description outlines the major principles used

for this survey. A family is defined to consist of two or more related persons usually resident in the same household at the time of the survey. A family comprises a married couple or a family head (as defined in paragraph 24) together with any persons having any of the following relationships to them:

- (a) sons or daughters of any age, if not married and with no children of their own present;
- (b) other relatives if not accompanied by a spouse, sons or daughters, or parents of their own; or
- (c) any children under 15 years of age who do not have a parent present.
- 23. The following points should be noted in relation to the definition of a family in the previous paragraph:
 - (a) the term *relationship* includes relationships by blood, marriage or adoption;
 - (b) a family, as defined, can contain no more than two married persons, and can contain two married persons only if these persons are husband and wife (referred to as married-couple families);
 - (c) other families are families other than married-couple families as defined above. From the definition of married and not married in paragraph 21 it can be seen that the heads of other families must, by definition, be not married. In addition to one-parent families, this category includes families in which there is no parent, for example a family head living with a brother or sister;
 - (d) persons are defined as not a member of a family if they are not related to any other member of the household in which they are living. A person is considered to be living alone if he or she is the sole member of a household. Thus, a person who is the sole occupant of a self-contained flat attached to another dwelling is considered to be living alone;
 - (e) the terms usually reside and present are synonomous, and refer to persons who were identified by the respondent as usual residents of the household at the time of the survey.
- 24. The family head of an other family is the parent in the case of a one-parent family or, in the case of other groups of related persons, it is generally defined to be the eldest person in the family. No family head is defined for a married-couple family.
- 25. Dependent children comprise all family members under 15 years of age and all family members aged 15 to 20 years who are full-time students.

Comparability of series

26. Estimates for the July 1983 survey are based on population estimates derived from the results of the 1981 Population Census (adjusted for underenumeration). Estimates for previous surveys conducted in 1979, 1980, 1981 and 1982 were based on 1976 Census results.

- 27. For the 1982 and previous surveys office imputation was undertaken to determine the family status of those persons enumerated in private dwellings where family information could not be obtained for all usual residents, and for those persons enumerated in non-private dwellings or as visitors to private dwellings where family information could not be obtained for each member of the family. Due to the increased demand for family data on a consistent and more regular basis, it was decided to change the processing methodology to eliminate office imputation and rely solely on the reported information. Consequently the scope of the 1983 survey was narrowed to exclude those three groups of respondents for whom it is known that complete family information is difficult to collect (see paragraphs 5 and 6).
- 28. The 1983 survey is thus not strictly comparable with previous surveys since the persons excluded may have differing family and labour force characteristics to those persons included in the survey. Because of these exclusions the total number of persons with particular family characteristics will also differ between the 1983 and previous surveys.

Reliability of the estimates

29. Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if the information had been obtained from occupants of all dwellings. More information on this topic is given in the Technical note.



SUMMARY OF FINDINGS


In July 1983 the estimated number of families in Australia was 3,946,500 comprising 3,429,200 married-couple families and 517,300 other families (94,100 with a male head and 423,300 with a female head); see Explanatory notes for details of the scope of the survey. Over half (55 per cent) of the married-couple families had dependent children present compared with 39 per cent of other families headed by males and 61 per cent of other families headed by females. There were 1,480,300 persons who did not live in families of whom nearly 60 per cent lived alone. More than half those non-family members who lived alone were aged 60 years or more compared with non-family members who did not live alone where less than 10 per cent were aged 60 years or more and 77 per cent were in the age groups 15-34 years.

Other families with a not-married male or female head were far more likely to consist of persons who were not employed, than were married-couple families. In about 47 per cent of other families with a female head, there were no family members employed and in only about 16 per cent of such families were there two or more family members employed. For married-couple families the proportions were 19.4 per cent and 45.3 per cent respectively. It should be remembered that married-couple families must, by definition, contain a husband and a wife compared to other families which may only include a not-married head. The opportunity of at least one person to be employed in a married-couple family is thus larger than that for other families. In general, married-couple families are much larger than other families. Just under half the married-couple families contained four or more persons compared with only 15 per cent of other families of this size.

In July 1983 there were 384,000 married-couple families containing one or more persons who were unemployed (249,700 or 65 per cent of these families were those with dependent children present). There were 78,800 other families with some unemployment including 40,000 where dependent children were present. 70 per cent of other families with dependent children present and some unemployment contained no family members who were employed.









Diagram 4 details the employment status of both husband and wife in married-couple families. It shows that of the 197,900 families with dependent children where the husband was not employed, in 84 per cent of these families, the wife was also not employed. There were 24,600 families where both husband and wife were unemployed; two thirds of these included dependent children. Married-couple families in which wives were most likely to be employed were those families without dependent children where the husband was also employed.

The employment status of the head of other than married-couple families is shown in diagram 5. Not-married female heads were far less likely to be employed compared with not-married male heads. There were 9,500 (10 per cent) families with an unemployed male head and 22,000 (5 per cent) families with an unemployed female head (including 17,400 with dependent children).

In terms of individuals, husbands or wives were more likely to be participating in the labour force than not-married family heads and within these groups, those heads with dependent children had higher participation rates than those without dependent children. In general, heads without dependent children were older and thus more likely to be not in the labour force. For those persons who were non-family members, those living alone had significantly lower participation rates compared with those not living alone, again reflecting the age distribution of each group.

Unemployment rates varied for heads of families. The unemployment rate was much higher for not-married heads, particularly those with dependent children present (17.5 per cent for males and 17.3 per cent for females) than for married heads (6.2 per cent for husbands and 8.7 per cent for wives with dependent children). Other family members (children aged 15 years and over and other relatives of the head) had the highest unemployment rates of all persons in families.

TECHNICAL NOTE

Estimation procedure

The estimates are derived from the population survey by use of a complex ratio estimation procedure, which ensures that the survey estimates conform to an independently estimated distribution of the population by age and sex, rather than to the age and sex distribution within the sample itself.

Reliability of the estimates

- 2. Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they are subject to sampling variability; that is, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included. One measure of the likely difference is given by the *standard error*, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included in the survey. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included in the survey, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors.
- 3. Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this publication. A table of standard errors for general application is given below. These figures will not give a precise measure of the standard error of a particular estimate since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of past surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics. However, they will provide an indication of the magnitude of the standard error. An example of the calculation and use of standard errors is as follows. The estimated number of families with a not-married female

- head is 423,500. From the table below it will be seen that this estimate has a standard error of about 6,800 and therefore there are about two chances in three that the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey will fall within the range 416,700 to 430,300 and about nineteen chances in twenty that it will fall within the range 409,900 to 437,100.
- 4. The reliability of an estimated percentage computed by using sample data for both numerator and denominator depends upon both the size of the numerator and the size of the denominator. However, the per cent standard error of the estimated percentage will generally be lower than the per cent standard error of the estimate of the numerator. The per cent standard error of the numerator can be obtained from the table below.
- 5. As the standard errors in the table below show, the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. Although figures for these small components can in some cases be derived by subtraction, they should not be regarded as reliable.
- 6. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the *non-sampling error*, and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
