EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

In June 1986 a survey, based on the monthly population survey, was conducted throughout Australia to provide details of the labour force status of family members, their relationship to the family head and family composition.

2. Table 1 summarizes the family status of persons aged 15 and over and details those persons included in and excluded from the scope of the survey. Tables 2 to 23 show information about married-couple and other families — for example, number of dependents present, labour force status of husband, wife or head of other family — while Tables 24 to 32 contain more detailed estimates of the family status of persons aged 15 and over classified by age, birthplace and other variables.

The population survey

3. The population survey is based on a multi-stage area sample of private dwellings (about 35,000 houses, flats, etc.) and non-private dwellings (hotels, motels, etc.) and covers about two-thirds of one per cent of the population of Australia. The information was obtained from the occupants of selected dwellings by carefully chosen and specially trained interviewers. The interviews for this survey having been conducted during the two weeks beginning on Monday 9 June 1986. The information obtained relates to the week before the interview (i.e. the survey week).

Scope

- 4. The labour force survey includes all persons aged 15 and over except:
 - (a) members of the permanent defence forces;
 - (b) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
 - (c) overseas residents in Australia; and
 - (d) members of non-Australian defence forces (and their dependents) stationed in Australia.
- 5. Because of the coverage rules of the population survey which associate persons with particular dwellings so that each person has an equal chance of selection in the survey, persons who usually live with other members of their family may, at the time of the survey, be enumerated as not living with all the usual members of their family. This situation is more likely for persons who are enumerated as visitors to other private dwellings or as persons staying in non-private dwellings (hotels, caravan parks, hospitals, etc.). The determination of family structure and family characteristics in such cases is most difficult. Thus for the family survey, scope was further restricted to usual residents of private dwellings and the following persons were excluded:
 - (a) all persons enumerated in non-private dwellings (including hotels, motels, hospitals and other institutions); and
 - (b) persons enumerated as visitors to (rather than usual residents of) private dwellings.

In addition, in those private dwellings where it was not possible to obtain information relating to all the usual residents, no family information was recorded. Thus persons living in families which include a member of the permanent defence forces, who is outside the scope of the population survey, are excluded from the family survey because family information could not be obtained from each usual resident. Similarly families which, at the time of the survey, have one or more of their members away from the usual residence, are also excluded from the family survey. Table 1 summarizes those persons for whom family information was obtained as well as those usual residents of private dwellings for whom complete family information could not be obtained, and those persons specifically excluded from the scope of the family survey. The table shows that family status was determined in this survey for 11,377,400 persons out of a total of 12,180,500 civilians aged 15 and over — a coverage of 93.4 per cent.

Definitions

Labour force

- 7. The labour force category to which a person is assigned depends on the *actual activity* undertaken during the survey week (i.e. whether working, looking for work, etc.). The following definitions, which conform closely to the international standard definitions specified by the International Labour Office (ILO), relate only to those persons within the scope of the survey.
- 8. *Employed persons* comprise all those aged 15 and over who, during the survey week:
 - (a) worked for one hour or more for pay, profit, commission or payment in kind in a job or business, or on a farm (including employees, employers and self-employed persons); or
 - (b) worked for one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm (i.e. unpaid family helpers); or
 - (c) were employees who had a job but were not at work and were: on paid leave; on leave without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week; stood down without pay because of bad weather or plant breakdown at their place of employment for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week; on strike or locked out; on workers' compensation and expected to be returning to their job; or receiving wages or salary while undertaking full-time study; or
 - (d) were employers, self-employed persons or unpaid family helpers who had a job, business or farm, but were not at work.
- 9. Full-time workers are those who usually work 35 hours or more a week and others who, although usually part-time workers, worked 35 hours or more during the survey week. Part-time workers are those who usually work less than 35 hours a week and who did so during the survey week. When recording hours of work, fractions of an hour are disregarded.

- 10. Hours of work. The figures refer to actual hours worked during the survey week, not hours paid for. They may be affected by public holidays, leave, absenteeism; temporary absence from work due to sickness, injury, accident and industrial disputes; and stoppages of work due to bad weather, plant breakdown, etc. Fractions of an hour are disregarded and this results in slightly lower figures than would be the case if actual time worked was recorded.
- 11. Unemployed persons are those aged 15 and over who were not employed during the survey week, and
 - (a) had actively looked for full-time or part-time work at any time in the four weeks up to the end of the survey week and:
 - (i) were available for work in the survey week, or would have been available except for temporary illness (i.e. lasting for less than four weeks to the end of the survey week);
 - (ii) were waiting to start a new job within four weeks from the end of the survey week and would have started in the survey week if the job had been available then;
 - or (b) were waiting to be called back to a full-time or part-time job from which they had been stood down without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week (including the whole of the survey week) for reasons other than bad weather or plant breakdown.
- 12. The unemployment rate for any group is the number unemployed expressed as a percentage of the labour force (i.e. employed plus unemployed) in the same group.
- 13. Duration of unemployment is the period from the time the person began looking for work or was stood down to the end of the survey week. Thus the survey measures current (and continuing) periods of unemployment rather than completed spells. For persons who may have begun looking for work while still employed, the duration of unemployment is defined as the period from the time the person last worked full time for two weeks or more to the end of the survey week. Periods of unemployment are recorded in complete weeks and this results in a slight understatement of duration. Average (mean) duration is the duration obtained by dividing the aggregate number of weeks a group has been unemployed by the number of persons in that group. Median duration is the duration which divides unemployed persons into two equal groups, one comprising persons whose duration of unemployment is above the median and the other, persons whose duration is below it.
- 14. The *labour force* comprises all persons who, during the survey week, were employed or unemployed, as defined in paragraphs 8 and 11.

- 15. The *labour force participation rate* for any group is the labour force expressed as a percentage of the civilian population aged 15 and over in the same group.
- 16. Persons not in the labour force are those who, during the survey week, were not in the categories employed or unemployed, as defined above. They include persons who were keeping house (unpaid), attending an educational institution (school, university, etc.), retired, voluntarily inactive, permanently unable to work, inmates of institutions (hospitals, gaols, sanatoria, etc.), trainee teachers, members of contemplative religious orders, and persons whose only activity during the survey week was jury service or unpaid voluntary work for a charitable organisation.
- 17. Persons classified by *labour force status* are classified according to whether or not they are in the labour force. Persons in the labour force classified by *employment status* are classified according to whether they are employed or unemployed.
- 18. Main English-speaking countries comprise the United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, the United States of America, New Zealand and South Africa.
- 19. Other countries comprise all countries outside Australia other than the main English-speaking countries mentioned in paragraph 18.
- 20. A dwelling may contain one or more households, and separate households were considered to exist within a dwelling when:
 - (a) a group of one or more persons considered themselves to be a separate household from others in the dwelling;
 - (b) regular provision was made for groups to take meals at different times or in different rooms; or
 - (c) a dwelling contained one or more lodgers, who received accommodation, but no meals; each lodger was then considered to be a separate household.

A household may consist of any number of families and non-family members. A boarder who received both accommodation and meals was not considered to constitute a separate household.

21. In the labour force survey, persons are classified as married or not married. Marital status is determined from information supplied by the respondent about the individual himself or herself and, where the person was reported as being married, about the living arrangements of persons usually resident in the household. Marital status does not therefore necessarily reflect legal status. Persons are classified as married if they are reported as being married (including de facto) and their spouse was a

usual resident of the household at the time of the survey. The *not-married* category comprises persons who have never married, or are separated, widowed or divorced, as well as those who, although reported as being married, did not have a spouse who usually lived in the household. Persons who live in a de facto relationship but do not volunteer this information when asked whether they are married are classified as not married.

Family relationships

- 22. The determination of family relationships and composition is complex, involving many factors. The following description outlines the major principles used for this survey. A family is defined to consist of two or more related persons usually resident in the same household at the time of the survey. A family comprises a married couple or a family head (as defined in paragraph 24) together with any persons having any of the following relationships to them:
 - (a) sons or daughters of any age, if not married and with no children of their own present;
 - (b) other relatives if not accompanied by a spouse, sons or daughters, or parents of their own; or
 - (c) any children under 15 years of age who do not have a parent present.
- 23. The following points should be noted in relation to the definition of a family in the previous paragraph:
 - (a) the term *relationship* includes relationships by blood, marriage or adoption;
 - (b) a family, as defined, can contain no more than two married persons, and can contain two married persons only if these persons are husband and wife (referred to as married-couple families);
 - (c) other families are families other than married-couple families as defined above. From the definition of married and not married in paragraph 21 it can be seen that the heads of other families must, by definition, be not married. In addition to one-parent families, this category includes families in which there is no parent, for example a family head living with a brother or sister:
 - (d) persons are defined as not a member of a family if they are not related to any other member of the household in which they are living. A person is considered to be living alone if he or she is the sole member of a household. Thus, a person who is the sole occupant of a self-contained flat attached to another dwelling is considered to be living alone;
 - (e) the terms usually reside and present are synonomous, and refer to persons who were identified by the respondent as usual residents of the household at the time of the survey.
- 24. The family head of an other family is the parent in the case of a one-parent family or, in the case of other groups of related persons, is generally defined to be the

- eldest person in the family. No family head is defined for a married-couple family.
- 25. Dependents comprise all family members under 15 years of age; all family members aged 15 to 19 attending school; and all family members aged 15 to 24 who are full-time students at a tertiary or further educational institution. This differs from the definition for "dependent children" used in previous years. See paragraph 29.

Comparability of series

- 26. Estimates for surveys from July 1983 onwards are based on population estimates derived from the results of the 1981 Population Census (adjusted for underenumeration). Estimates for surveys conducted in 1979, 1980, 1981 and 1982 were based on 1976 Census results.
- 27. For the 1982 and previous surveys office imputation was undertaken to determine the family status of those persons enumerated in private dwellings where family information could not be obtained for all usual residents, and for those persons enumerated in non-private dwellings or as visitors to private dwellings where family information could not be obtained for each member of the family. Due to the increased demand for family data on a consistent and more regular basis, it was decided to change the processing methodology to eliminate office imputation and rely solely on the reported information. Consequently the scope of the 1983 and subsequent surveys was narrowed to exclude those three groups of respondents for whom it is known that complete family information is difficult to collect (see paragraphs 5 and 6).
- 28. Surveys from July 1983 onwards are thus not strictly comparable with previous surveys since the persons excluded may have differing family and labour force characteristics to those persons included in the survey. Because of these exclusions the total number of persons with particular family characteristics will also differ between surveys conducted prior to 1983 and those conducted from July 1983 onwards. Table I shows the number of persons excluded from the survey (see also paragraph 2.)
- 29. In the 1985 and previous surveys, dependents (then described as dependent children) comprised all family members under 15 years of age and all family members aged 15 to 20 who were full-time students. The current definition is given in paragraph 25 above. Tables 24, 25 and 31 provide an indication of the differences between the student component of the old and new definitions.
- 30. Since the 1985 survey was conducted, the definition of employed persons has been extended to include persons who worked without pay between 1 and 14 hours per week in a family business or on a farm (i.e. unpaid family helpers). This new definition aligns the Australian labour force concepts with a set of changed international definitions adopted by the International Labour Office at the 13th Conference of Labour Statisticians in October 1982.
- 31. Previously, such persons who worked 1 to 14 hours or who had such a job but were not at work were defined as either unemployed or not in the labour force, depending

on whether they were actively looking for work. The changes in definition have resulted in employment for March 1986 increasing by 34,900 and unemployment decreasing by 5,800. Estimates for June 1986 in this publication are based on the new definition while estimates for July 1985 are based on the old definition.

- 32. Estimates of the number of families in June 1986 have been calculated differently to those for earlier years. This is due to the adoption of a new weighting procedure where the family weight is determined using an average of all family members responding to the labour force survey. Previously, the family weight used to publish estimates of the number of families was determined by nomination of a proxy 'head of household' as representative of the family. It is estimated that this change in procedure has resulted in the number of families being approximately 35,000 (i.e. less than one per cent) lower than it would have been had the old weighting procedure been used.
- 33. For these reasons, estimates for the June 1986 survey are not strictly comparable with those for earlier surveys. Although comparisons may generally be made, users should be aware of the above differences.

Reliability of the estimates

34. Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if the information had been obtained from occupants of all dwellings. More information on this topic is given in the Technical Note.

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
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SUMMARY OF FINDINGS


In June 1986 the estimated number of families in Australia was 4,087,100 comprising 3,524,900 married-couple families and 562,200 other families (of which 105,100 had a male head and 457,100 had a female head). 53.2 per cent of the married-couple families had dependents present compared with 38.3 per cent of other families with a male head and 61.2 per cent of other families with a female head. There were 1,625,900 persons who did not live in families of whom just under 62 per cent lived alone. Slightly more than half those non-family members who lived alone were aged 60 or more. In contrast, less than 6 per cent of non-family members who did not live alone were 60 and over and nearly 80 per cent were in the age group 15-34.

Other families with a not-married male or female head were far more likely to consist of persons who were not employed, than were married-couple families. In approximately 41 per cent of other families with a female head, there were no family members employed and in only about 19 per cent of such families were there two or more family members employed. For married-couple families the proportions were approximately 19 per cent and 51 per cent respectively. The average size of a married-couple family is 3.4 persons compared with 2.4 for an other family with a male head and 2.7 for other families headed by females. For married-couple families approximately 45 per cent contained four or more persons while only about 14 per cent of other families were this size.

In June 1986 there were 308,000 married-couple families containing one or more persons who were unemployed (203,400 or nearly 66 per cent of these families had dependents present). There were 74,400 other families with some unemployment including 37,600 where dependents were present. About 73 per cent of other families with dependents present and some unemployment contained no family members who were employed.





Diagram 4 details the employment status of both husband and wife in married-couple families. It shows that in the 175,400 families with dependents where the husband was not employed, the wife was also not employed in approximately 81 per cent of these cases. There were 19,600 families where both husband and wife were unemployed; 61 per cent of these included dependents. Married-couple families in which wives were most likely to be employed were those families without dependents where the husband was also employed.




Diagram 5 provides a comparison between July 1985 and June 1986 for the labour force status of husbands or wives in married-couple families with dependents as a percentage of total families. It shows that where the husband was employed the likelihood of wives being employed had risen from nearly 50 per cent to about 54 per cent and of being unemployed had risen slightly from 3.0 to 3.1 per cent. Where the husband was unemployed the proportion of wives employed increased from 11.9 to 14.5 per cent while the proportion of wives unemployed fell from 13.5 per cent to 10.3 per cent.


The employment status of the head of other than married-couple families is shown in diagram 6 for both July 1985 and June 1986. Not-married female heads were far less likely to be employed than not-married male heads. Of the other families with a male head, unemployed family heads numbered 7,800 (7.5 per cent) in June 1986 compared with 4,700 (4.9 per cent) in July 1985. By comparison there were 21,600 unemployed female heads (4.7 per cent of other families with a female head) in June 1986 compared with 19,700 (4.3 per cent) in July 1985.

DIAGRAM 6. OTHER FAMILIES: LABOUR FORCE STATUS OF HEAD, JULY 1985 AND JUNE 1986




In terms of individuals, husbands or wives were more likely to be participating in the labour force than not-married family heads, and within these groups those heads with dependents had higher participation rates than those without dependents. In general, heads without dependents were older and thus were more likely to be not in the labour force. For persons classified as non-family members, those living alone had a significantly lower participation rate (43.8 per cent) than those not living alone (85.8 per cent) reflecting the age distribution of each group. Non-family members living alone were aged 55 and over in about 59 per cent of cases whereas for those not living alone approximately 78 per cent were aged less than 35.

Full-time students aged 15-24 (17.3 per cent) and other relatives of family heads (16.4 per cent) had the highest unemployment rates of all persons in families. The unemployment rate was also high for female not-married family heads, particularly those with dependents present (13.6 per cent). For married-couple families, the unemployment rate was highest for wives with dependents present (6.7 per cent) and lowest for wives without dependents present (3.6 per cent). For persons not classified as members of a family, those not living alone had a much higher unemployment rate (9.9 per cent).

Comparing unemployment rates by family status between July 1985 and June 1986, the unemployment rate for not-married family heads with dependents present rose from 11.8 per cent in July 1985 to 13.6 per cent in June 1986. The unemployment rate for not-married family heads without dependents present rose from 8.2 per cent to 8.9 per cent.

DIAGRAM 9. UNEMPLOYMENT RATES BY FAMILY STATUS, JULY 1985 AND JUNE 1986



TECHNICAL NOTE

Estimation procedure


The estimates are derived from the population survey by use of a complex ratio estimation procedure, which ensures that the survey estimates conform to an independently estimated distribution of the population by age and sex, rather than to the age and sex distribution within the sample itself.

Reliability of the estimates

- Two types of error are possible in an estimate based on a sample survey: sampling error and non-sampling error. The sampling error is a measure of the variability that occurs by chance because a sample, rather than the entire population, is surveyed. Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they, and the movements derived from them are subject to sampling variability; that is, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included in the survey. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included in the survey, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors. Another measure of sampling variability is the relative standard error which is obtained by expressing the standard error as a percentage of the estimate to which it refers. The relative standard error is a useful measure in that it provides an immediate indication of the percentage errors likely to have occurred due to sampling, and thus avoids the need to refer also to the size of the estimate.
- 3. Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this publication. A table of *standard errors* for general application (Table A) and a table of publication cut-off points (Table B) are shown below.
- 4. The size of the standard error increases with the level of the estimate, so that the larger the estimate the larger is the standard error. However, it should be noted that the larger the sample estimate the smaller will be the standard error in percentage terms. Thus, larger sample estimates will be relatively more reliable than smaller estimates.
- 5. As the standard errors in Table A show, the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error. Very small estimates are subject to such high standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. For the labour force survey, estimates which have a relative standard error larger than 25 per cent are not published. In the tables in this publication, estimates below the levels shown in Table B, and percentages based on such estimates, have not been included but are indicated with a '*'. Although figures for these small components can be

derived by subtraction in some cases, they should not be regarded as reliable. See paragraph 8 concerning higher publication cut-off points for some estimates.

- 6. The movement in the level of an estimate is also subject to sampling variability. The standard error of the movement depends on the levels of the estimates from which the movement is obtained rather than the size of the movement. Standard errors of all annual movements can be obtained by multiplying the figures in Table A by 1.3. When using Table A to calculate standard errors of annual movements, refer to the larger of the two estimates from which the movement is derived.
- 7. An example of the calculation and use of standard errors is given below:
 - (a) From Table A it will be seen that the estimate of 454,700 families with a not-married female head in June 1986 has a standard error of about 7,200. Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the number that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included in the survey would have been within the range 447,500 to 461,900 and about nineteen chances in twenty that it would have been within the range 440,300 to 469,100.



8. The relative standard errors of estimates of average (mean) duration of unemployment and median duration of unemployment are obtained by first finding the relative standard error of the estimate of the total number of persons contributing to the estimate (see Table A) and then multiplying the figure so obtained by the following relevant factors:

Average (mean) duration of unemployment: 1.3 Median duration of unemployment: 2.0

Publication cut-off points for these and other labour force estimates (see paragraph 5) are shown in Table B on the next page. Because of these higher relative standard errors, estimates of aggregate hours worked, average (mean) duration of unemployment, and median duration of unemployment have higher cut-off points for publication (see paragraph 5) than other estimates as shown in Table A.

9. An example of the calculation of standard errors by the use of these factors is as follows:

In June 1986 the estimate of median duration of unemployment for husbands of married-couple

families was 34 weeks (from Table 15) and the number unemployed was estimated as 123,300. From Table A it can be estimated that this figure (123,300) has a standard error of about 4,300 and therefore a relative standard error of about 3.5 per cent. The relative standard error of the estimate of median duration of unemployment is calculated by multiplying this figure (3.5) by the appropriate factor shown in the previous paragraph (in this case 2.0): $3.5 \times 2.0 = 7.0$ per cent. The standard error of this estimate of median duration of unemployment is therefore 7.0 per cent of 34, i.e. about 2. Therefore there are about two chances in three that the median duration of unemployment for unemployed males that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included in the survey would have been within the range 32 to 36 weeks and about nineteen chances in twenty that it would have been within the range 30 to 38 weeks.

10. Proportions and percentages (for example, participation rates) formed from the ratio of two estimates are also subject to sampling error. The size of the error depends on the accuracy of both the numerator and denominator. The formula for the relative standard error (RSE) of a proportion or percentage is given below:

RSE $(x/y) = \sqrt{[RSE(x)]^2 - [RSE(y)]^2}$

- 11. Standard errors contained in Table A are designed to provide an average standard error applicable for all monthly labour force survey estimates. Recent analysis of the standard errors applicable to particular survey estimates has shown that the standard errors of estimates of employment are generally equivalent to those shown in Table A, while standard errors for unemployment and not in the labour force are approximately 3 per cent and 11 per cent respectively higher. Standard errors of estimates of numbers of families are approximately the same as those for numbers of persons. Standard errors for estimates classified by country of birth are approximately the same for persons born in Australia. For aggregate estimates of persons born outside Australia the standard errors are about 15% higher.
- 12. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by respondents. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the *non-sampling error*, and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
