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# LABOUR FORCE STATUS AND EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT, AUSTRALIA, FEBRUARY 1988, SUMMARY

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#### MAIN FEATURES






An estimated 4,684,800 persons with post-school qualifications made up 37.1 per cent of the civilian population aged 15 and over in February 1988. Those with no post-school qualifications numbered 7,351,800 (58.2 per cent) and 586,600 (4.6 per cent) were still at school.

Participation in the labour force varied according to educational attainment, with the highest rates recorded by those persons with a degree (84.9 per cent) and those with a trade qualification or apprenticeship (77.3 per cent). For those who had left school, male participation rates were higher than female rates for all categories of educational attainment. The participation rates were closest for those who had a degree (89.2 per cent for males compared to 77.5 per cent for females), and differed most for those who had not attended the highest level of secondary school available (71.2 per cent for males compared to 39.5 per cent for females).

The unemployment rate for persons with post-school qualifications (5.2 per cent) was about half that for persons without post-school qualifications (10.1 per cent). The rate for persons with a degree was 3.6 per cent, and for those with a trade qualification or apprenticeship was 4.8 per cent.

The overall proportion of males with post-school qualifications (43.7 per cent) is considerably higher than the corresponding estimate of 30.7 per cent for females. The proportions of males and females with post-school qualifications are most dissimilar for older age groups, as illustrated in Diagram 3. In the 55 years and over age group, males were twice as likely to have post-school qualifications as females (40.6 per cent compared with 20.3 per cent). For persons in the 25 to 34 year age group the comparative rates were 55.4 per cent for males and 45.1 per cent for females. The proportions of persons with post-school qualifications were similar for males and females aged 20 to 24 years. While a large number of these persons have yet to complete their tertiary studies, the similarity between these proportions is not expected to alter significantly.

## APPENDIX 1

#### **GLOSSARY**

Certificate or diploma: completion of an approved certificate or diploma in secretarial or business studies, administration, teaching, nursing, etc.

Degree: a bachelor degree (including honours), a graduate or post-graduate diploma, masters degree or a doctorate.

Educational attainment: measures the highest qualification obtained by the respondent. Qualifications may include those obtained at other than educational institutions (e.g. nursing qualifications obtained at a hospital).

Highest level of secondary school available: the highest level of secondary schooling (or equivalent) offered by the education system at the time the respondent left school.

Other post-school qualifications: completion of other types of education, e.g. adult education, preparatory/bridging course or hobby course.

Persons with a post-school qualification: those who had left school and answered 'Yes' to the question: 'Since leaving school have you obtained a trade qualification, certificate, diploma, degree or any other qualification?'. Respondents indicated which of the following groups best described their highest qualification: Degree; Trade qualification or apprenticeship; Certificate or diploma; Other post-school qualification.

Still at school: current school attendance was recorded only for persons aged fifteen to twenty years.

Trade qualification or apprenticeship: completion of an approved trade/technical apprenticeship in fitting and turning, hairdressing, plumbing, carpentry, etc.

## **APPENDIX 2**

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

## Introduction

The monthly population survey (which is described in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0)) comprises the monthly labour force survey and supplementary topics. This publication contains some results of a supplementary survey run in association with the February 1988 labour force survey conducted throughout Australia.

2. Of the respondents to the labour force survey, those who fell within the scope of the supplementary survey were asked additional questions. They were asked about their highest educational qualifications. For persons with post-school qualifications, the information sought included field of study, and for those without post-school qualifications, it included whether they completed the highest level of secondary schooling available, and if not, at what age they left school.

#### Scope

- 3. The scope of this supplementary survey was the same as that used for the labour force survey (described in full in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0)) except that it excluded visitors to private dwellings, students who were boarding at school, some patients in hospitals and sanatoriums and inmates of gaols, reformatories etc.
- 4. In the tables, "All Persons" refers to all persons within the scope of the survey.

## Coverage

5. In the population survey, coverage rules are applied which aim to ensure that each person is associated with only one dwelling, and hence has only one chance of selection. See *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0) for more details.

#### **Definitions**

- 6. Definitions of labour force and demographic classifications appearing in this publication are given in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0).
- 7. Unless otherwise stated, all characteristics referenced in this publication relate to the week before the interview.

#### Results of the survey

- 8. Due to differences in the method of estimation used in this supplementary survey and that used in the labour force survey, there are some small variations between estimates in this publication and those in the corresponding issue of *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0).
- 9. This publication contains only a summary of the results of the survey. A more detailed publication *Labour Force Status and Educational Attainment* (6235.0) will be released as soon as possible. Tables of unpublished data may be purchased on request.

- 10. Results of similar surveys, conducted annually since February 1979, have been published in *Labour Force Status and Educational Attainment, Australia* (6235.0).
- 11. It is proposed that this survey will be conducted next in February 1989.

#### Discontinuities in the series

- 12. Educational attainment of persons not in the labour force is not available for the February 1979, 1980 and 1981 surveys.
- 13. Since February 1987 an expanded classification of post-school qualifications has been used. As a result a small number of persons previously categorised as "Degree" or "Other" may now be included in the categories "Trade qualification or apprenticeship" or "Certificate or diploma".
- 14. Estimates contained in this publication are based on a revised labour force questionnaire introduced in April 1986. The definition of employment was expanded, resulting in decreases in the estimates of unemployed persons and persons not in the labour force. Further information is contained in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0) and in an information paper *Questionnaires Used in the Labour Force Survey* (6232.0).
- 15. Classification of occupation according to the Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (ASCO 1986) was introduced in the August 1986 labour force survey, replacing the Classification and Classified List of Occupations (CCLO), used in previous surveys. The main difference between these classifications is that ASCO occupations are classified on the basis of the level and specialisation of skill required for the satisfactory performance of primary tasks. For a more detailed explanation of ASCO see the appendix to *The Labour Force*, *Australia*, *August 1986* (6203.0).
- 16. To provide a link between the two classifications, a matrix has been produced and is shown in Table 41 of *The Labour Force, Australia, August 1986* (6203.0). It shows the relationship between ASCO and CCLO at the broadest classification level (the Major Group). The estimates in the matrix are based on a sub-sample of respondents to the May 1986 labour force survey.

# Survey sample redesign

17. The Labour Force Survey (LFS) sample has been redesigned and reselected using information collected in the 1986 Population Census. As a result, the standard errors used in this supplementary survey differ from those used in surveys of the same topic run prior to September 1987. For details, see *Information Paper — Labour Force Survey — Sample Design* (6269.0).

## Reliability of the estimates

- 18. Estimates in this publication are subject to two sources of error:
  - (a) sampling error: since the estimates are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings they may differ from those that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error. More information about this topic can be found in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0). A table of estimated standard errors for this survey follows these notes. Estimates with a standard error of more than about 25 per cent have not been shown in this publication, as the degree of sampling variability would seriously detract from their value for most reasonable uses. Although, in some cases, estimates for these small components can be derived by subtraction they should not be regarded as reliable; and
  - (b) non-sampling error: inaccuracies may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents and errors made in coding and processing data. These inaccuracies may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
