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



#### Overview

In September 1991, 47.9 per cent (1,307,600) of the estimated 2,732,200 persons aged 15 to 24 were attending an educational institution. This represented a 4 percentage point increase since September 1988.

The survey indicated an estimated population increase of 21,600 among 15 to 24 year olds between September 1988 and 1991 while the number in this group attending

an educational institution rose by 133,000 - 75,900 females and 57,000 males.


Estimates of attendance in September 1991 comprised 706,200 (54%) at school, 325,100 (25%) in higher education, 239,700 (18%) in TAFE and 36,500 (3%) at other educational institutions.


#### Persons attending a school

Fifty-two per cent of the 1,342,600 persons aged 15 to 19 years in September 1991 were attending school at the time of the survey, a 3 percentage point increase since September 1990. School participation rates for individual ages were estimated at 95.5 per cent for 15 year olds, 83.1 per cent for 16 year olds and 66.4 per cent for 17 year olds. Only moderate levels of school participation were reported for 18 and 19 year olds.

Of the 15 to 19 year olds who were attending school, 66 per cent (461,400) said they were attending government schools and the remaining 34 per cent (236,200) were attending non-government schools including 26,100 attending boarding schools.

There were 706,200 persons aged 15 to 24 attending school at the time of the survey. Of these, 24 per cent (168,400) were employed — 166,000 on a part-time basis, 7 per cent (51,600) were unemployed and 69 per cent (486,200) were not in the labour force.





#### Persons attending a tertiary educational institution

An estimated 22.0 per cent (601,400) of 15 to 24 year olds were participating in tertiary education in September 1991, an increase of 4 percentage points over the 18.2 per cent recorded in September 1988 (491,100). Over the same period, 15 to 19 and 20 to 24 year olds show increases of 2 and 5 percentage points respectively.

Full-time tertiary participation rates for 15 to 24 year olds increased by 4 percentage points (109,300) to 13.8 per cent while part-time tertiary participation rates remained constant at around 8 per cent over the 4 years.

Other characteristics of tertiary students in September 1991 include:

- 54 per cent (327,400) were males
- 63 per cent (376,200) were attending full time
- 57 per cent (341,900) were aged 20 to 24
- 54 per cent (325,100) were in higher education, 40 per cent (239,700) in TAFE and 6 per cent (36,500) in other tertiary educational institutions
- 58 per cent (349,500) were employed, 10 per cent (57,200) unemployed and 32 per cent (194,700) were not in the labour force
- 64 per cent (383,600) had last attended a government school.

#### Labour force activity among students

In September 1991 518,000 students aged 15 to 24 were employed — 332,100 on a part-time basis. These, together with the 108,800 students actively seeking work, combined to give a labour force participation rate of 47.9 per cent of all students compared to 89.8 per cent of non-students aged 15 to 24.

Labour force participation rates for other specific groups were:

- 95.6 per cent for part-time students
- 37.9 per cent for full-time students
- 69.8 per cent for all 15 to 24 year olds.


Students aged 20 to 24 had a higher labour force participation rate than 15 to 19 year old students with 66.7 per cent and 41.1 per cent respectively.

#### Birthplace characteristics of students

A labour force participation rate for overseas-born students of 35.0 per cent was recorded in September 1991 compared to 51.8 per cent for Australian-born students. Their unemployment rates also differed — 26.3 per cent for overseas-born and 16.1 per cent for Australian-born students.

Education participation rates differed widely according to country of birth. The rates were 46.0 per cent for Australian-born students, 41.4 per cent for those born overseas in main English-speaking countries and 64.7 per cent for those born in other overseas countries. The following diagram shows the male and female distribution.


#### DIAGRAM 4. EDUCATION PARTICIPATION RATES BY BIRTHPLACE, SEPTEMBER 1991



#### States and Territories

The national education participation rate for 15 to 24 year olds was 47.9 per cent in September 1991. New South Wales, Victoria and the Australian Capital Territory all recorded rates of more than 50 per cent, South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania were around 44 to 45 per cent, Queensland was 41 per cent and the Northern Territory was 33 per cent. The lower rates for the latter two areas coincided with tertiary educational participation rates of 16 and 10 per cent respectively compared to the national average of 22 per cent.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTES

#### Introduction

The monthly population survey (which is described in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0)) comprises the monthly labour force survey and supplementary topics. This publication contains some results of a supplementary survey run in association with the September 1991 labour force survey conducted throughout Australia.

2. Of the respondents to the labour force survey, those who fell within the scope of the supplementary survey were asked additional questions. They were asked whether they were attending an educational institution and, if so, the type of educational institution and the type of attendance.

#### Scope

3. The scope of this supplementary survey was restricted to persons aged 15 to 24 and excluded the following persons:

- (a) members of the permanent defence forces;
- (b) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
- (c) overseas residents in Australia;
- (d) members of non-Australian defence forces (and their dependants);
- (e) persons permanently unable to work;
- (f) some patients in hospitals and sanitariums; and
- (g) inmates of reformatories, gaols etc.

#### Coverage

4. In the population survey, coverage rules are applied which aim to ensure that each person is associated with only one dwelling, and hence has only one chance of selection. See *The Labour Force*, *Australia* (6203.0) for more details.

#### Definitions

5. Definition of labour force and demographic classifications appearing in this publication are given in *The Labour Force*, *Australia* (6203.0).

6. Unless otherwise stated, all characteristics referenced in this publication relate to the week before the interview (i.e. the reference week).

#### **Results of the Survey**

7. Due to differences in the method of estimation used in this supplementary survey and that used in the labour force survey, there are some small variations between estimates in this publication and those in the corresponding issue of *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0). 8. The estimates in this publication refer to information collected in the survey month and, due to seasonal factors, may not be representative of other months of the year.

9. This survey will be conducted next in September 1992.

#### Comparability of series estimates

10. When comparing estimates of attendance between May and September, particularly for schools, it should be noted that approximately one third of 14 year olds turn 15 between the two surveys, thus coming within the scope of the survey and boosting the September estimates. Because attendance estimates amongst 24 year olds are relatively small there is little corresponding loss among 24 year olds turning 25 between surveys.

#### **Reliability of the estimates**

12. Estimates in this publication are subject to sampling and non-sampling errors. For more information refer to the Technical Note.

#### **Estimation procedure**

13. The estimates are derived from the population survey by use of a ratio estimation procedure which ensures that the estimates conform to an independently estimated distribution of the population for each capital city and remainder of state by age and sex, rather than to the corresponding distribution within the sample itself.

16. Because estimates have been rounded, discrepancies may occur between sums of the component items and totals.

#### Estimation procedure

Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they are subject to sampling variability, that is, they may differ from those that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the number that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors. Another measure of the likely difference is the relative standard error, which is obtained by expressing the standard error as a percentage of the estimate.

Space does not allow for the separate indication of 2 the standard errors of all estimates in this publication. A table of standard errors for general application is given on the following page. Since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of past surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics these numbers will not give a precise measure of the standard error of a particular estimate but they will provide an indication of its magnitude.

An example of the calculation and the use of 3. standard errors in relation to estimates of persons is as follows. Table 1 shows the estimated number of persons aged 15 to 24 who, in September 1991, were attending a TAFE as 239,700. Since this estimate is between 200,000 and 300,000 in the standard error table, the standard error for Australia will be between 5,800 and 6,900 and can be approximated by interpolation as 6,300 (rounded to the nearest 100). Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey will fall within the range 233,400 to 246,000 and about nineteen chances in twenty that the value will fall within the range 227,100 to 252,300. This example is illustrated in the following diagram.

4. As can be seen from the standard error table, the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In the tables in this publication only estimates with relative standard errors of 25 per cent or less and percentages based on such estimates are considered sufficiently reliable for most purposes. However, estimates and percentages with larger relative standard errors have been included and are preceeded by an asterisk (e.g. \*3.4) to indicate they are subject to high standard errors and should be used with caution.

Proportions and percentages formed from the ratio of 5. two estimates are also subject to sampling errors. The size of the error depends on the accuracy of both the numerator and the denominator. A formula to approximate the relative standard error (RSE) of a proportion is given below:



Considering the example from paragraph 3 above, 6. the 239,700 persons represent 39.9 per cent of the 601,400 persons aged 15 to 24 who were attending tertiary institutions in September 1991. The standard error of 601,400 is approximately 9,100 so the relative standard error is 1.5 per cent. The relative standard error for 239,700 is 2.6 per cent. Applying the above formula, the relative standard error of the proportion is  $\sqrt{(2.6)^2 - (1.5)^2}$ or 2.0 per cent, giving a standard error for the proportion (39.9 per cent) of 0.8 percentage points. Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the proportion of persons aged 15 to 24 who were attending a TAFE in September 1991 is between 39.1 per cent and 40.7 per cent and nineteen chances in twenty the proportion is within the range 38.3 per cent to 41.5 per cent.

Published estimates may also be used to calculate the 7. difference between two survey estimates (of numbers or percentages). Such an estimate is subject to sampling error. The sampling error of the difference between two estimates depends on their standard errors and the relationship (correlation) between them. An approximate standard error (SE) of the difference between two estimates (x-y) may be calculated by the following formula:

SE (x-y) = 
$$\sqrt{[SE(x)]^2 + [SE(y)]^2}$$

While this formula will only be exact for differences between separate and uncorrelated characteristics of subpopulations it is expected to provide a good approximation for all differences likely to be of interest in this publication.



8. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents, and errors made in coding and processing data. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the *non-sampling error*, and they

may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.

#### GLOSSARY

*Certificate or diploma:* an approved certificate or diploma in secretarial or business studies, administration, teaching, nursing, etc.

*Degree*: a bachelor degree (including honours), a graduate or post-graduate diploma, masters degree or a doctorate.

*Educational institution:* any institution whose primary role is education. Included are schools, universities, colleges of advanced education, colleges of technical and further education, public and private colleges, etc. Excluded are institutions whose primary role is not education, for example hospitals.

*Education participation rate:* the estimate of persons attending an educational institution in any group expressed as a percentage of the civilian population in the same group.

*Full-time attendance:* persons who consider themselves to be attending full time, or the institution which they are attending so classifies them.

*Government schools:* all schools administered by the relevant State and Territory governments.

*Higher Education Institutions:* includes all Australian institutions providing higher education courses, eg., Universities; Colleges of Advanced Education; Institutes of Technology; Institutes of Advanced Education; Institutes of Higher Education; Institutes of Tertiary Education; Agricultural Colleges. *Other educational institutions:* includes business, commercial and secretarial colleges, religious and theological colleges, and instances where insufficient information was available to determine the type of educational institution.

*Other post-school courses:* other types of courses not specified, e.g. adult education, preparatory/bridging courses, hobby courses, etc.

*Participation rate:* in this publication refers to labour force participation rate which is an estimate of the labour force in any group expressed as a percentage of the civilian population in the same group.

*Part-time attendance:* persons who consider themselves to be attending part time or the institution which they are attending so classifies them.

TAFE: college of technical and further education.

*Tertiary institutions:* any educational institutions other than schools.

*Trade qualification/apprenticeship:* an approved trade/technical apprenticeship in fitting and turning, hair-dressing, plumbing, carpentry, etc.

*Unemployment rate:* an estimate of unemployed persons in any group expressed as a percentage of the labour force in the same group.

### TRANSITION FROM EDUCATION TO WORK, AUSTRALIA, MAY 1991

This annual publication was released in December 1991 and provides information from a household based survey on the labour force characteristics of persons aged 15 to 64 in the educational system, both at the time of the survey and in the previous calendar year. For those attending and those not attending an educational institution it gives a broad picture of their contribution to the workforce, their level of education and the type of work they are engaged in.

The publication features information on:

- socio-demographic characteristics such as sex, age, labour force status and educational attainment
- · work history details such as occupation and industry
- type of institution attending
- type of school last attended
- level of course attended/attending
- highest level of education obtained
