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TRADE UNION STATISTICS, DECEMBER 1969

The figures contained in this bulletin have been obtained from the annual collection of membership of trade unions, etc. as at 31 December 1969. For comparison, figures for some earlier years are also shown. More detailed statistics for earlier years and a description of these series appear in the Labour Report and the Official Year Book. This is the first publication of this series in the form of a mimeographed bulletin.

2. Table 1 of this bulletin shows the number of unions and membership in each State and Territory; Tables 2 and 3 figures for industry groups; Tables 4 and 5 the proportion of total wage and salary earners; Table 6 a classification according to the number of members; and Table 7 interstate unions classified by the area of operation. On page 4 details are shown of organisations registered under the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act.

3. In Tables 1 and 3, under the heading "Number of Separate Unions", a union with members in a State or Territory is counted as one union within that State or Territory. The figures do not add to the Australian total because a union represented in more than one State or Territory is included in the figures for each State or Territory in which it is represented, but is counted only once in the Australian total.

4. Where membership figures have been rounded in this bulletin, any discrepancies between totals and sums of components are due to rounding.

Proportion of Total Wage and Salary Earners. Tables 4 and 5 below show the approximate percentages of wage and salary earners in employment who were members of trade unions. The estimates of total wage and salary earners have been derived by adding figures for employees in rural industries and in private domestic service recorded at the 1966 Population Census to the estimates of employees in all other industries as at the end of each year. In comparing the percentages shown in these tables with those previously published, allowance should be made for the fact that the present percentages are based on a new series of employment estimates as from June 1966. The change is more significant for female employees as the new employment estimates include a considerable number of part-time employees who had previously been excluded.

ORGANISATIONS REGISTERED UNDER THE COMMONWEALTH CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION ACT

At the end of 1969 the number of employers' organisations registered under provisions of the Act was 75 (74). The number of unions registered at the end of 1969 was 149 (147), with membership of 1,901,100 (1,836,000), representing 85 (84) percent of total membership of all trade unions in Australia. Comparable figures for 1968 are shown in brackets.
