The most commonly used measure of economic growth is the income-based estimate of constant price gross domestic product (referred to as GDP(I)). Seasonally adjusted GDP(I) fell by 1.0 per cent in June quarter.

The trend estimate of GDP(I) fell by 0.3 per cent in March quarter 1991, its fourth successive quarterly fall.

The only component of private gross fixed capital expenditure to record a rise in June quarter 1991 was dwellings (up 1.6 per cent in constant price, seasonally adjusted terms, but still 7.2 per cent lower than in June quarter 1990). Total private gross fixed capital expenditure declined by 4.7 per cent in constant price, seasonally adjusted terms.

There was a small positive contribution (0.3 percentage points) from private non-farm stocks to the seasonally adjusted real growth in GDP. However, this was more

than offset by a negative contribution (-0.7 percentage points) from farm stocks as a result of a big rundown in wool stocks held by bodies other than the Australian Wool Corporation.

The volume of exports of goods and services rose by 4.7 per cent in seasonally adjusted terms in June quarter. The major contributors to the growth were *wool* and *cotton*.

Imports of goods and services rose by 3.5 per cent in constant price seasonally adjusted terms in June quarter. The major contributor to the growth was *office machinery and computer equipment*.

In seasonally adjusted terms, wages, salaries and supplements fell by 2.3 per cent in June quarter 1991. The fall was made up of a decline in employment of about 0.8 per cent and a drop in average earnings per wage and salary earner of 1.5 per cent.

NOTES ON THE ESTIMATES

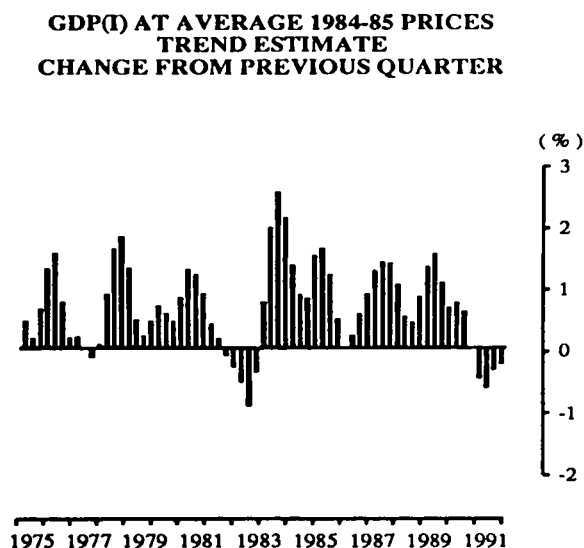
Release date of June quarter 1991 issue

In past years, the June quarter estimates of national income and expenditure have usually been released in conjunction with the Commonwealth Budget papers at 7.30pm on Budget night. For a number of years, only the main tables were released at that time with the main publication coming out some time later. The systems used to produce the June quarter estimates have been progressively improved to the point that the national accounts for the June quarter will normally be available for release before Budget night. As a result, this publication is being released on 15 August this year.

Trend estimates

A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. In practice, it is calculated for estimates in this publication by applying a centred 7-term Henderson moving average to the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated by this method and an asymmetric average is used instead.

The following graph shows percentage changes from 1975 onwards in trend estimates of gross domestic product (GDP(I)) at constant prices.



Government final consumption expenditure

In seasonally adjusted constant price terms, government final consumption expenditure decreased by 2.6 per cent during June quarter 1991, following a rise of 3.4 per cent in March quarter. While the Gulf War was partly responsible for the March quarter 1991 increase (contributing about \$160 million in current price original terms), this series has behaved very erratically in recent years, as can be seen in Table 2 on page 11. When analysing these estimates, it should be noted that they largely reflect the cash payments made by government (rather than the desired measure, which is the actual flow of services consumed by government). As such the

estimates tend to be 'lumpy'. Seasonal adjustment removes regular fluctuations and a pay-day correction removes the effect of the varying number of pays received by a large proportion of Commonwealth employees during a quarter. Nevertheless, after these adjustments have been made, the estimates are still subject to large irregular fluctuations.

Private gross fixed capital expenditure - non-dwelling construction and equipment

In recent years there have been several significant transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors. Details are provided in the following tables of new work done on private non-dwelling construction and purchases of new items of equipment.

Stock valuation adjustment

The stock valuation adjustment (SVA) for *private non-farm stocks* in June quarter 1991 is negative (-\$116 million) and follows a negative SVA of similar magnitude in March quarter 1991 (-\$136 million). In contrast, the average level of the SVA during 1989 and 1990 was about \$600 million per quarter. Changes in the size of the SVA are largely a function of changes in the rate of inflation of the goods held in stock. Therefore, it is generally the case that a lower SVA will be associated with a fall in the rate of price increase, and a negative SVA will be caused by an actual fall in prices. A major contributor to the negative SVA recorded in March quarter 1991 was the large fall in petroleum prices from the December quarter 1990 peak caused by the Gulf Crisis. While declining petroleum prices contributed to a lesser extent to the negative SVA in June quarter, they were reinforced by price falls for a number of other commodities, including wool and non-ferrous metals.

The methodology underlying the estimate of the SVA is based on the following series of assumptions:

- (a) book value levels reported by businesses are based on accounting valuations at historical cost assigned by the FIFO (first in, first out) method;
- (b) within most sectors, sales price movements can be used to adjust stock levels valued at cost; that is, the selling price of finished goods is established as a fixed mark-up on the costs incurred in the current period;
- (c) the commodities in stock have a fixed turnover period; that is, the ratios *stock level of materials/value of purchases* and *stock level of finished goods/value of sales* remain constant;
- (d) the commodity composition of each estimation cell remains fixed; and
- (e) within each estimation cell, the rate of physical increase (or decrease) in stocks is constant throughout each quarter.

At times when prices change markedly from one quarter to the next, discrepancies can arise between this methodology and actual business practice. Should this happen, the most likely effect would be a distorted estimate of the SVA. A problem of this nature would apply mainly in the short term, as it is expected that such distortions would be largely offsetting in the long run.

As noted above, there have been large price changes during recent quarters in some major commodities (such as petroleum, wool, and non-ferrous metals). Special adjustments have been made in an attempt to account for the impact on the SVA of recent changes in wool and petroleum prices. However, it is still possible that the SVA for December quarter 1990 may be overstated (because businesses did not increase the prices underlying the book value of their stocks as much as expected in the light of the price increases in that quarter). Conversely, the SVA for March quarter 1991, and possibly for June quarter 1991, may be too low (because businesses did not decrease the prices underlying the book value of their stocks as much as expected). If the turnaround recorded in the SVA between December quarter 1990 and March quarter 1991 is exaggerated, then the movement shown for gross domestic product in March quarter 1991 would be too high, while those for December quarter 1990 and June quarter 1991 would be too low. It should be noted that errors in the measurement of the SVA have no impact on the size of the statistical discrepancy because it is deducted from both sides of the domestic production account.

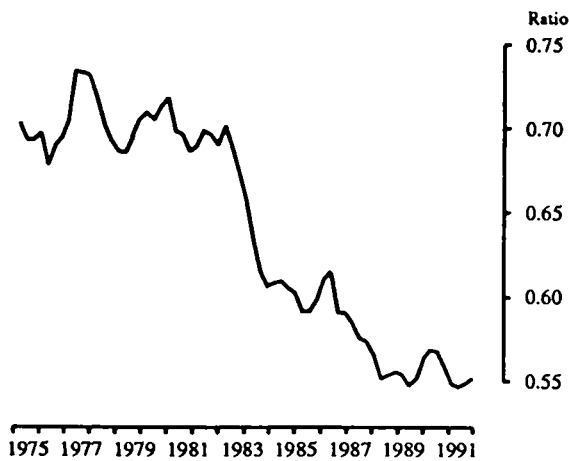
The SVA for *public marketing authority stocks* was -\$908 million in June quarter 1991. The main reason was the large fall in wool prices following the removal of the floor price for wool.

Stocks to sales ratio

In seasonally adjusted constant price terms, *private non-farm stocks* increased marginally (by \$47 million, or 0.1 per cent) during June quarter 1991, while sales (see paragraph 23 of the 'Explanatory Notes') decreased by \$281 million (or 0.4 per cent). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio remained almost the same, going from 0.551 to 0.554.

The graph at the top of the following page presents this ratio from 1975 onwards.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED**



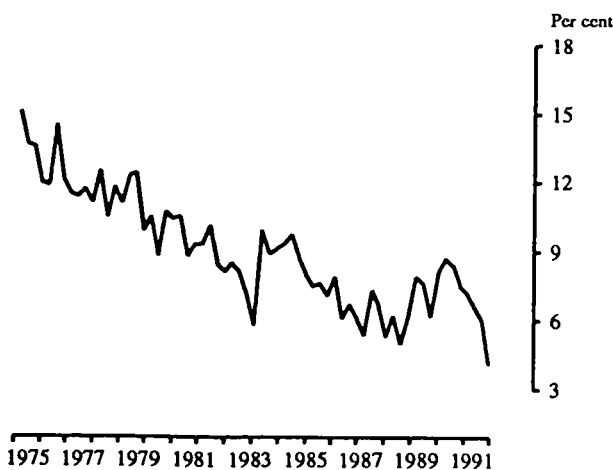
Household saving ratio

Present estimates indicate that, on a seasonally adjusted basis, the proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the March quarter was 95.7 per cent while *household saving*, which is derived as a balancing item, represented 4.3 per cent. The main reasons for the low level of saving are the very depressed level of farm unincorporated enterprise income and the fall in wages, salaries and supplements in June quarter 1991.

The *household saving ratio* is affected by any deficiencies or inconsistencies in the estimation and seasonal adjustment of household income and expenditure. Particular caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio for recent years, and particularly for the most recent quarter, because major components may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of such revisions on the saving ratio can be quite marked and can cause changes in the apparent direction of the trend.

The following graph presents this ratio from March quarter 1975 onwards.

National saving

A feature of the preliminary 1990-91 estimates is the large decline in *national saving*, from \$24.2 billion in 1989-90 to \$9.3 billion in 1990-91. *Household saving* fell by about \$3.4 billion. However, more significant falls were in the *general government surplus on current account* (down \$6.7 billion, from \$8.4 billion to \$1.7 billion) and in '*other saving*' (mainly corporate undistributed income and provisions for income tax) from -\$2.9 billion in 1989-90 to -\$7.8 billion in 1990-91.

Gross farm product

The increase of 4.8 per cent in constant price, seasonally adjusted gross farm product in June quarter 1991 was mainly due to higher meat production.

Exports and imports of goods and services

Constant price estimates of exports of goods and services increased substantially in seasonally adjusted terms in June quarter 1991 (up 4.7 per cent). The two components largely responsible were *wool* (up 79.0 per cent) and *other rural products* (up 26.6 per cent, largely reflecting the record cotton harvest for 1991). These increases were offset by falls in some categories, the most noticeable being *transport equipment* (down 28.5 per cent from the high level in March quarter caused by Qantas selling several second-hand aircraft overseas) and *sugar* (a fall of 50.7 per cent).

The implicit price deflator (IPD) for exports of goods and services fell by 3.8 per cent in June quarter 1991. Prices declined in most commodity groupings but *wool* (down 25.9 per cent, following the abolition of the floor price for wool) and *other mineral fuels* (with a price fall of 21.7 per cent, following the end of the Gulf War) were the most significant. However, the movement in the overall IPD is the result of both price and compositional effects, some of which have been substantial. For example, *wool* actually had a positive effect on the movement in the IPD for total exports of goods and services because the compositional effect on the total IPD of the large increase in the constant price value of wool outweighed the effect of the price fall. The fixed-weighted deflator for exports of goods and services excludes the effect of compositional changes. It fell by 4.5 per cent.

In seasonally adjusted, constant price terms, imports of goods and services rose by 3.5 per cent in June quarter 1991. The major contributor was *machinery*, which increased by 9.6 per cent largely reflecting dramatic growth in imports of *office machines and computer equipment* (up \$513 million or 34.0 per cent in the quarter in original constant price terms).

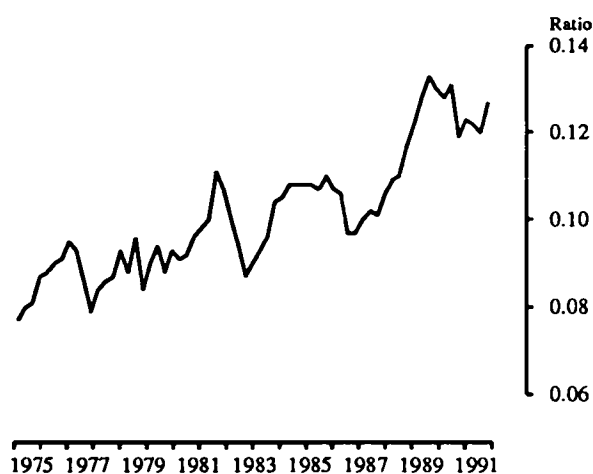
The IPD for imports of goods and services fell by 4.9 per cent. The most significant contributor was *fuel* prices, which fell further from the December quarter 1990 peak caused by the Gulf Crisis; the decline in the *fuel* IPD in June quarter 1991 was 29.6 per cent. There are also significant compositional effects on the IPD, as shown by the decrease of only 2.8 per cent in the fixed-weighted deflator for imports of goods and services. The major contributor to the compositional effects was computer equipment. The combination of its very low deflator and a dramatic increase in its constant price value in June quarter had a negative effect of about 2 percentage points on the total imports IPD in the quarter.

Imports to sales ratio

The imports to sales ratio (see paragraph 24 of the 'Explanatory Notes') increased to 0.126 in June quarter 1991 from 0.119 in the previous quarter. The rise was associated with an increase of 5.7 per cent in endogenous imports and a decrease in sales of 0.4 per cent, both measured in seasonally adjusted constant price terms.

The ratio of imports to sales is presented in the following graph.

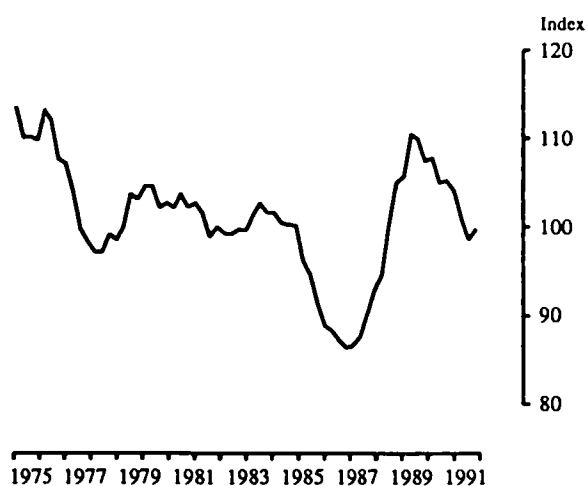
**RATIO OF IMPORTS TO SALES

Terms of trade

Initial estimates indicate that Australia's terms of trade rose 1.2 per cent in June quarter 1991, reflecting a fall of 3.8 per cent in export prices and an even larger drop in import prices (4.9 per cent). The terms of trade since March quarter 1975 are shown in the graph below.

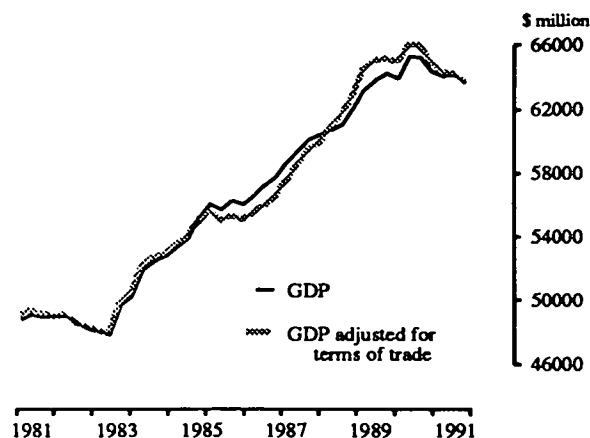
**TERMS OF TRADE

Changes in the aggregate *gross domestic product at constant prices* provide an indication of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If, however, the terms of trade have changed significantly over the period of comparison, then this aggregate will not provide an accurate reflection of the changes in the real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. A detailed description of the terms of trade effect was included in the *Notes on the estimates* section of the December quarter 1990 issue of this publication.

Domestic final demand deflator

The implicit price deflator (IPD) for *domestic final demand* fell by 0.1 per cent in June quarter 1991. This is the first fall in this IPD since September quarter 1962.

Hours worked data

The index of *hours worked* has moved erratically in March and June quarters 1991. This reflects the effect of certain holiday periods, particularly in January, occasionally impacting on the survey period in a non-seasonal manner. It is difficult to make appropriate allowance for such non-seasonal effects.

Revisions in this issue

The estimates of gross operating surplus of private corporate trading enterprises have been revised due to the availability of improved estimates of interest becoming available. While the level of the series has been affected over the last few years, there has been little impact on quarterly movements.

Estimates of exports and imports of services have been revised over the last few years as a result of incorporating data from the *survey of international trade in services*. In addition, estimates of exports of services have been revised by incorporating the latest results from the *international visitors survey*.

Release of gross product by industry estimates

The June Quarter 1991 issue of *Australian National Accounts: Gross Product, Employment and Hours Worked* (5222.0) is due for release on 10 September 1991. It will contain constant price estimates of GDP(A) - the average of the three measures of GDP produced by the ABS - as well as the production-based series (GDP(P)).

Changes in this issue

There has been a change in the treatment of the diesel fuel rebate. Previously, it was treated as a negative indirect

tax. However, as from June quarter 1991, this treatment has been changed to show the initial payment of tax on diesel fuel as an indirect tax and the subsequent reimbursement to users as a subsidy. This change has not had any impact on the *domestic production account*; it shows up only in the detailed government sector accounts.

Tables 56 to 66 provide annual sectoral income and outlay accounts and Government sector capital accounts. They have been included on pages 62 to 66 in this issue.

Release date for September Quarter 1991 issue

The expected release date for the September quarter 1991 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0) is 5 December 1991. The September quarter 1991 issue of *Australian National Accounts: Gross Product, Employment and Hours Worked* (5222.0) is expected to be released on the same date.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication provides estimates of the components of gross domestic product and national expenditure and supporting tables for the June quarter 1991, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the four years 1987-88 to 1990-91. In addition, seasonally adjusted estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are provided for the June quarter 1991, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. Tables 41-46 show revisions that have been made to major aggregates since the previous publication. Tables 47-55 provide time series, in both original and seasonally adjusted terms, for the period from September quarter 1975 for the aggregates contained in the domestic production account (at both current and average 1984-85 prices), some income aggregates, implicit price deflators and some other selected series. Tables 56 to 66 provide annual sectoral income and outlay accounts and Government sector capital accounts.

Concepts, definitions, sources and methods

2. An expanded version of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0) was released last year. It outlines major concepts and definitions, describes sources of data and methods used to derive annual and quarterly estimates for major aggregates at both current and constant prices and discusses the accuracy and reliability of the national accounts. In addition it now includes documentation on input-output tables, flow of funds tables, capital stock and State accounts.

Interpretation of quarterly estimates

3. Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems in that it is often difficult to adhere strictly to the definitions and concepts used in annual estimates. The measurement of income for a quarterly period is particularly difficult since it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. This problem occurs, for example, in estimating the income of farm unincorporated enterprises in each quarter and results in considerable variation in estimates for this series, and for gross farm product, from quarter to quarter. Difficulties are also experienced in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from various sources where different accounting procedures and periods are used.

4. These problems inevitably affect the consistency and reliability of the current price estimates, and similarly affect the constant price estimates based on the current price estimates. Accordingly, these factors as well as the approximations and assumptions necessarily made in the revaluation of flows to constant prices should be taken into account when interpreting or using the estimates (for example, in attempting to draw precise quantitative inferences relating to quarter-to-quarter changes in gross domestic product or its components, or in measuring productivity).

5. Analysis of trends requires allowance for these uncertainties in estimation. To some extent, the effects are indicated by the changes in the statistical discrepancy for corresponding periods. Uncertainty in trends arises also from the likelihood of revisions as more information becomes available and from the irregularity of short-term movements. The inclusion of the statistical discrepancy on the expenditure side of the accounts is a convention and does not necessarily imply that the sum of income components more accurately measures GDP than the sum of the expenditure components (plus exports less imports). As household and other saving are estimated as balancing items in their respective accounts, care should be exercised in their interpretation.

6. Estimates of national income and expenditure are necessarily prepared from a wide range of statistical information, some of which is available quickly and some only with a delay of several years. For this reason most figures should be regarded as subject to revision as more complete and more accurate information becomes available. The revisions will be of two main types - those made to the most recent quarters as firmer quarterly or monthly data come to hand and those which are a consequence of revisions to annual totals and distributed to the quarters approximately in accordance with existing quarterly patterns.

7. No simple measure is available of the accuracy of the major summary national accounting aggregates. However, the following example illustrates the *sensitivity* of quarter-to-quarter growth to the timing of recording a transaction. If, in the latest year, the timing of recording a transaction were delayed by one quarter and if the transaction had an impact on constant price gross domestic product of +\$65 million then the measure of the rate of growth would be affected in the three adjoining quarters (centred on the quarter in which the transaction was recorded) by -0.1, +0.2, and -0.1 percentage points respectively. Of course the percentage impact of such a timing delay on relevant sub-aggregates would be greater.

8. The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) shown in Table 11 are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted current price estimates by the corresponding seasonally adjusted constant price estimates. Movements in the levels of individual implicit price deflators can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. Generally, it is considered that IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted data are more reliable than those obtained by using original (i.e. unadjusted) series, because the former are less likely to be affected by compositional change than are the latter. However the seasonal adjustment process is itself a source of possible distortion, especially to the extent that it is not possible to identify, in a fully consistent way, the seasonality of the current price estimates and of the constant price estimates. A discussion of the limitations involved in using IPDs as measures of pure price change is contained in Appendix B of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

Seasonal adjustment

9. As most series are affected to some extent by seasonal factors, allowance should be made for normal seasonal variation. In a number of tables, *seasonally adjusted* values are presented for selected series. Series which show substantial irregularities in the original or adjusted series should be treated with some reserve. As different methods of seasonal adjustment tend to produce different results, it is necessary to take into account the methods by which seasonally adjusted estimates have been derived and the limitations to which those methods are subject. It should also be noted that the methods of seasonal adjustment used by the ABS do not force the sum of the seasonally adjusted estimates for each quarter of a financial year to equal the original annual total.

10. The general methods used in the ABS for making seasonal adjustments are described in *Seasonally Adjusted Indicators, Australia 1983* (1308.0). However, special methods have been used to adjust some of the components of gross farm product which were not amenable to seasonal adjustment by the usual methods. To obtain these seasonally adjusted estimates, the estimated values of production of wheat, other grain and sugar cane, for any financial year, are distributed equally over the four quarters of the year ended June. One effect of this method is that changes in the annual production of these commodities enter into the seasonally adjusted figures in the September quarter.

11. Where there is no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, constant price estimates are seasonally adjusted using the same factors as are used for adjusting the corresponding current price estimates. As far as possible the remaining constant price estimates have been adjusted using methods similar to those for corresponding current price estimates.

12. Seasonally adjusted estimates of private final consumption expenditure for each State and Territory at current and average 1984-85 prices are shown in Tables 37 and 39 of this publication. Due to the relatively short span of data available for analysis, no Easter or trading-day correction factors have been applied in the seasonal adjustment of these series. The State and Territory series have been adjusted at a more aggregated level than the Australian series and independently of them (although as far as possible similar methods have been used). For these reasons the sum of the seasonally adjusted State and Territory series do not generally equal the seasonally adjusted Australian series.

Trend estimates

13. Trend estimates of two aggregates - GDP and gross non-farm product (GNFP) - are presented in Table 10. They are been derived by applying a 7-term Henderson moving average to the quarterly seasonally adjusted constant price estimates. The weights of the 7-term average are as follows: -0.059, 0.059, 0.294, 0.412, 0.294, 0.059, -0.059.

14. As a moving average approaches the end of a time series and begins to run out of observations, asymmetric averages have to be used. Unlike the asymmetric weights of the standard 5-term and 7-term Henderson moving averages, the weights employed here have been tailored to suit the particular characteristics of GDP and GNFP.

15. Users may wish to refer to the ABS Information Papers *A Guide to Smoothing Time Series - Estimates of 'Trend'* (1316.0) and *Time Series Decomposition - An Overview* (1317.0) for more detailed information on smoothing seasonally adjusted time series data.

Analysis of contributions to growth table

16. Table 5 presents an analysis of the contribution provided by each major aggregate to the percentage change in seasonally adjusted gross domestic product at constant prices. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100.0$$

where A(t) = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration

A(t-1) = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter

GDP(t-1) = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

All these values are seasonally adjusted constant price estimates. It should be noted that the figures in this table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication.

Terms of trade

17. There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. A common means of doing so is by calculating an index of the form:

$$\frac{\text{Price index of exports}}{\text{Price index of imports}} \times 100.0$$

18. In this publication the price indexes used in calculating the terms of trade are the implicit price deflators for exports of goods and services and for imports of goods and services. They take into account not only the changes in the prices of exports and imports, but also the effects of changes in the composition of exports and imports on total recorded price movements. The terms of trade is presented as a memorandum item in Tables 6 and 11.

Gross domestic product (GDP) at constant prices, adjusted for the terms of trade

19. Changes in the aggregate 'gross domestic product at constant prices' provide an indication of changes in the volume of goods and services produced within Australia. If, however, the terms of trade have changed significantly over the period of comparison this aggregate will not provide an accurate reflection of the change in the real

purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production.

20. As with the terms of trade, no single agreed measure of the effect of the terms of trade on movements in GDP at constant prices is available, and the available methods will generally produce different results.

21. In this publication the adjustment has been calculated by first revaluing exports of goods and services by the implicit price deflator of imports of goods and services (thereby providing a measure of the purchasing power of exports over imports). The actual constant price value of exports of goods and services has then been deducted from this value to provide the terms of trade adjustment which has been added to GDP at constant prices to obtain the required result. The series is presented as a memorandum item in Tables 2 and 10.

Expenditure-based estimate of gross domestic product

22. The published measure of GDP is the sum of the income components in the domestic production account. Alternatively, expenditure-based estimates of GDP can be produced by subtracting the statistical discrepancy from the published estimates. Expenditure-based estimates of gross domestic product are presented as a memorandum item in Tables 2 and 10.

Private non-farm stocks to sales ratio

23. The denominator of this ratio is defined as gross non-farm product *plus* endogenous imports (imports of goods *excluding* imports of fuel, imports of certain large items of equipment by both the public and private sectors and certain other government imports) *plus* imports of services *less* changes in private non-farm stocks. All of these variables are at constant prices. The ratio is presented as a memorandum item in Table 10.

Imports to sales ratio

24. The ratio is endogenous imports to sales (both as defined for the private non-farm stocks to sales ratio - see paragraph 23). It is presented as a memorandum item in Table 10.

Household saving ratio

25. This is defined as the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is a balancing item derived as the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is presented as a memorandum item in Table 25.

Data on floppy disk

26. All quarterly series included in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk (*Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk* (5228.0)). These data generally run from September quarter 1959 for current price estimates and from September quarter 1974 for constant price estimates.
