OVERVIEW

- Introduction
- 1 This publication provides information concerning the sample file on magnetic media which contains unit record data from the 1993–94 Household Expenditure Survey. This file, called the 1993–94 Household Expenditure Survey Confidentialised Unit Record File (CURF), is now available.
 - 2 The Household Expenditure Survey, conducted throughout Australia during July 1993 to June 1994, obtained information on the household characteristics and detailed expenditure of households in Australia, as well as information on the characteristics of persons in the household, plus some of the characteristics of their dwellings.
 - 3 The survey covered persons in private dwellings. Trained ABS interviewers were used to collect information from persons aged 15 years or more in the household.
 - 4 The survey was conducted during July 1993 to June 1994, with a final sample of around 8,400 dwellings.
 - 5 Estimates from the survey, as well as more information on the scope, definitions and methodology used in the survey, are published in: *1993–94 Household Expenditure Survey: User Guide* (6527.0).
 - 6 The second edition of this CURF contains additional data items from a study based on the results of the 1993–94 Household Expenditure Survey which examined the effects of Government on household income. The study was a replication of a previous study which was based on the results of the 1988–89 Household Expenditure Survey. The new data items include estimates of taxes paid and benefits received by households in 1993–94. Taxes include personal income tax and indirect taxes on goods and services purchased by households. Benefits include cash pensions and allowances and the imputed value of government services in the areas of education, health, housing and other social security. Results from the study, and further details of the methodology were published in *1993–94 Household Expenditure Survey, Australia, The Effects of Government Benefits and Taxes on Household Income* (6537.0).
 - 7 As well as the CURF and the data released in the above publications, there is also available an extensive range of State and Capital city tables and unpublished data. Inquiries should be directed to the contact officer of the Household Income and Expenditure section on (06) 252 7614.
- Release of the data
- 8 The release of the data is possible under the *Census and Statistics Act 1905*, which has provision for the release of data in the form of unit records where the information is not likely to enable the identification of a particular person or organisation. Accordingly, there are no names or addresses of survey respondents on the CURF and the detail for some data items has been suppressed or reduced to ensure that the confidentiality of individuals is protected.
 - 9 The CURF will only be provided under the conditions set forth in the Conditions of sale (see page 9), and following the Australian Statistician's approval for its release.
- Magnetic media formats
- 10 The CURF is available on:
 - Magnetic tape (see pages 19 to 28); or
 - Floppy disk (see page 20).

- File and record structure **11** The CURF is distributed on either a single reel of magnetic tape or on floppy disk, and contains five files associated with the survey:
- File 1 is a series of 665,756 records, made up of 8,389 household records, 25,660 person records and 631,707 expenditure records. Each household record is 837 characters long. Each person record is 268 characters long. Each expenditure record is 26 characters long.
 - File 2 is a 'print file' in that it contains standard ANSI control characters. A purchaser may print this file to obtain extensive documentation about the data in File 1.
 - File 3 is a compressed and formatted version of File 2 which a purchaser may load into their system for ADP purposes. Each record in this file contains 148 bytes. The basic difference between Files 2 and 3 is that, in File 3, the carriage return (printer control) character and superfluous blank characters have been removed, and fields have been placed in specific positions within the records, together with identifiers to enable interpretation. Further information is provided with the CURF.
 - File 4 is a copyright warning file.
 - File 5 is a text file that contains three SAS[®] programs. There is a SAS[®] program to read each of the household, person and expenditure record types separately into their respective files. Users of this program will have to adapt the INFILE and DATA step names to suit their requirements.

Using the data

- Classifications **12** Some changes have been made to data items to avoid the release of identifiable information, namely:
- (a) detail of many data items (see pages 29 to 57) have been reduced;
 - (b) perturbation of all income items not expressed in ranges;
 - (c) ranging and collapsing of variables as in previous releases of HES CURFs;
 - (d) Broad Geographic Area (i.e. Metropolitan, Other urban and Rural) has not been released this time;
 - (e) calculation of direct taxes based on perturbed income;
 - (f) limited data swapping to mask information available from zone rebates; and
 - (g) recalculation of indirect preschool benefits to mask ages of children in households.

- Data item list **13** The data items which are on the CURF are listed, starting on page 29. Unless otherwise stated, all zero values are 'Not applicable' (i.e. the respondent was not asked the question).

- Effects of sampling **14** As the survey was conducted on a sample of all households in Australia, it is important to take account of the method of sample selection when deriving estimates from the CURF. This is particularly important as a person's chance of selection in the survey varied depending on the State or Territory or, in some cases, area of State/Territory in which he/she lived.

- 15** Each record contains a 'weight'. For person, income unit and household records, the 'weight' takes account of the probability of selection in the sample from their region, with an adjustment to account for under-enumeration.

- 16** If estimates of population sub-groups are to be derived from the CURF, it is essential that they are calculated by adding the weights of households in each category and not just by counting the number falling into each category. If each household's 'weight' were to be ignored, then no account would be taken of the fact that a household's chance of being selected in the survey varied from region to region and the resulting estimates would be seriously biased.
- Estimation procedure **17** Estimates derived from the survey are obtained by using a complex regression estimation procedure, which ensures that the survey estimates conform to both an independently estimated distribution of the population by age and sex at the State of residence and region level and an independently estimated distribution of households by household type (i.e. number of adults and number of children) at the State of usual residence. See Technical Notes in *1993–94 Household Expenditure Survey: User Guide* (6527.0).
- 18** Further information on how to use the data is provided with the CURF.
- Sampling errors **19** Any statistics produced from the CURF will be subject to sampling errors. Tables of standard errors (which are a measure of sampling error) are provided with the CURF.
- Reconciliation with published data **20** As a result of the steps that have been taken to preserve confidentiality, it is not possible to reconcile exactly some data produced from the CURF with published data.
- Charges **21** The price for the CURF, as at April 1996, is listed on the Order Form (see pages 11 to 13). The price includes freight and handling charges to a destination within Australia. Overseas clients are required to pay the appropriate freight charge.
- Conditions of sale **22** The CURF is released under strict conditions. Prior to completing the CURF Order Form, prospective purchasers should carefully read the Conditions of Sale described on pages 9 and 10.
- 23** The CURF is released in accordance with a Ministerial Determination (Clause 7, Statutory Rules 1983, No. 19) (see pages 16 and 17) made in pursuance of Section 13 of the *Census and Statistics Act* 1905. As required by the Determination, the CURF has been designed so that the information on the file will not enable the identification of the particular persons or households to which it relates.
- 24** In pursuance of Clause 7, the Determination requires a prospective purchaser to sign an undertaking (see pages 14 and 15) that they will:
- not attempt to identify particular persons or households; and
 - not attempt to match the data with administrative lists of persons or households; and
 - use the information for statistical purposes only; and
 - not disclose the information to any other person or organisation.
- 25** Note that access to the CURF is restricted to persons, organisations or departments who have given an Undertaking. Other potential users of the data must therefore make separate application to the ABS.

26 The CURF can only be used for statistical purposes. Examples of statistical purposes are:

- the manipulation of the data to produce means, correlations or other descriptive or summary measures;
- the estimation of population characteristics from sample data;
- the use of data as input to mathematical models or for other types of analysis (e.g. factor analysis); and
- to provide graphical or pictorial representations of the characteristics of the population or subsets of the population.

27 Use of the data for unauthorised purposes may render a user liable to severe penalties. For further information about the propriety of any particular intended use of the data, please contact the ABS.

28 While the utmost care is taken in preparing and handling each CURF, deterioration may occur between the time of copying and receipt of the file. Accordingly, if the file is unreadable on receipt and this is reported to the ABS within 30 days of receipt, it will be recopied free of charge. As an added precaution, a security copy ('backup') of the file should be made on receipt.

How to order **29** Please submit orders on the form provided on pages 11 to 13. The Order Form, which asks for formatting requirements etc., should be completed with the assistance of someone with technical knowledge of the computer system to be used to process the files.

30 In the case of requests from organisations or departments, please ensure that the required Undertaking is signed by someone authorised to sign legal documents on behalf of the purchasing organisation and that a copy of the signed Order Form and the Undertaking are retained by the purchasing organisation.

31 Note that we can not process orders unless we have received a fully completed and signed Order Form and Undertaking. The Australian Statistician will not approve the release of a CURF before signed undertakings have been received from the purchaser.

INFORMATION REGARDING THE PURCHASE OF AUSTRALIAN BUREAU OF STATISTICS CONFIDENTIALISED UNIT RECORD FILES

Steps involved	If you wish to purchase an Australian Bureau of Statistics Confidentialised Unit Record File (CURF) you will be required to fill in the Order Form and the associated Undertaking and return them to the Australian Bureau of Statistics. Your order will then be referred to the Australian Statistician for consideration. Under the <i>Census and Statistics Act 1905</i>, the Australian Statistician may only release unit record information in accordance with the provisions of a Determination under the Act, and these require that the recipient of such information signs an undertaking which specifies the conditions under which such information is released and the uses to which it may be put.
Conditions of sale (Section one)	Please read the Conditions of Sale in Section One before completing the Order Form and the associated Undertaking.
Order form (Section two)	The Order Form allows you to specify your technical specifications for the CURF and a delivery address.
Undertaking (Section three)	Individuals or, in the case of organisations, a responsible officer of that organisation, seeking access to a unit record file will be required to sign an appropriate undertaking indicating that they accept the conditions under which the data is provided and the uses to which it may be put. The Australian Statistician can not approve the release of unit record data until signed undertakings have been received from those persons or organisations who are seeking access to the information.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

1993-94 HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE SURVEY CONFIDENTIALISED UNIT RECORD FILE (CURF)

Interpretation

- 'ABS' means the Australian Bureau of Statistics.
- 'Data' means 1993-94 Household Expenditure Survey Confidentialised Unit Record File.
- 'Commercialise', in respect of the Data or a product derived from the Data, means to manufacture, sell, distribute, hire or otherwise exploit a product or process, or to provide a service, incorporating the Data or any product or service derived from the Data, or to license a third party to do any of the above.
- 'Purchaser' means the individual or organisation granted access to the CURF.
- 'Licence Fee' means \$7,600.
- 'Statistical Purposes' means use by the purchaser to produce information of a statistical nature. Examples of such uses are:
 - (a) the manipulation of the Data to produce means, correlations or other descriptive or summary measures;
 - (b) the estimation of population characteristics from the Data;
 - (c) the use of the Data as input to mathematical models and for other types of analyses (e.g., factor analysis); and
 - (d) to provide graphical or pictorial representations of characteristics of the population or sub-sets of the population.

Permitted uses

- The ABS grants the purchaser a non-transferable, non-exclusive licence to use the Data on the terms and conditions set out in the associated Undertaking.
- The purchaser is permitted to:
 - (a) use the Data within, and for the purposes of, their organisation only;
 - (b) use the Data for Statistical Purposes only;
 - (c) make a back-up copy of the Data to be labelled with the same copyright notice as the Data and to be used by their organisation only; and
 - (d) produce hard copies and computer files from the Data for use within their organisation.
- The purchaser must treat the Data as private and confidential to the ABS and must take all reasonable measures to protect the Data from unauthorised use, replication, distribution or publication.

Uses not permitted

- The purchaser may not make copies of or use the Data, except as permitted by these Conditions of Sale.
- The purchaser may not alter, decompile, disassemble or otherwise dispose of the Data.
- The purchaser may not rent, lease, sub-license, lend, sell, assign or transfer the Data to a third party.

Legislative restraints

- The release of this Data to the purchaser is subject to a Ministerial Determination made under the *Census and Statistics Act 1905*. Pursuant to this Determination, the ABS requires the purchaser to undertake that:

- (a) no attempt will be made to use the Data to identify or attempt to identify particular persons or households; and
- (b) no attempt will be made to match the Data with administrative lists of persons or households; and
- (c) the information will only be used for Statistical Purposes; and
- (d) the information will not be disclosed to any other person or organisation.

- In accordance with the Undertaking, the purchaser may not commercialise the Data or any product or service incorporating, the Data (whether or not amounting to a reproduction within the meaning of the *Copyright Act* 1968). The commercialisation of products or services derived from the Data may only be carried out with the prior written agreement of the ABS.

Breaches of these conditions ■ In our sole opinion, if the purchaser has failed to comply with any of the Conditions of Sale, the ABS by notice in writing will demand return of all copies of the Data in their possession, power or control. The ABS may request that the purchaser certify that they have done so.

Delivery ■ The ABS will despatch the Data to the purchaser, at the address nominated, within 7 working days of the Australian Statistician's approval to release the CURF to the purchaser.

Intellectual property right ■ The purchaser acknowledges that the intellectual property right, including copyright, in the Data is owned by the Commonwealth of Australia, represented by the ABS.

■ Copyright notices appearing on the Data, or on information displayed or printed by the Data, shall not be removed.

Limitation of liability ■ The ABS gives no warranty, other than a warranty that may be implied by law, that the Data is free from errors, is complete, has any particular quality, is suitable for any purpose or otherwise.

■ Subject to any warranty which may be implied by law, our liability to the purchaser for any loss, damage or injury howsoever caused by the ABS, whether due to negligence or otherwise, in relation to the Data shall be limited to providing a replacement copy of the Data.

■ The purchaser agrees to indemnify the ABS (and our servants and agents) in respect of all liability for loss (including all legal costs), or liability from any claim, suit, demand, action or proceeding brought by any third person in connection with this Condition of Sale or from their use of the Data.

■ These limitation of liability provisions shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of any agreement with the purchaser.

- C. An undertaking may be given by the responsible minister in relation to, or a responsible officer of, the

SCHEDULE

1993-94 HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE SURVEY (Second edition)

A confidentialised unit record file consisting of unidentified individual statistical records containing data on 8 389 households in private dwellings including State/Territory identifiers; household, family and income unit types; age, sex, marital status, birthplace, year of arrival in Australia, disability status and severity of handicap, labour force details, occupation, student status, details of income and source of income of persons in the household; details of mortgages, loans and credit cards, tenure, number of bedrooms and type of dwelling structure, number of spenders in household and details of weekly household expenditure by fine level expenditure commodity items. This second edition of the confidentialised unit record file includes additional data derived from the survey data and other data to estimate the effects of selected government benefits and taxes on household income, including weekly household direct and indirect taxes and benefits by type, and private, disposable and final income.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Subsection 13(1) of the *Census and Statistics Act* 1905 ('the Act') provides for the Minister administering the Act to make determinations allowing, with the approval in writing of the Australian Statistician ('the Statistician'), the disclosure of a specified class of information.

On 16 February 1983, the Minister of State for Veterans' Affairs acting for and on behalf of the Treasurer (the latter being the Minister at that time administering the Act) made such a determination ('the Determination'), being No. 19 of the Statutory Rules 1983.

The relevant parts of the Act and the Determination are reproduced below.

SUBSECTIONS 13(1) AND (2), *CENSUS AND STATISTICS ACT* 1905

- (1) Notwithstanding anything in this Act (other than this section), the Minister may, by instrument in writing, make determinations providing for and in relation to the disclosure, with the approval in writing of the Statistician, of information included in a specified class of information furnished in the pursuance of this Act.
- (2) Without limiting the generality of subsection (1), determinations may make provision –
 - (a) as to the person to whom the information may be disclosed;
 - (b) as to the persons, being the persons from whom the information has been obtained, whose consent is required for the disclosure of the information; and
 - (c) specifying terms and conditions subject to which the information may be disclosed, including, but without limiting the generality of the foregoing, terms and conditions as to the requiring of a person to whom the information is, or is to be, disclosed to give an undertaking, in writing with respect to the disclosure of the information by that person, including an undertaking not to disclose any of the information to any person.
- (3) Information of a personal or domestic nature relating to a person shall not be disclosed in accordance with a determination in a manner that is likely to enable the identification of that person.

SUBSECTIONS 19(1) AND (2), *CENSUS AND STATISTICS ACT* 1905

- (1) A person who is, or has been, the Statistician or an officer shall not, except —
 - (a) in accordance with a determination; or
 - (b) for the purposes of this Act,either directly or indirectly, divulge or communicate any information furnished in pursuance of this Act to any person (other than the person from whom the information was obtained).
- (2) A person who contravenes subsection (1) or fails to comply with an undertaking of the kind referred to in paragraph 13(2)(c) given by him in relation to information disclosed to him in accordance with a determination is guilty of an indictable offence punishable on conviction by a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or imprisonment for a period not exceeding 2 years, or both.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY — *continued*

CLAUSE 7 OF THE STATISTICS DETERMINATION (STATUTORY RULES 1983, NO. 19)

- (1) Information in the form of individual statistical records may, with the approval in writing of the Statistician, be disclosed where –
 - (a) all identifying information such as name and address has been removed;
 - (b) the information is disclosed in a manner that is not likely to enable the identification of the particular person or organisation to which it relates; and
 - (c) the Statistician has been given a relevant undertaking for the purposes of this clause.
- (2) A reference in paragraph (1)(c) to a relevant undertaking shall be read as a reference to an undertaking in writing by –
 - (d) in the case of information to be disclosed to a person, being an individual – that person;
 - (e) in the case of information to be disclosed to an official body – the responsible Minister in relation to, or a responsible officer of, that official body; or
 - (f) in the case of information to be disclosed to an organisation other than an official body – a responsible officer of that organisation,

that use of the information will be subject to the following terms and conditions:

- (a) no attempt will be made to identify particular persons or households; and
- (b) the information will be used only for statistical purposes; and
- (c) the information will not be disclosed to any other person or organisation; and
- (d) if the Statistician considers it necessary in a particular case – either or both of the following
 - (i) that the information, and all copies (if any) of the information, will be returned to the Statistician as soon as the statistical purposes for which it was disclosed have been achieved;
 - (ii) that access by officers to information, documents or premises will be given as may be necessary for the purpose of conducting a compliance audit concerning observance of the terms and conditions under which the information is disclosed; and
- (e) any other condition that, in the opinion of the Statistician, is reasonably necessary in a particular case.

CONFIDENTIALISED UNIT RECORD FILE (CURF) FORMATS

MAGNETIC TAPE FORMATS

Tape specifications	All data on magnetic tape from household sample surveys are supplied from the ABS Canberra office and encoded by a FACOM M780 computer. All tapes are of standard dimensions (730m x 12.7mm) and use 9 tracks.
Tape labelling conventions	Three labelling options are available: ■ FACOM Standard Label (same as IBM Standard Label). A label block consists of an 80 character EBCDIC coded fixed format record prefixed as for Australian Standard Labels but with some fields containing different information. However, the contents of the main fields are the same as for ANSI X3.27 labels. For a complete description, see pages 19 to 26; ■ Australian Standard Label (ANSI X3.27 — 1978 and AS 1068 — 1971). A label block consists of an 80 character ASCII coded fixed format record prefixed by the characters VOL1, HDR or EOF. For a complete description, see pages 20 and 21; and ■ Unlabelled. Note: All data files labelled and unlabelled will be encoded using either ASCII or EBCDIC Code Sets and will be blocked. The last file of data will be terminated by two consecutive tape marks. Although the ABS can supply unlabelled tapes from the M780 computer, the practice is strongly discouraged.
Recording densities	There are two recording densities available, and these are phase encoded 63 RPmm (1600 BPI) and 246 RPmm (6250 BPI).
Code sets	Two code sets are available: ■ ASCII Code Set (AS1776 – 1975) which requires a minimum of 7 bits for representation. ABS always writes this code in 8 bit representation with the high order bit set to zero. This code will not be represented on tapes with FACOM Standard Labels; and ■ EBCDIC Code Set. The ABS always writes this code in 8 bit representation. This code will not be represented on tapes with ANSI labels.
Block sizes	The block sizes, which can only be allocated by the ABS, will be as close as possible to 2048 characters. This is the maximum block size allowed for ANSI labelled tapes.
Provision of magnetic tapes	The CURF will be supplied on ABS tapes. These tapes are certified 730m x 12.7mm new tapes.
Initialising arrangements for magnetic tapes	All tapes will be initialised by the ABS under its Tape Management System (TMS). Labelled tapes will be allocated volume serial numbers (VSNs) by the ABS and hardcopy of the label details will be supplied to you. You may specify an expiry date on the order form. Unlabelled tapes can also be provided.
ABS recommended tape option	The ABS recommends that the data be provided on 9 track tapes which are FACOM Standard labelled and written at 246 RPmm (6250 BPI) using the EBCDIC code set.

FLOPPY DISK FORMATS

If you choose to obtain the data on floppy disks, to enable processing of the data on IBM or IBM compatible microcomputers, the data files will be provided on appropriately labelled disks, in a highly compressed format. Public domain software, together with associated documentation, will be provided to enable you to de-compress the files into the same format as would normally be provided on magnetic tape and, as such, would reflect the documentation provided in this publication.

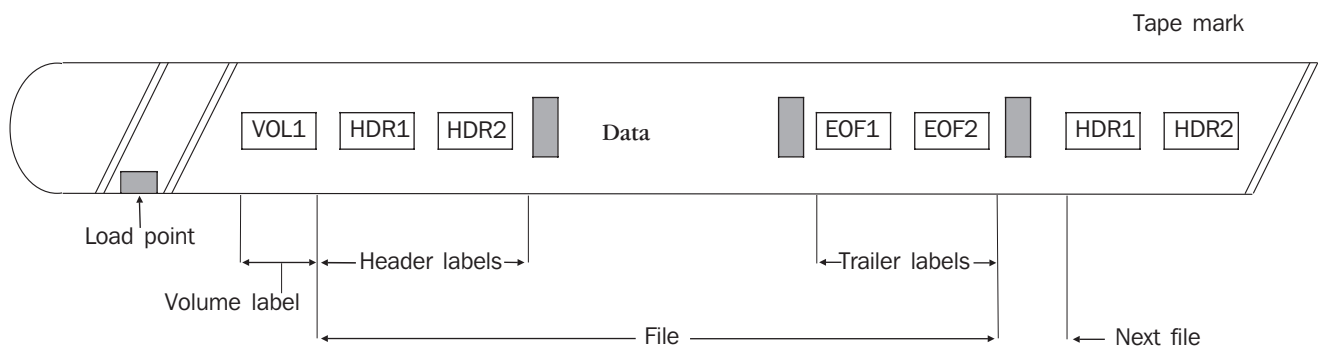
MAGNETIC TAPE VOLUME AND DATA SET LABELS

Section A — FACOM Standard Labels (same as IBM Standard Labels)

Each label is one 80-byte record containing various attributes of the data set or reel. EBCDIC code is used.

There are five kinds of labels, as shown in Figure 1.

Volume label

One volume label exists as the first block on each reel. This label contains the volume serial number (VSN), owner name, and other data pertinent to this reel. A volume label is characterised by its first four characters: VOL1.

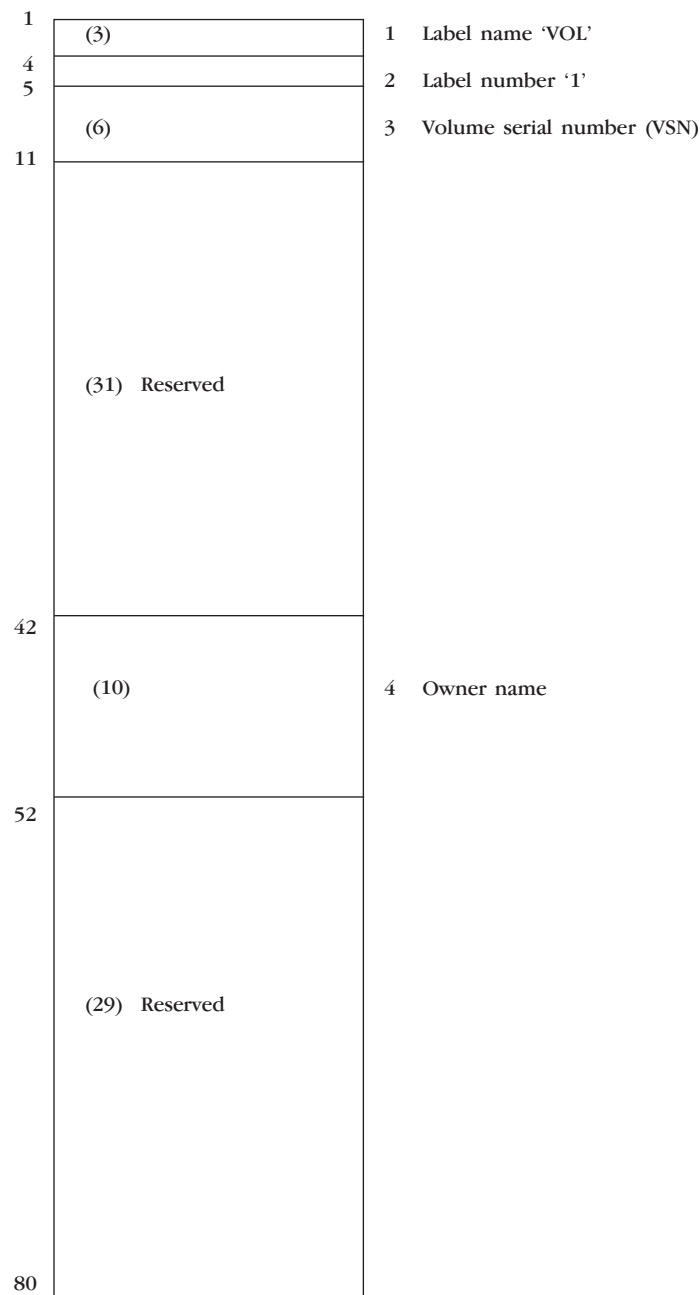
Header labels

Two header labels are written at the front of each file: header label 1 (HDR1) and the header label 2 (HDR2). The former contains an identification of this file, the latter contains various attributes.

Trailer labels

Two trailer labels are written at the end of each file: trailer label 1 (EOF1) and trailer label 2 (EOF2). As can be seen from Figure 1, header and trailer labels are paired for each file on the volume. Trailer labels are quite similar to header labels, since reel processing does not always start from the front of a file, for example, when reading backwards.

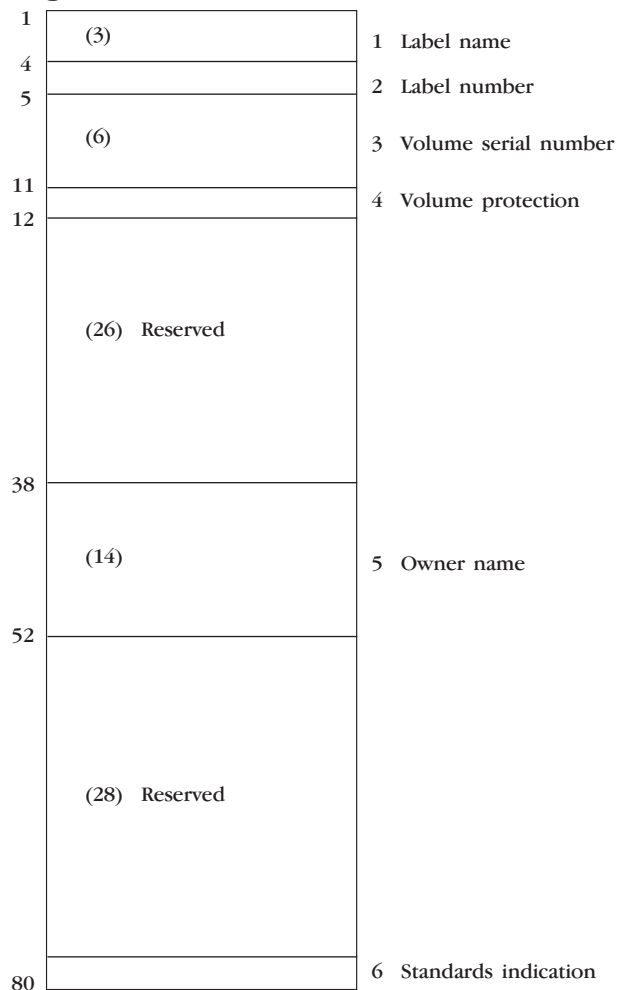

Section B — Australian Standard Labels (ANSI)

ANSI labels have basically the same format as FACOM standard labels. There are some differences in positions of fields in VOL1 and HDR1. HDR3 and subsequent header labels are not used. All ANSI labels and data are recorded in ASCII code at a recording density of 63 RPmm (1600 BPI) or 246 RPmm (6250 BPI).
