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INDIGENOUS PROFILE EXPLANATORY NOTES

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INTRODUCTION	1. The Indigenous Profile provides 26 tables containing key census characteristics of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander persons, families and dwellings. Some tables provide comparisons with the non-Indigenous population. It is based on place of enumeration. 2. Information was collected from the 1996 Census of Population and Housing. 3. Each table title in the Indigenous Profile consists of two parts. The first part lists the variables included in the table. The second part describes the table population. 4. For more information on classifications and Census concepts see the 1996 Census Dictionary (Cat No. 2901.0).
DATA QUALITY	5. The Census is subject to a number of inaccuracies resulting from mistakes in collection or data processing and respondent error. Some of these are overcome or 'repaired' during processing. The effect of those that remain is generally slight, although it may be more important for small groups in the population such as the Indigenous population. The main kinds of error to keep in mind are:
Partial non-response	6. In some cases an answer, where not provided to a question, was imputed or derived (often from other information on the form). In other cases a 'not stated' code was allocated.
Processing error	7. While such errors can occur in any processing system, quality management is used to continuously improve the quality of processed data, and to identify and correct data of unacceptable quality.
Random adjustment	8. Cells with counts of 1 or 2 are randomly adjusted to 0 or 3 to avoid releasing information about particular individuals, families or households. The effect of random adjustment is statistically insignificant. Medians based on two values are based on the higher value.

Respondent error	9. Because processing procedures cannot detect or repair all errors made by persons in completing the form, some remain in final data.
Undercount	10. Although the Census aims to count each person once, there are some people who are missed and others who are counted more than once. A post enumeration survey is conducted soon after the Census to measure the undercount. 11. The undercount for Indigenous people is estimated to be between 2% and 10% depending on the geographical location. For further information on data quality see Population Distribution, Indigenous Australians (Cat. No. 4705.0).
INDIGENOUS GEOGRAPHY	12. An Indigenous Geography was newly established for the 1996 Census consisting of, from smallest to largest, Indigenous Locations, Indigenous Areas and ATSIC Regions. Indigenous Locations generally include at least 80 Indigenous persons, and comprise one or more Collection Districts. Indigenous Areas generally include around 280 Indigenous persons, and comprise one or more Indigenous Locations. An ATSIC Region is a legally prescribed area for the purpose of administration by the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission (ATSIC), and comprises a number of Indigenous Areas. Indigenous profiles will not be released for the following Indigenous Areas and Indigenous Locations, due to poor data quality: Indigenous Areas: Yam Island (Qld); Balance AP lands, Indulkana (Iwantja), Fregon (Kaltitji & Irintata) (SA); Wyndham-East Kimberly: Oombulgurri (WA); Warlpiri/Redgum/Wallaby Camps, Rockhole (NT). Indigenous Locations: Yam Island (Qld); Pipalyatjara, Kalka & Homelands, Murputja Homelands, Indulkana (Iwantja), Fregon (Kaltitj & Irintata) (SA); Wyndham-East Kimberley: Oombulgurri (WA); Daly balance, Warlpiri/Redgum/Wallaby Camps, Rockhole, Yugul Mangi balance, Belyuen outstations-Cox Peninsula (NT).

INDIGENOUS PROFILE GLOSSARY

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Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander origin	1. The question used in the 1996 Census was 'Is the person of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin?' Respondents could report Aboriginal origin, Torres Strait Islander origin, both origins or neither. Prior to the 1996 Census only one or the other Indigenous origin could be recorded.
Employed full-time	2. Employed full-time means that the person worked 35 hours or more in all jobs held in the week prior to Census night.
Employed part-time	3. Employed part-time means that the person worked less than 35 hours in all jobs held in the week prior to Census night.
Family	4. A family is defined as two or more persons, one of whom is at least 15 years of age, who are related by blood, marriage (registered or de facto), adoption, step or fostering, and who are usually resident in the same household and includes same sex couples.
Family income	5. Family income is the sum of the personal incomes of each resident family member aged 15 years or more. Family income is not applicable to non-family households such as group households or lone person households; or to people in non-private dwellings.
Household	6. A household is defined as a group of two or more related or unrelated people who usually reside in the same dwelling, who regard themselves as a household, and who make common provision for food or other essentials for living; or a person living in a dwelling who makes provision for his/her own food and other essentials for living, without combining with any other person.

	7. For census purposes, the total number of households is equal to the total number of occupied private dwellings.
Household income	8. Household income is the sum of the personal incomes of each resident household member aged 15 years and over. If any household member did not state their income, or was temporarily absent, household income is not calculated. These families fall into the 'Partial income stated' category.
Indigenous family	9. An Indigenous family is one where either the reference person or spouse is of Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islander origin.
Indigenous household	10. An Indigenous household is a family household where any family in the household is defined as an Indigenous family or a lone person household where the lone person is of Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islander origin.
Nfd	11. Nfd means 'not further defined'.
Overseas visitor	12. Overseas visitors are excluded from all tables in the Indigenous Profile.
Place of enumeration	13. The Census count, based on place of enumeration, is a count of every person who spent Census night in Australia. People are counted where they are on Census night, which may not be where they usually live.
Table population	14. Table population is a description of what the table is counting. For example, tables containing marital status usually have a table population of persons aged 15 years and over. It appears under the table title.
