INTRODUCTION

1. The Working Population Community Profile provides 17 tables containing labour force and related data on the characteristics of employed people enumerated and working within the same Journey To Work (JTW) study area. These JTW study areas are designed to suit analysis of working populations, and primarily cover capital cities and surrounding areas.
- Data are available for the workplace Statistical Local Area (SLA) level (regardless of the SLA of enumeration provided the enumeration SLA is in the JTW study area), and for the JTW study area as a whole.
2. In the 1996 Census, there were eight JTW study areas -

3. Information was collected from the 1996 Census of Population and Housing.
4. Each table title in the Profile consists of two parts. The first part lists the variables included in the table. The second part describes the table population.

GLOSSARY

- Destination Zones
7. Information on Journey to Work is obtained from the response to the Census question that asks address of employer's workplace for the main job held last week (Q35).
8. The workplace address was used to code the work destination zone for each employed person enumerated in a study area. Destination zones were designed by the local transport authorities and are not necessarily the same as CDs. However, they do aggregate to SLAs, with the exception of 2 SLAs.
9. The Cooma-Monaro(A) SLA consists of only 3 CDs for inclusion in the A.C.T. JTW Study Area rather than the standard 22 CDs, and the Mareeba(S) SLA consists of only 2 CDs for inclusion in the Queensland JTW Study area rather than the standard 41 CDs. For further information, please ask your CSSSU representative for a copy of Fact Sheet 14.
10. In previous Censuses, data for destination zones comprised those employed persons who were enumerated at their place of usual residence within the study areas.

11. Employed full-time means that the person worked 35 hours or more in all jobs held during the week prior to Census night. Employed part-time means that the person worked less than 35 hours in all jobs held during the week prior to Census night.
12. For Census purposes, people who stated they were employed, but worked zero hours in the week prior to Census night have been coded to 'employed part-time'.

WORKING POPULATION COMMUNITY PROFILE EXPLANATORY NOTES

Social Marital Status 13. Social Marital Status is the relationship status of an individual with reference to another person who is usually resident in the household. A marriage exists when the two people live together as husband and wife, or partners, regardless of whether the marriage is formalised through registration. In the 1996 Census, where information about same-sex couples is volunteered in the relationship question, it is included in the family coding and classified as a partner in a de facto marriage.

Table Population 14. Table population is a description of what the table is counting. Most tables within the Working Population Community Profile have a table population of 'employed persons'. It appears under the table title.

DATA QUALITY 15. The Census is subject to a number of inaccuracies resulting from errors by respondents or mistakes in collection or processing of the data. Some of these are overcome or 'repaired' by careful processing procedures and quality management of the processing itself. The effect of those that remain is generally slight, although it may be more important for small groups in the population. The main kinds of error to keep in mind are:

Partial non-response 16. In some cases where an answer was not provided to a question an answer was imputed or derived (often from other information on the form). In other cases a 'not stated' code was allocated.

Processing error 17. While such errors can occur in any processing system, quality management is used to continuously improve the quality of processed data, and to identify and correct data of unacceptable quality.

Random adjustment 18. Cells containing small values are randomly adjusted to avoid releasing information about particular individuals, families or households. The effect of random adjustment is statistically insignificant.

Respondent error 19. Processing procedures cannot detect or repair all errors made by persons in completing the form, therefore some may remain in final data.

Undercount 20. Although the Census aims to count each person once, there are some people who are missed and others who are counted more than once. A post enumeration survey is conducted soon after the Census to measure the undercount.

21. Further information on data quality will be provided progressively in Census Update and in the 1996 Census fact sheets and working papers.
