


## State growth rate





## Capital city growth














#### Where do migrants live?





## Overseas-born population – Australia 1966-2016










#### Age diversity of migrants
































#### Median personal income






### Housing costs – mortgage repayment

## Mortgage repayments and household income






## Rent and household income

% of households paying >30% monthly income




