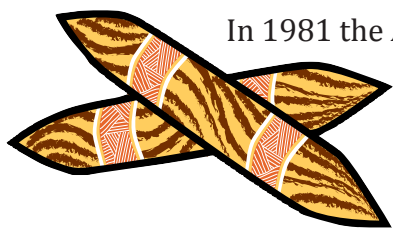


Graphing Indigenous Australian population

'Considerable caution is required in making any inter-censal comparisons. In particular, it is believed that a substantial proportion of the increases reflect a growing willingness of people to identify themselves as Aboriginals or Torres Strait Islanders'. In 1981 the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) formally adopted the following question as the standard for identifying the Indigenous population: 'Is the person of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin?'

In 1995 the ABS formally adopted the following question as the standard for identifying the Indigenous population: 'Is the person of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin? For persons of both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander origin mark both 'Yes' boxes.'

Tasks

- 1 Create a line graph of Estimates of Indigenous Australian population versus time. Look carefully at the Census Year and make sure your scale for time has equal increments and goes past 2011. Remember all graphs are drawn in pencil with a ruler.
- 2 Look carefully at your graph. Put a small cross on your graph to represent what you think the Australian Indigenous Population will be in 2011. Connect the 2011 point to the rest of your line, but with a different coloured pencil. Extending your graph using estimation is called *extrapolation*.

Questions

- 1 Give reasons for why a line graph is the most appropriate way to present this data.
- 2 Explain why a histogram is an incorrect way to present this data.
- 3 Look at the shape of the line in your graph. What sort of graph is this?
- 4 Use extrapolation to estimate the Indigenous population for 2011.
- 5 Do you think your estimate will be correct? Give reasons for your answer.
