











Census population growth





Population growth 2016 - 2021





Population and dwelling growth









Age distribution - 2001



Age distribution - 2001 vs 2021




























Top 5 countries of birth








Age distribution of migrants






Top country of birth excluding Australia






Religious affiliation over time








Religious affiliation change over time
















Domestic work by sex










