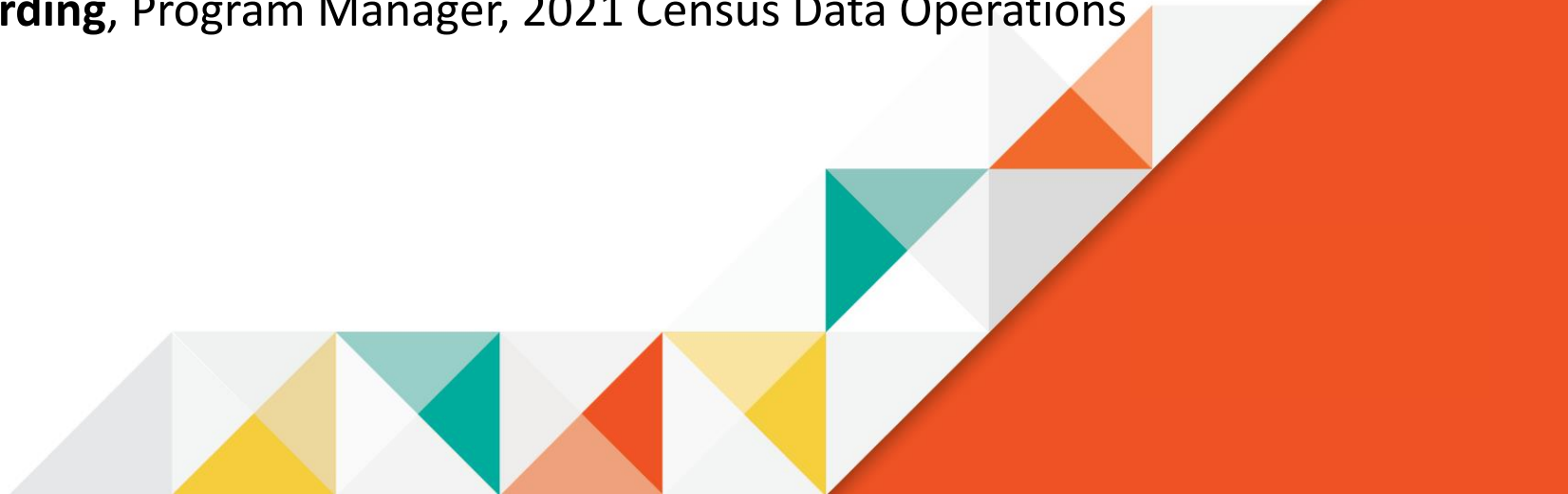

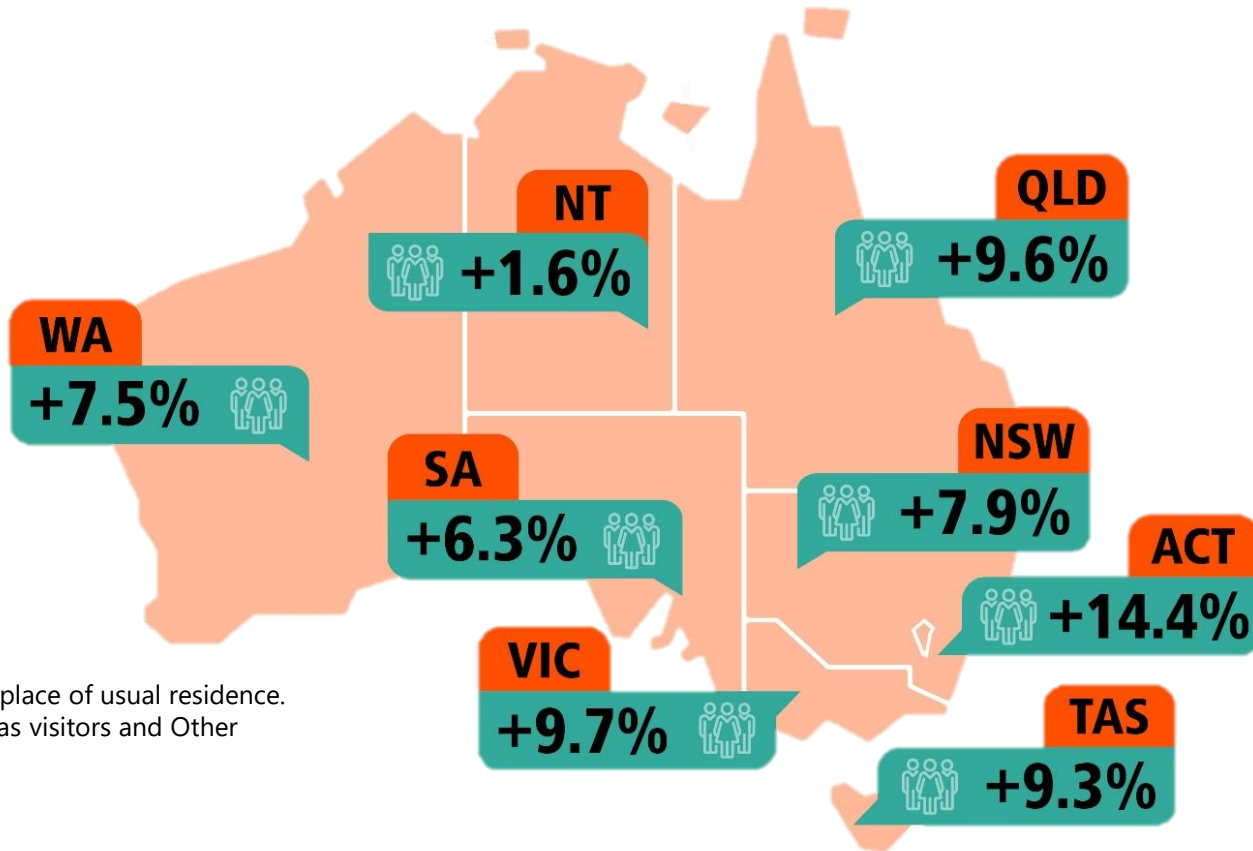

Population growth 2016 - 2021

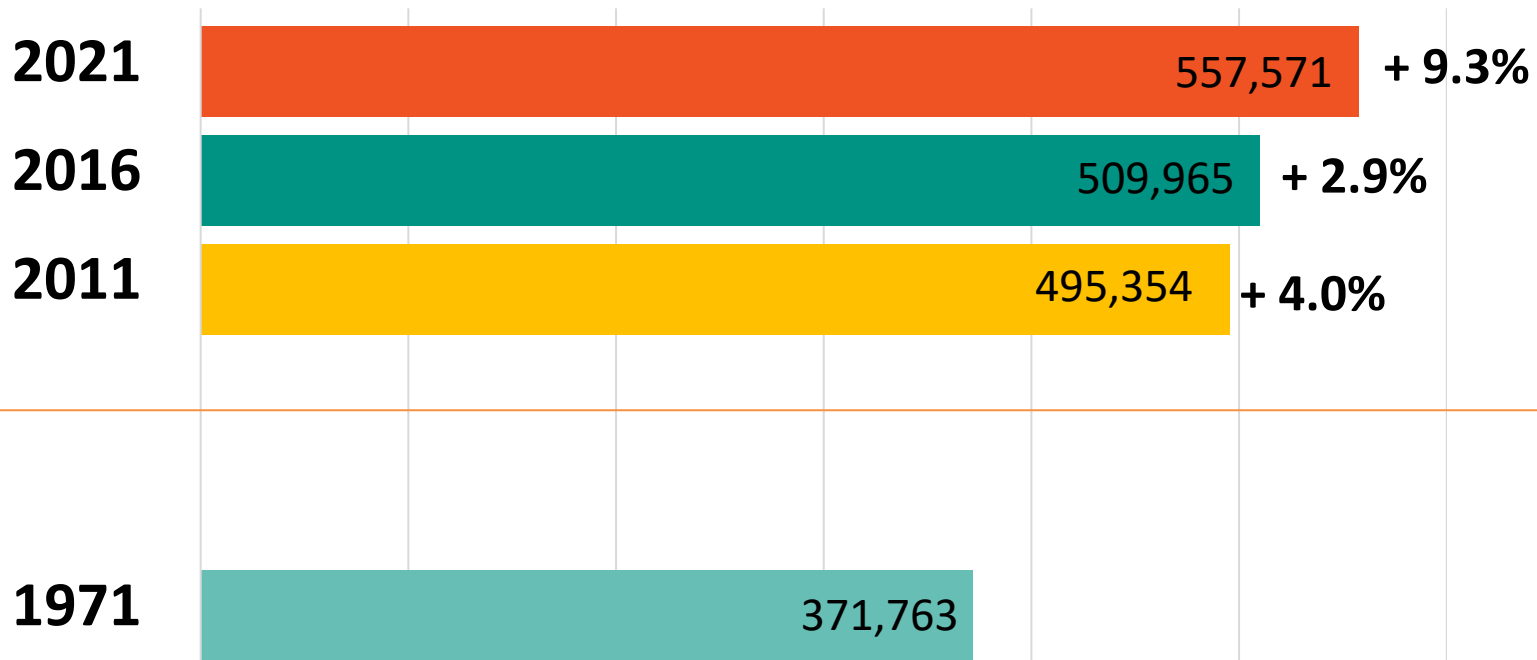

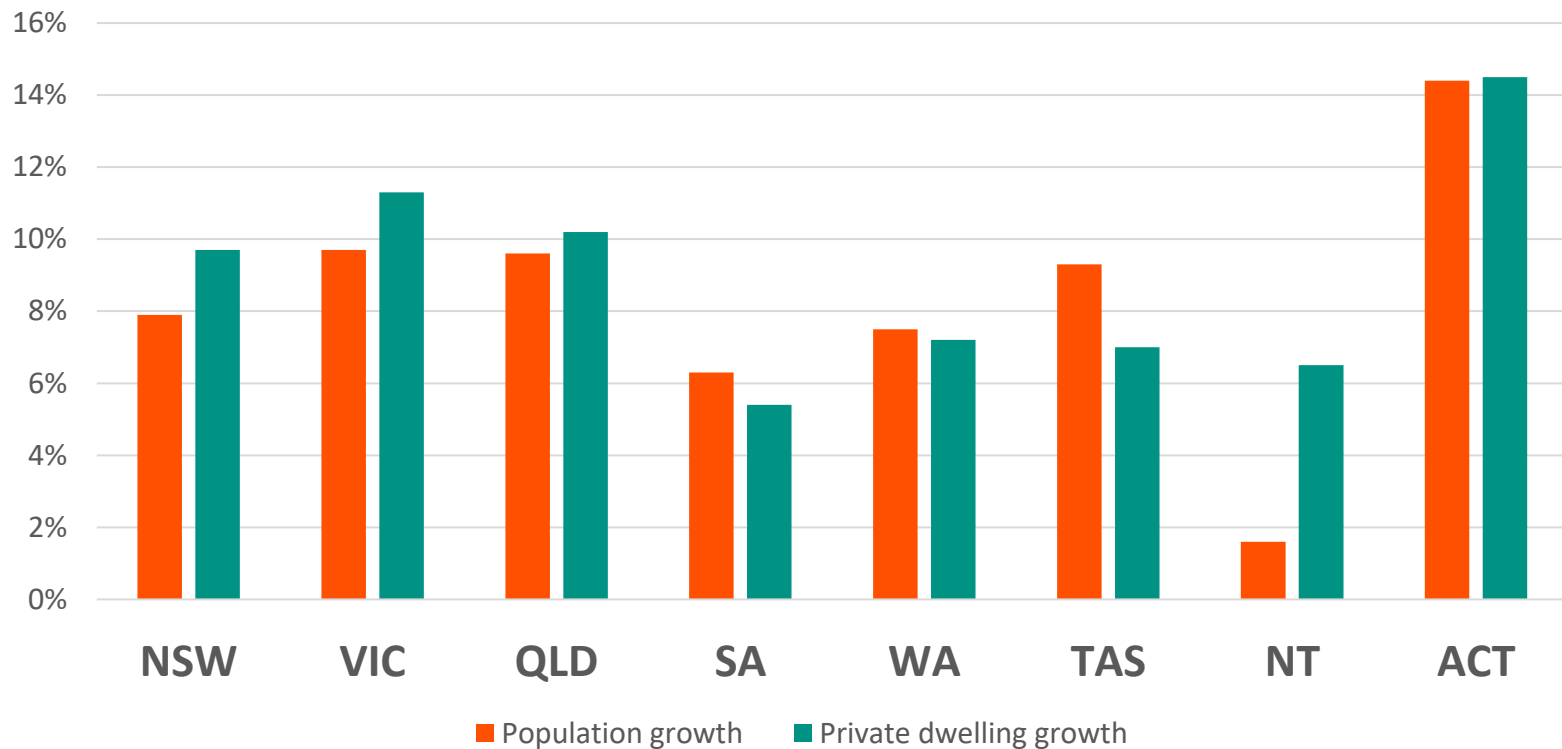

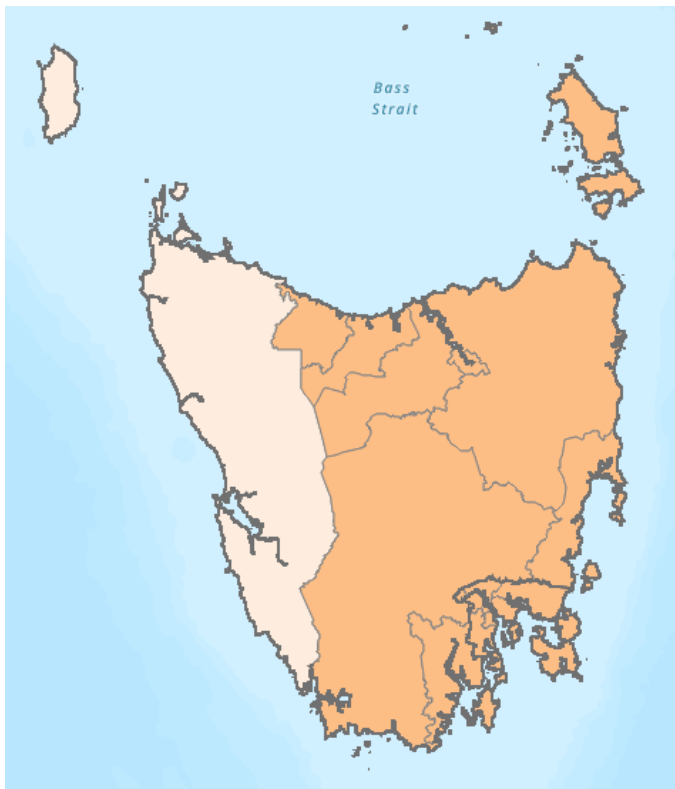

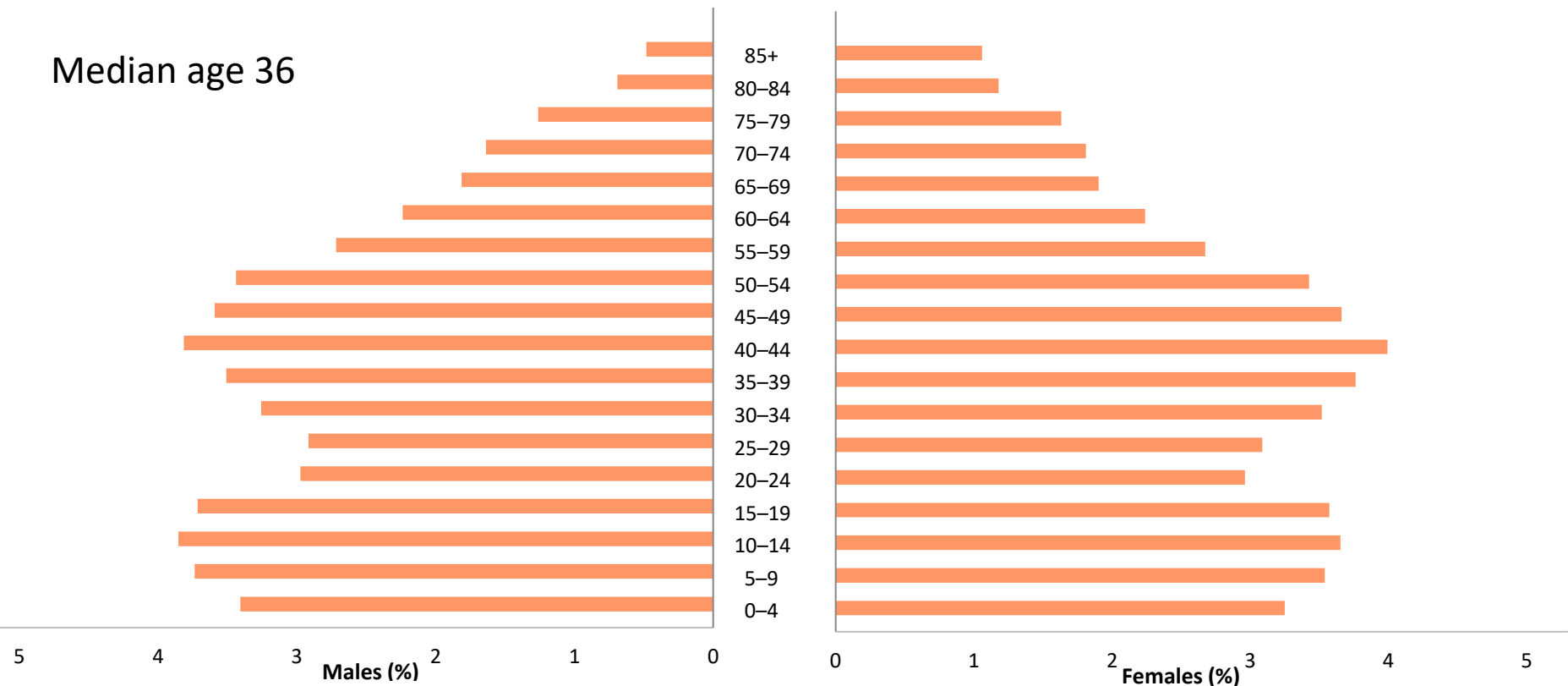


Age distribution - 2001

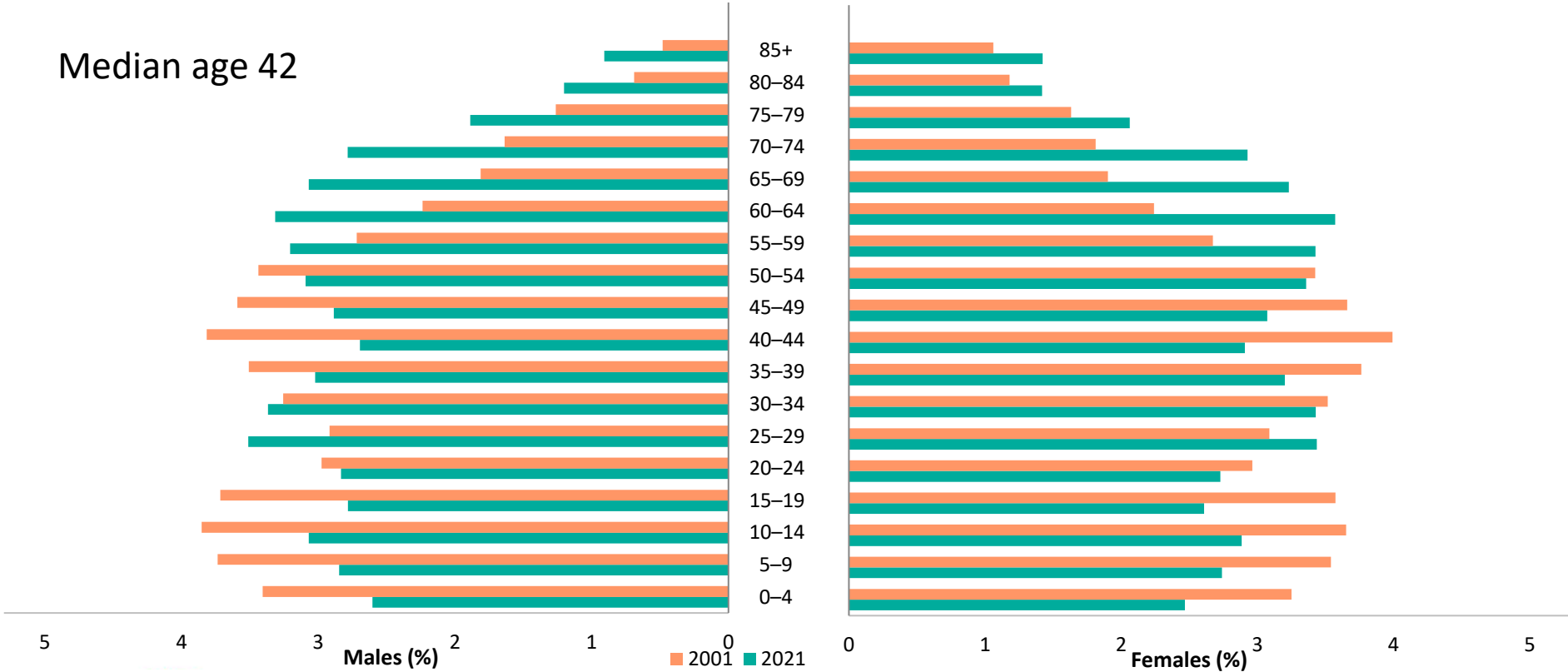


Age distribution - 2001 and 2021

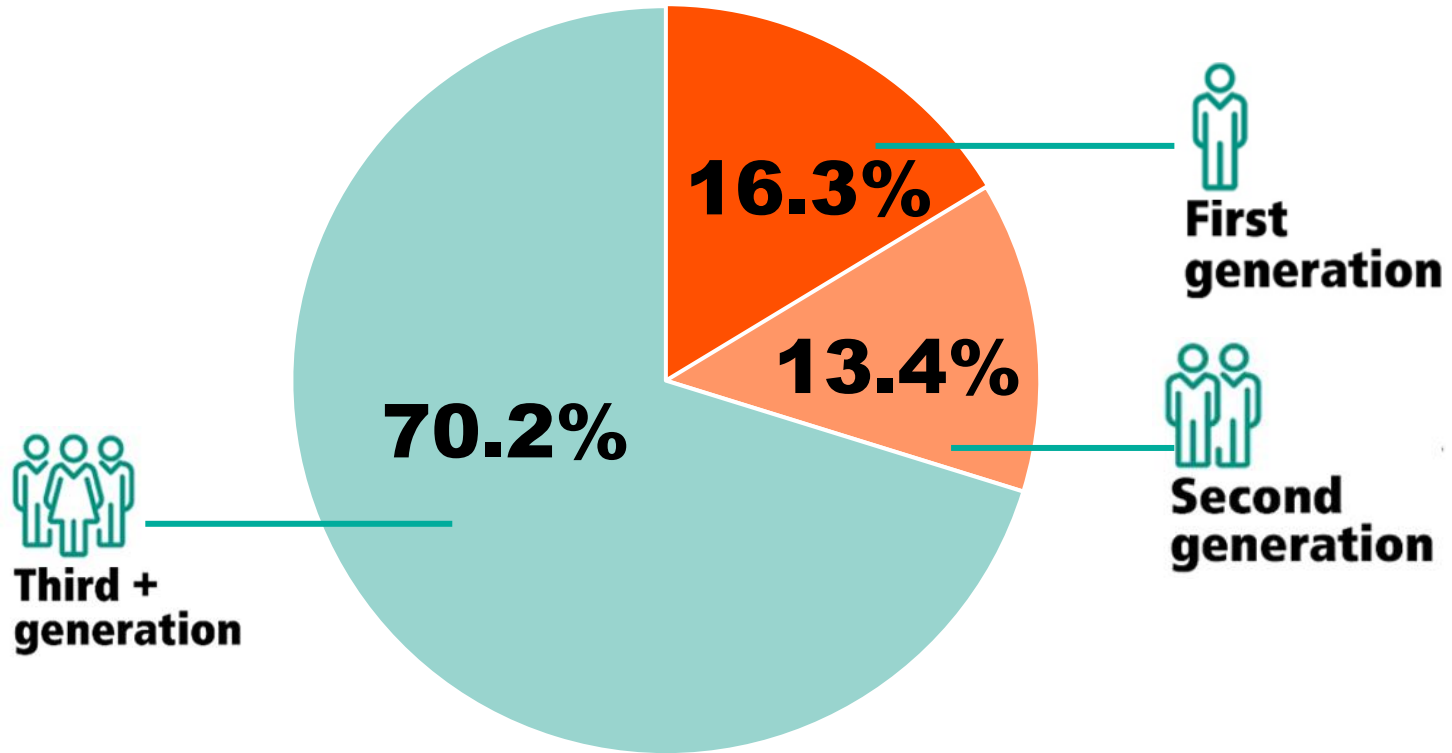

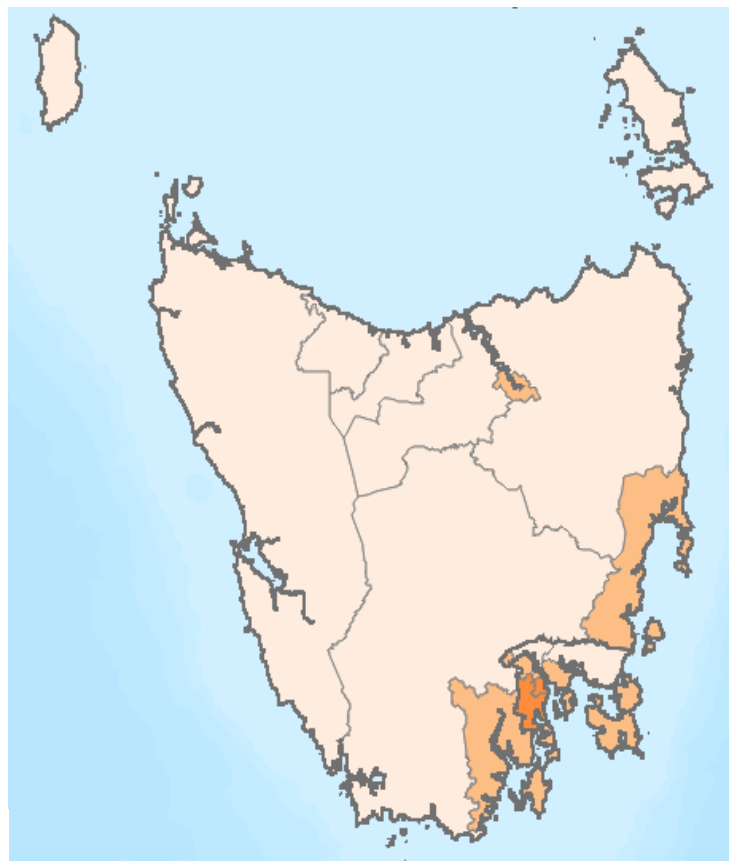

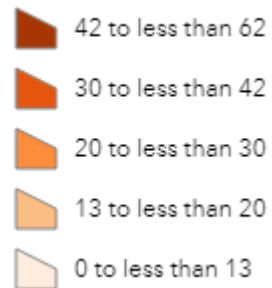

Proportion born overseas by SA3



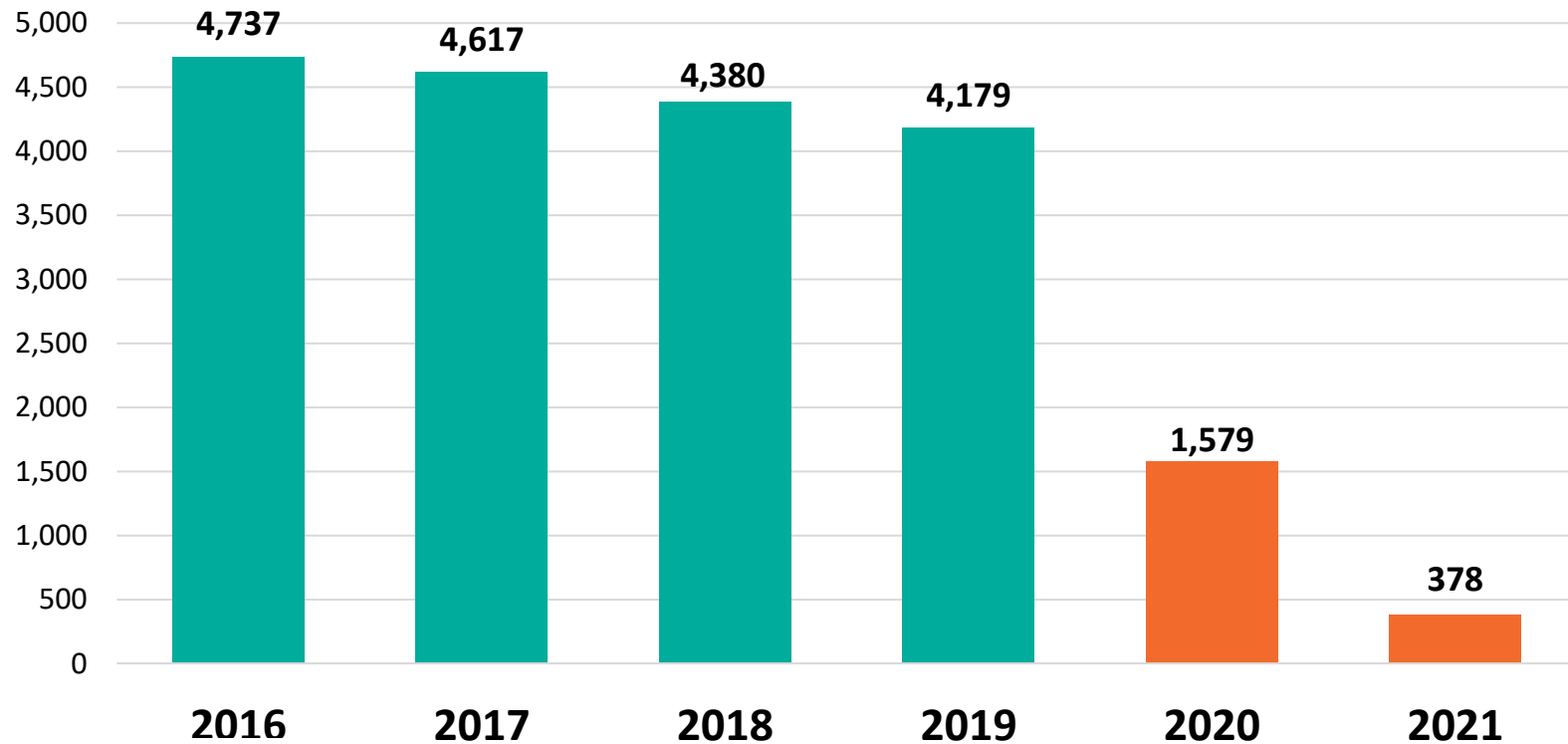

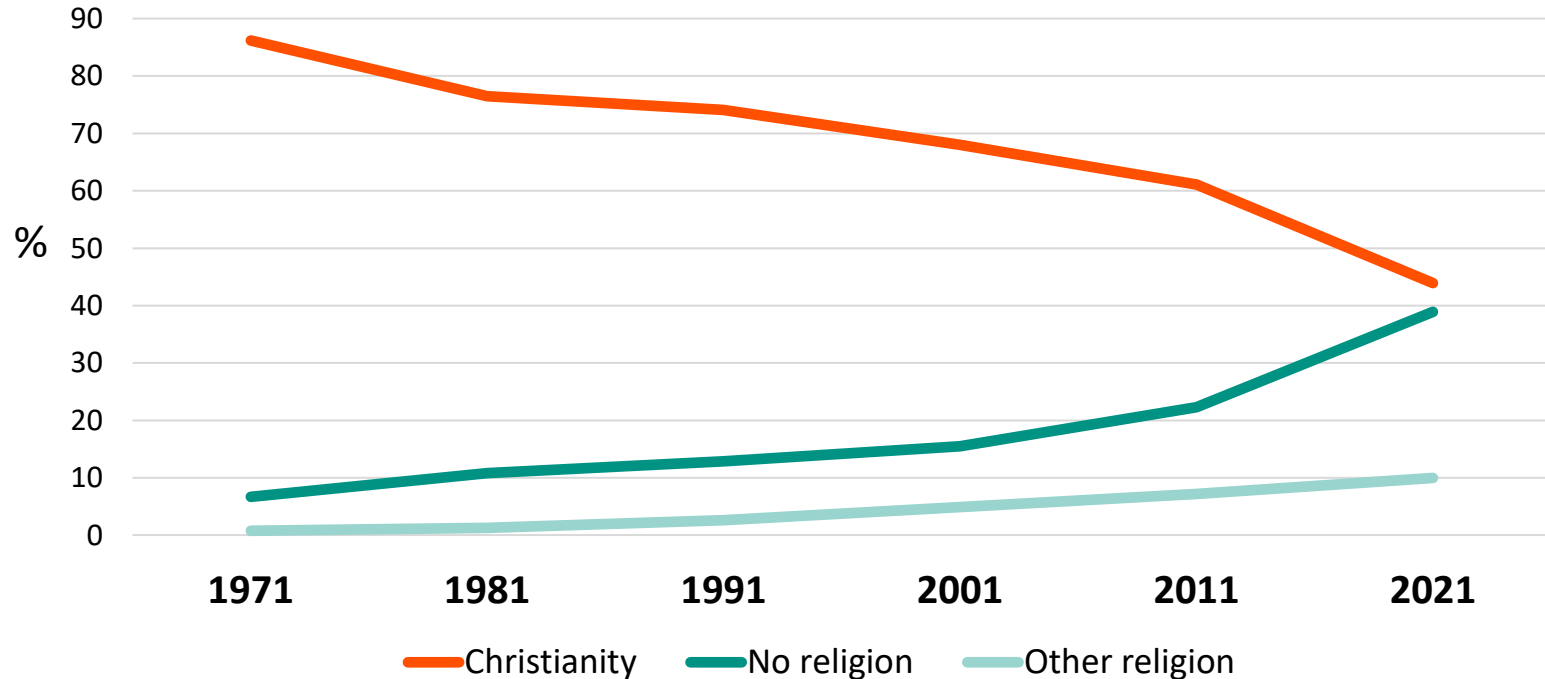

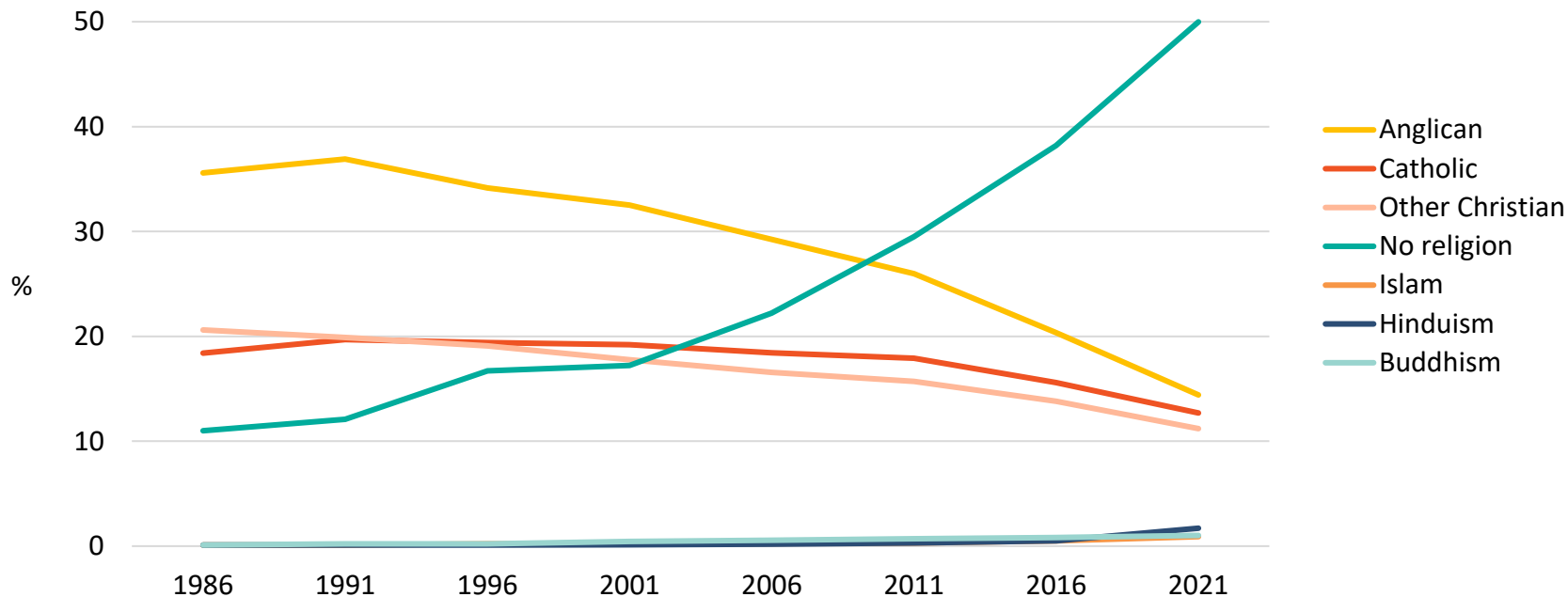

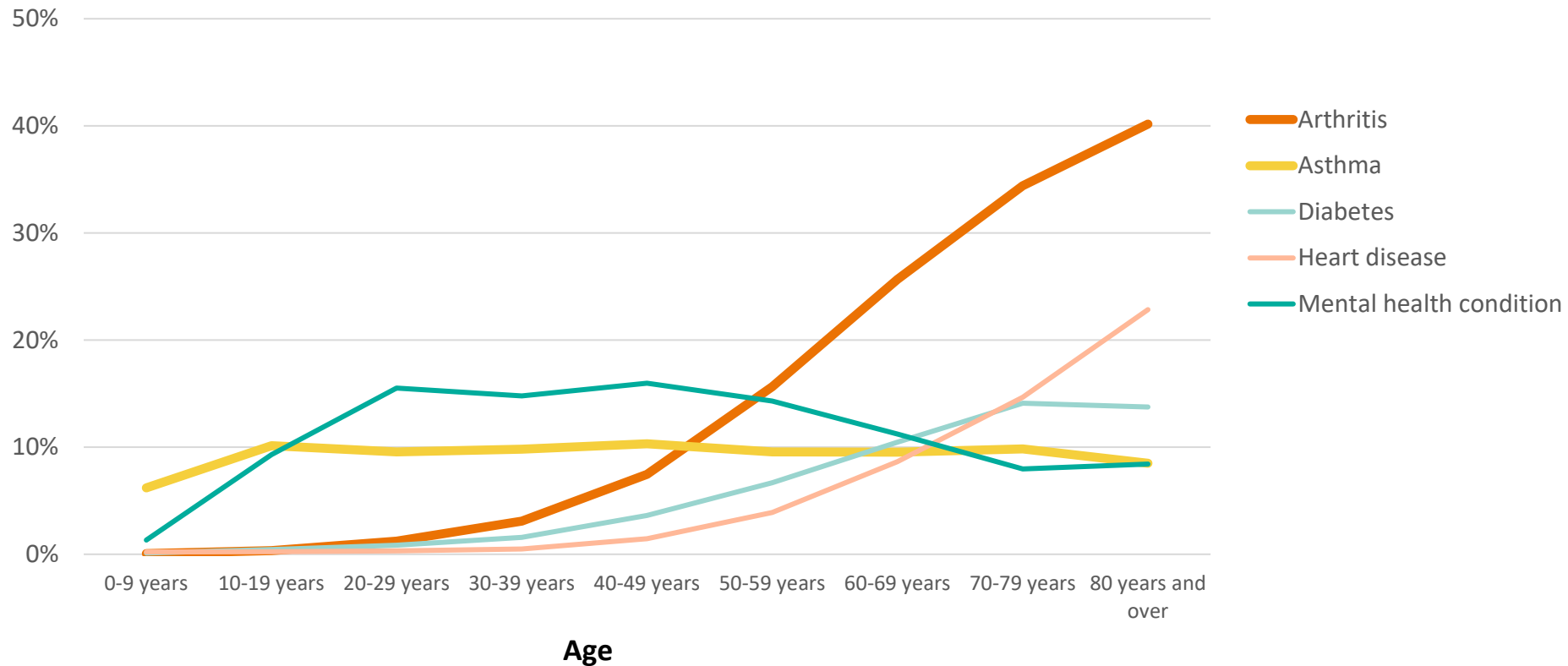

Long-term health conditions by age



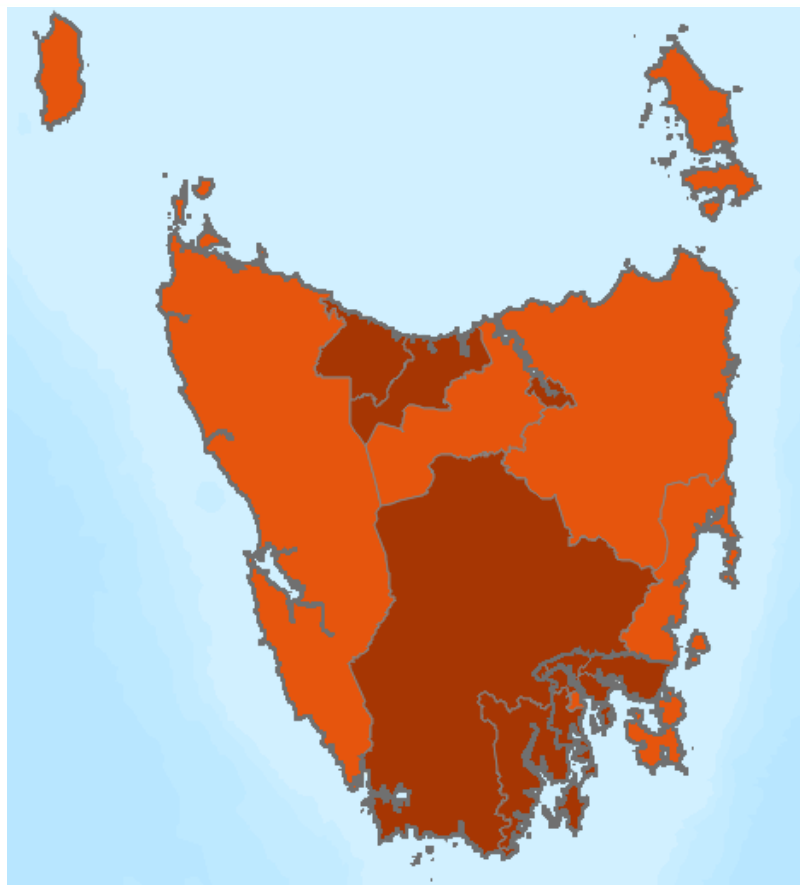

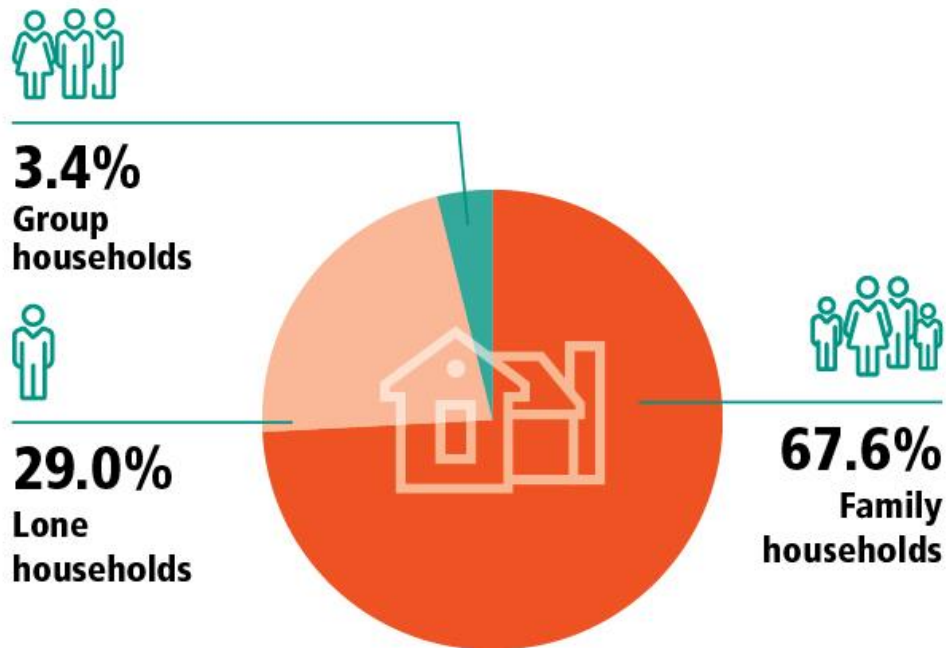

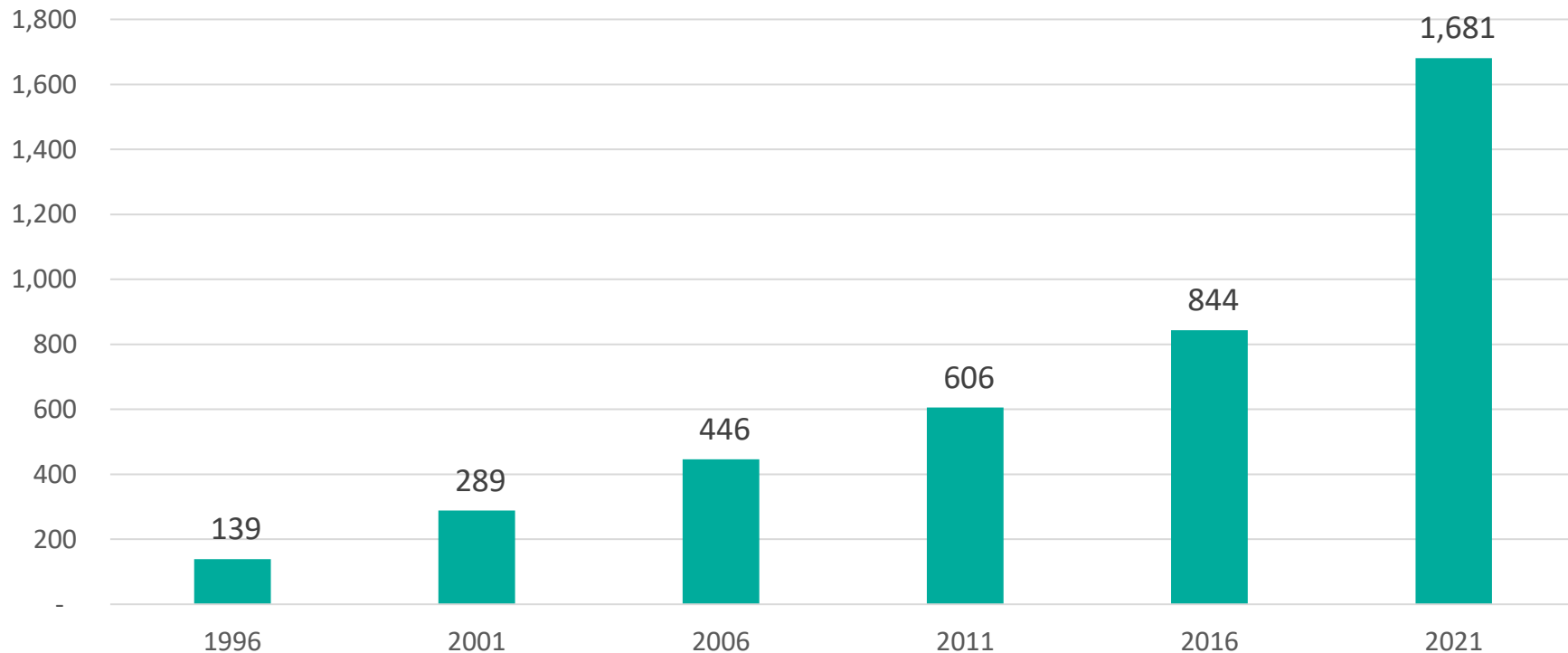

Dwelling tenure over time



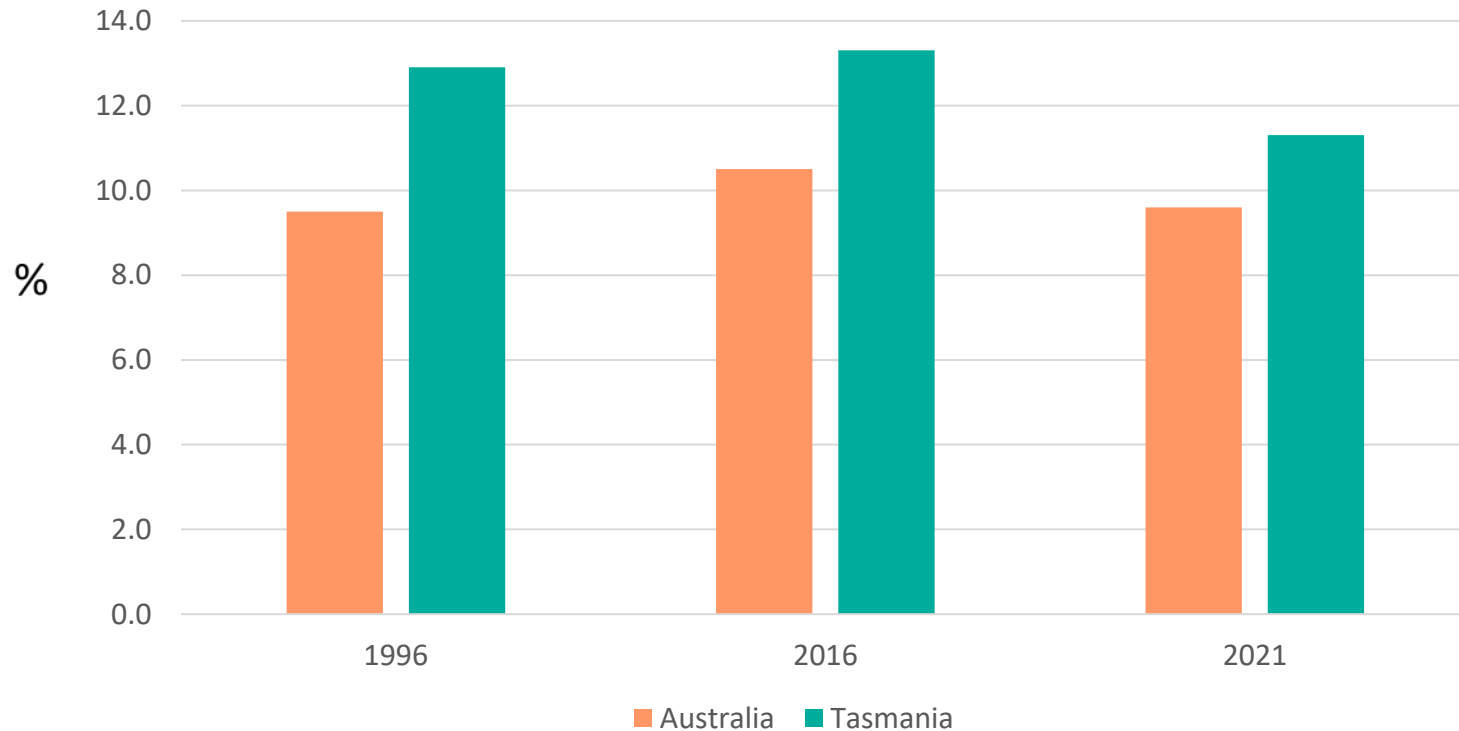

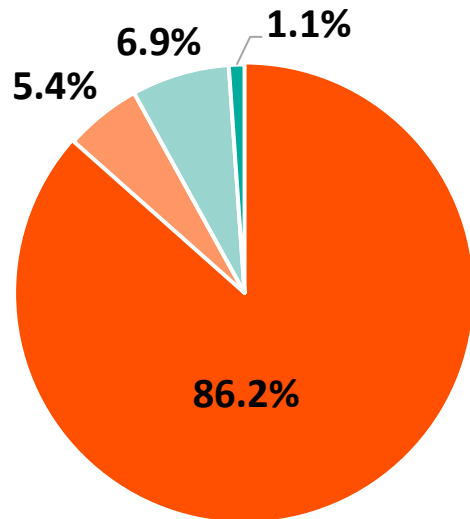

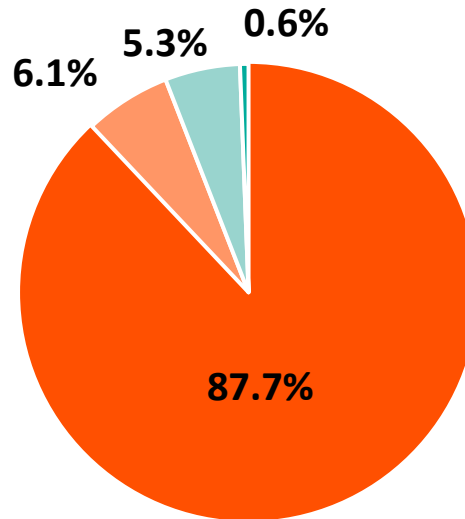
